We continue to be successful in our efforts to procure grants and contracts, and our faculty continue to be creatively engaged in furthering the knowledge base in their fields.

I am proud that our students are successful on the professional examinations which allow them access to required professional credentialing. I am even prouder that so many of our graduates choose to practice in Idaho—when many can choose from positions across the nation.

# **Kasiska College of Health Professions**

## **Mission Statement**

The mission of the KCHP is multifaceted. The primary responsibility is the enhancement of the quality of life of the residents of Idaho and the greater community through the education of students in the health care professions. This is facilitated through excellence in research, community service, teaching and application of technology, as well as strong leadership on issues related to health professions education and the delivery of health care services.

Five **Goal Categories** have been identified in the **KCHP STRATEGIC PLAN** in order to fulfill the mission of the college: Access; Teaching; Scholarly Activity, Community Service and Interprofessional Activity.

**1. ACCESS:** addressing availability of programs and resources, student recruitment, marketing and publicity.

Long-term goals of the KCHP continue to include development of new program offerings and expansion of existing professional programs to meet the health-care needs of the citizens of Idaho and to provide maximal opportunities for Idaho students. The college currently offers an array of undergraduate and graduate programs in many health care disciplines (Table 1). During FY 03, a new doctoral program in audiology (Au.D.) was approved for implementation and the number of accepted students was increased in Communication Sciences, Health Care Administration, Dietetics, and Nursing; a total of 804 undergraduate and graduate students were enrolled in the programs offered through the KCHP (Table 6). These accomplishments were supported in the college by a 7.52% increase in state funding over FY 02 and a 36% increase over the past 5 fiscal years (Table 2).

**2. TEACHING:** addressing faculty development, faculty recruitment and retention, and improvement of instructional capabilities.

Although state funding for the college increased by only 7.52% over FY 02, the college experienced a 28% increase in FTE Faculty positions during FY 03 (Table 2; Figure 1); funding for many of the new faculty positions was accomplished through outside funding, reallocation and student fee increases. Although faculty salaries remained fixed during FY 03, the college has been reasonably successful in retention of existing faculty. Faculty in the Department of Physician Assistant Studies received training through the APAP, CME and IRTC; the Department of Physical and Occupational Therapy completed departmental server access for the PT and OT data base and provided space for a faculty consult room; and faculty in most programs attended and/or participated in regional and national professional meetings.

**3. SCHOLARLY ACTIVITY:** facilitating and improving faculty and student research and scholarly activity addressing and promoting the health professions.

KCHP departments were successful in obtaining \$4,427, 248 in grants from various state and national agencies for research and program development (Figure 6; Table 9). College faculty published 120 refereed publications and presented 235 papers at local, state, regional, national and international meetings; the number of publications for FY 03 represented a 31% increase over FY 02 and a 9% increase over the past 5 years; paper presentations at meetings increased by 17% and 19%, respectively (Table 10). Mentoring programs have been established in the college departments to aid in development of faculty in their respective research programs.

**4. COMMUNITY SERVICE:** including professional involvement of faculty, staff and students with the general public as well as client and patient care activities.

Professional community service by KCHP faculty, including service to Idaho's residents, private and professional organizations, and health care facilities and schools in Idaho continues to be outstanding. While too many to be listed here, specific contributions by the faculty are itemized in the respective departmental annual reports included herein.

**5. INTERPROFESSIONAL ACTIVITY:** involving collaboration among the college departments and professional disciplines on projects related to teaching, research and/or clinical activities in the health professions.

Collaboration between faculty from the various departments of the KCHP and with other academic departments in the university is strongly encouraged, and success is demonstrated by the increasing number of collaborative papers and presentations given by college faculty (see departmental reports).

# FTE Positions AY 03

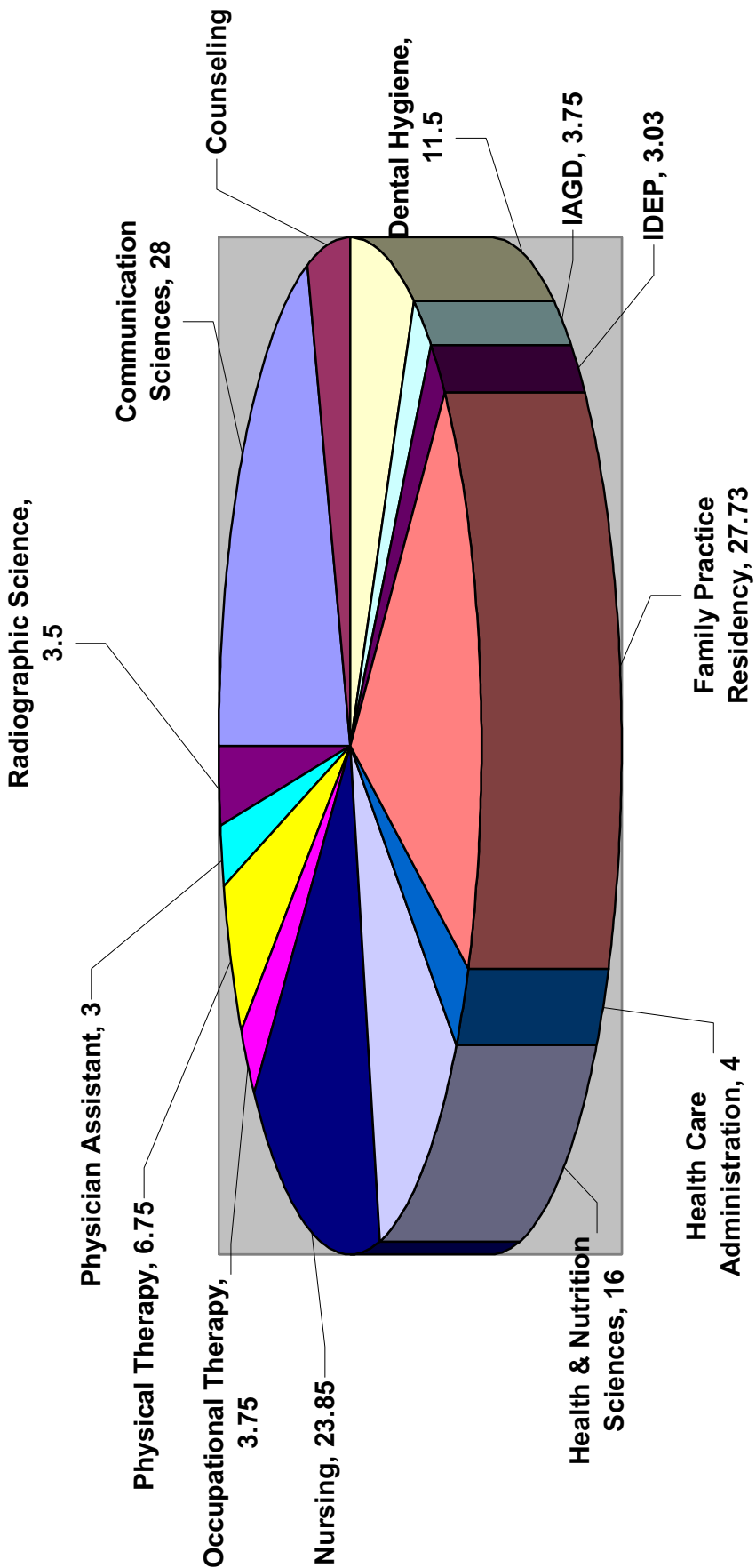
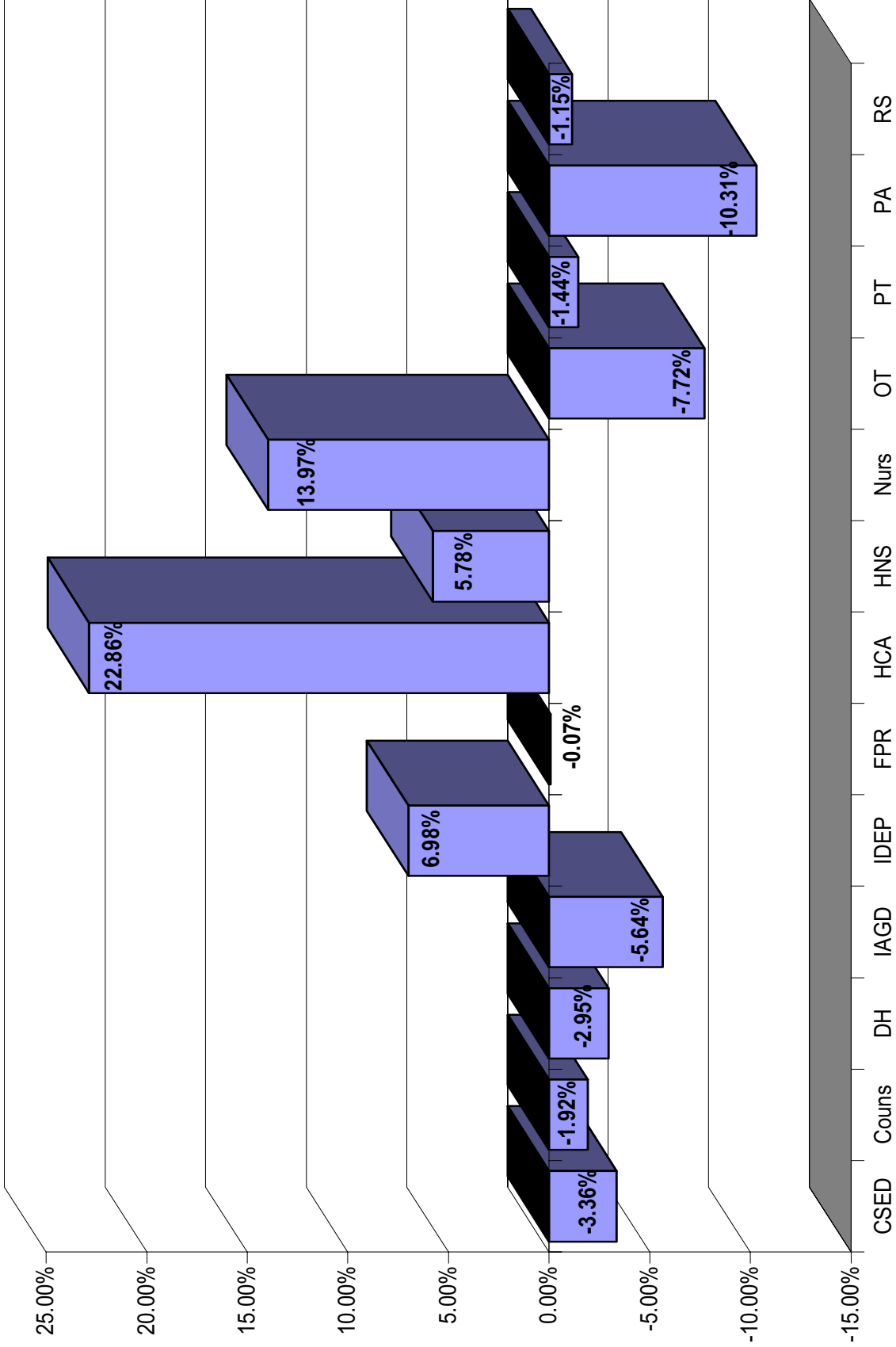

# FY 03 Budget Percent Increase/Decrease from AY02

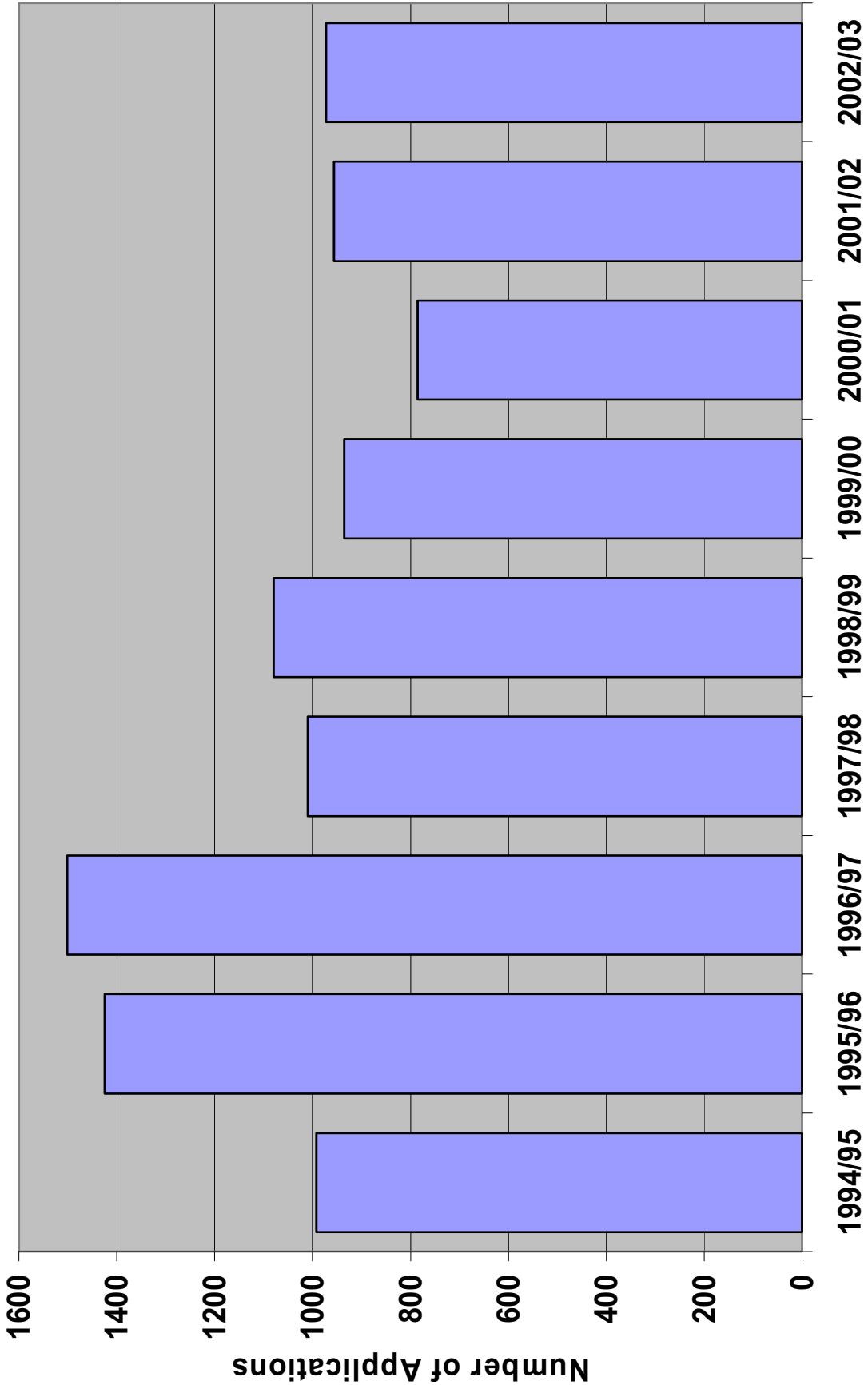

# KCHP Total Student Applicants 1994-2003

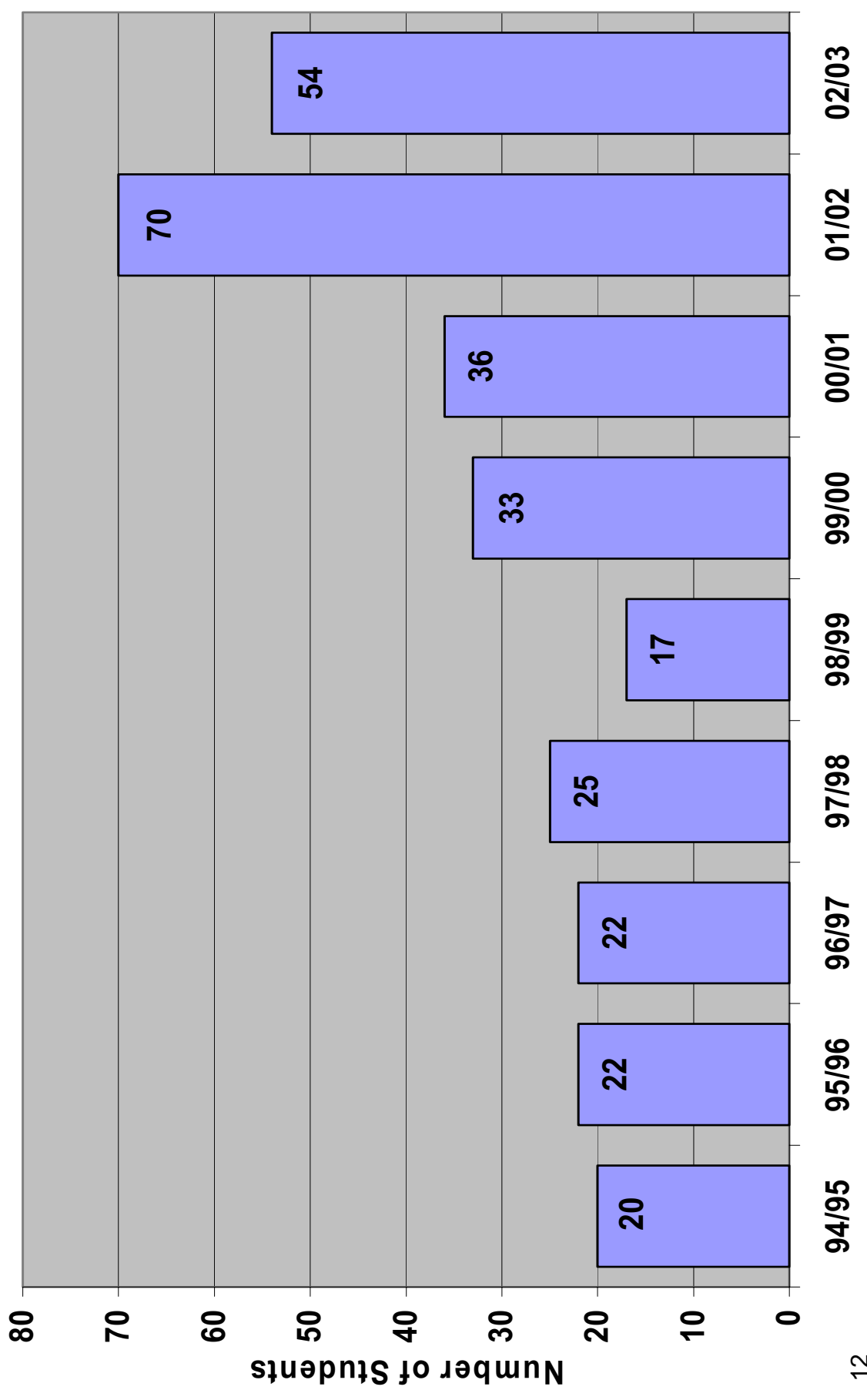

# Total Grant Support for KCHP 1994-2003

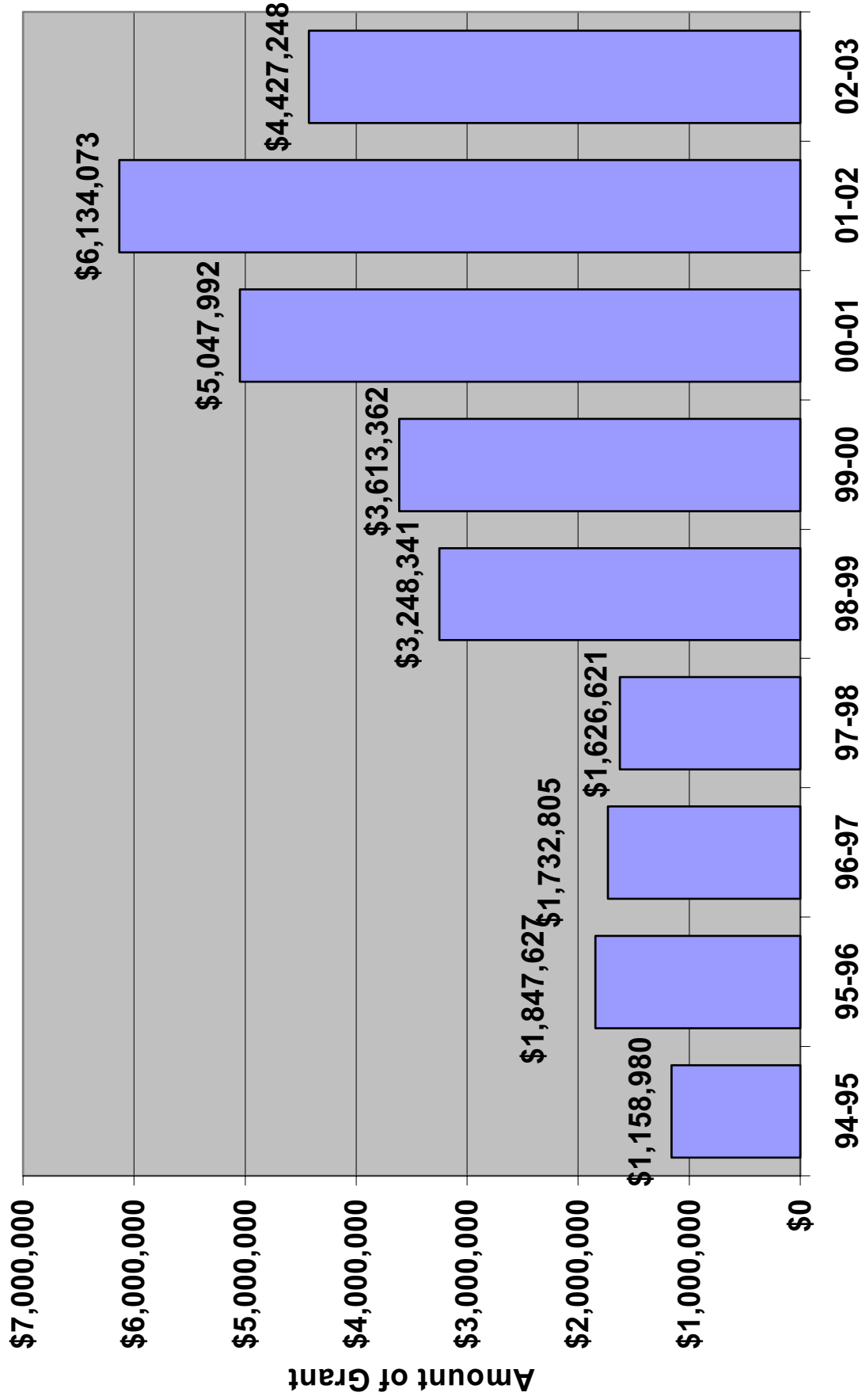

# Kasiska College of Health Professions Clinic Operations - 2002-2003 Annual Report

## Communication Sciences

During the 2002-2003 academic year 128 Clients were seen in the audiology clinic. Hearing evaluations, ~~AR~~ and impedance c linics were used to examine 217 children, while 1031 adults participated in hearing evaluations and ENG examinations.

The speech language clinic provided therapy for 137 clients, 124 children and 13 adults. There were 78 clients for diagnostics, 9 children, and 19 adults, ~~\$69~~ was generated from the speech language and audiology clinics during 2002-2003. \$0,212 was generated from ~~X~~ audiology clinics during 20 02-2003. \$08.80 from ~~h~~ited Way donations.

Hearing and speech screenings were held at the Pocatello School District Head Start Program, Southeast Idaho School Districts, health care facilities, local Health ~~Firs~~, and the ISU~~Health Fir~~, ISU~~Preschool~~, ~~D~~onneville County, ~~PM~~ West Nursery ~~&~~Developmental Options.

## Counseling

During the 2002-2003 academic year, a total of 1 couples and 1 families was seen in the ~~F~~amily Education and Counseling Center clinics. The two clinics had a combined income of \$20.

## Dental Hygiene

During the 2002-2003 academic year, a total of 106 patients were seen in the preventive clinic. Of that number 19 were children. A total of 306 pit and fissure sealants were placed and 23 full series radiographs were taken. In the expanded functions clinic, a total of 980 amalgam surfaces were placed and 40 composite surfaces were placed. The combined clinic revenue for preventive and expanded clinic was \$,000 for the academic year. Clinic sites - ISU~~D~~ental Hygiene Clinic and Not-Tsoo-Gah-Nee Indian Health Center  
Preceptors at Extramural sites - One dental hygienist and three dentists

## Dental Sciences

During the 2002-2003 academic year a total of 143 patients were seen at the Pocatello ~~F~~amily Dentistry Clinic. The total revenue for clinic services was \$42,017. The resident dentist also provided dental services through rural rotations at the Not-Tsoo-Gah-Nee Indian Health Center, Terreton, and Preston.

## Family Medicine

During the 2002-2003 academic year, a total of 134 visits were made in the clinic. Of that number 416 were ~~M~~icaid and 5 were ~~M~~icare. The clinic had gross charges of \$,50 for the academic year.

## Nursing - Senior Health Promotion Clinic

During the 2002-2003 academic year a total of 9 consultations/visits was made with patients in the clinic. Of the number 4 were new clients and 65 were return visits. Services performed included: 5 foot care; 0 health assessments; 0 social work counseling; 7 medications to indigent patients; 0 phone consultations; 14 other services; 11 referrals.

## Physical and Occupational Therapy

During the calendar year August 2002 - July 2003 a total of 111 patients was seen in the clinic. The total revenue for clinic services was \$,64.

3. The first part of the ASHA directed Formative and Summative Evaluation for Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology were completed. These evaluations were integrated into the Annual Accreditation Report and sent to ASHA.
4. Additional funding was allocated to the Sign Language Studies/Educational Interpreter program to make Janelle’s and Joan’s positions state-appropriated lines. We now have four state-appropriated lines in these programs.

5. The Memorandum of Understanding between Idaho State University and the Idaho Elks Rehabilitation Hospital was completed. The Memorandum will initiate the cooperative Hearing Opportunity Program. This provides an additional .50FTE supervisory position in our Boise clinic.
6. An additional .50FTE state-appropriated supervisory position was allocated to Boise. This brings the ISU faculty in Boise to five — three fulltime and two part time.
7. Successful searches were completed for the Boise Clinical Coordinator and Clinical Supervisor positions. Corey Clemente has taken the position as the Clinical Coordinator and Jody Wood has taken the full time clinical supervisor position.
8. New Departmental brochures were completed for Deaf Education and Speech-Language Pathology.

