## Professional History:

Provided and directed all audiologic services for 13,000 student district including preschool through 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Services included audiologic evaluation, auditory processing evaluation, amplification monitoring and maintenance, aural rehabilitation, hearing conservation, parent support, teacher inservice, early intervention services, IEP development and case management. I was responsible for developing this position into a progressive full-service educational audiology program not simply an identification and assessment program.

September 1987-August 2001. **Clinical Supervisor**, Affiliate Faculty, Idaho State University. Supervised audiology graduate students in weekly audiology clinic which provided pediatric clients with comprehensive evaluations. Graduate student extern site supervision completed in school district.

August 1986-September 1990. **Clinical Audiologist**, Idaho State University. Rural Speech and Hearing Outreach Program. Conducted hearing and speech-language screenings, evaluated results, provided necessary recommendations for referral and

follow-up. Sites included high risk infant clinic, preschools/daycares, Head Start, elementary schools, senior citizen centers and health fairs throughout southern Idaho. Administrative duties included establishing contacts, scheduling, advertising, monitoring follow-up, training and supervising audiometric technicians and graduate students.
