

Dietetic Programs Course/Program Fee Explanation

Several undergraduate courses in the dietetics program along with the dietetic internship require a course fee (program fee for internship). The following is an explanation of how these fees are spent.

Undergraduate Dietetic Courses:

NTD 104 Foods, 204 Meal Management, 300L Medical Nutrition Therapy I Lab, 301L Medical Nutrition Therapy II Lab, 312L Quantity Foods Lab, 410L Foodservice Systems Management Lab, and 457 Experimental Foods all have a \$50.00 lab fee. Approximate distributions of these fees are as follow:

- Food, supplies and annual equipment leases for the food science courses and supplemental course materials (51%);
- Annual program accreditation fee to the Commission on Accreditation for Dietetics Education (13%);
- Travel for undergraduates and faculty to state (and sometimes national) conferences and field trips (34%);
- Communications expenses for student advising, recruitment and preceptor contacts (2%).

NTD 199 Intro to Dietetics, 239 Nutrition and 340 Nutrition for the Health Profession are online classes and have a \$30.00 per credit hour fee per class. The fees are used to purchase license agreements for course resources and improve technology for a better online learning experience (100%).

Dietetic Internship Program:

NTD 488 (Internship in Dietetics I) and 489 (Internship in Dietetics II) have a \$1000.00 program fee. Approximate distributions of these fees are as follow:

- Adjunct faculty supervision in rotation sites and administrative support (59%)
- Travel for interns and faculty to state (and sometimes national) conferences, faculty in state travel to rotation sites for supervision and field trips (35%)
- Annual program accreditation fee to the Commission on Accreditation for Dietetics Education (3%)
- Supplemental course materials, background checks and CPR training for interns and recruitment materials (2%)
- Communications expenses for intern advising, recruitment and preceptor contacts (1%)