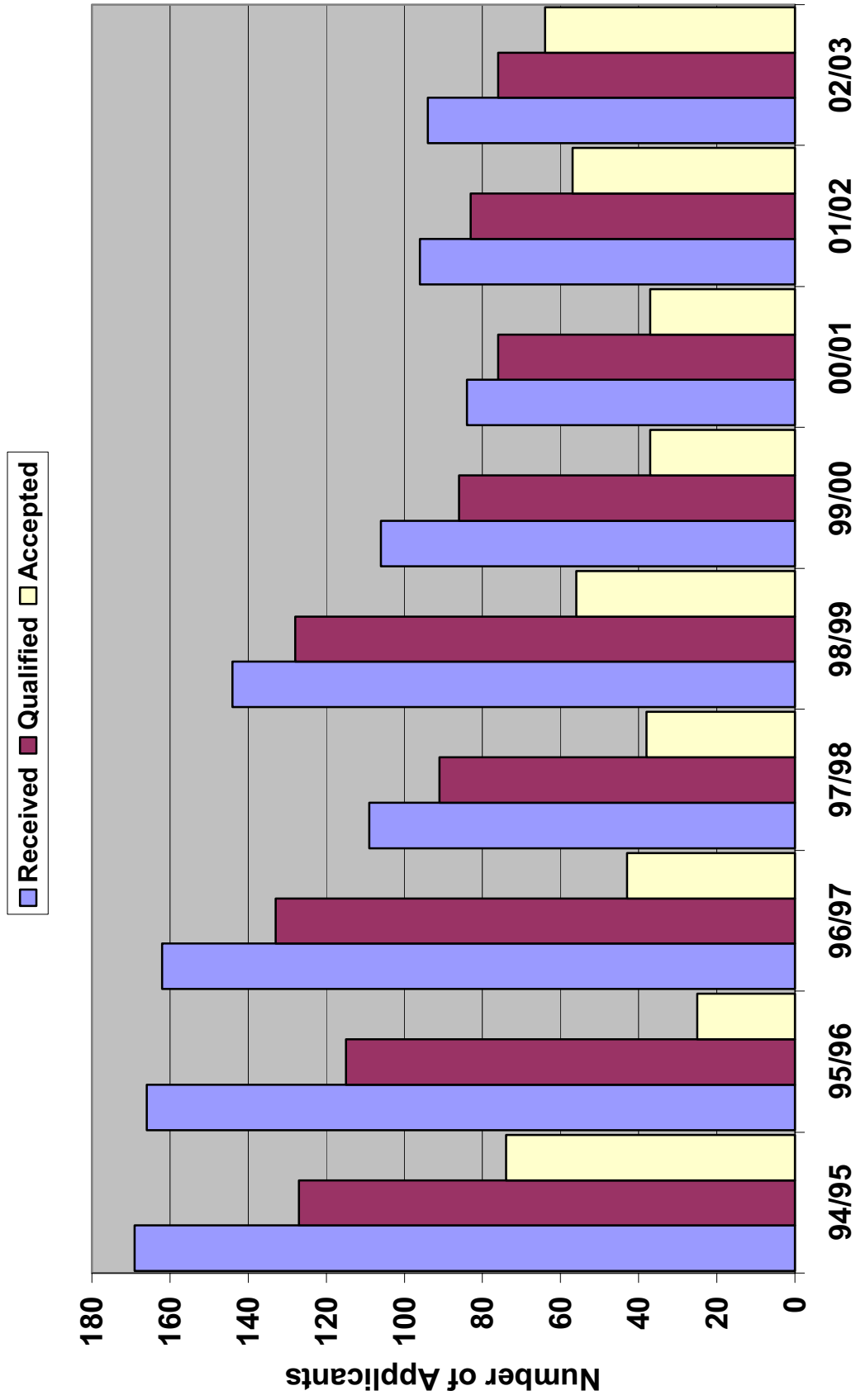

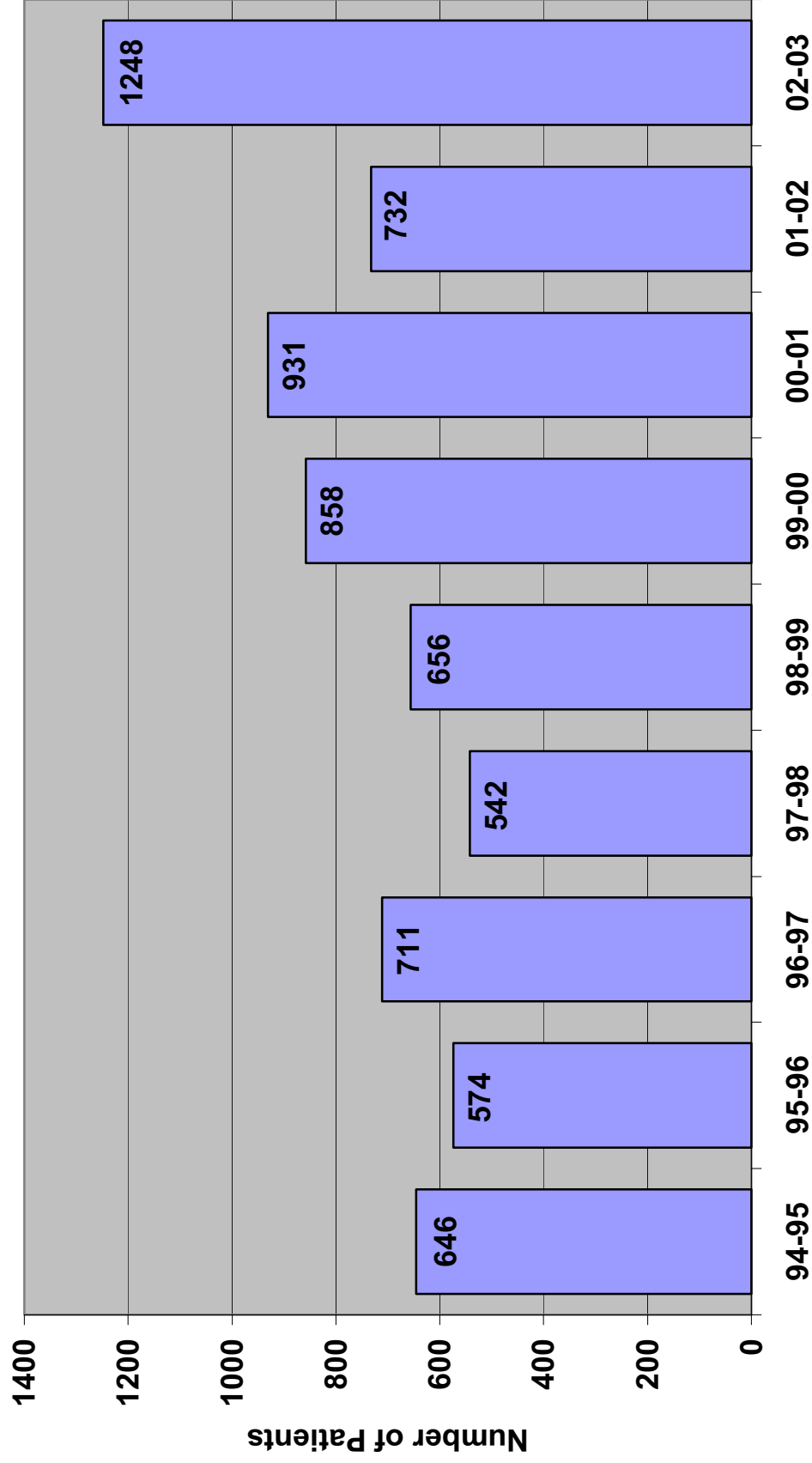

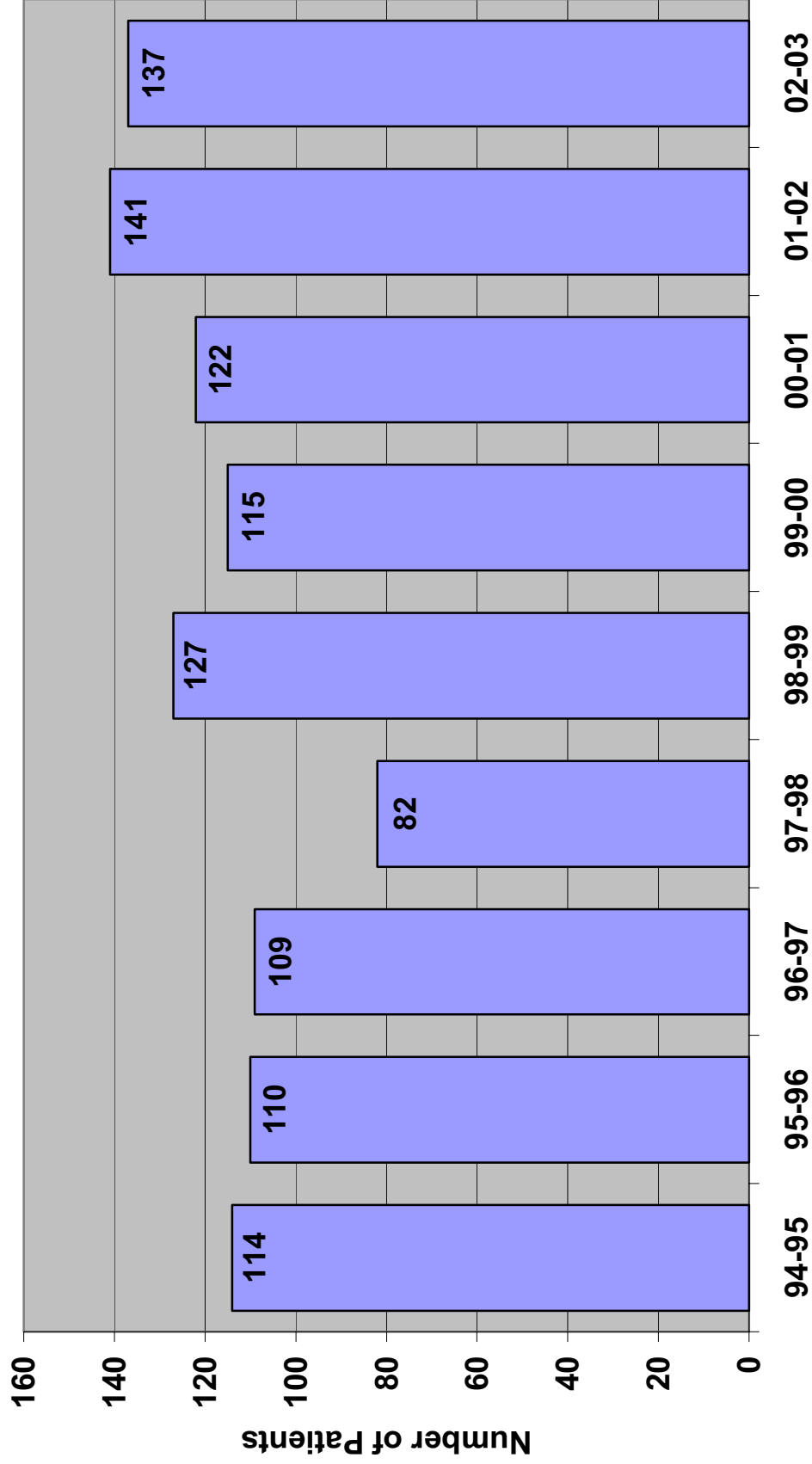

# Audiology Clinic Patient Numbers 1994-2003

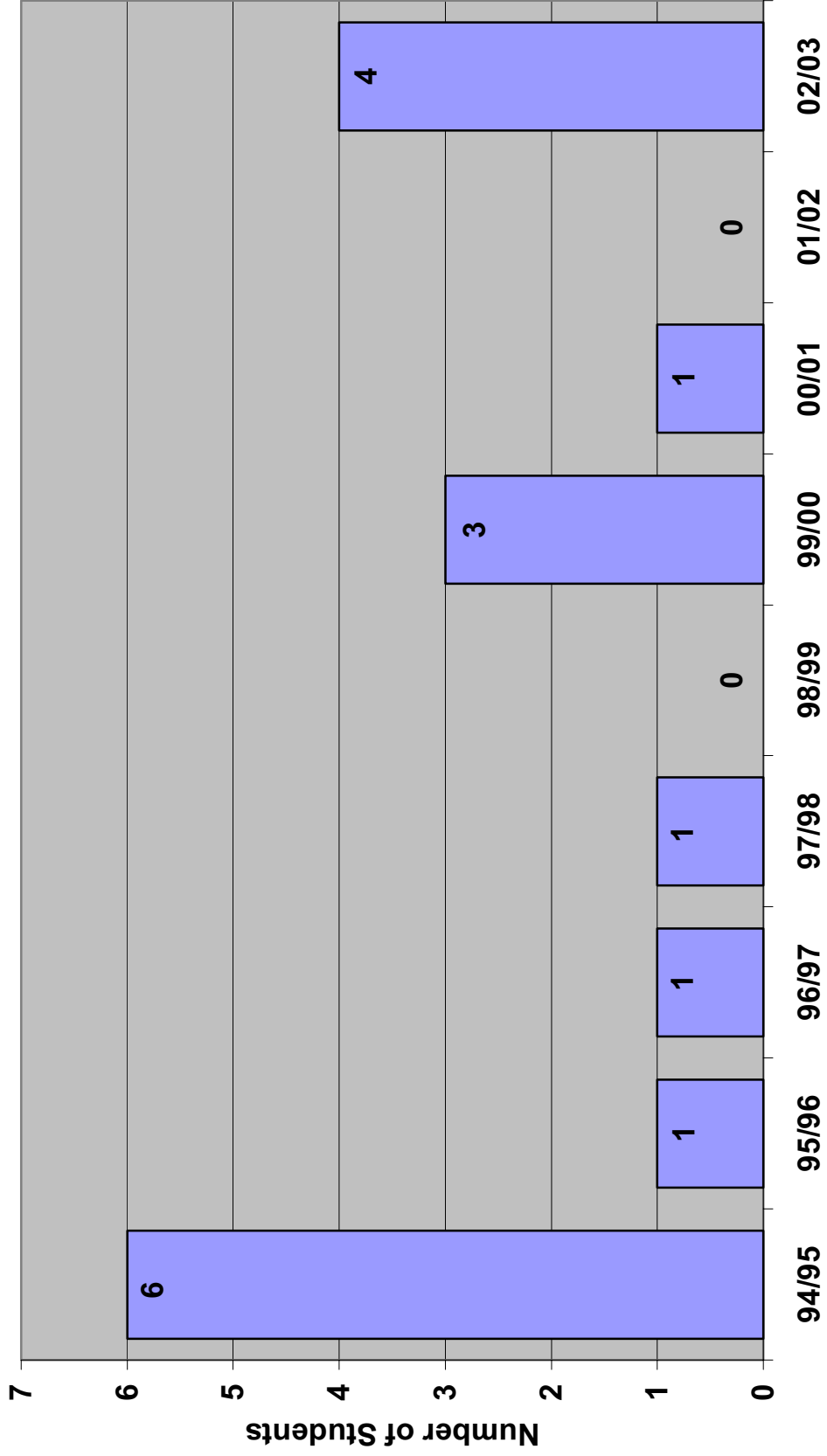


# Speech Language Pathology Clinic Patient Numbers 1994-2003



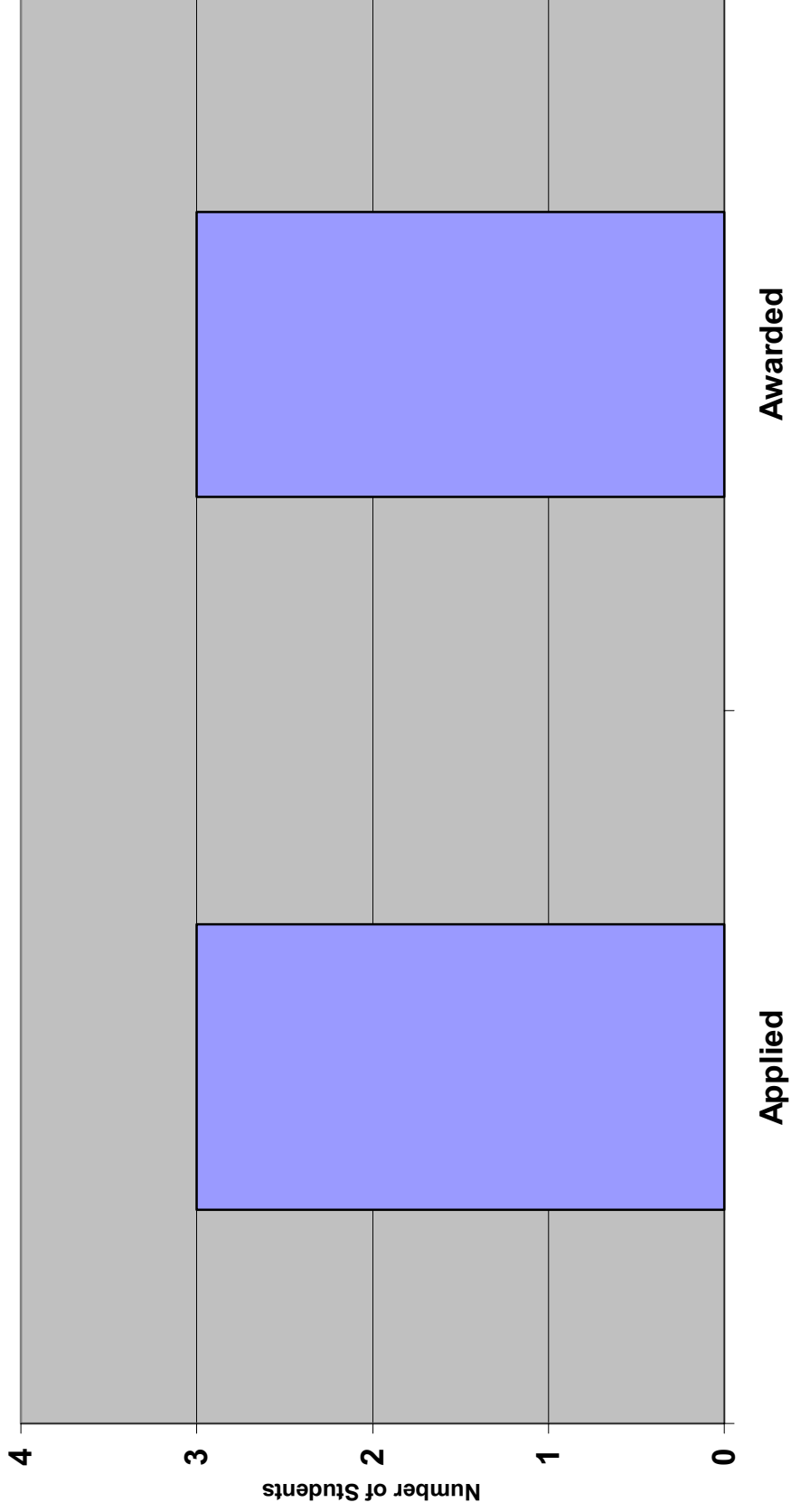

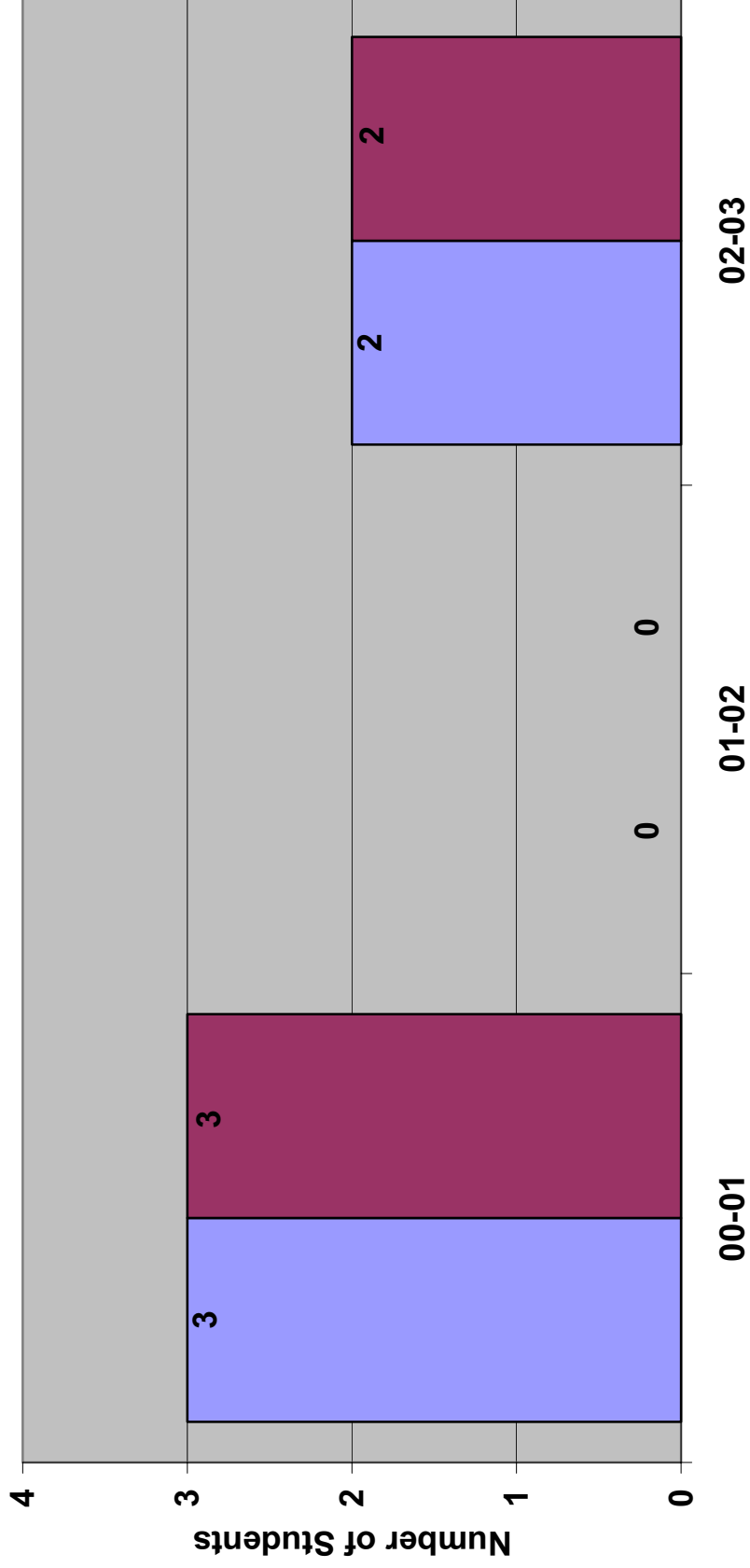

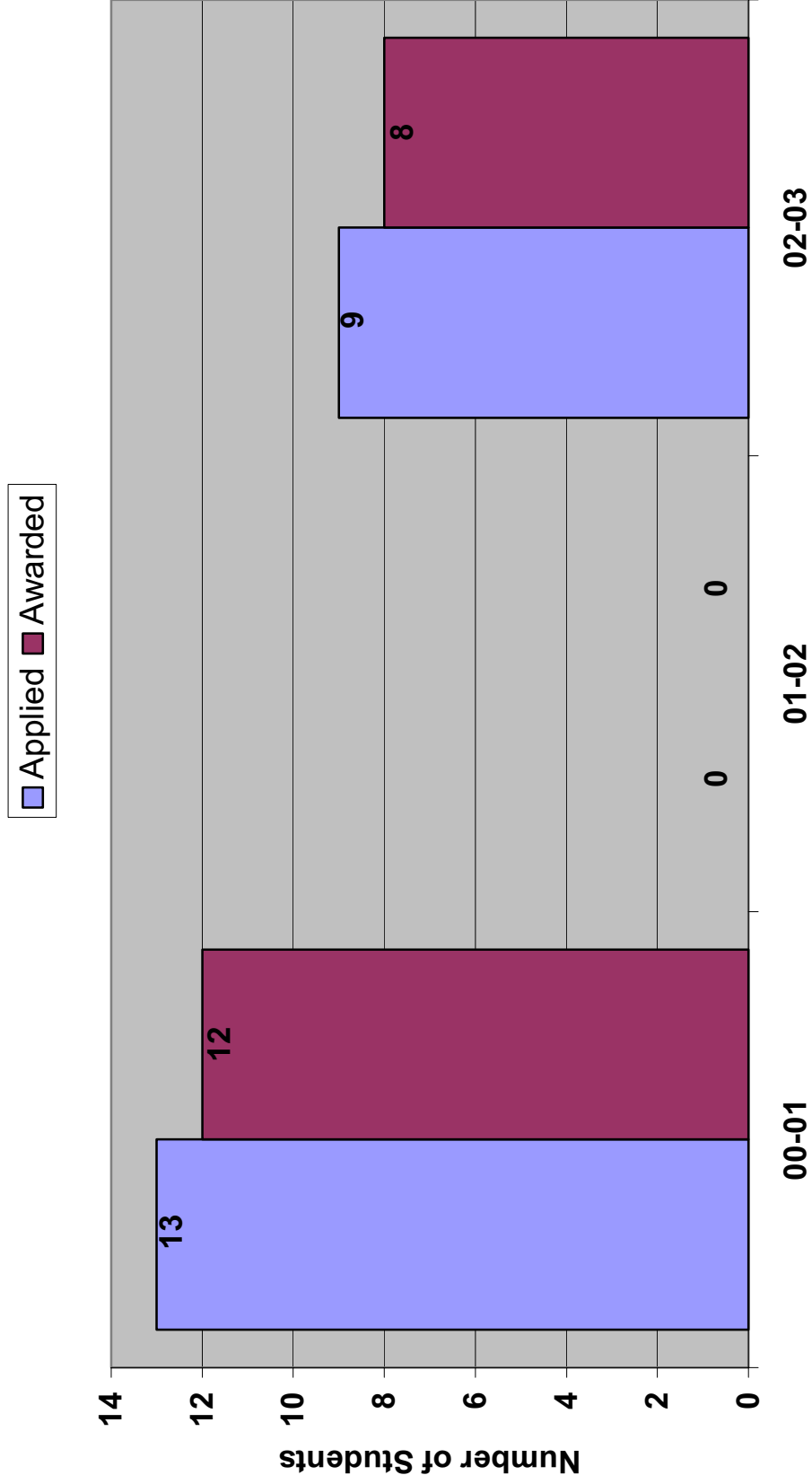

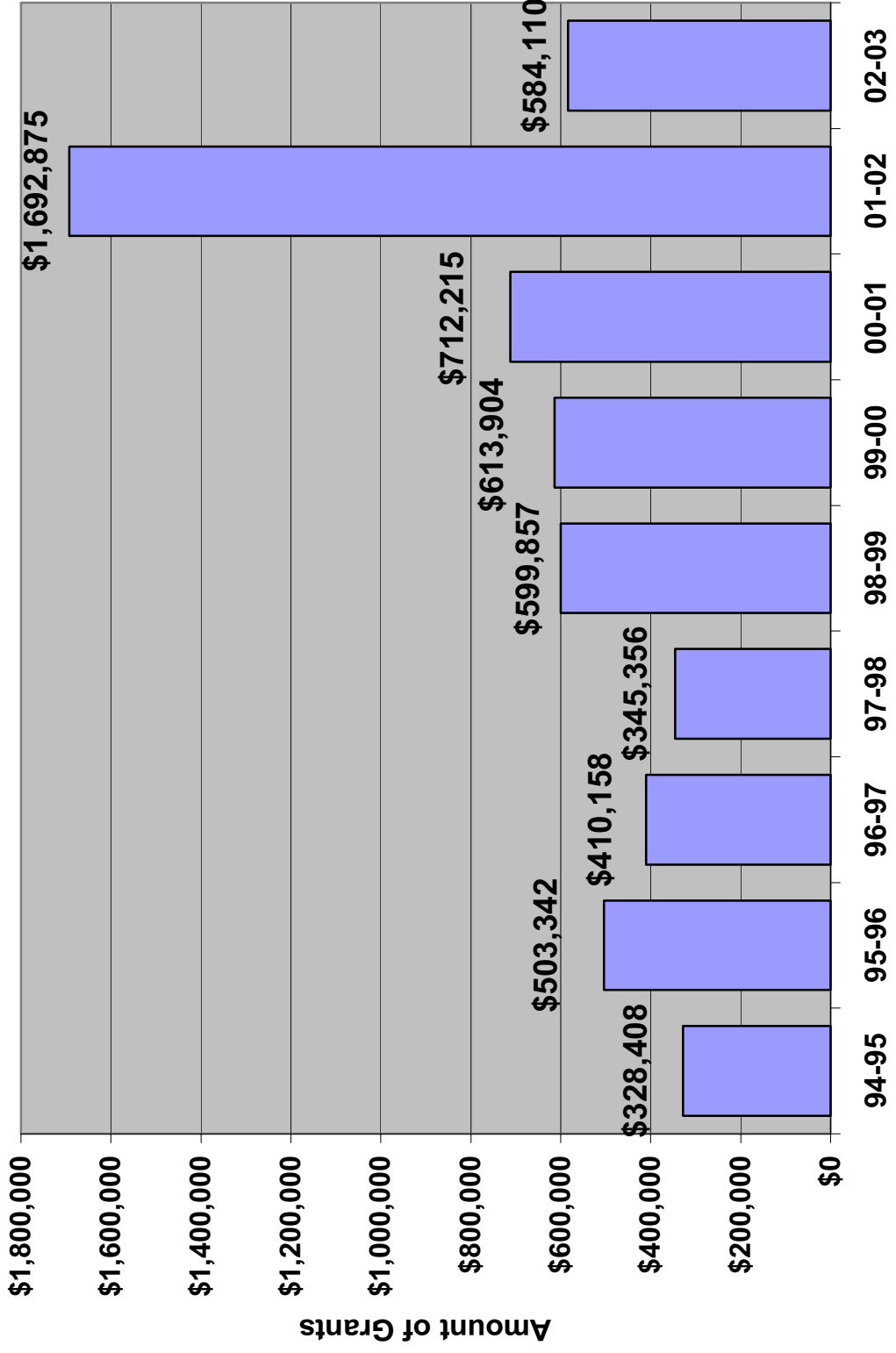

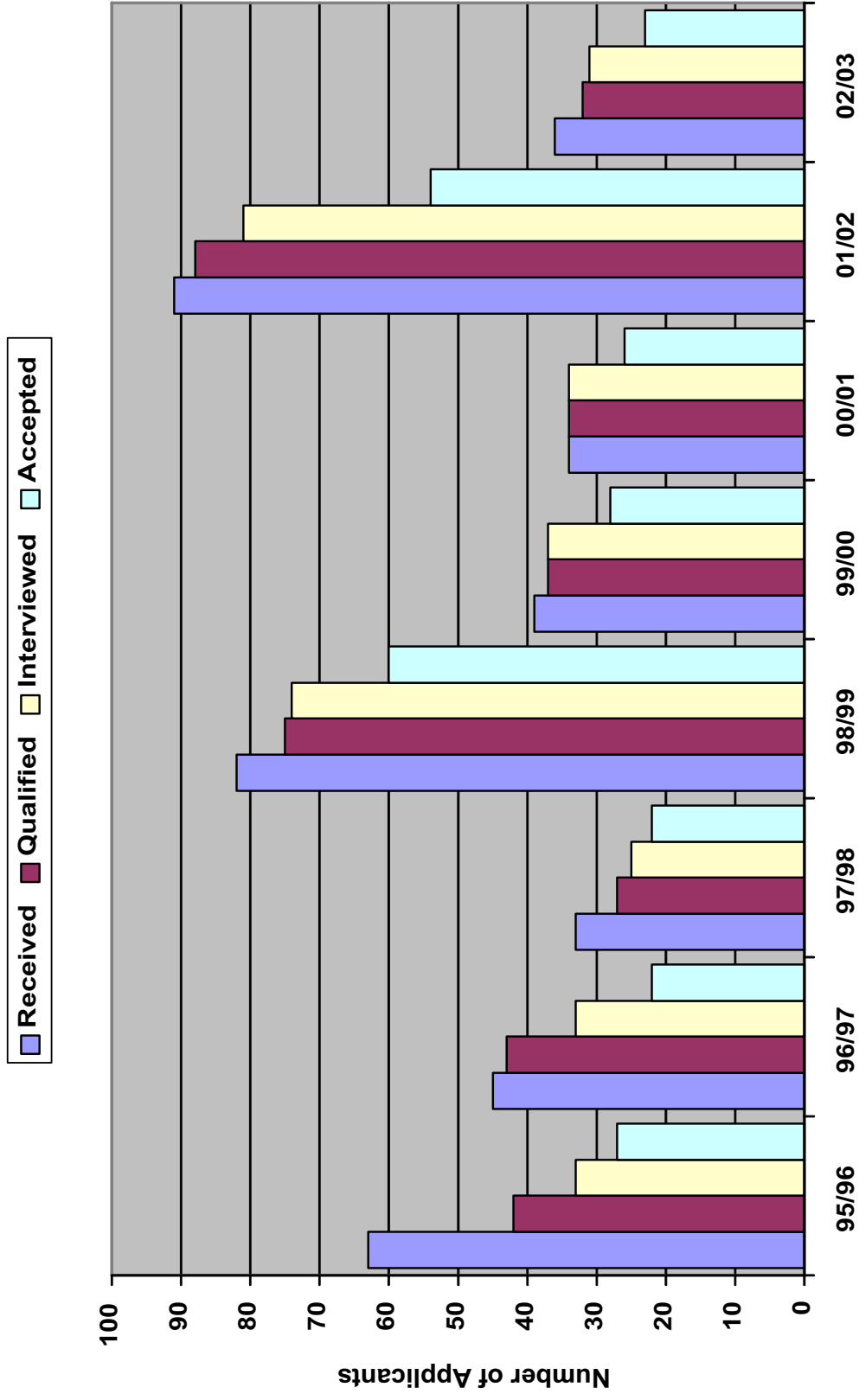

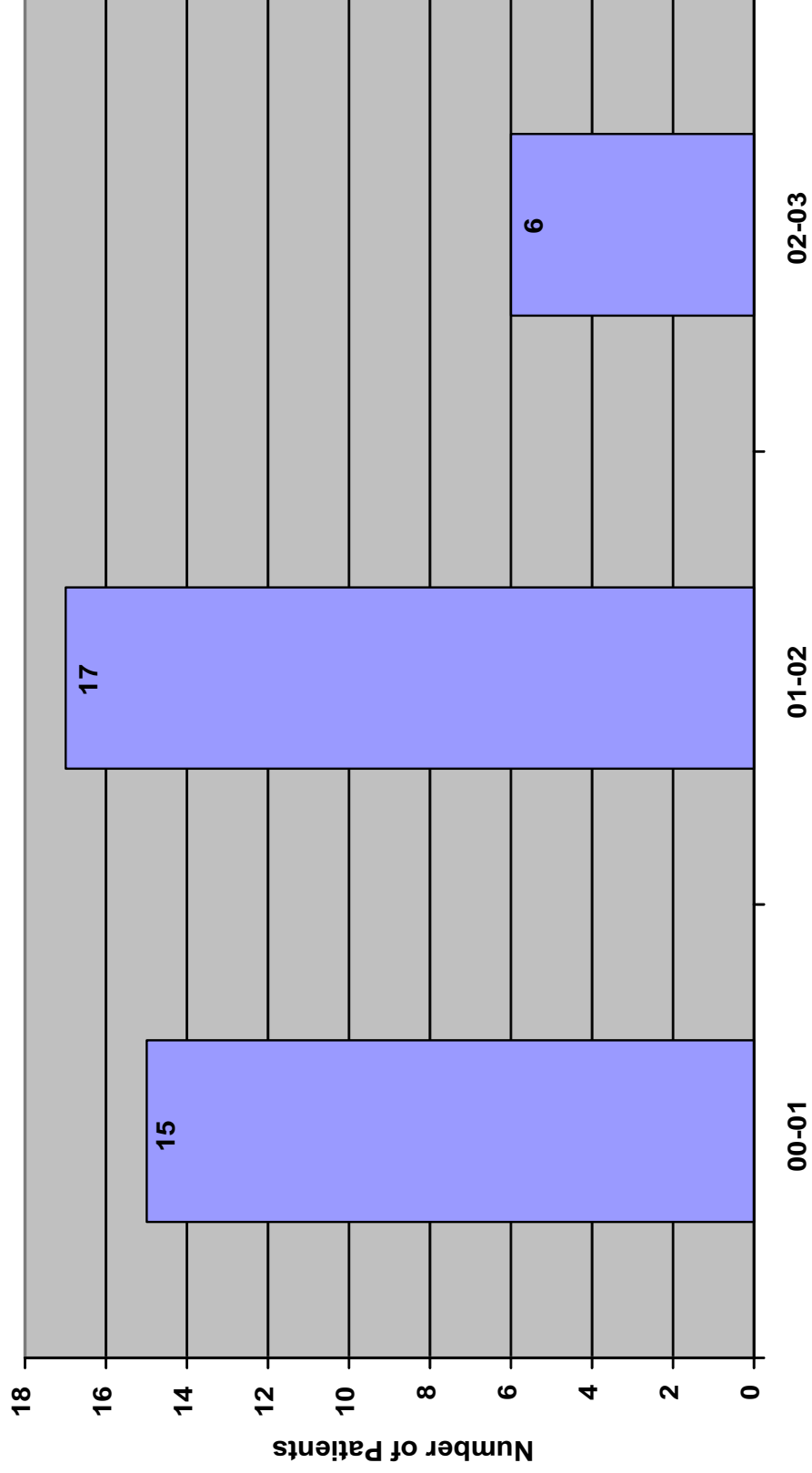
# Counseling-Ph.D., Applicants 1998-2003



