**Move Old Mail Later.** We urge you to start using your new account first and move old mail later. Due to the anticipated volume of calls during the transition period, the IT Service Desk will *not* be able to assist you in moving old mail until later in the month. Meanwhile, if you wish to move your old mail into your new Google Apps account yourself, [click here](#) for instructions. Note that mail left on the old server will only be available temporarily, and so after awhile you'll need to retrieve the emails you wish to save.
