

GRADUATE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS
M.S. SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY – AND AUDIOLOGY – M.S. DEAF EDUCATION

In applying for admission to a graduate program in the Department of Communication Sciences & Disorder, and Education of the Deaf, please submit the necessary information to the appropriate places:

A. Submit the following information to: Graduate School, Idaho State University, Campus Box 8075, Pocatello, ID 83209-8075:

1. Idaho State University Application for Admission form (Graduate School application).

NOTE: The application form needs to be filled out completely, including signing and dating the reverse side. The \$55 fee must be included.

These details must be completed, plus the Residency Form and all transcripts must be received in order to process your paperwork.

2. Residency Form

3. One official copy of transcripts from each university you have attended. **IMPORTANT--** Official transcripts are those sent directly from the institution to the Graduate Studies office in an officially sealed envelope.

4. An official record of the scores you received on the general knowledge portions of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) (i.e. verbal, quantitative, analytical).

If you have **not** taken the GRE, please submit all other required material and arrange to take the test as soon as possible. The GRE is typically offered at least quarterly at numerous testing sites throughout the nation. **It takes six weeks from the date of test to our receipt of GRE results: please plan accordingly.** Your GRE scores will be sent directly to Idaho State University Graduate School if you indicate on the GRE test registration form the ISU code number **R4355** and the department code **0620**. A computer administered GRE is available by appointment at the College/University testing center. The admission process starts approximately March 15. Your application will be at a decided disadvantage without GRE or equivalent scores (e.g. GMAT).

1. The Department of Communication Sciences & Disorders, and Education of the Deaf Application form.

2. Three ISU recommendation forms that relate to your ability to do graduate work.

Letters may also be submitted in addition to the ISU forms. Letters are not a substitute for ISU forms. Statements of recommendation should be completed by individuals who have first-hand knowledge of you academic and/or professional abilities, as well as other factors important to graduate study in Speech-Language Pathology or Audiology or Deaf Education.

Recommendation letters are to be placed inside an envelope by the recommender, sealed, and signed by the recommender on the back of the envelope over the seal, and returned to you for submission with your application packet or letters can be sent directly to the Director of Graduate Studies at CSED for submission.

3. One photocopy of your completed Graduate School application, Residency Form, and GRE scores.

4. Your statement of professional objectives.

All departmental application materials are to be submitted complete and postmarked no later than February 1st.