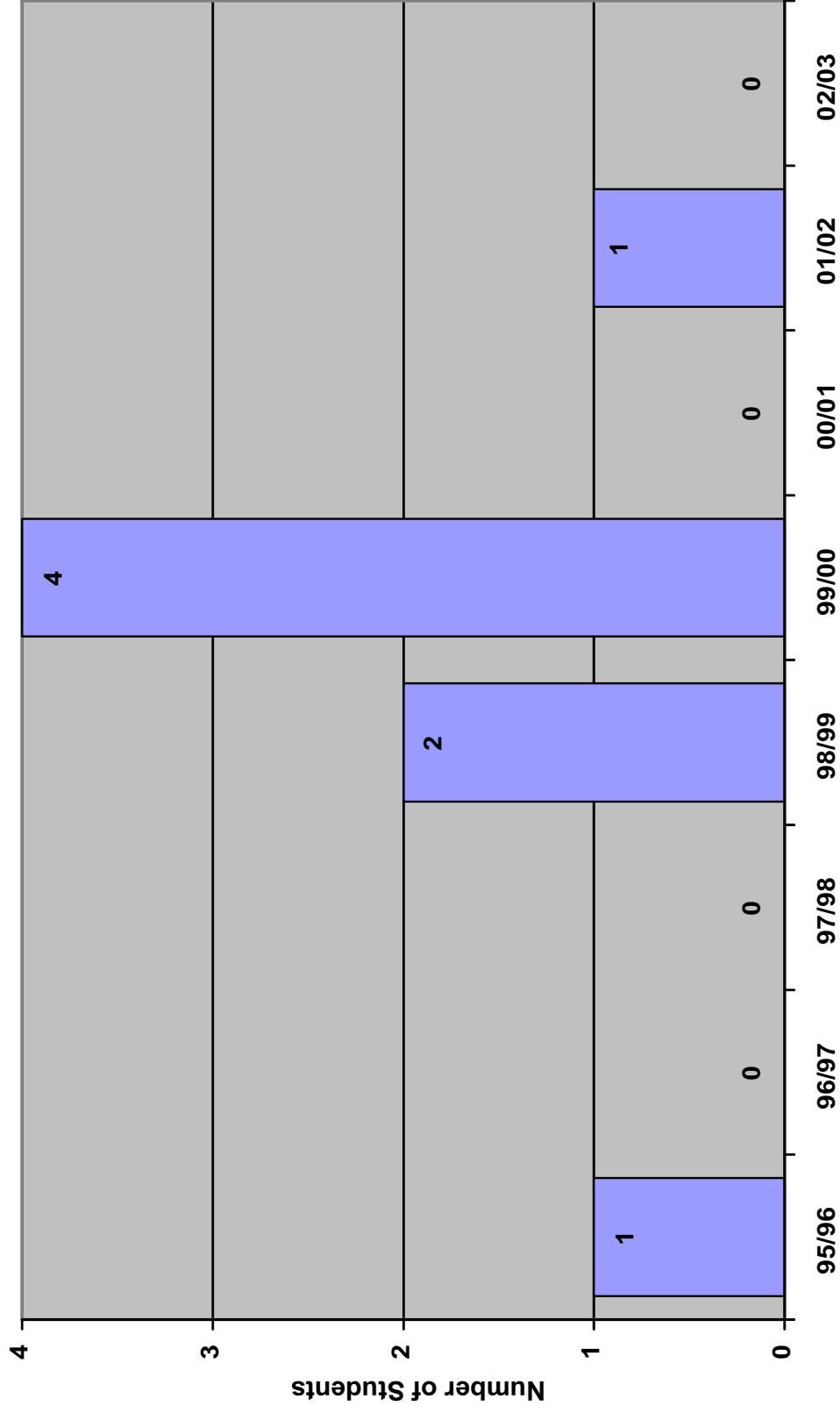
# Counseling National Exam Pass Rate 1994-2003



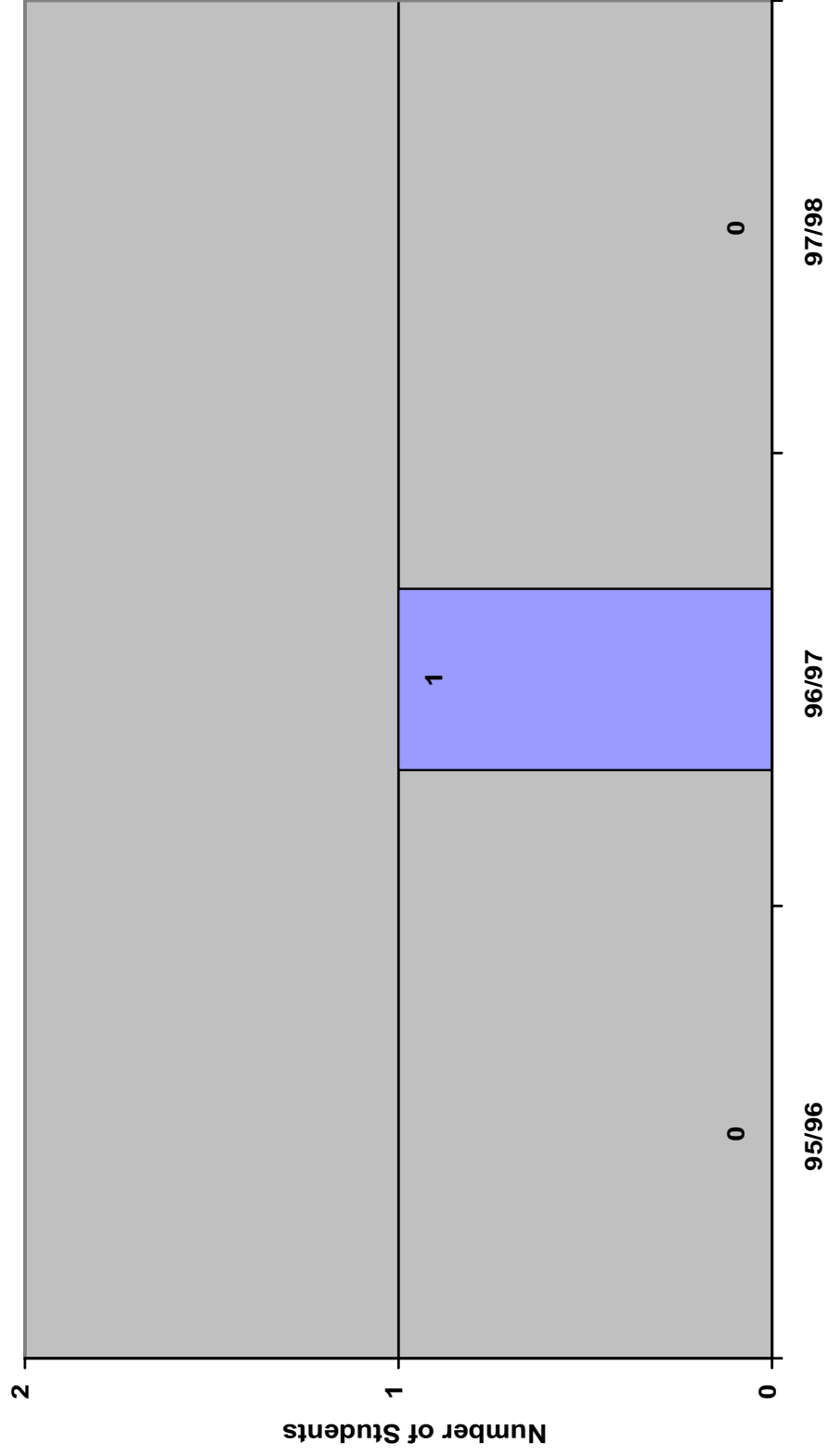
# Counseling Clinic Patient Numbers 2000-2003



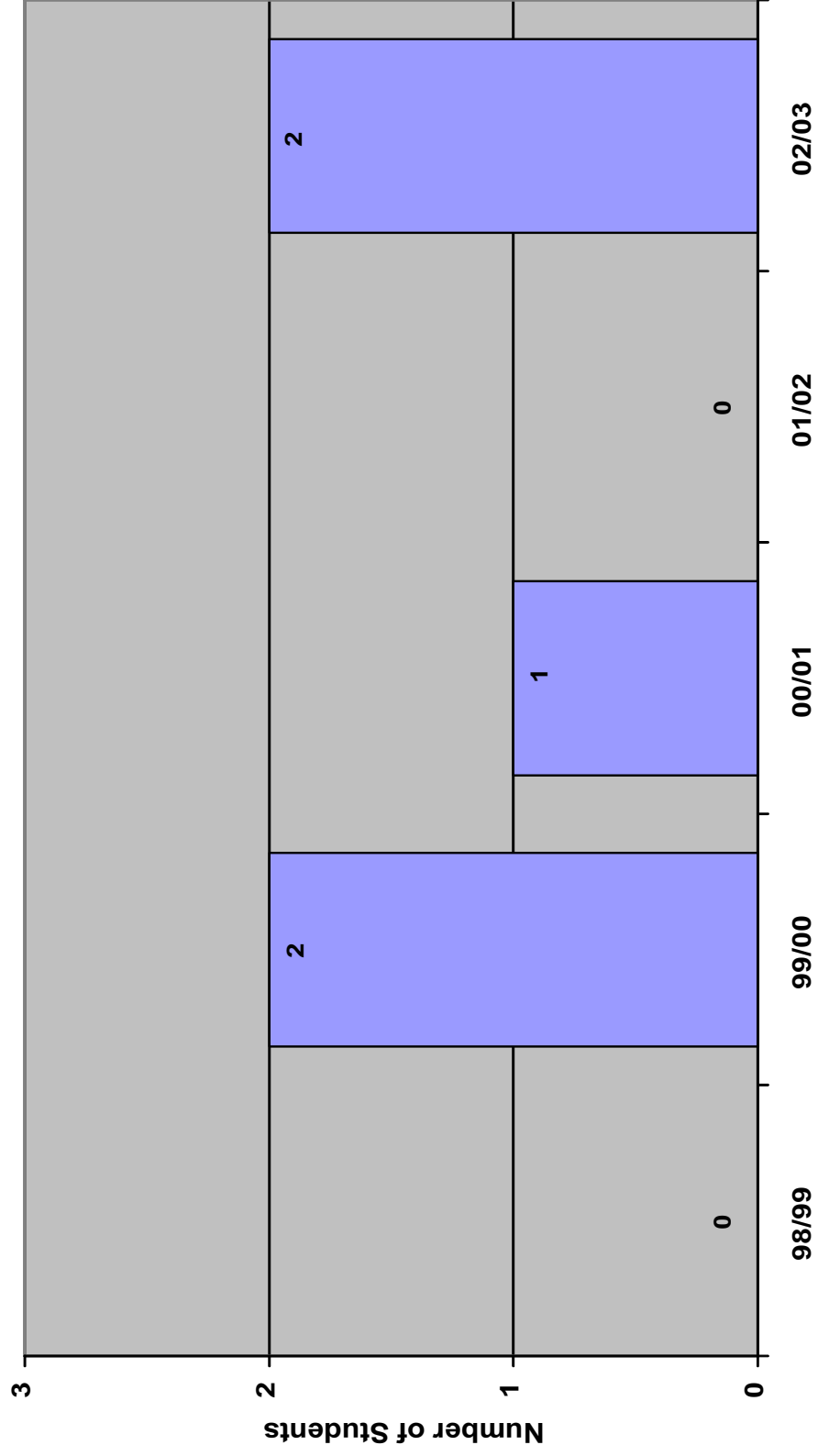

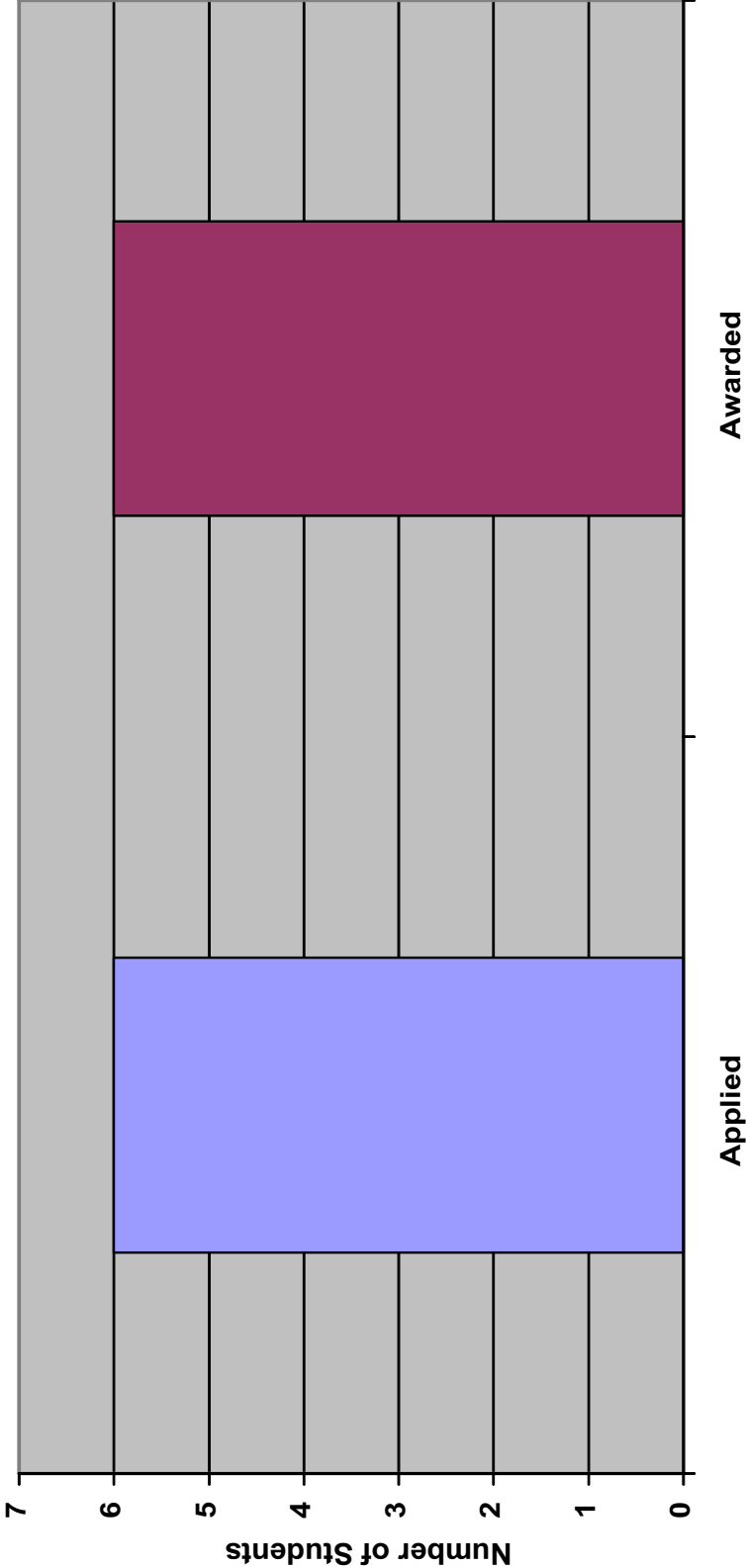
# Counseling-Ed.D. Ethnic Student Numbers 1995-1998



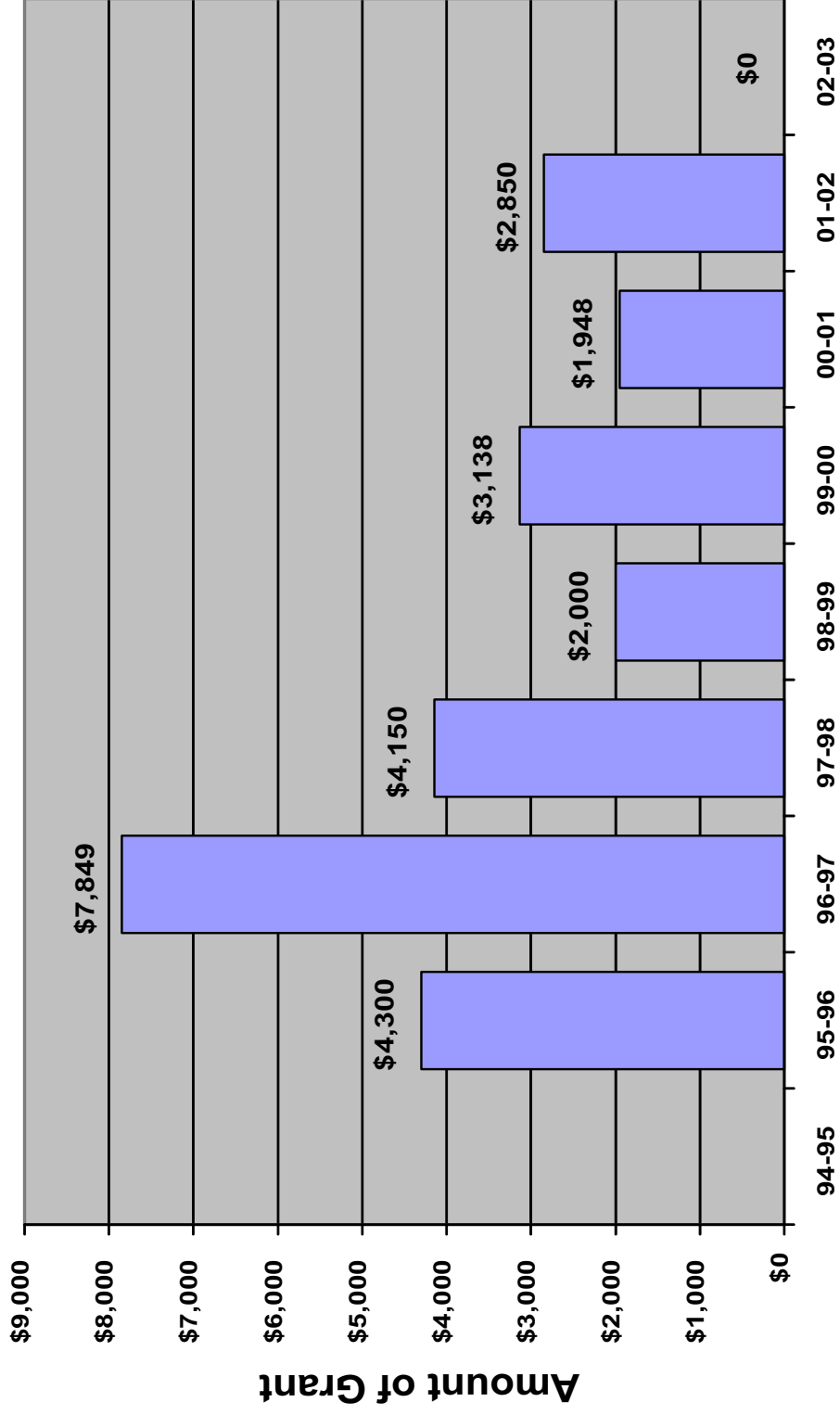

### Evaluation of Results

Assessment results for the 2002-2003 academic year were excellent. Following is a breakdown of the result of outcome measures.

#### National Board Exam

All students passed the written national board exam with an average score of 85.8%. Our students were above the national average in ten categories. The exceptions were: physiology-biochemistry-nutrition (.2 percentage points below the average); pathology (.9 percentage points below the average); pharmacology (.3 percentage points below the average). Overall student performance was below that of last year.

#### Licensing Exams

*Anesthesia:* ISU students received an average score of 86% on the written anesthesia exam. One hundred percent of our students were successful in passing the patient experience portion of the exam. That part of the exam is pass/fail only.

*Clinical:* All ISU students were successful in passing the clinical exam. The average ISU student score was 93%.

Both of these average scores are down slightly from the previous year. We are no longer able to receive information with regard to other test sites. Therefore, no comparison on licensing exams is available.

#### Alumni, Employer, and Patient Surveys

Surveys were sent to students one year out (10 surveys returned-40%) and to students three years out (6 returned-25%). Responses indicated that graduates believed the quality of their education was much better than average. Employers of students one year out (6) were extremely positive about the new graduates they employ. Employers of graduates three years out (3) were also positive about our graduates. One hundred ninety-five patient surveys were completed. There was overwhelmingly strong agreement that the quality of care, services provided, students, and faculty were very good. The major area of disagreement came in regard to patient parking availability.

### Student Self-assessment

The incorporation of self-assessment activities has added depth to the evaluation system used. Almost all evaluation forms now have space for students to complete in this area. Discussion with students indicates that although they do not particularly enjoy this phase of evaluation, they believe that their ability to self-assess adds strength to their critical thinking abilities as well as their skill development.

### Community Service

Due to a change in facility rules and the inability to find a suitable replacement location, the Children's Dental Health Fair was not held this year. However, students in the community health and leadership classes provided services and education to approximately 2075 children and adults during the year. The on-campus clinic served approximately 1,060 patients in the preventive clinic. Of that number, about 160 were children. A total of 306 pit and fissure sealants were placed and 253 sets of full series radiographs were taken. In the expanded functions clinic, a total of 980 amalgam filling surfaces were placed and 410 composite restoration surfaces were placed. When compared to previous years the total number of preventive patients was down, the number of children and restorative surfaces completed were both up.

### Graduation Rates

The class of 2003 graduated 26 students for a rate of 87%. Two junior students were dismissed at the end of the year due to receiving failing grades in a clinical course. One student chose to return and repeat her junior year. Two senior students were unable to complete the required competency assessments by the end of the spring semester and are currently completing the curriculum during the fall semester. Students are required to maintain a C average in all classes in order to progress through the curriculum.

### Placement Rates

One student has been unable to find employment.

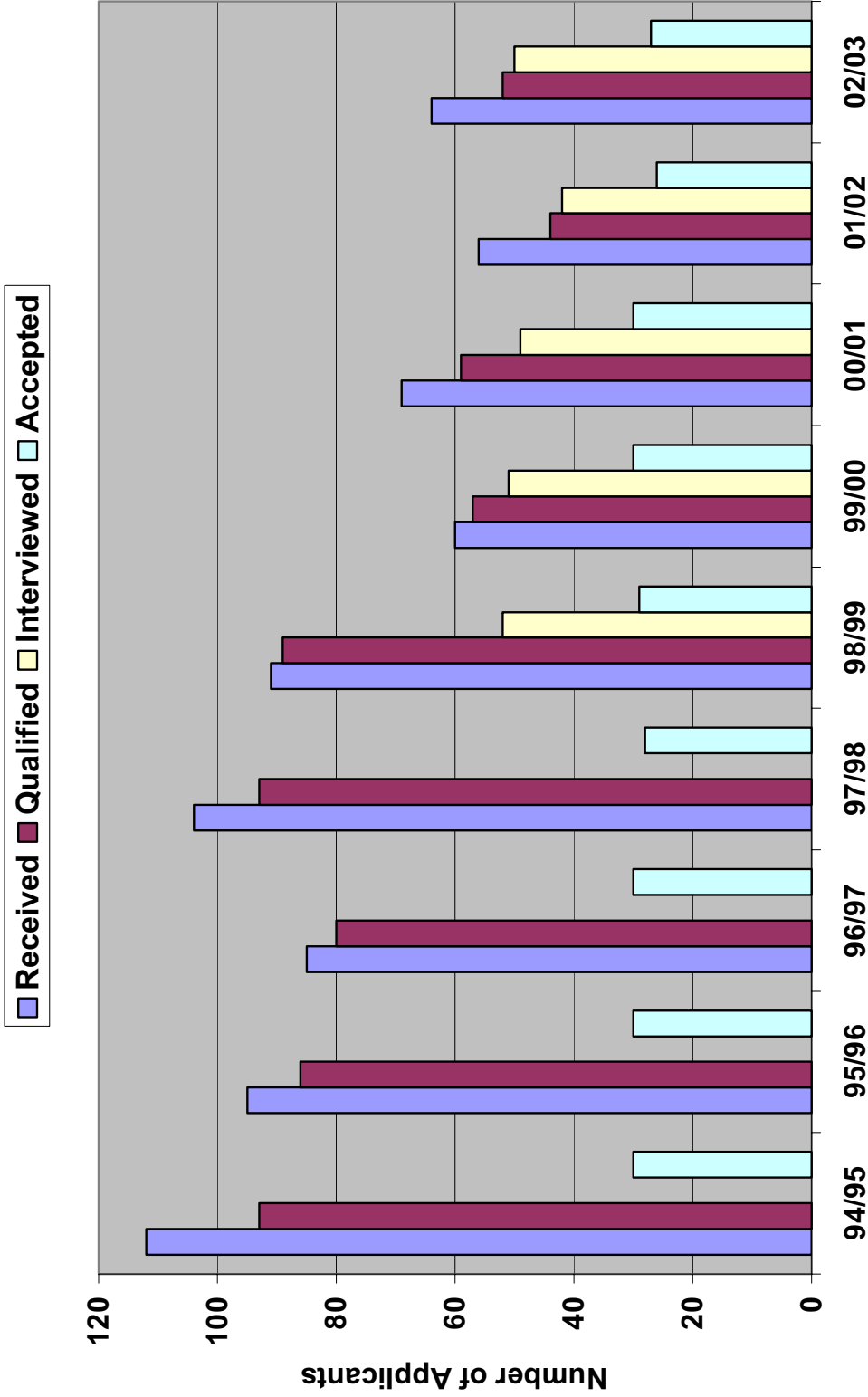
### **Use of Results**

Graduates of our program remain strong and as indicated by the employer survey results, are very employable, having excellent skills. However, addressing the clinical failure rate is a priority. All dismissals were due to failure to reach a clinically acceptable level at the progression point. A testing tool to measure manual dexterity has been added to the admissions process. Statistical correlations will be completed to assess its value in predicting clinical success. Our applicant pool increased significantly over the past year. We believe that is a result of partially achieving our goals from last year's assessment/annual report.

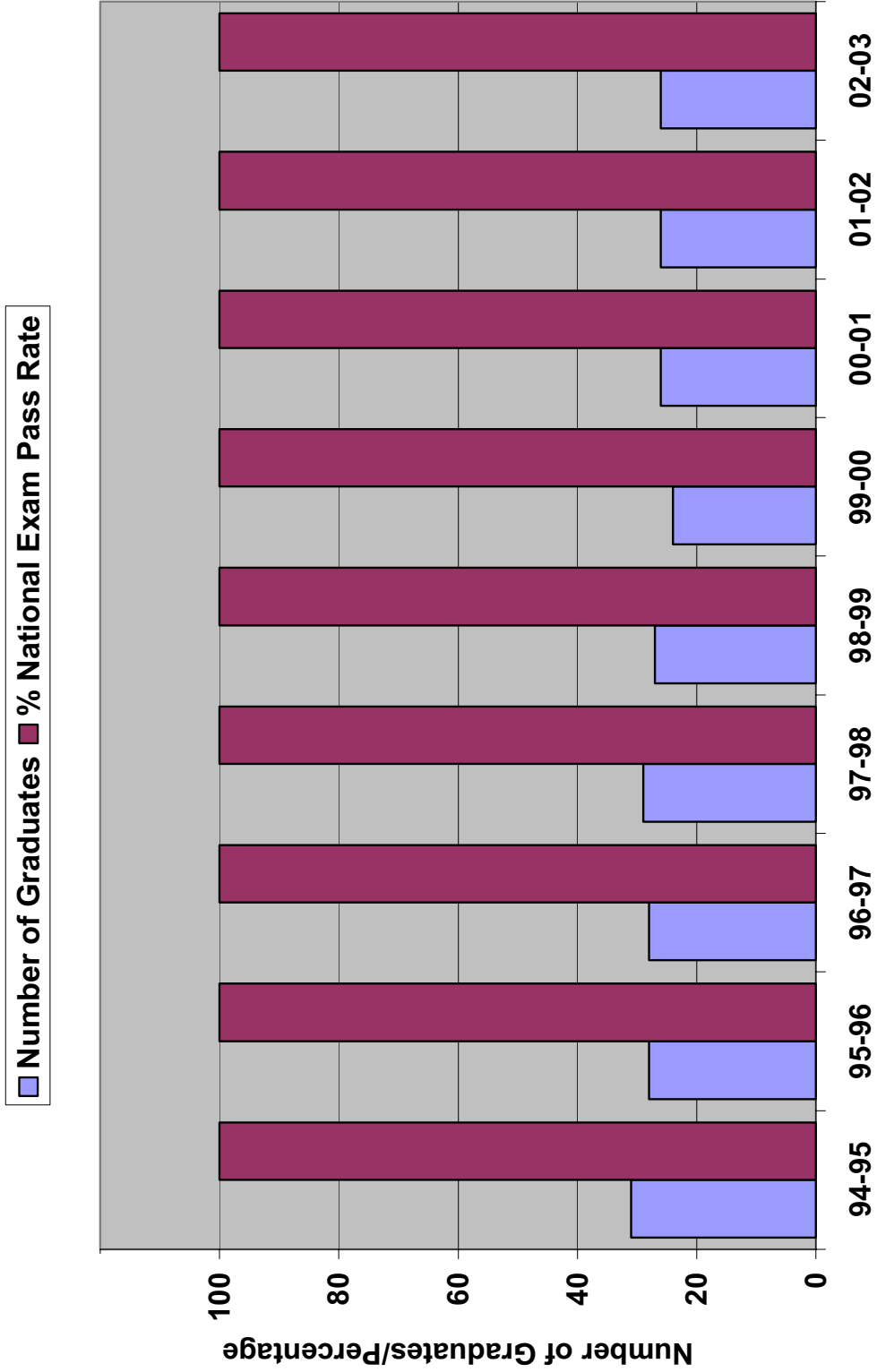
## **Evaluation and Revision of the Assessment Plan**

Based on results of this year's activities and evaluation, the assessment plan is unchanged. However, two additional tools have been added to the assessment matrix. In addition to the survey results currently used, we have added the Patient Survey, which is conducted on a volunteer basis at the end of clinical treatment. Also, because we believe student self-assessment to be crucial to the development of critical thinking and continued learning, self-assessment has been added to the matrix.

