Updated funding information

1. Graduate Teaching Assistant

Duties: Assist in teaching of introductory psychology (some lectures, testing, leading review sessions, office hours); assist chairperson as needed (managing front desk, departmental chores); possibly assist specific professor(s) in research.

Compensation: a) Fee waiver (\$5,474 in-state or \$14,678 nonresident)
b) Health insurance (\$1,156)
c) \$12,282 stipend per year (clinical doctoral students)
\$9,401 stipend per year (experimental masters students)
d) Fall and Spring semesters (9-month period)

2. Service Learning Positions

Duties: Direct care work in a community residential treatment center for dysfunctional adolescents and developmentally delayed children, or eligibility work for developmental services. 15 hours per week, usually combinations of late afternoon, evening, and weekend shifts. Duties vary but include discrete trial training, recreation and activity coordination, behavior management, discussion group leader, school liaison and skill building, and evaluation procedures.
