This one-day course, conducted by the Radiation Emergency Assistance Center/ Training Site (REAC/TS) in Oakridge, Tennessee, emphasizes the practical aspects of early hospital handling of irradiated and/or contaminated patients in the first week following an incident. The course includes discussion on:

- Myth and realities on radiological and nuclear hazards
- Basic health physics and radiation protection
- Acute radiation injury – whole body
- Treatment of internal contamination
- Acute radiation injury - local
- Overview of radiological terrorism and common sources of radiation
- Hospital response to radiological emergencies

Demonstrations and case studies will be provided to ensure that students are prepared to handle patients with radiation injuries and illnesses.