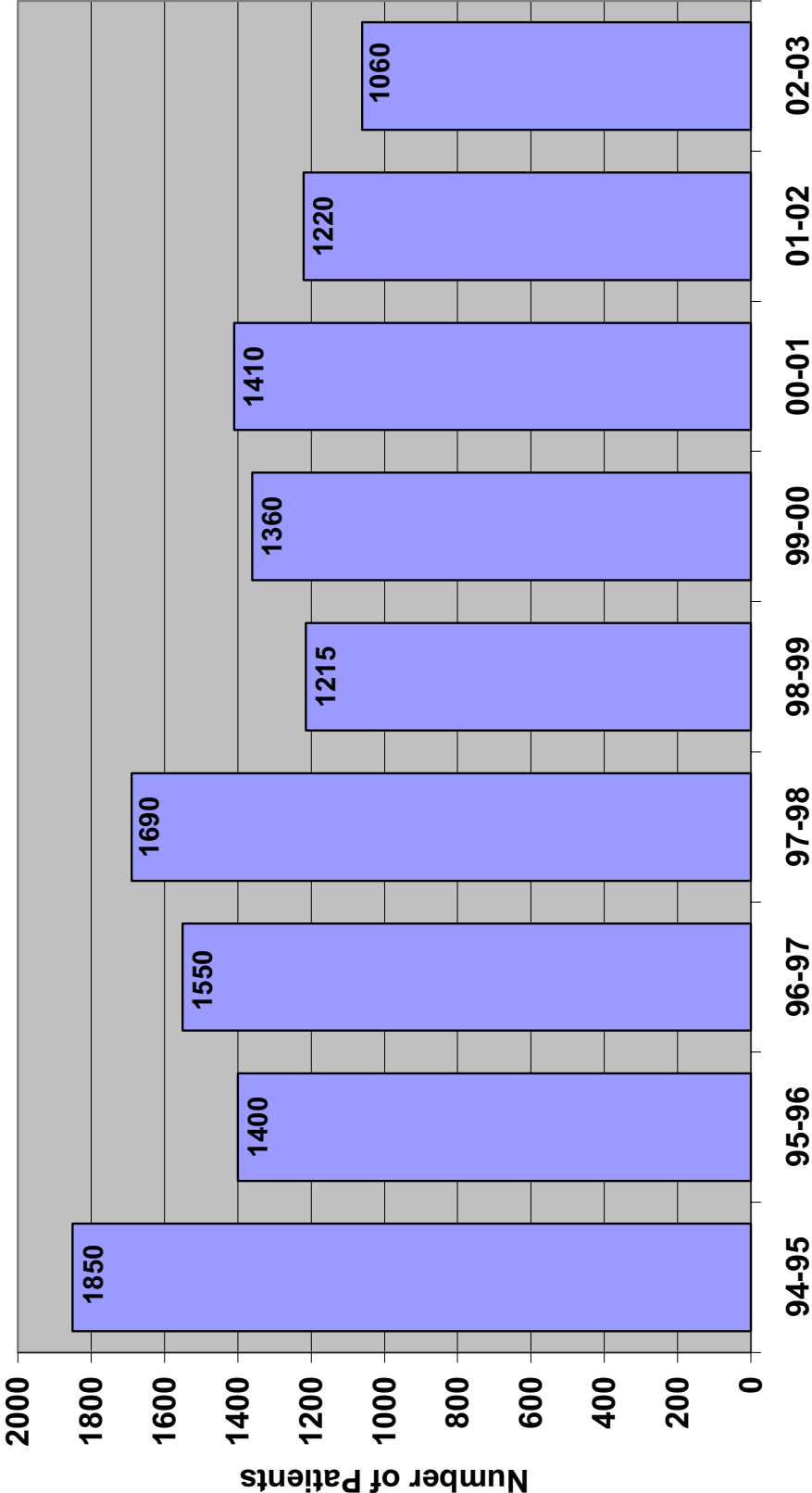
### Dental Hygiene Applicants 1994-2003



### Dental Hygiene National Exam Pass Rate 1994-2004

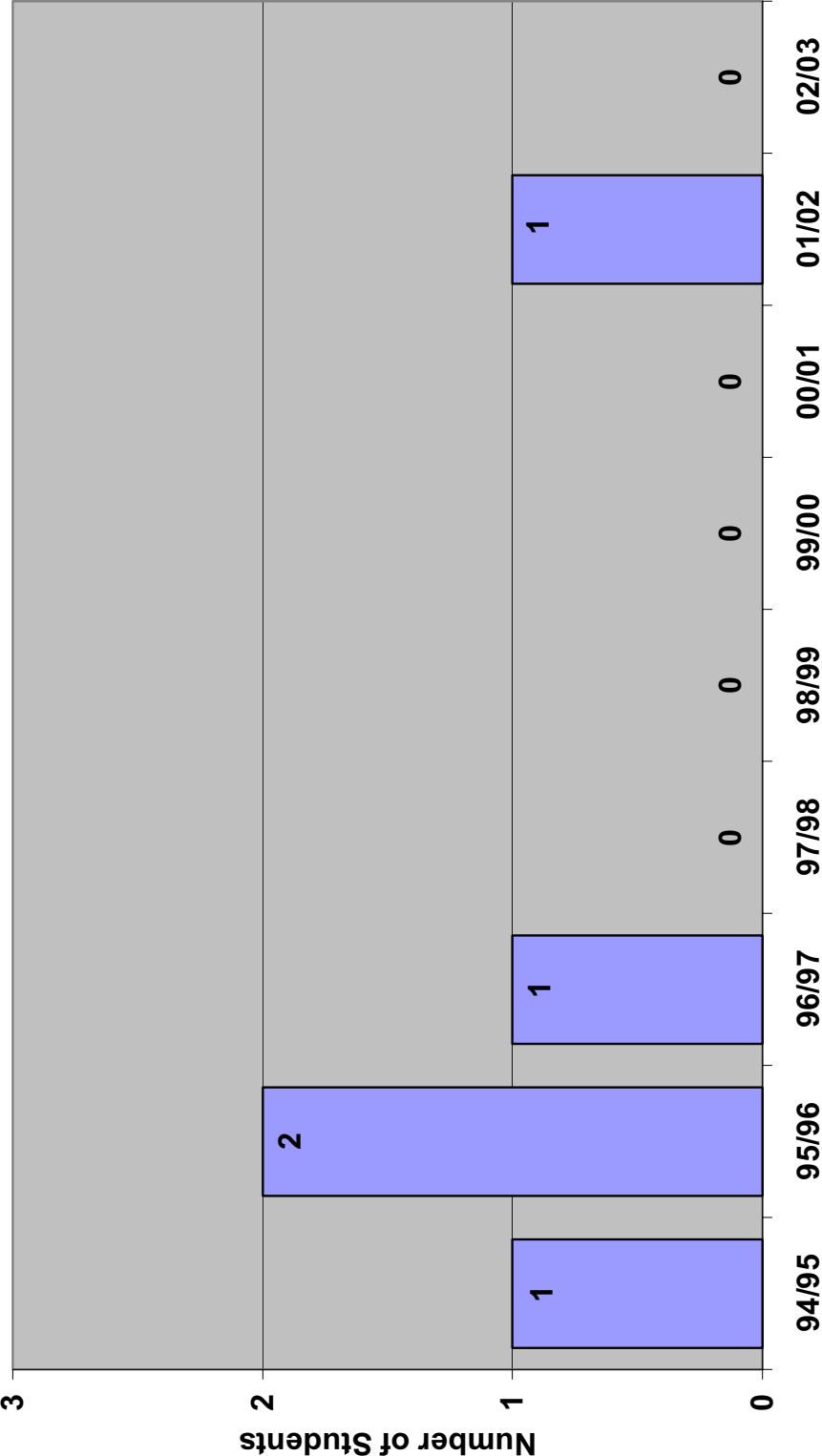


### Dental Hygiene Clinic Patient Numbers 1994-2003



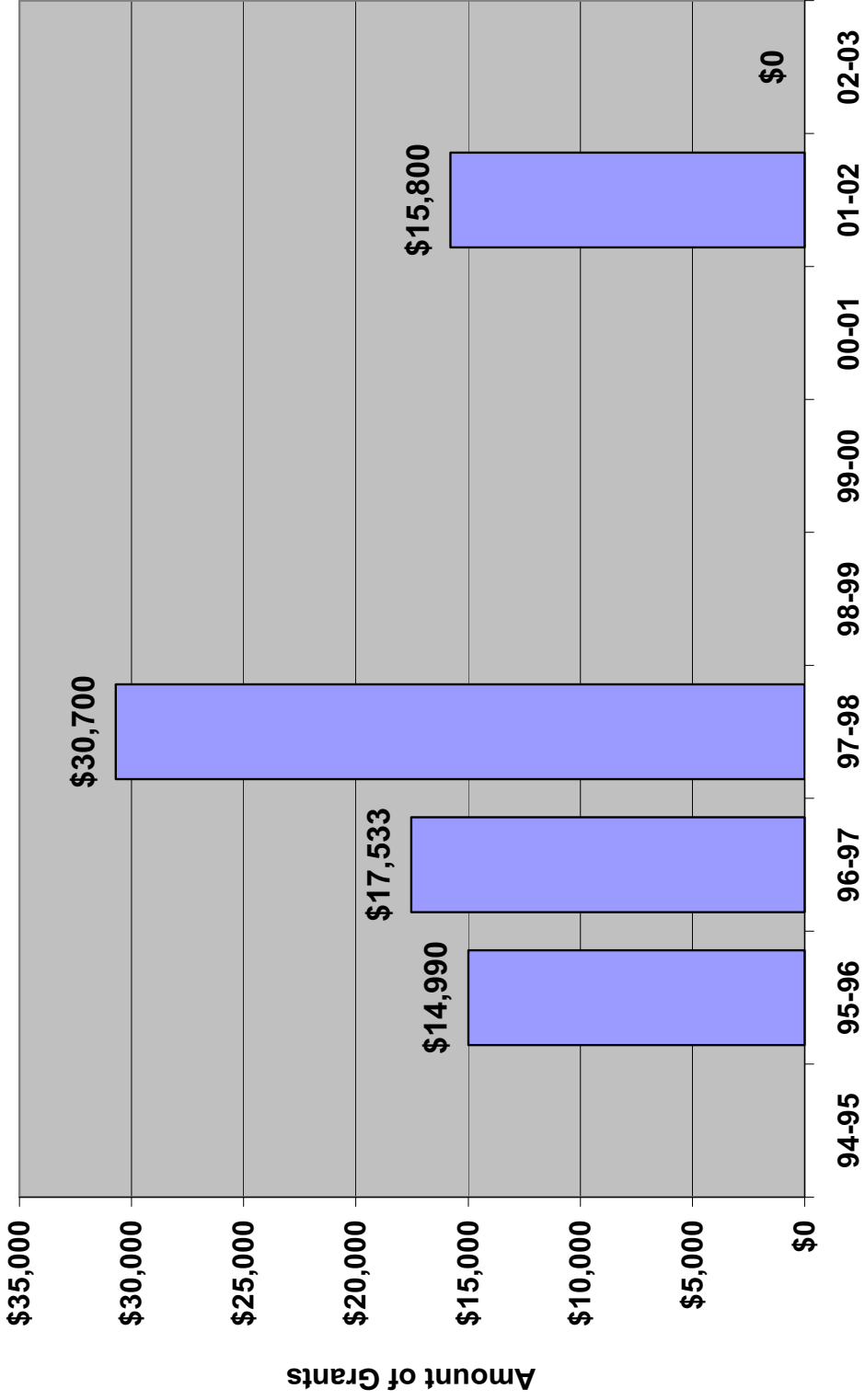

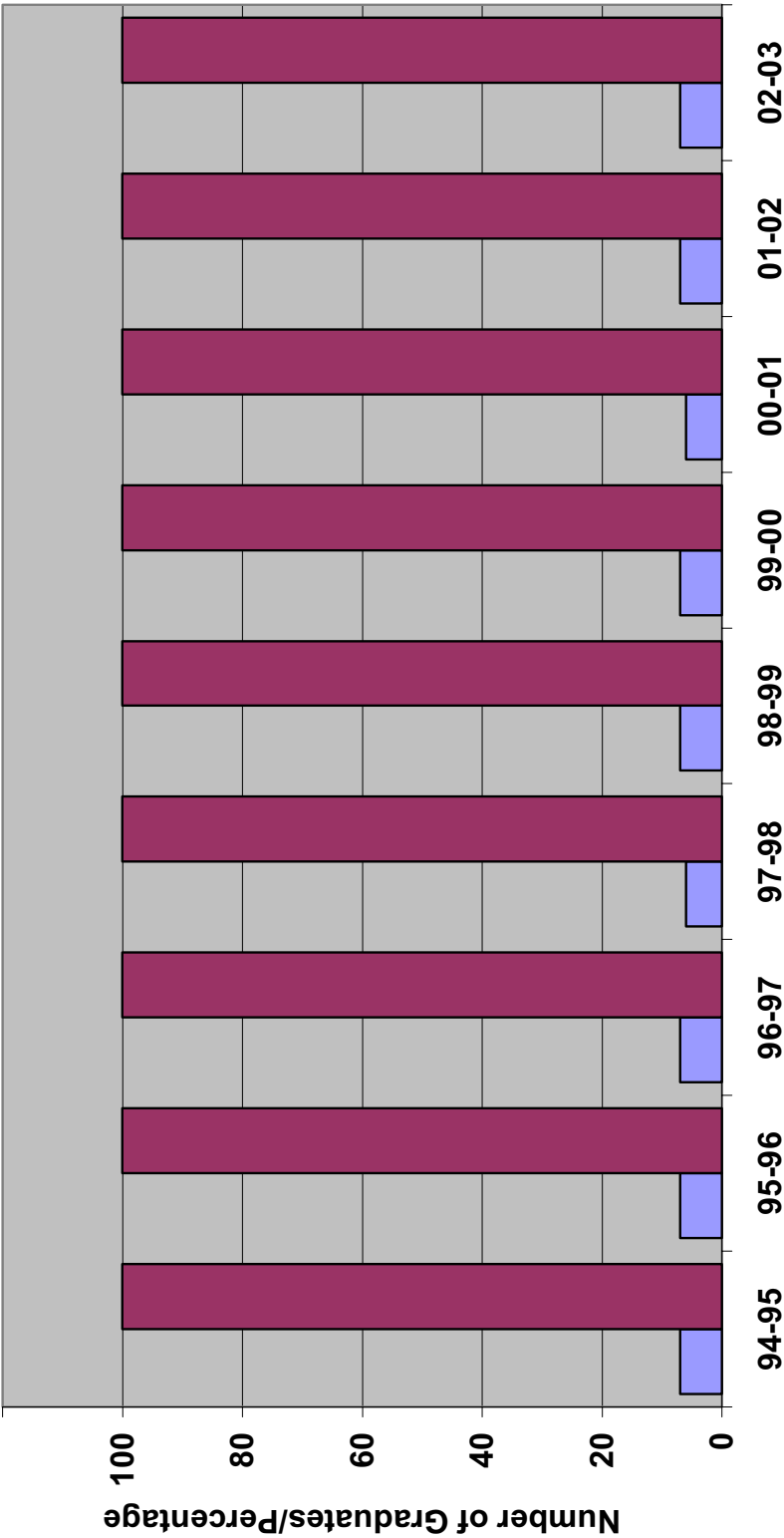


### Dental Sciences-IGD Applicants 2000-2003



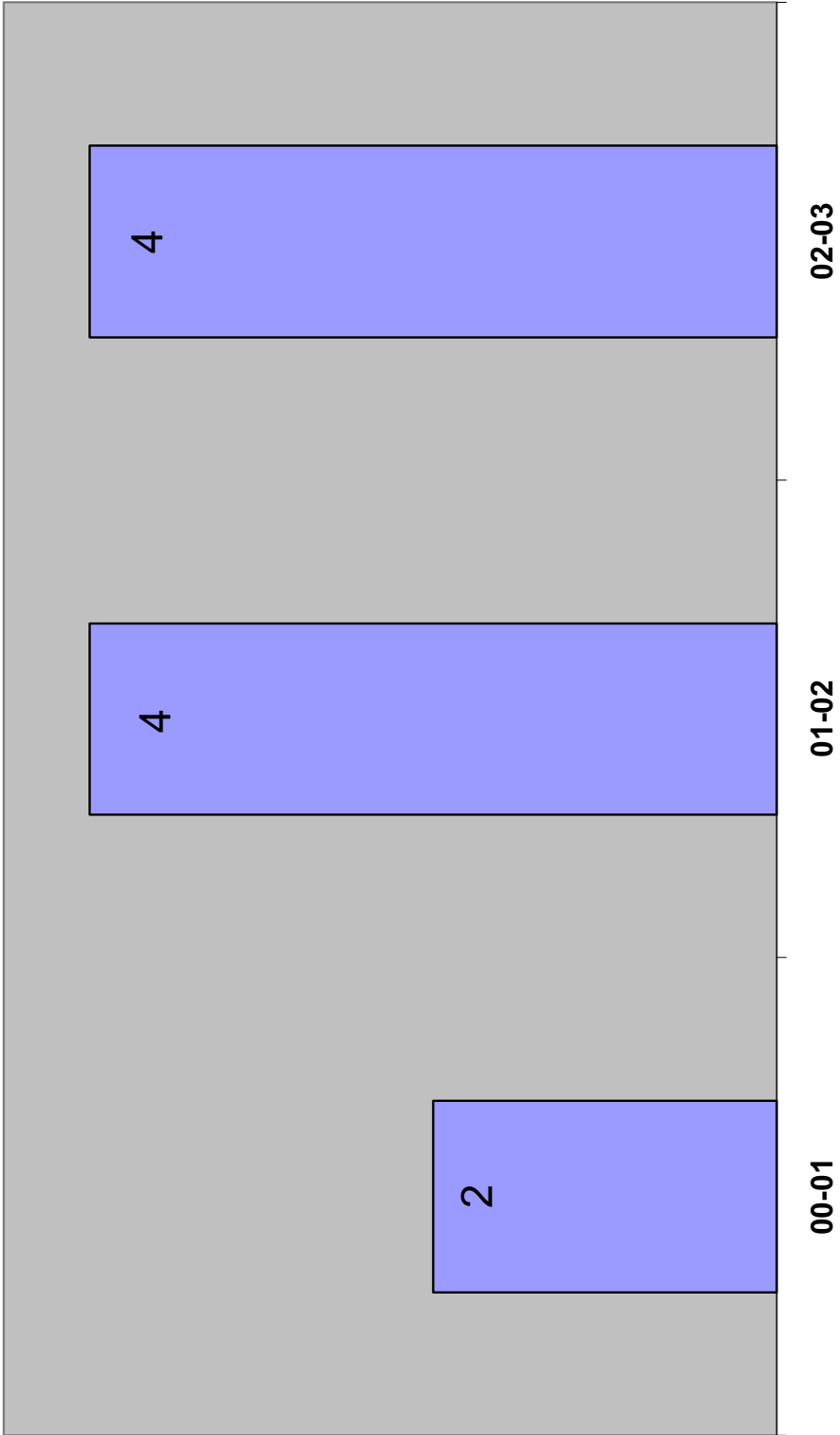
### Dental Sciences IDEP National Exam Pass Rate 1994-2003

Number of Graduates (light blue)    % National Exam Pass Rate (maroon)



