**When:** April 5-30, 2010

**Amount Awarded:** \$840.00

**Details:** Record number of students entered their works for consideration (223 works submitted) out of which the juror selected 71 works from 43 students. Opening reception entertained 150-200 in attendance and Dr. Moseman's lecture was well-attended by 50 people (fire-code capacity).

2. Kevin Marsh (*Idaho Yesterdays*, Department of History)

**Event:** Dr. Elliot West, Nez Perce War of 1877 and its significance in United States history

**When:** April 14, 2010

**Where:** 7:30 p.m. Goranson Hall

**Amount Awarded:** \$1,700.00

**Details:** Many students, faculty and community folks attended the presentation. Over 80 people were in attendance. Dr. West also had lunch with ISU graduate students in history and literature. His continued touring the area to Idaho Falls with a different lecture for the Annual East Idaho Distinguished Humanities Lecture Series

3. Bonnie Frantz (Student Affairs/Reading Project)  
**Event:** Greg Mortenson, Author of *Three Cups of Tea*  
**When:** November 2009/February 2010  
**Where:** Jensen Grand Concert Hall  
**Amount Awarded:** \$1700.00  
**Details:** Lecturer unavailable, grant was returned

4. Geoffrey Friedley (Coordinator, ISU Baroque Festival)  
**Event:** ISU Baroque Festival  
**When:** October 24-November 1, 2009  
**Where:** Different venues included: ISU's Goranson Hall, Jensen Grand Concert Hall, Trinity Episcopal Church  
**Amount Awarded:** \$6,700.00  
**Details:** Four concerts and a master class. Estimated attendance for all programs was 468. It should be noted that significant donations came from local establishments for program ads. Additionally, ISU's Baroque keyboards (3) were worked on and tuned by professional harpsichord tuner David Calhoun from Seattle Washington.

**When:** August 24-October 16, 2009  
**Where:** John B. Davis Gallery, FA Building ISU; FA 401  
**Amount Awarded:** \$1,200.00  
**Details:** Two exhibitions were held by visiting artist Paul LaJeunesse (Oregon) and collaborative artists Earl Swope and Amy Nack (both Boise). Public lectures, public receptions and a student workshop were held. Attendance for events were; 40+, 100, and 15. A grant from the Idaho Commission on the Arts also helped fund these events.