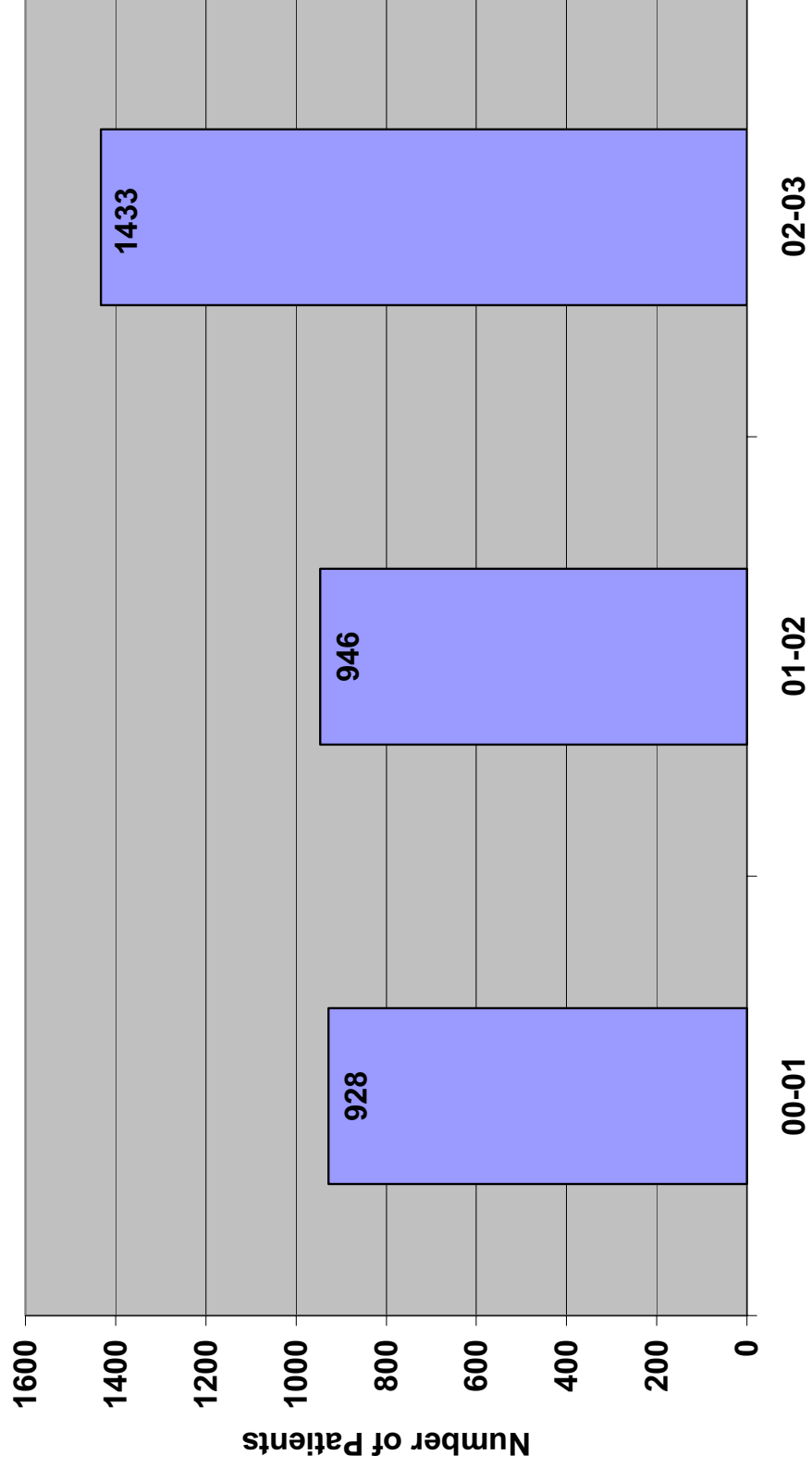

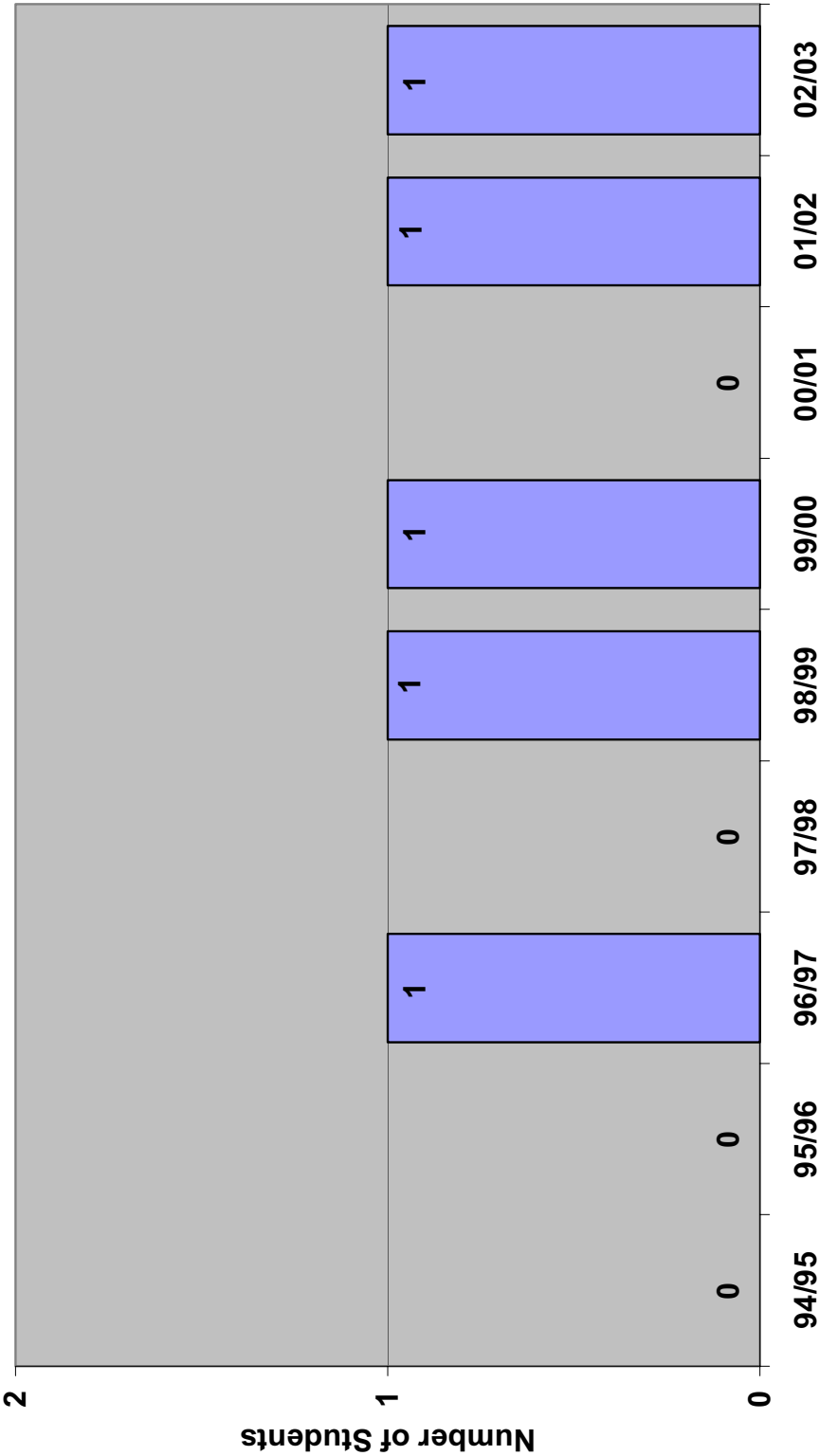

## Dentistry Clinic Number of Patients 2000-2003



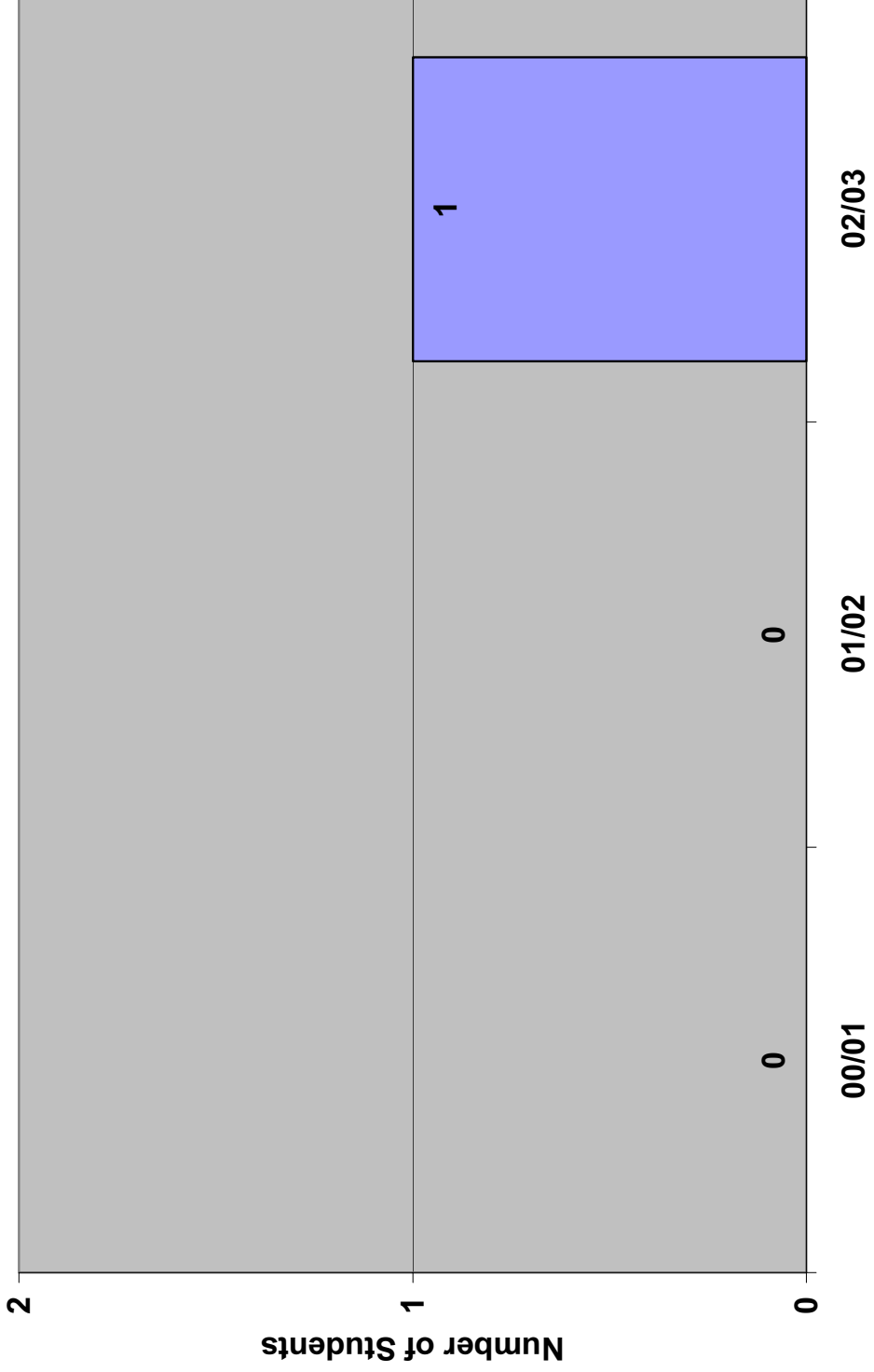

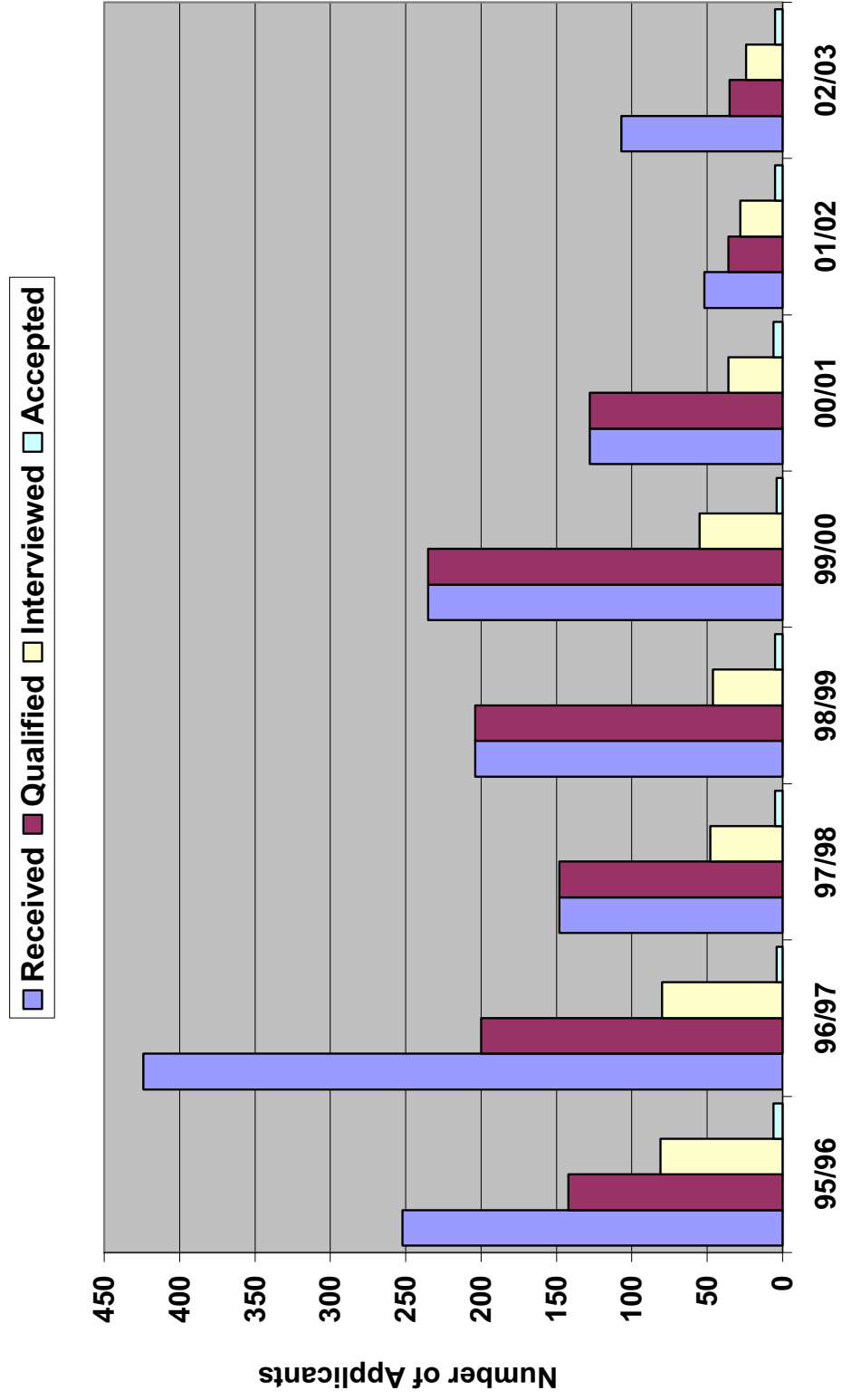

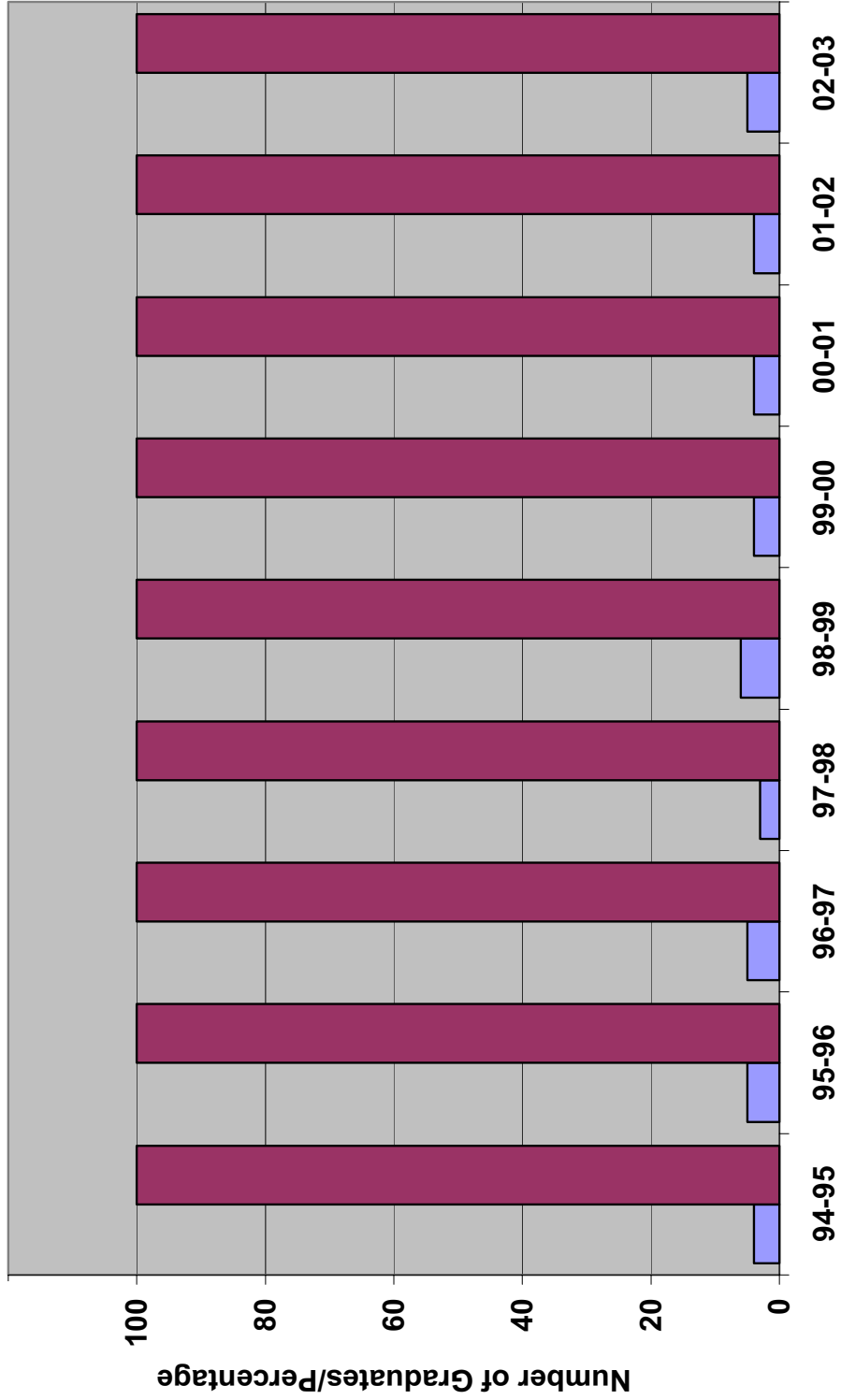
## Family Medicine Applicants 1995-2003

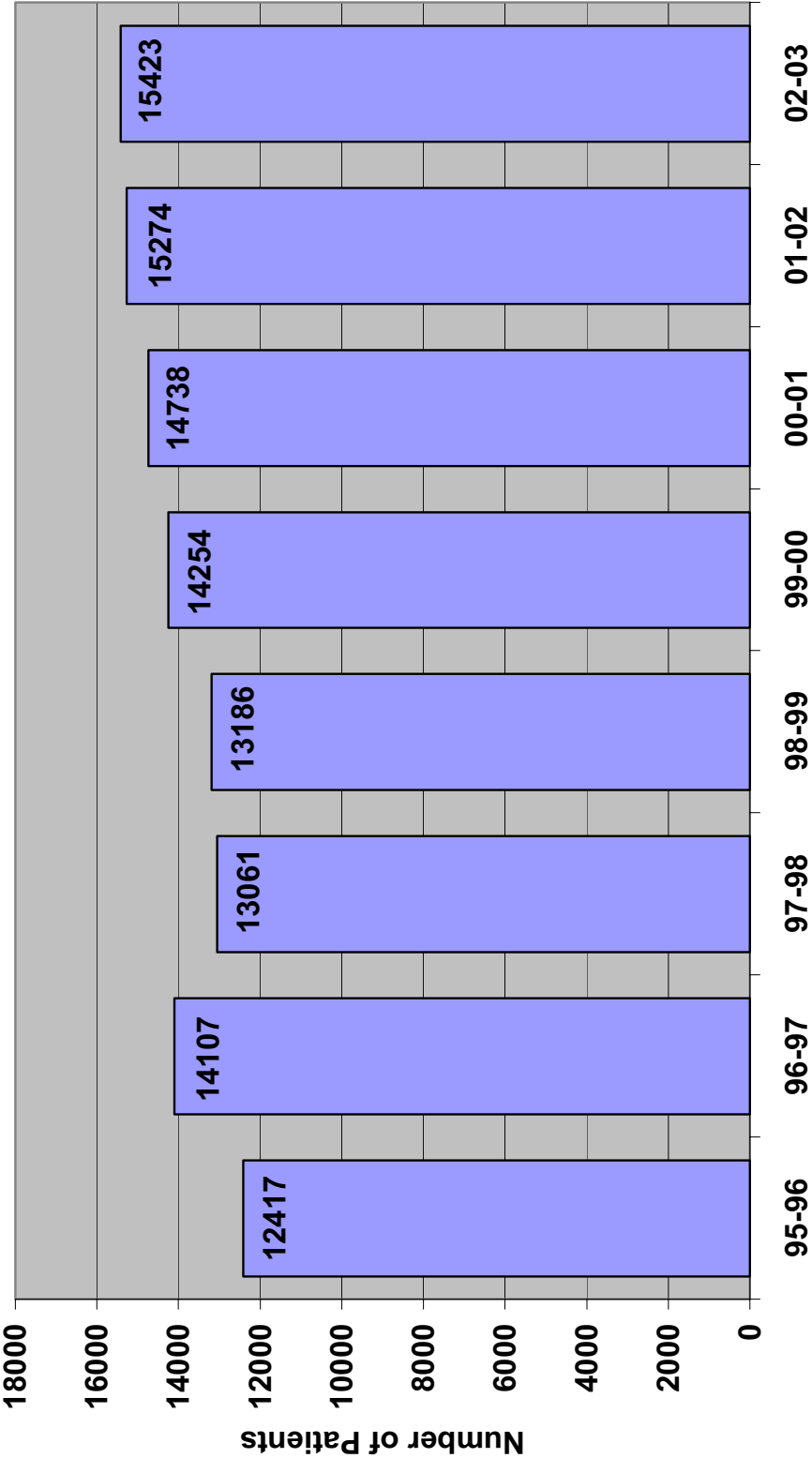
Family Medicine National Exam Pass Rate 1994-2003

■ Number of Graduates ■ % National Exam Pass Rate



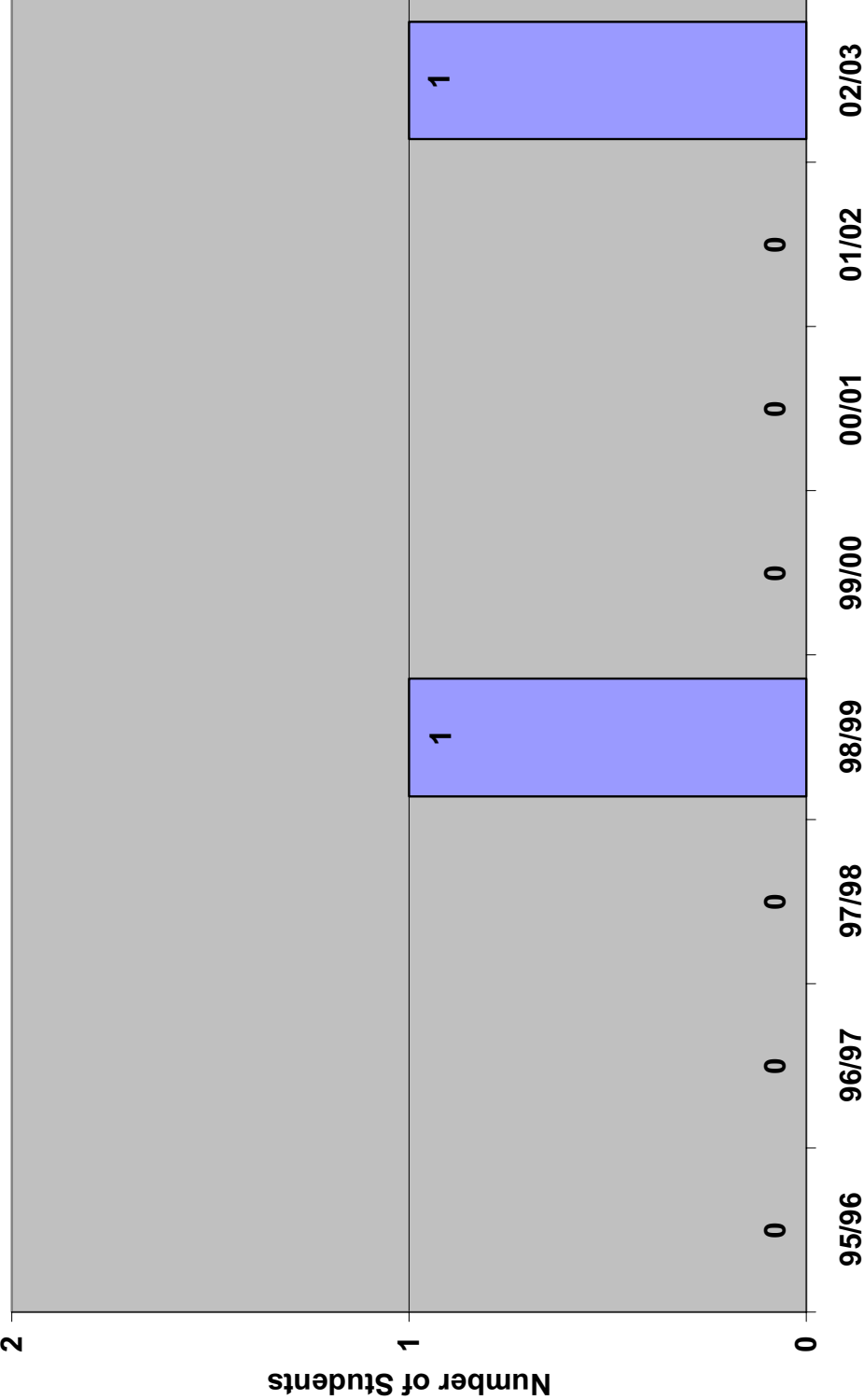

1995-2003**

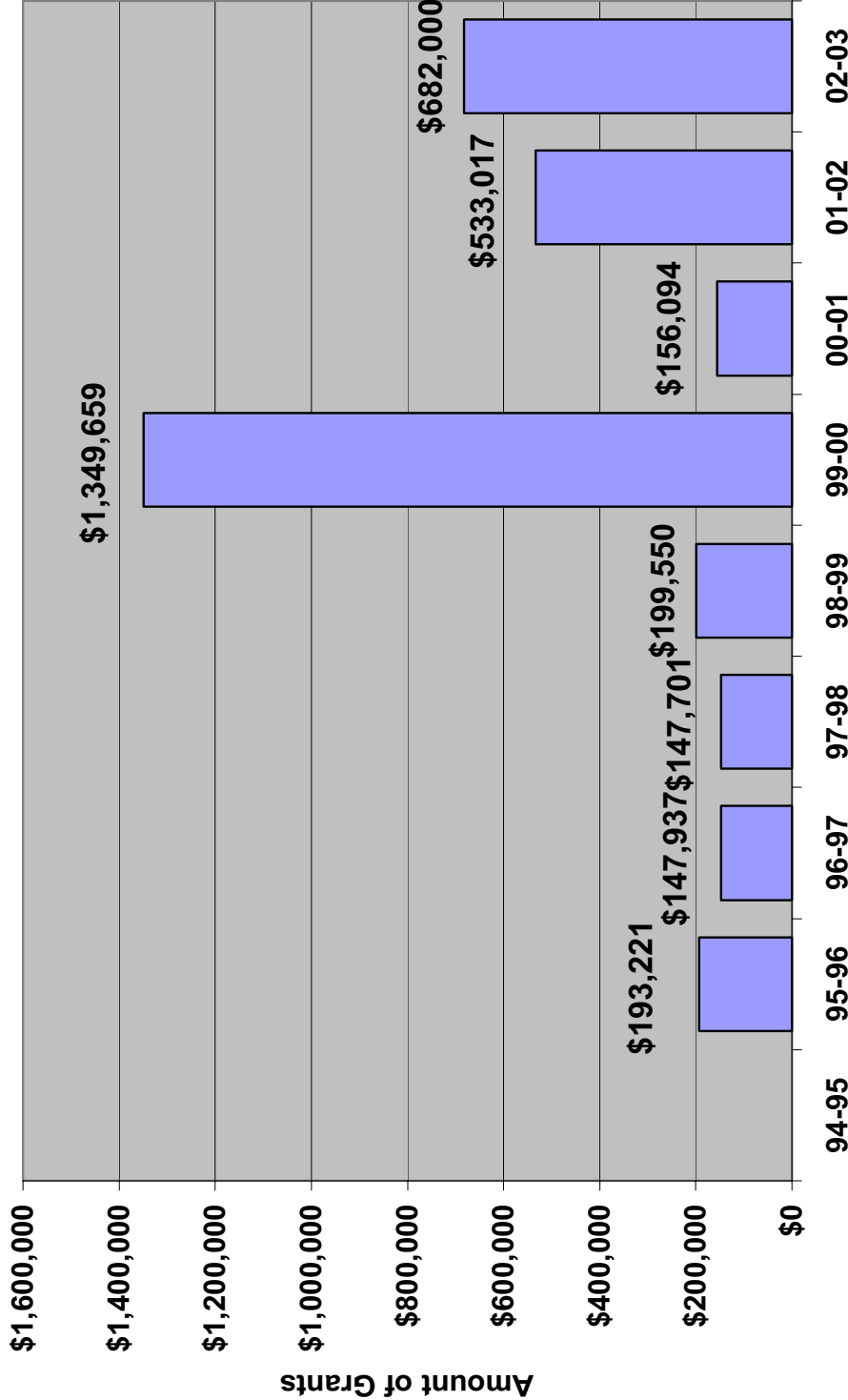

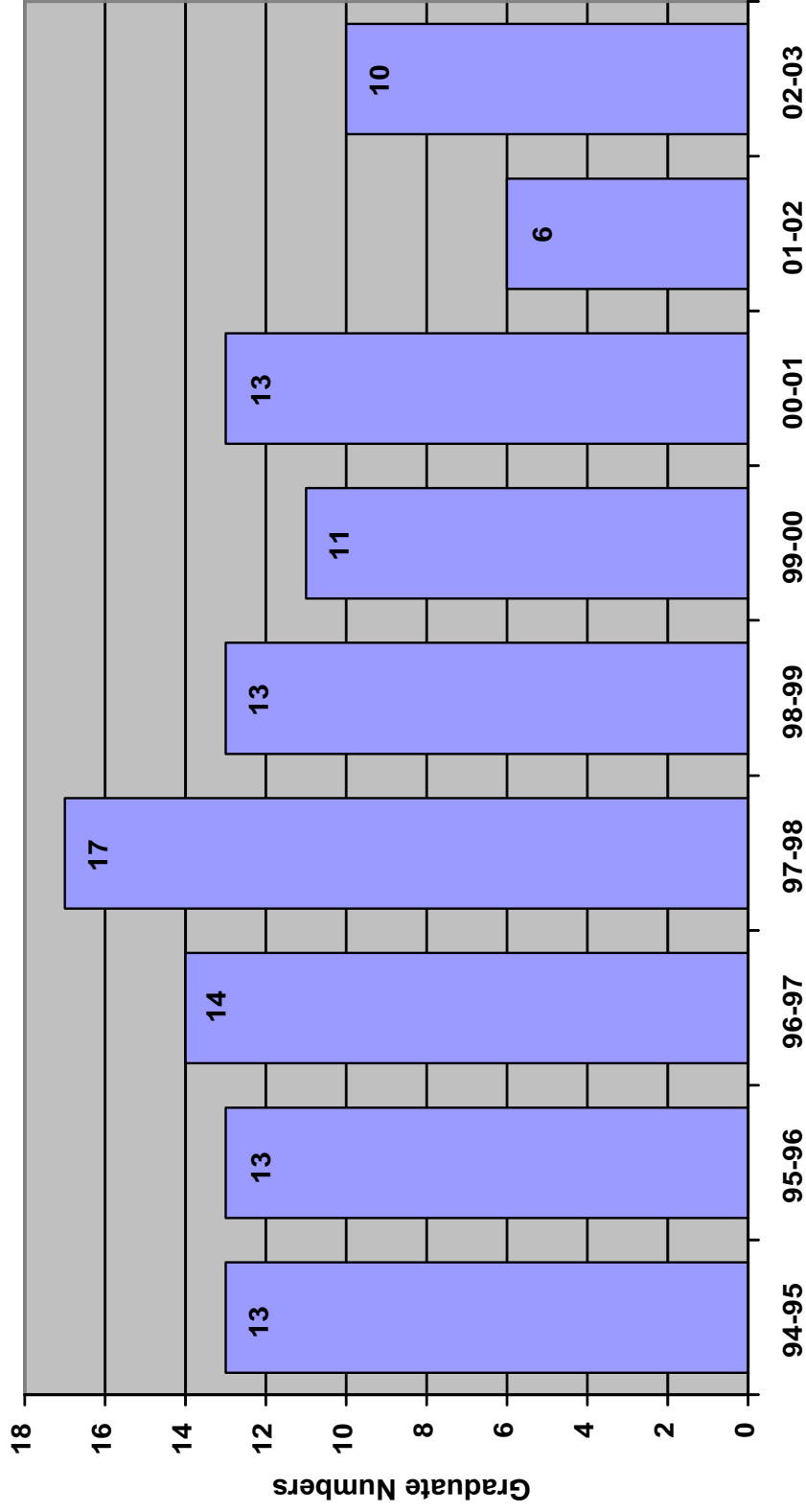




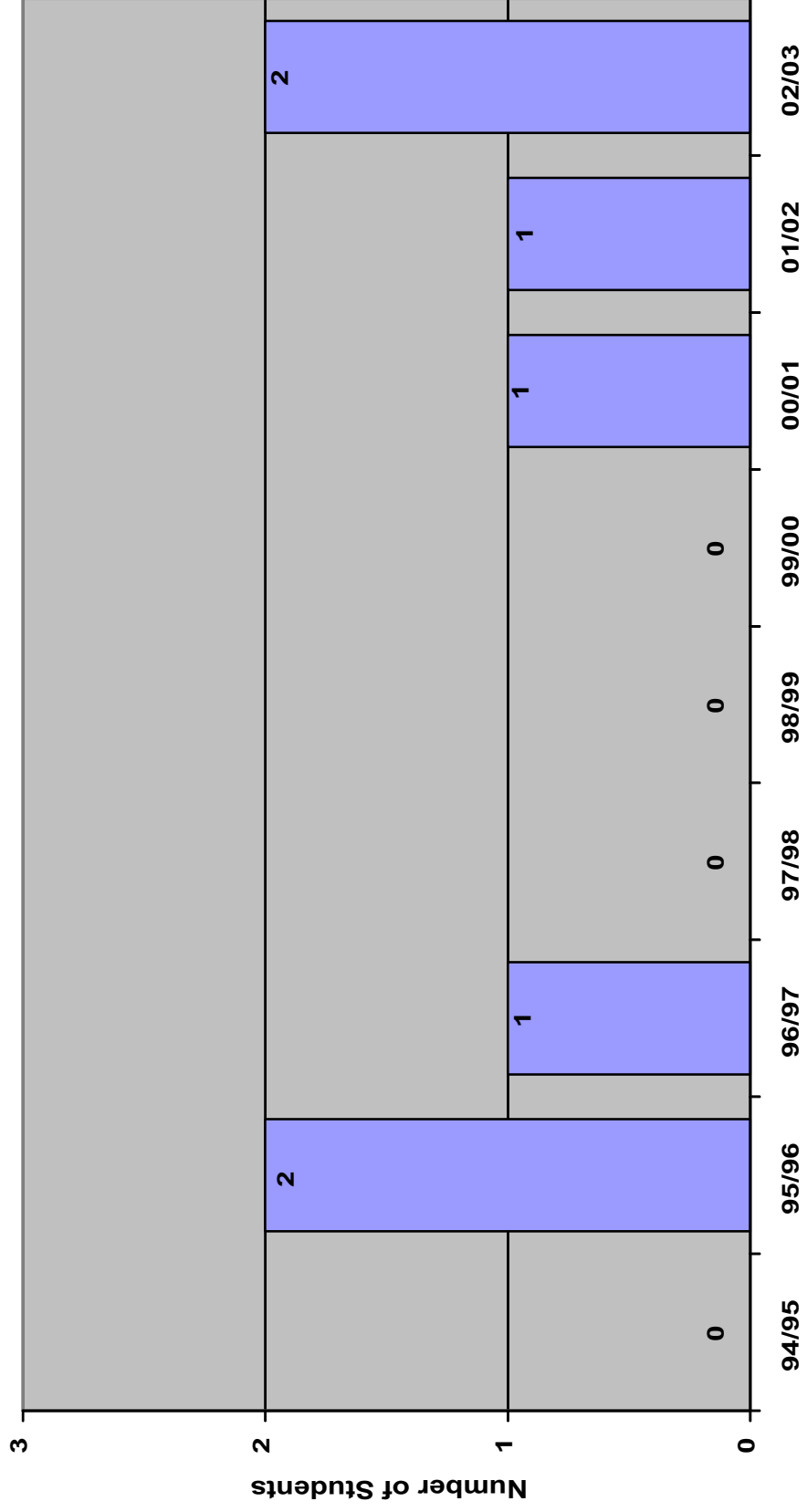
## Health Care Administration Applicants 1995-2003



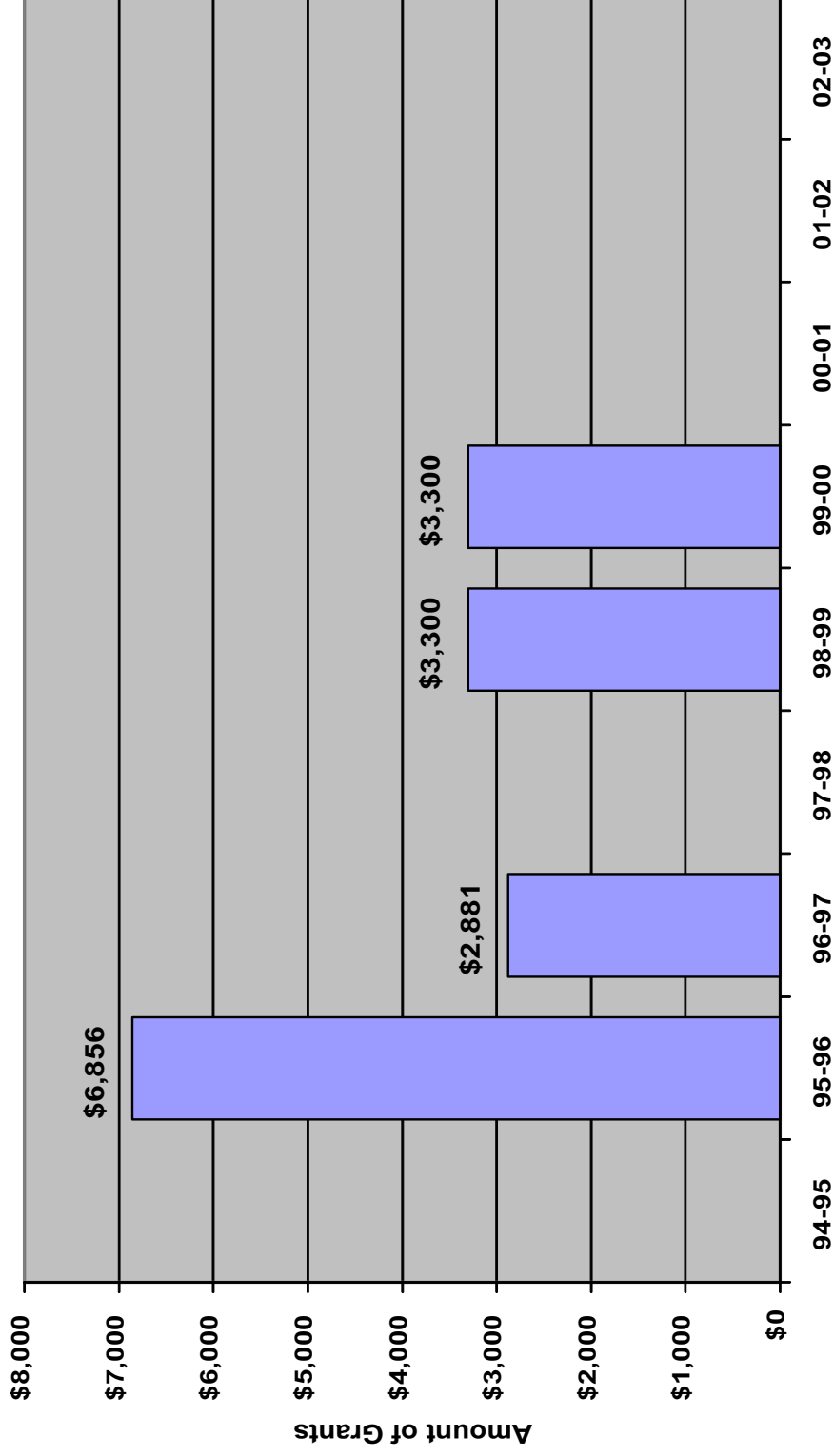
# Health Care Administration Number of Graduates 1994-2003

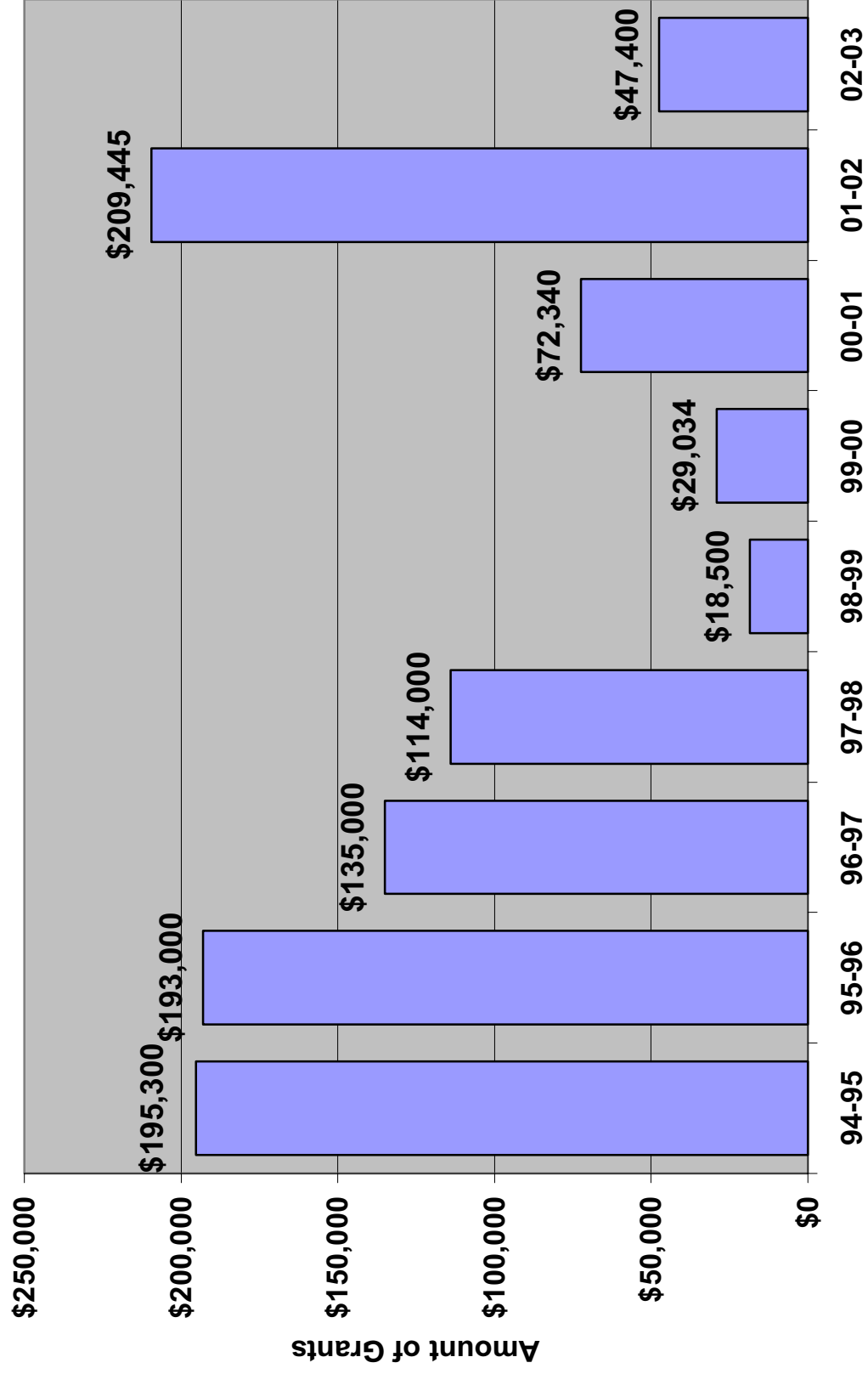

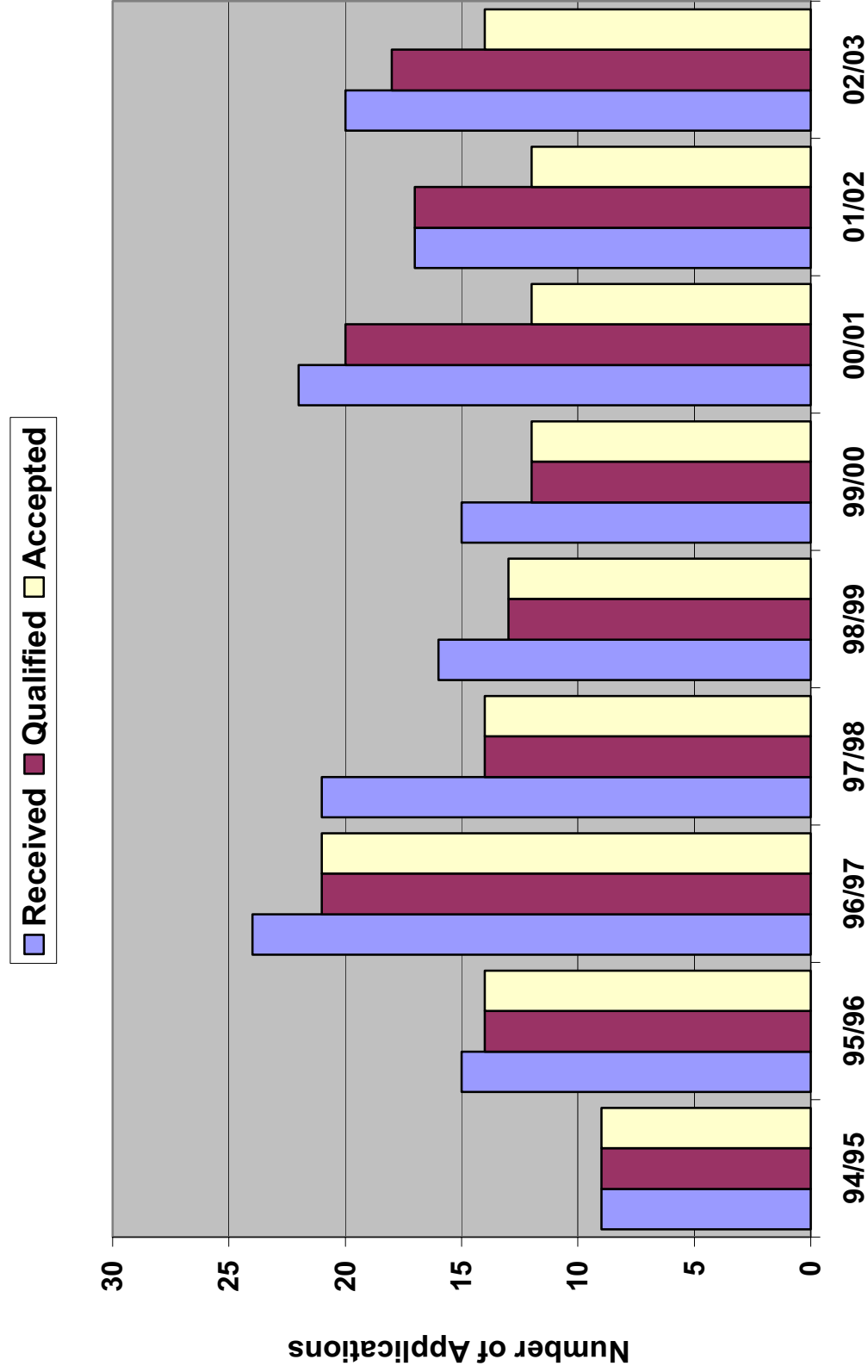

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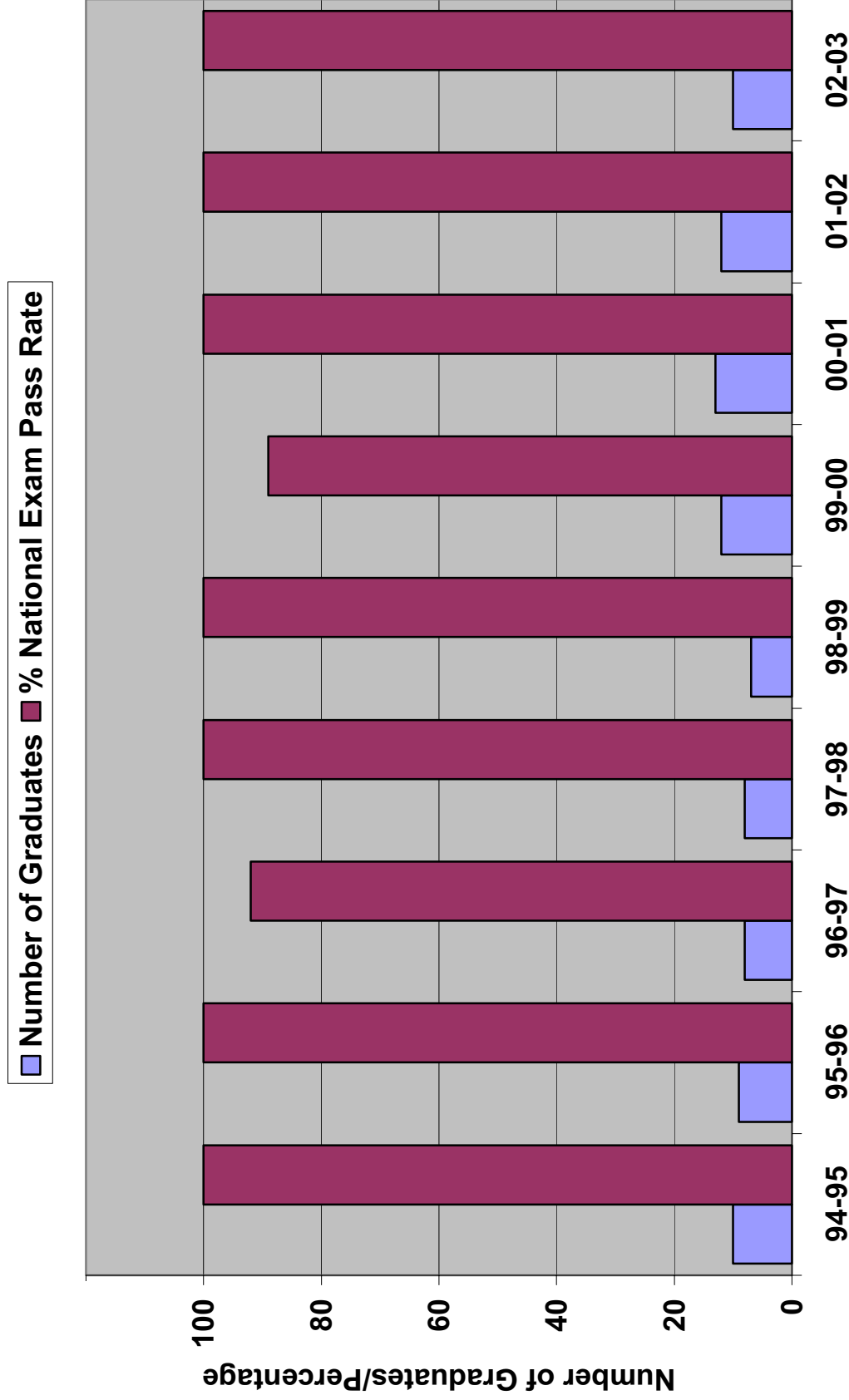
# Health & Nutrition Sciences-Grant Statistics 1994-2003



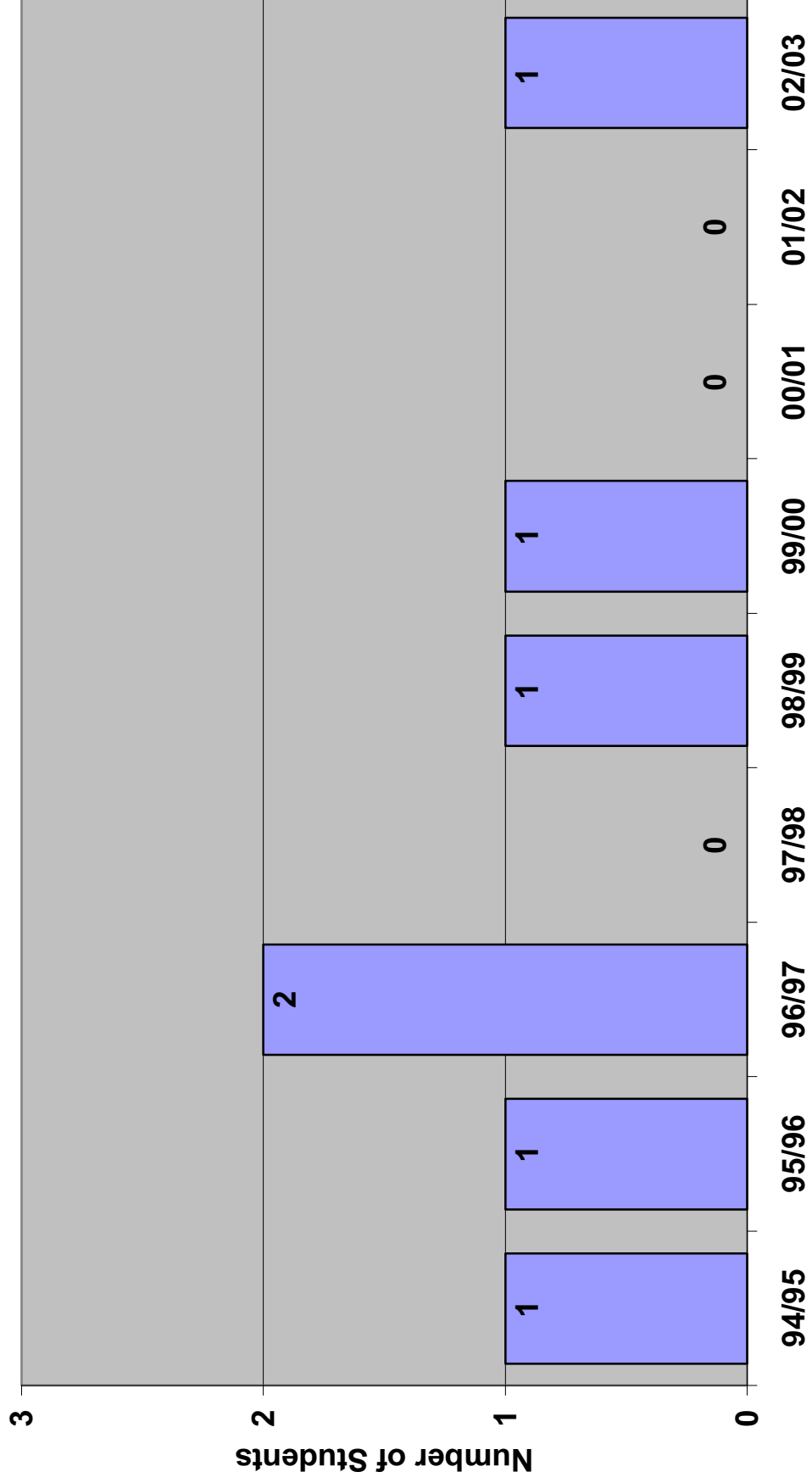
# Dietetics-BA/BS Applicants 1994-2003



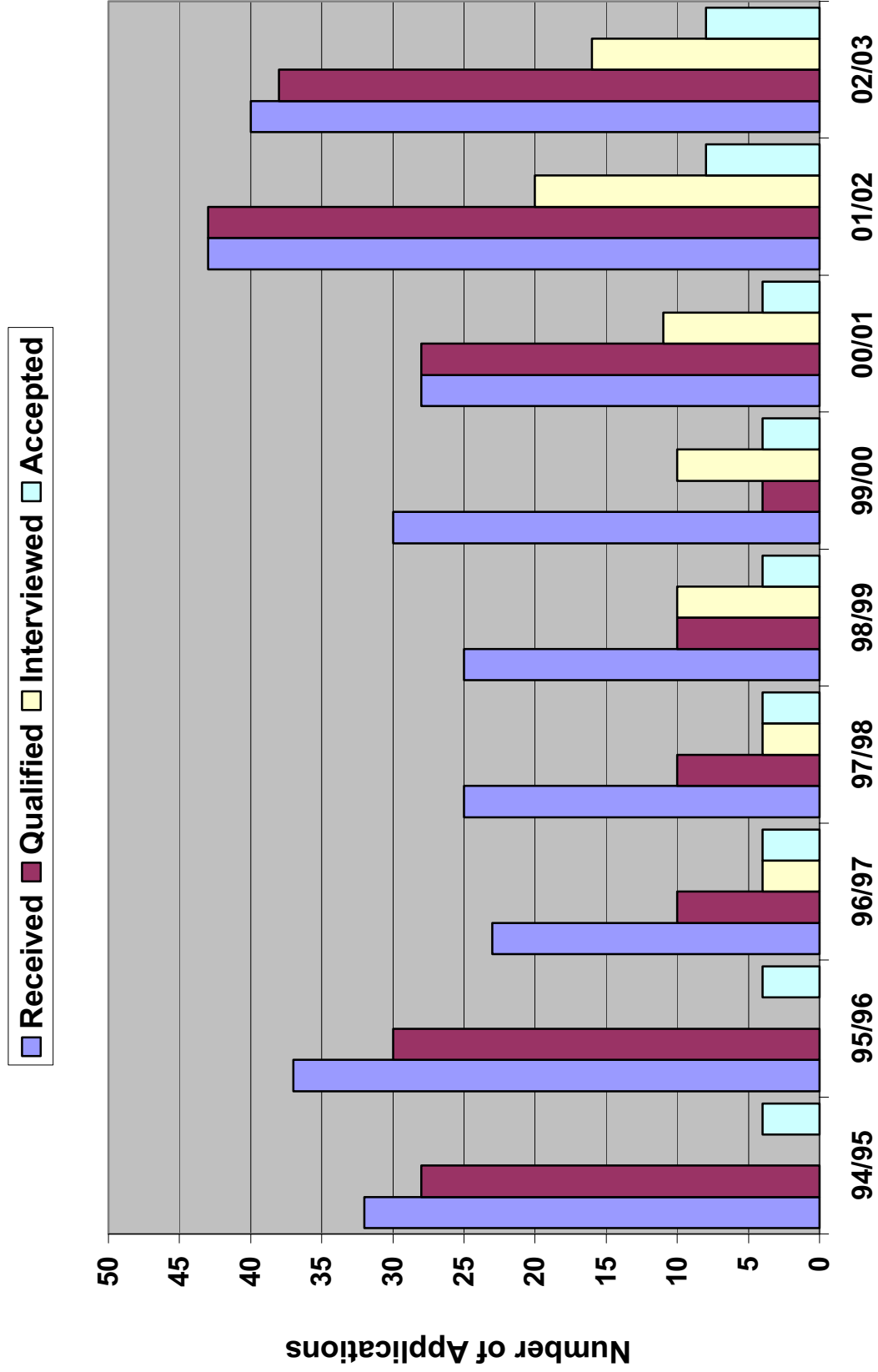
# Dietetics National Exam Pass Rate 1994-2003



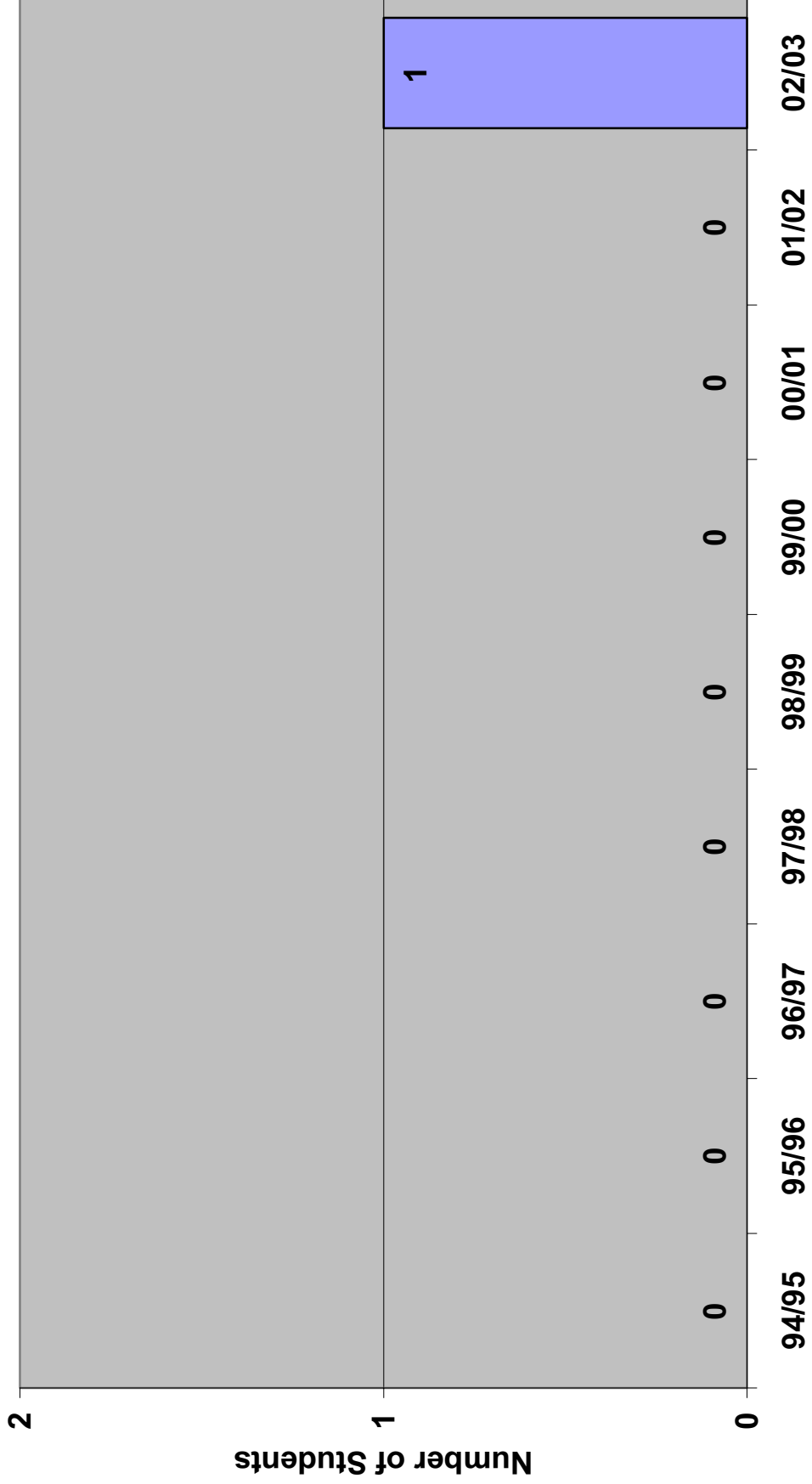
# Dietetics-BA/BS Ethnic Student Numbers 1994-2003



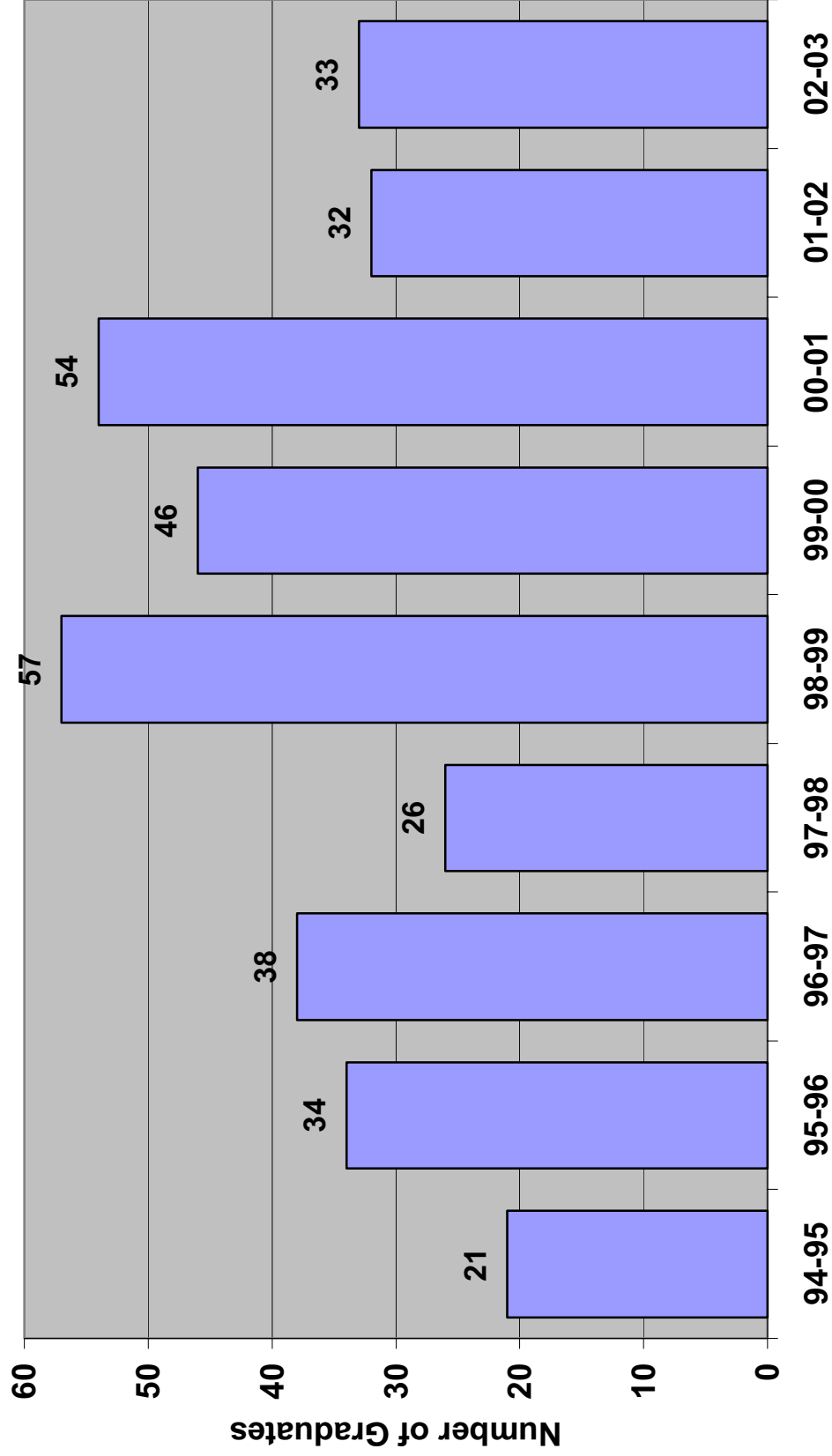

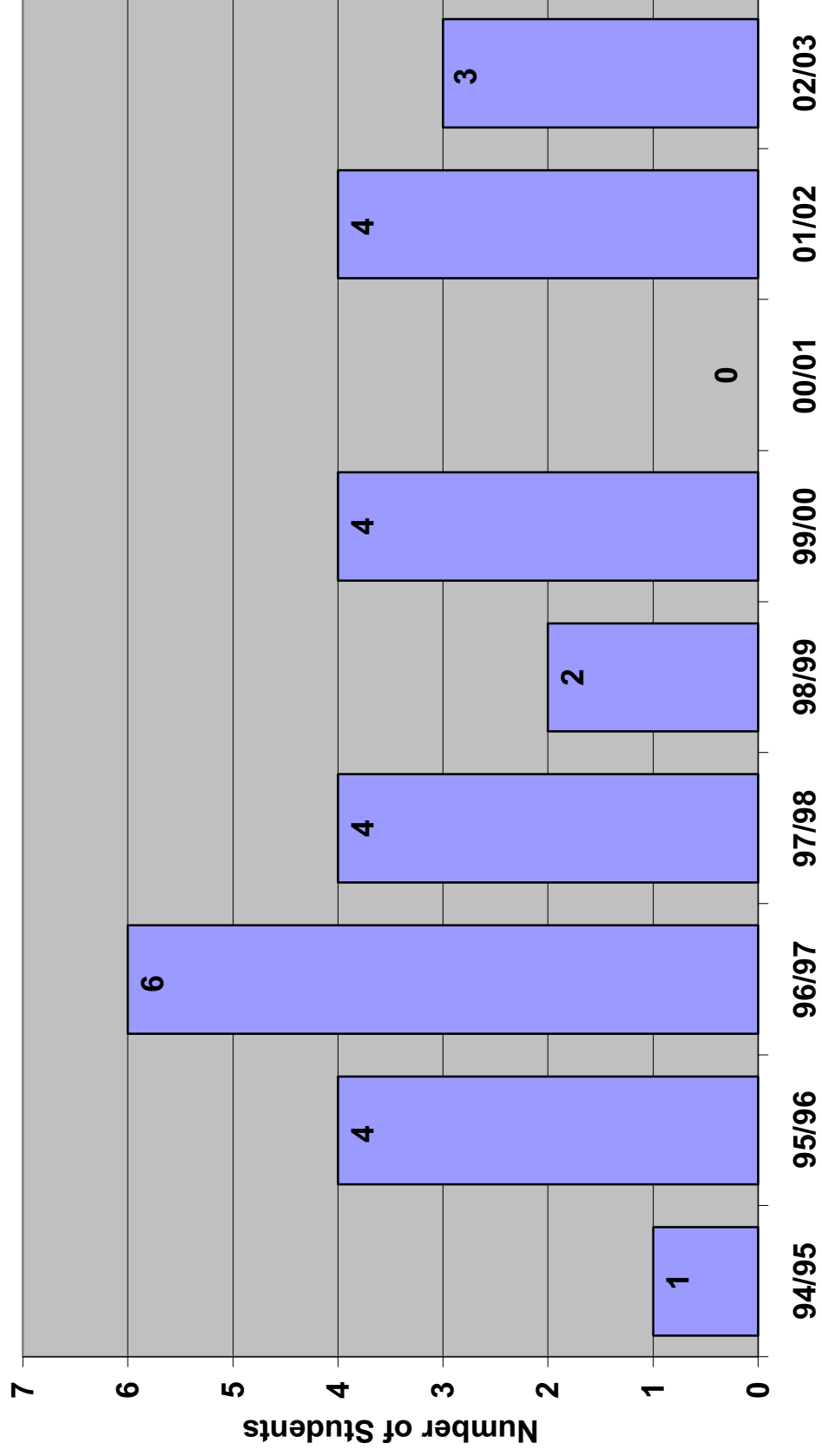

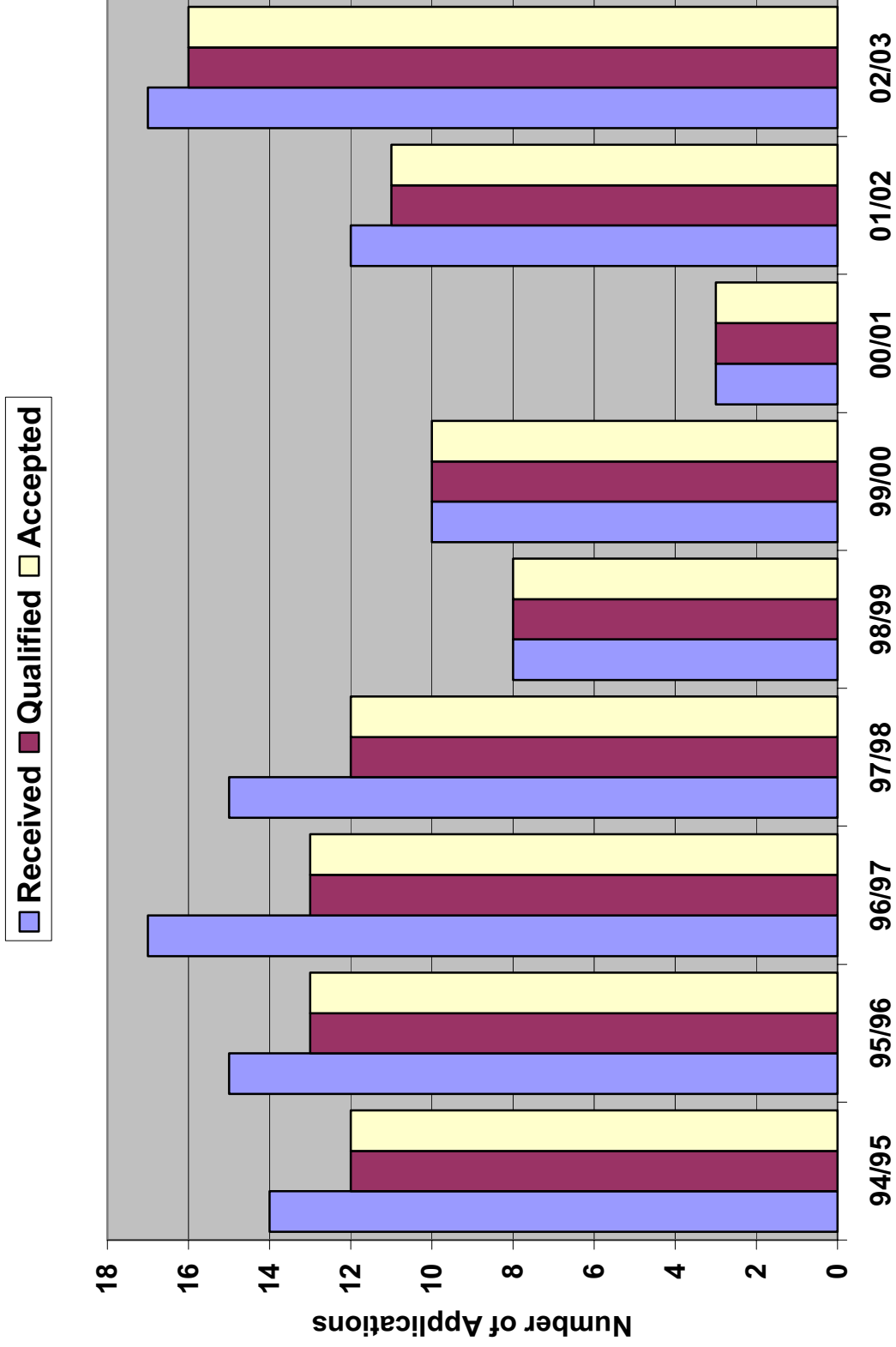

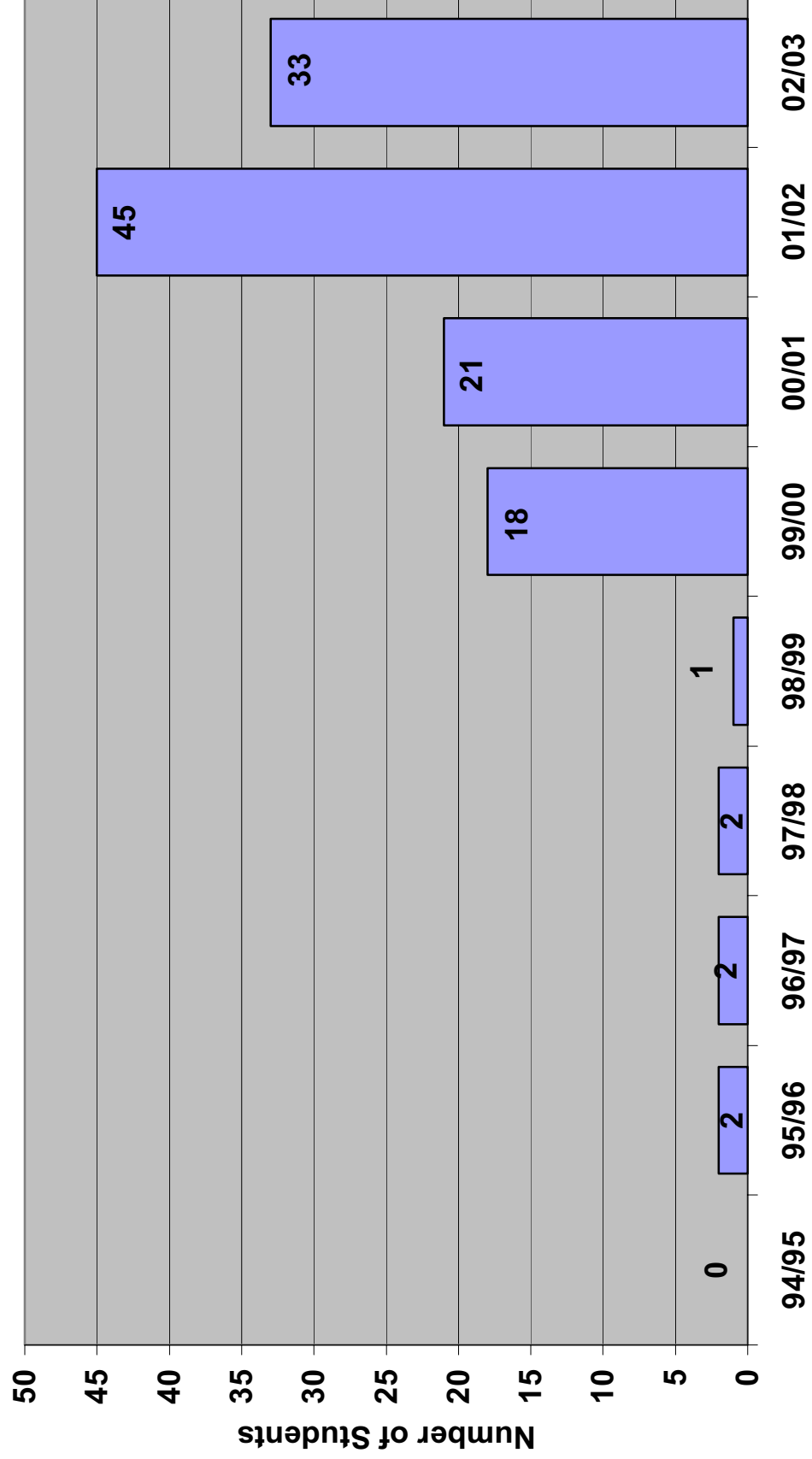

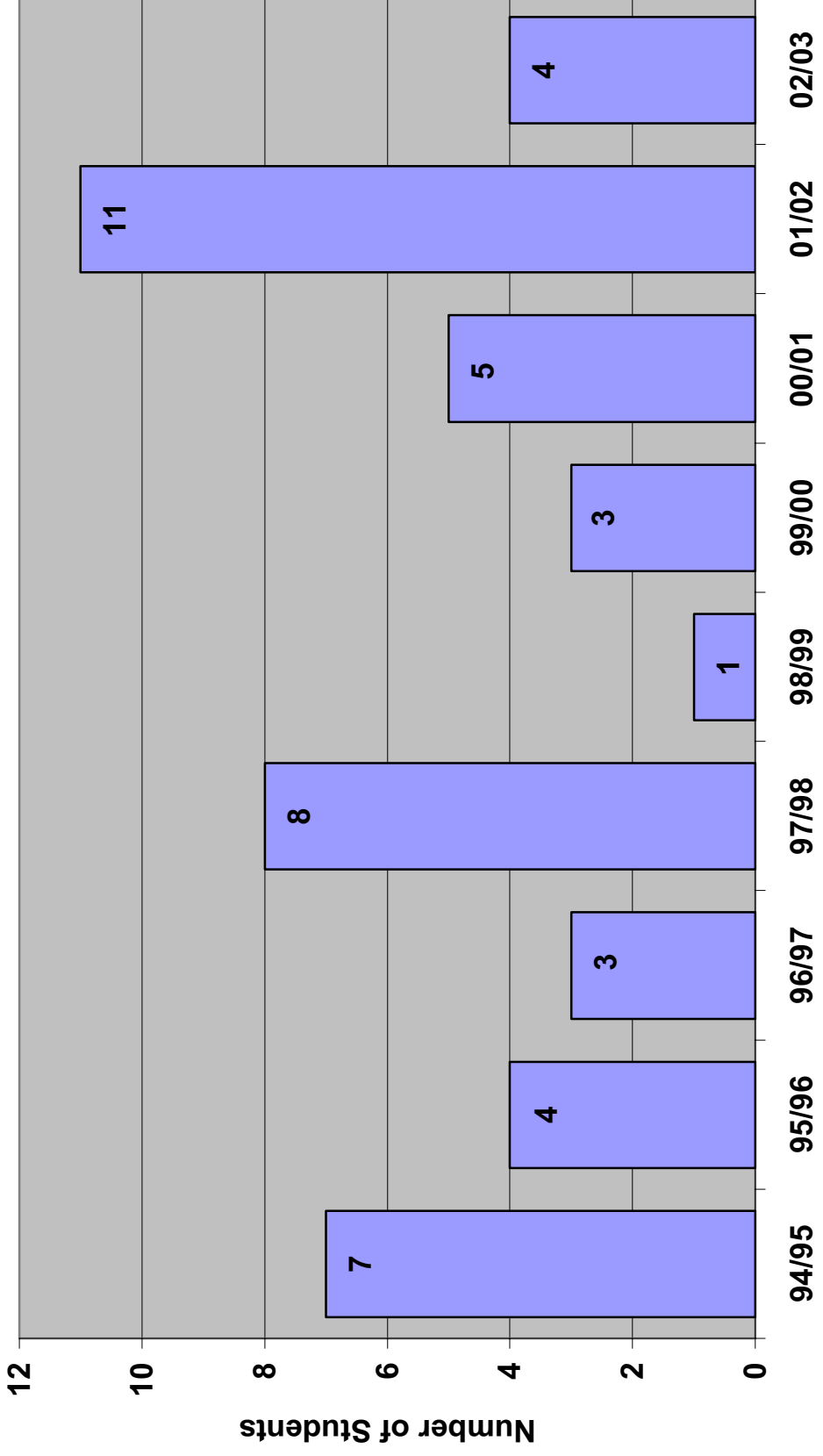
# Nursing-BS National Exam Pass Rate 1994-2003



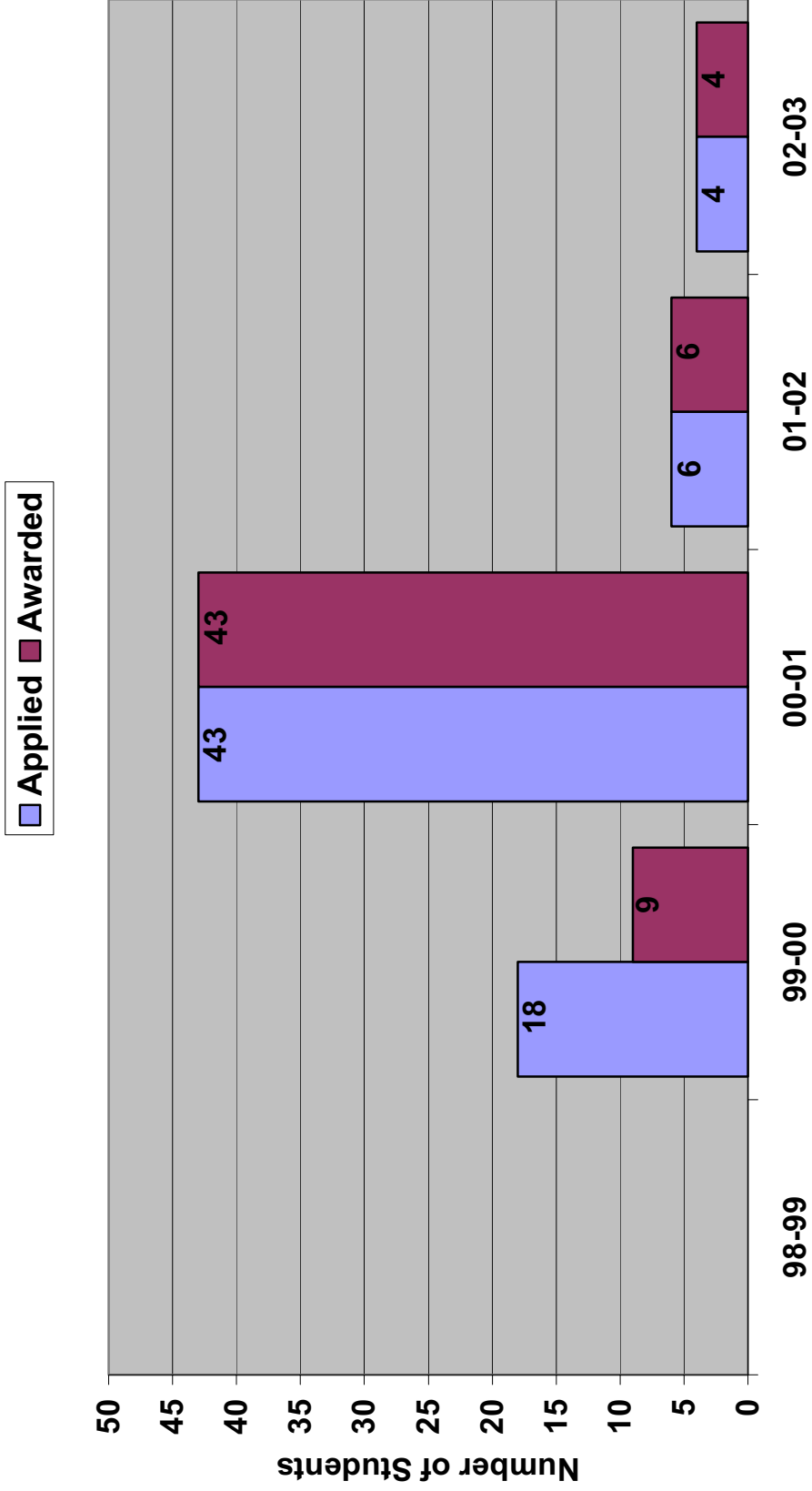

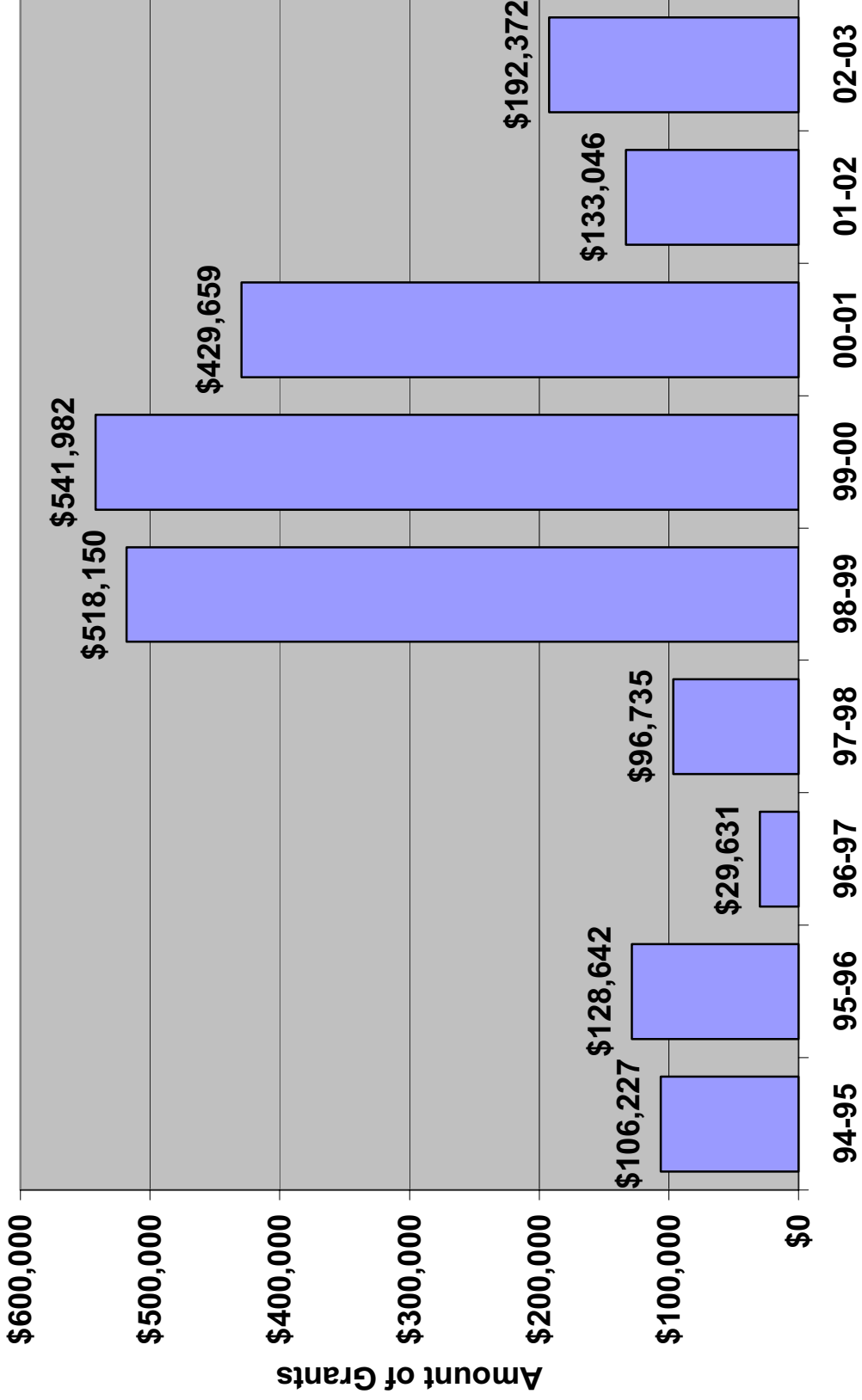

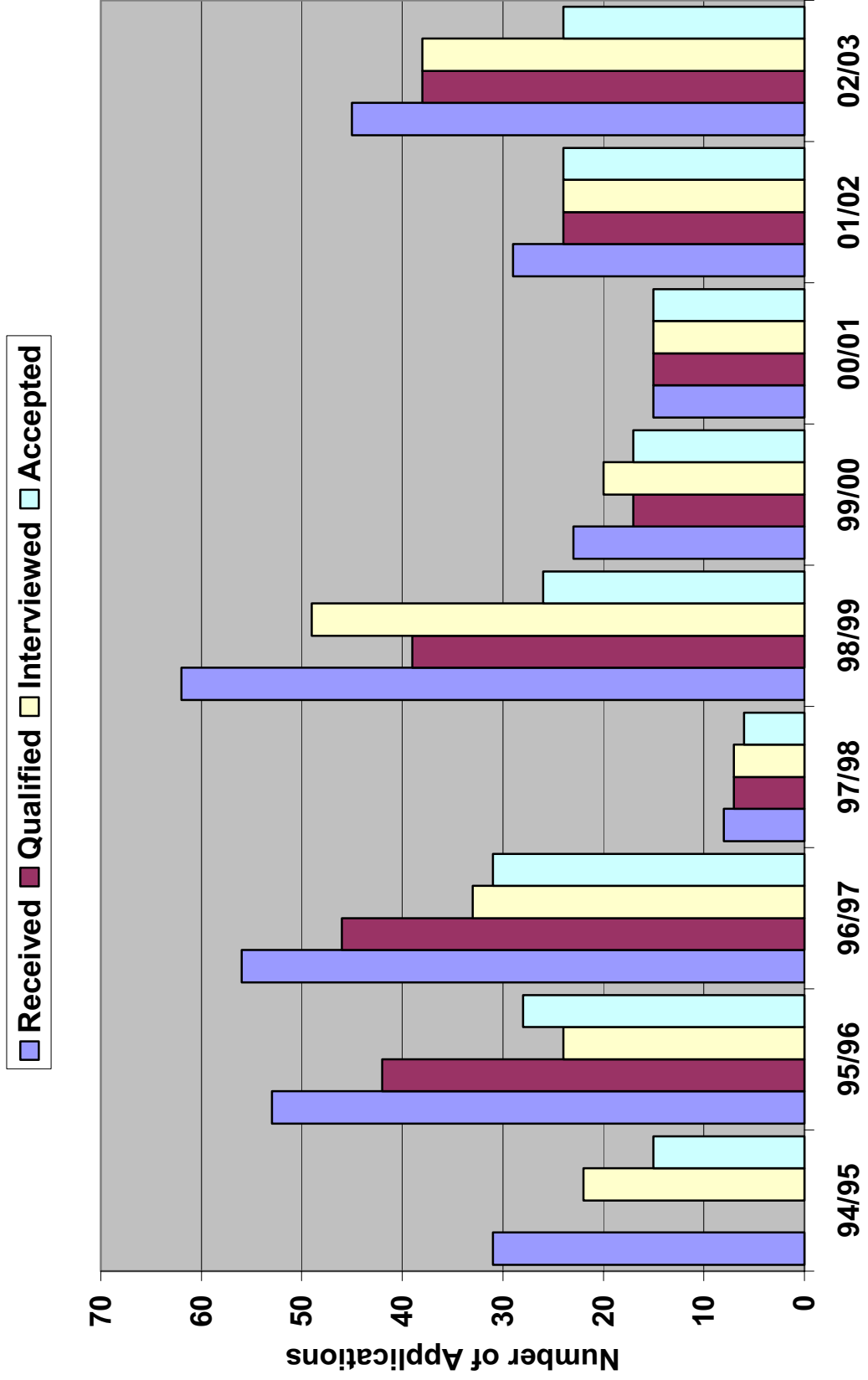
# Scholarships for Disadvantaged Nursing Students Through IRH Grant 1998-2003



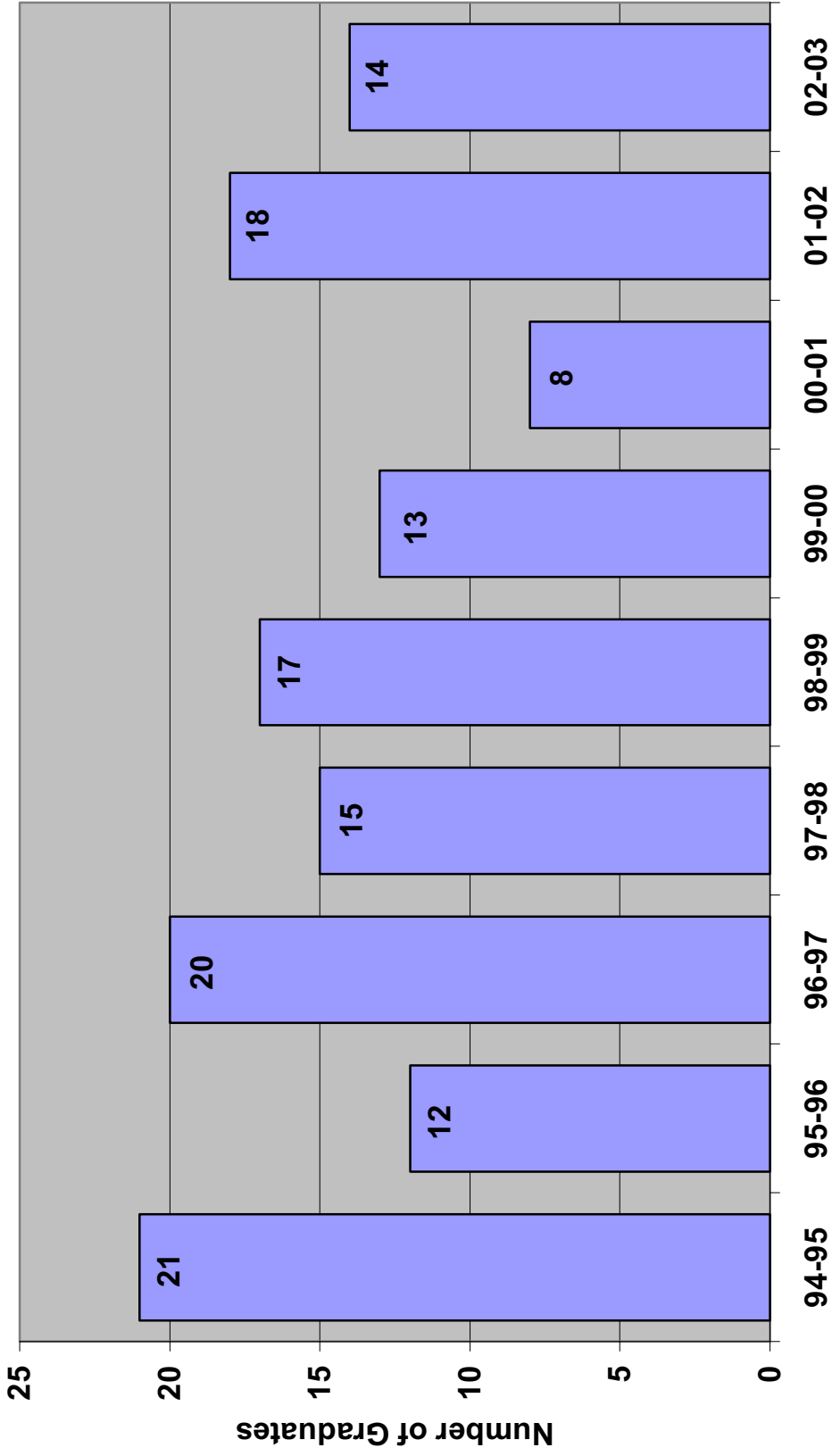

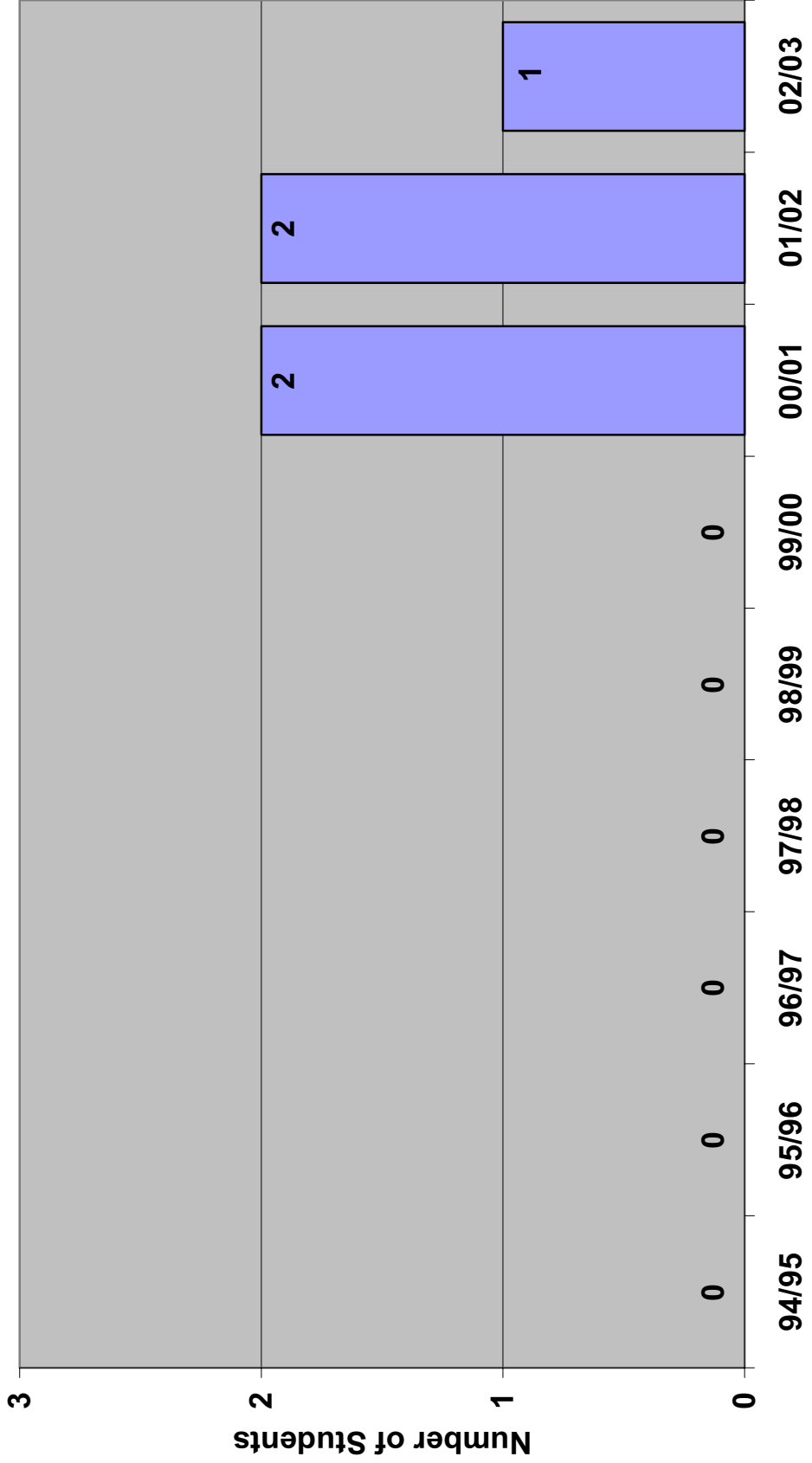

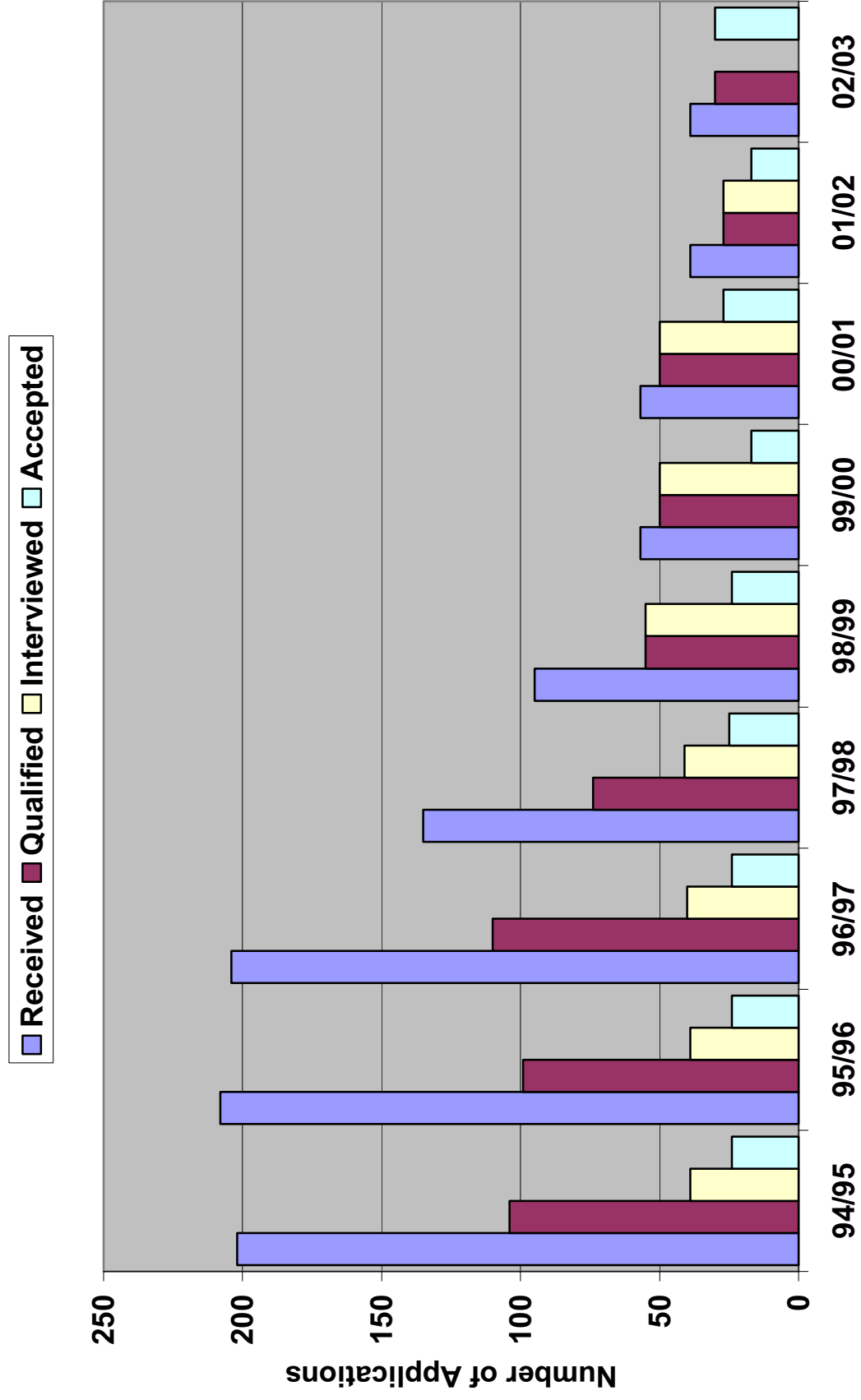
# Occupational Therapy Graduate National Exam Pass Rate 2000-2003



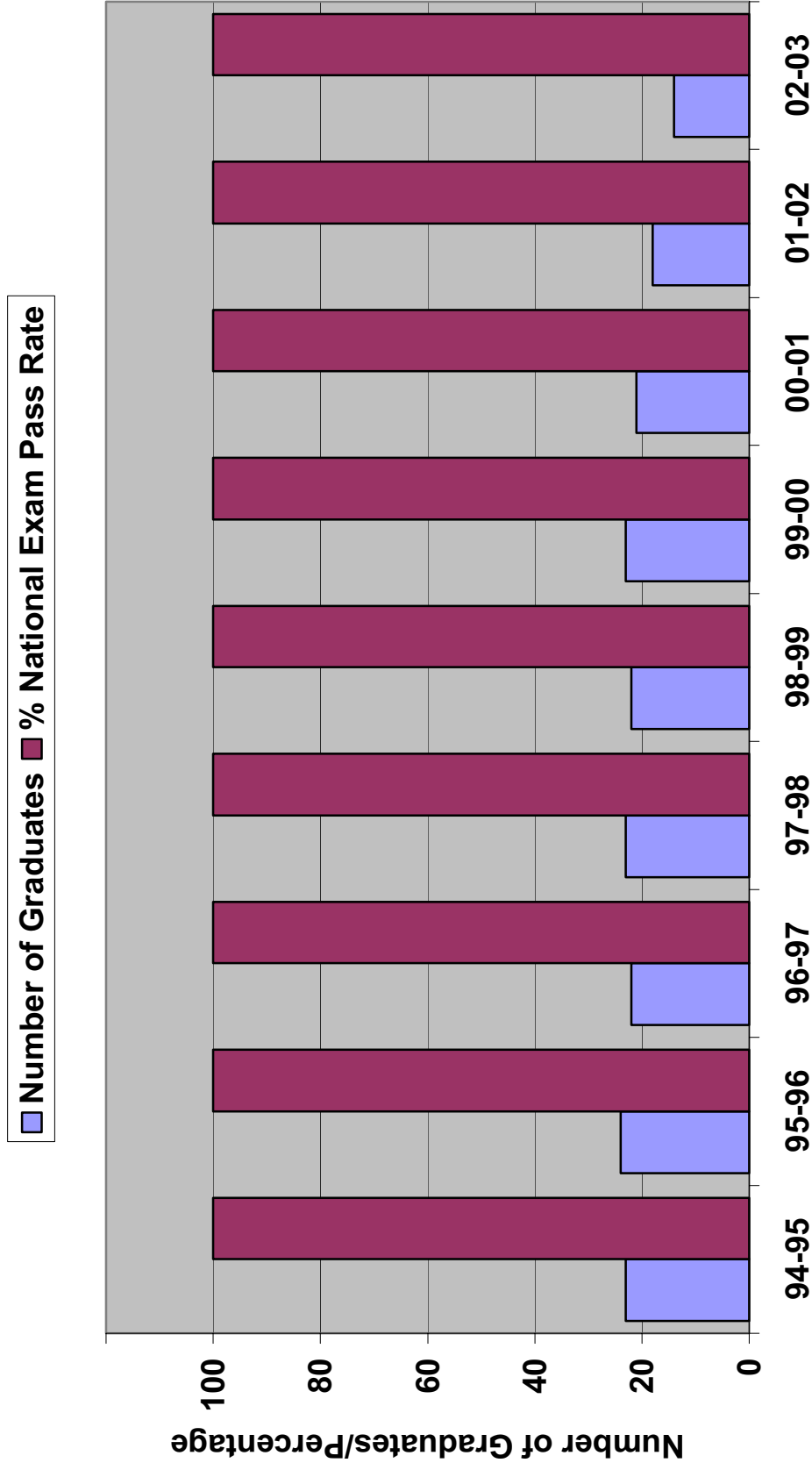

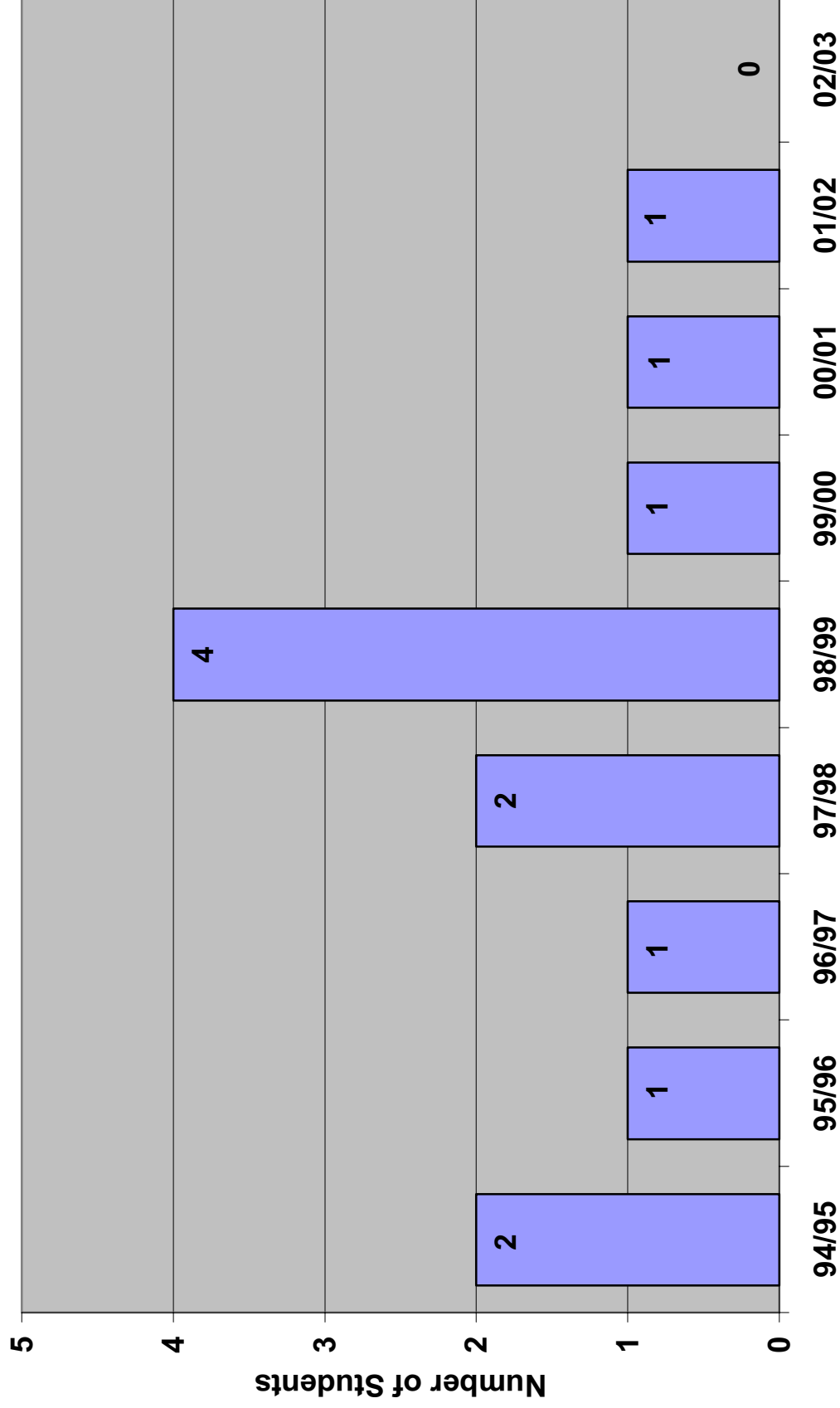

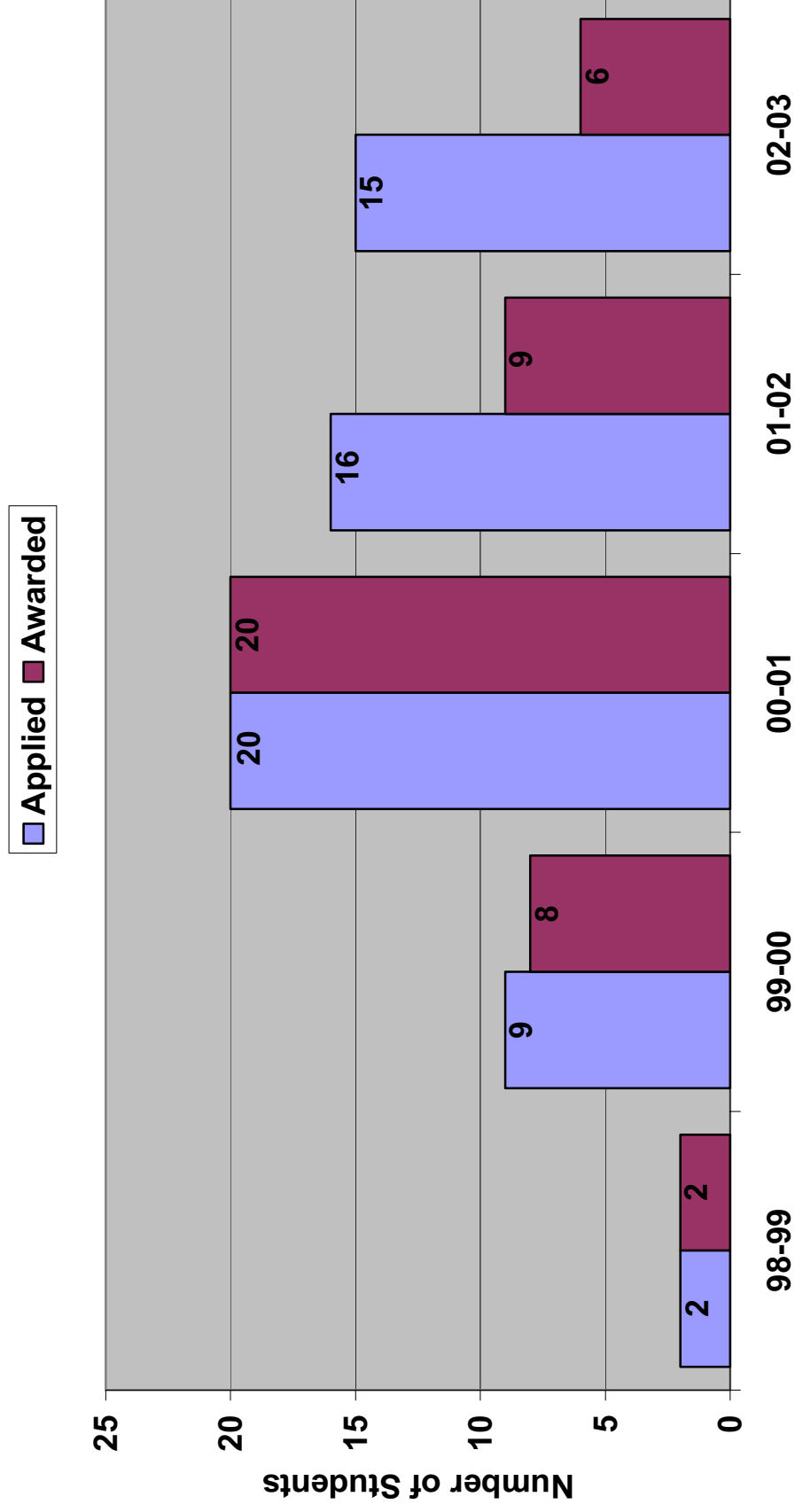
# Physical Therapy National Exam Pass Rate 1994-2003



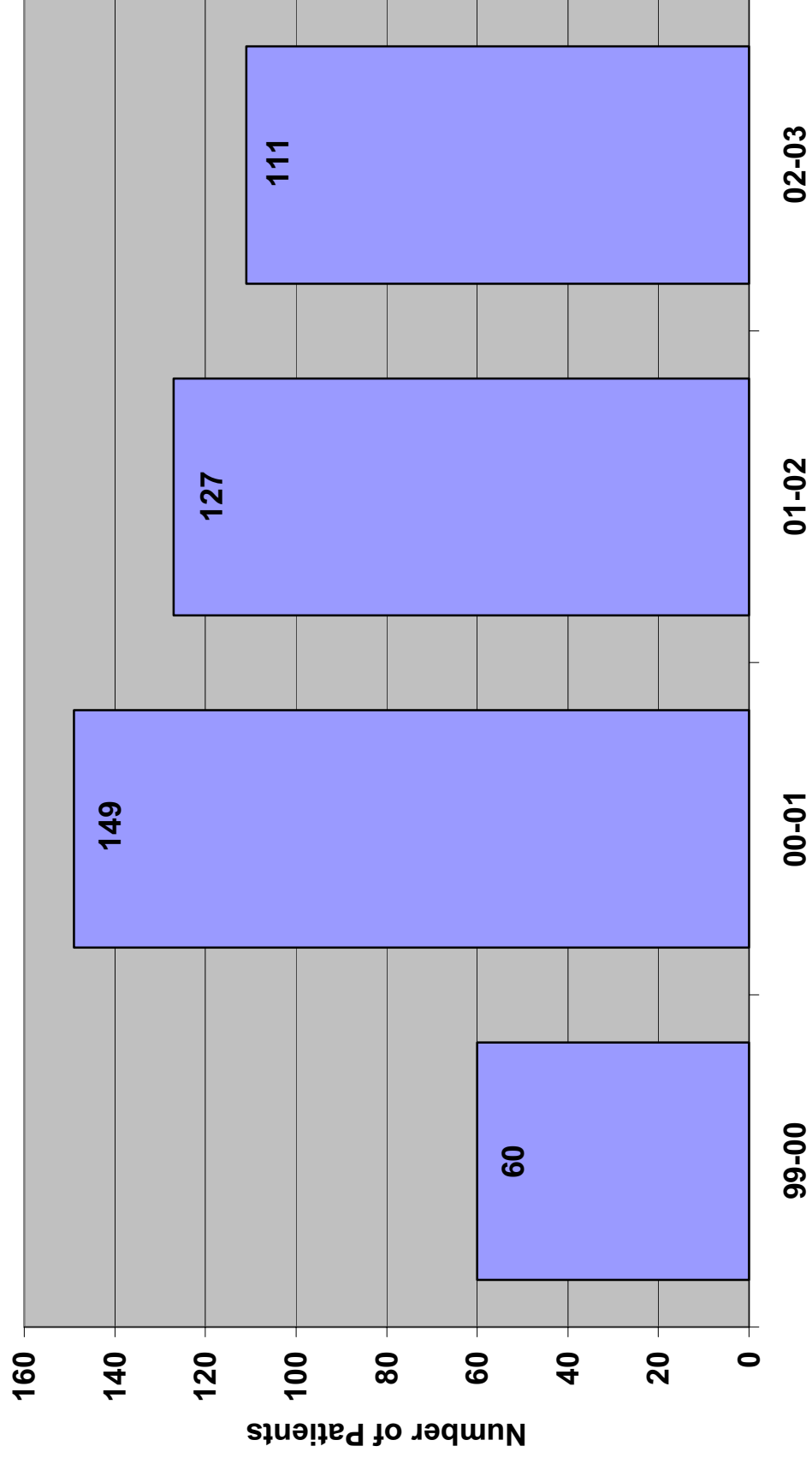

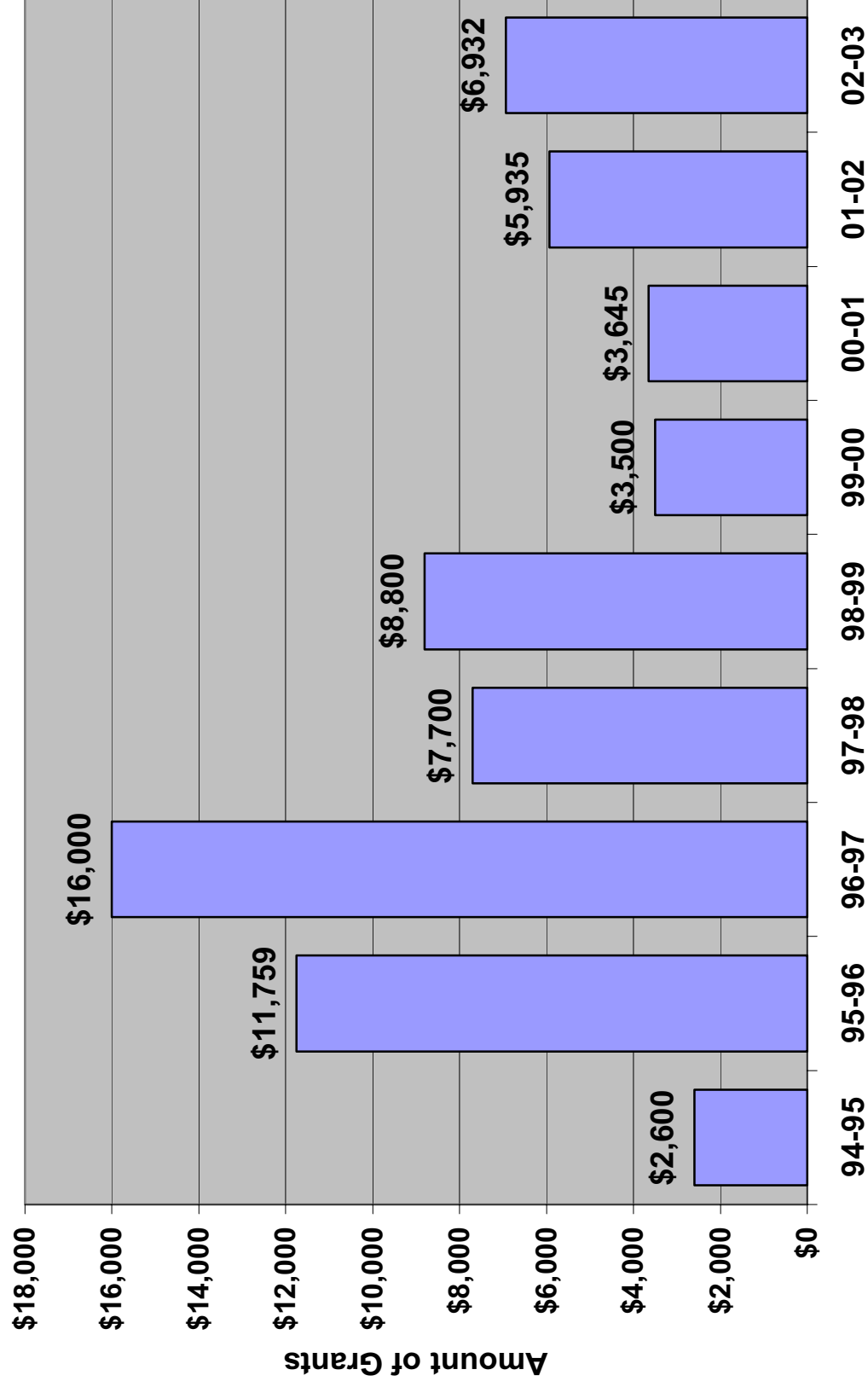

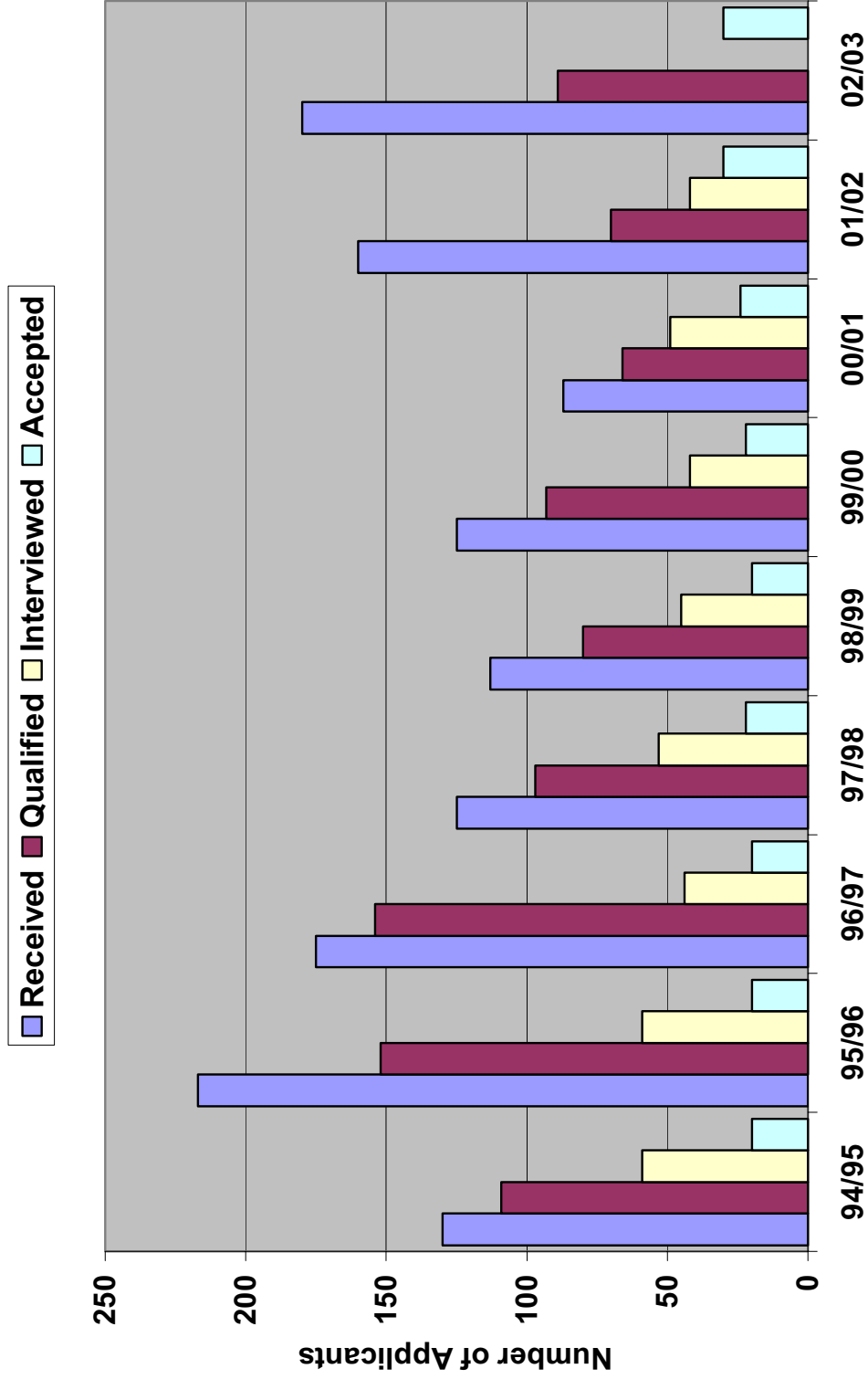

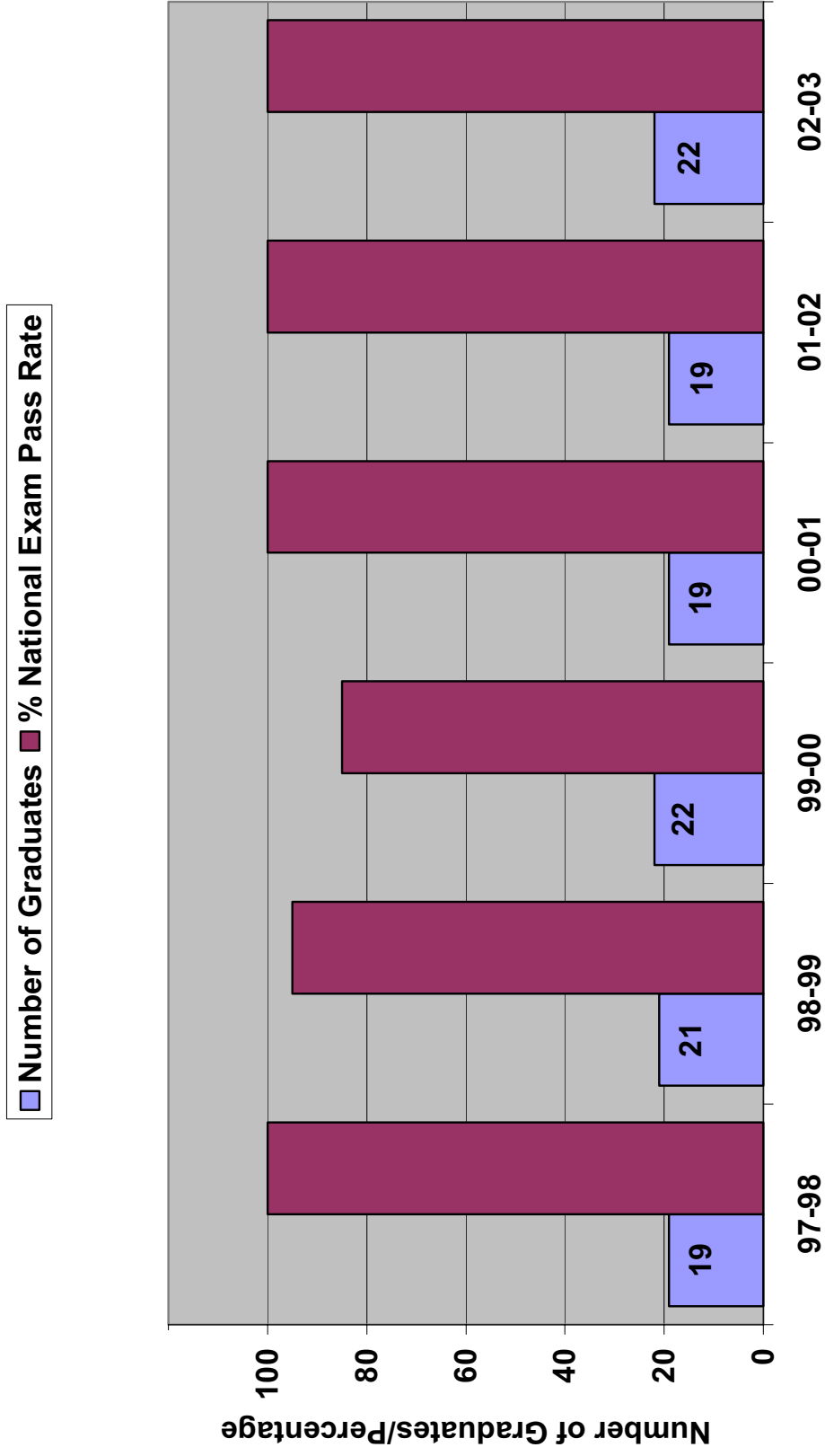

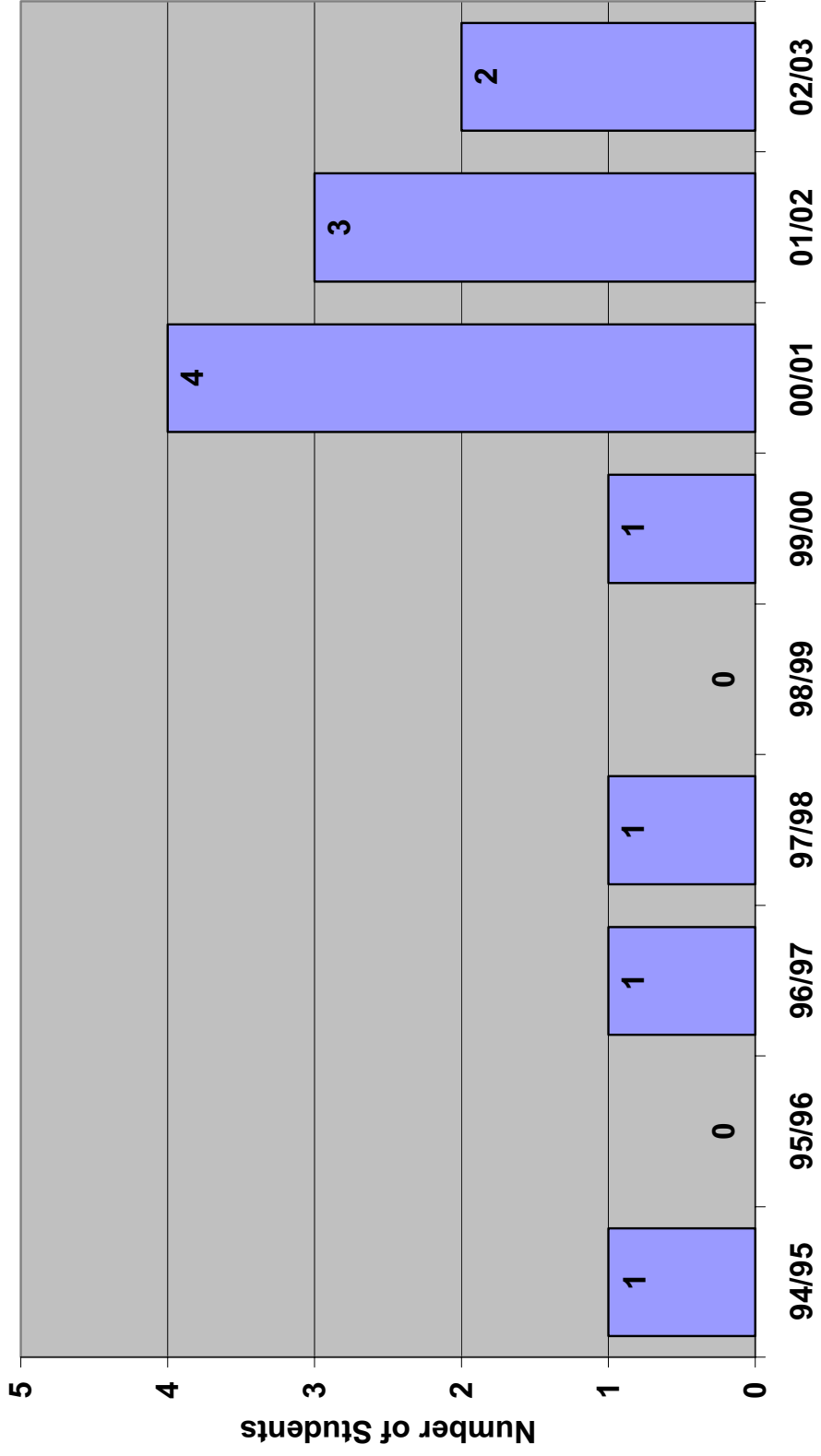
# Physician Assistant Applicants 1994-2003



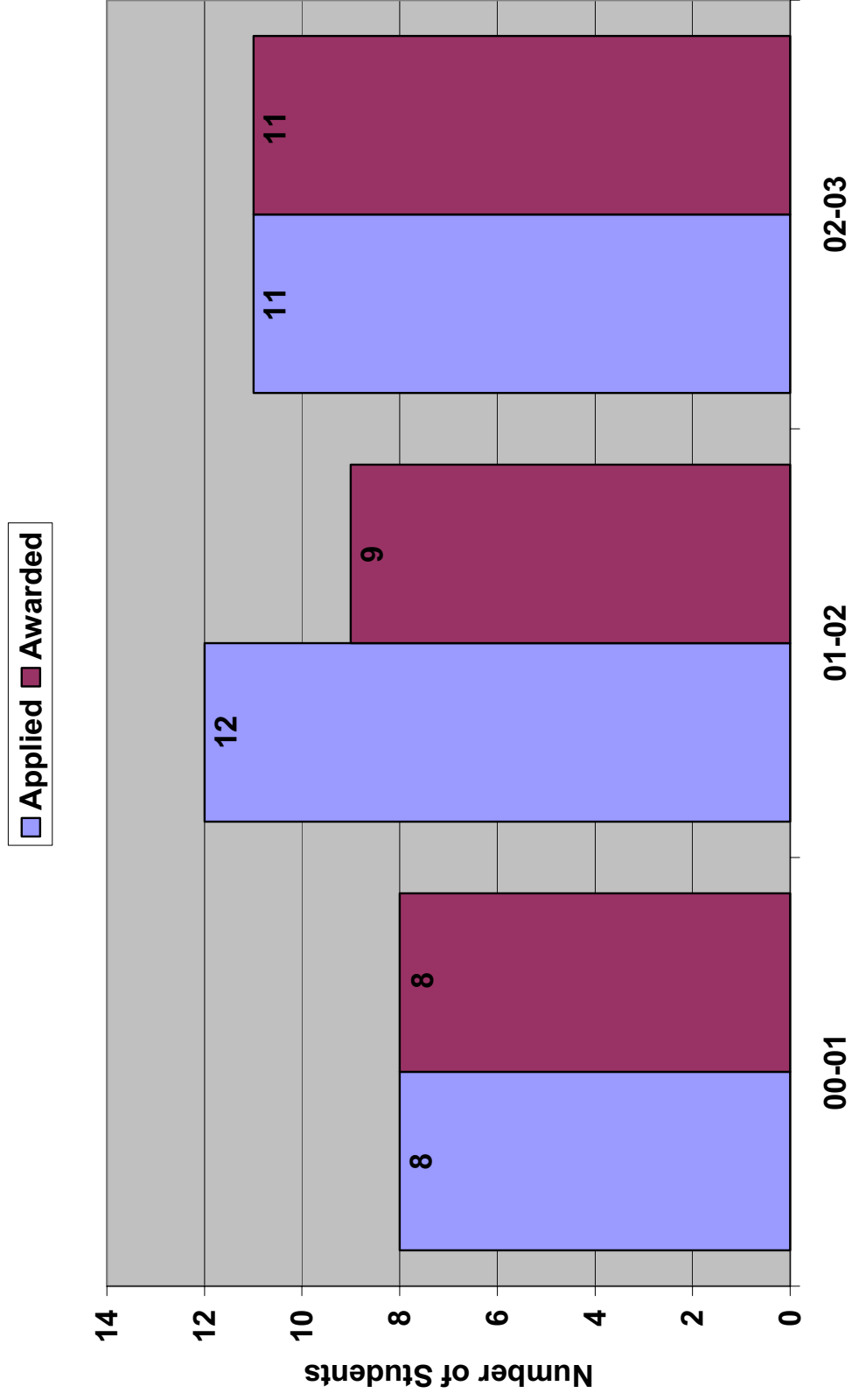
# Physician Assistant Graduate National Exam Pass Rate 1997-2003



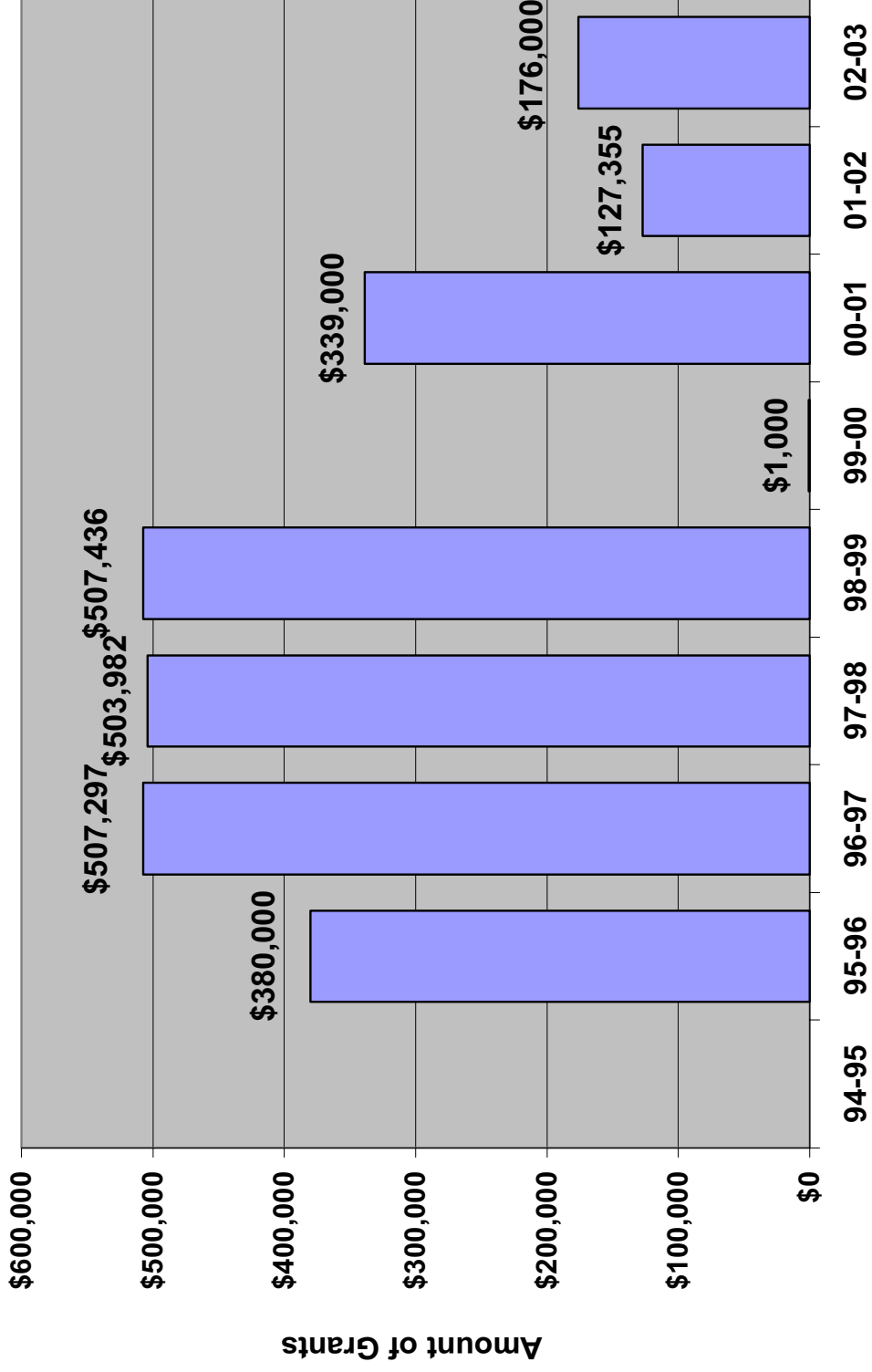
# Physician Assistant Ethnic Student Numbers 1994-2003

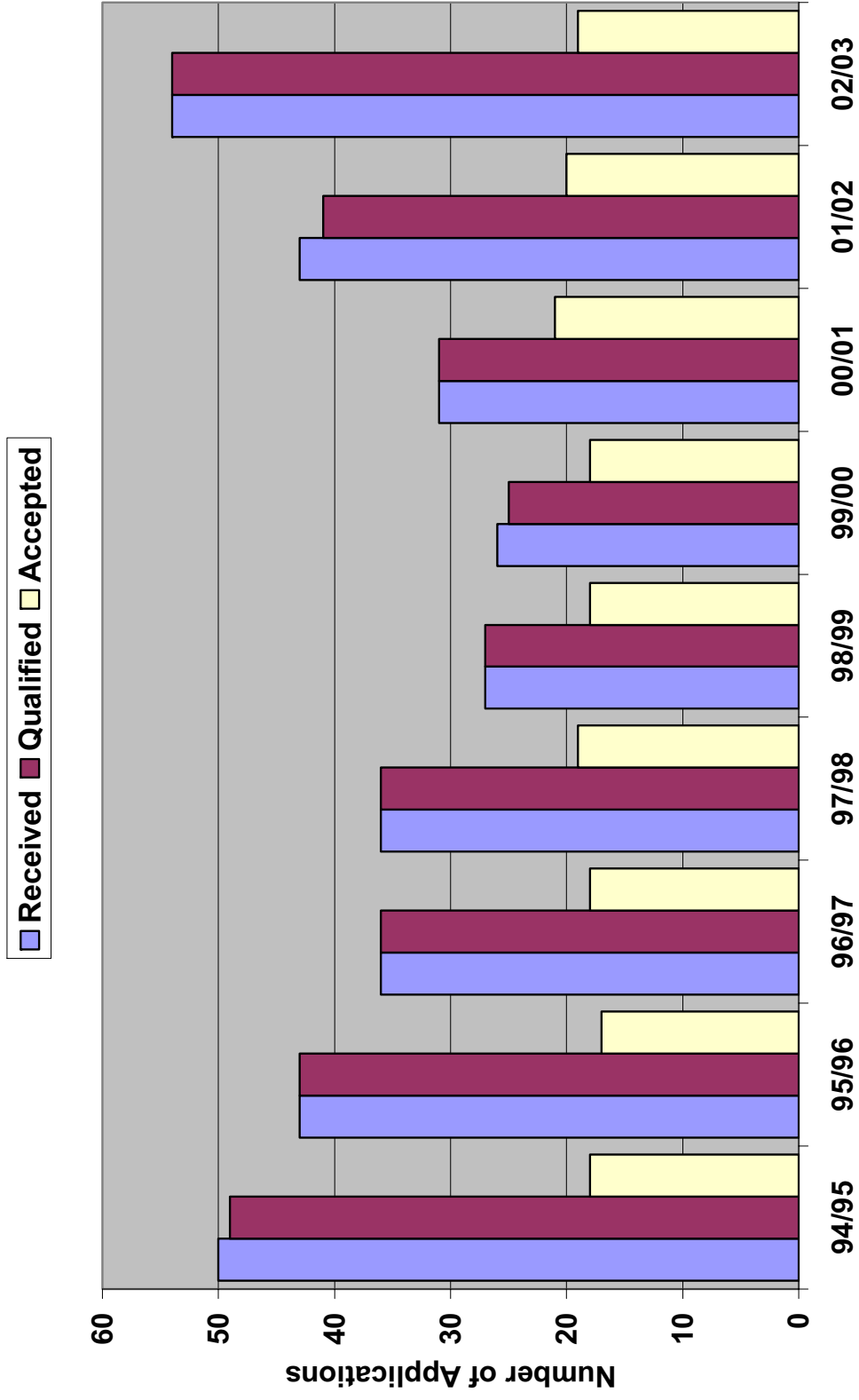

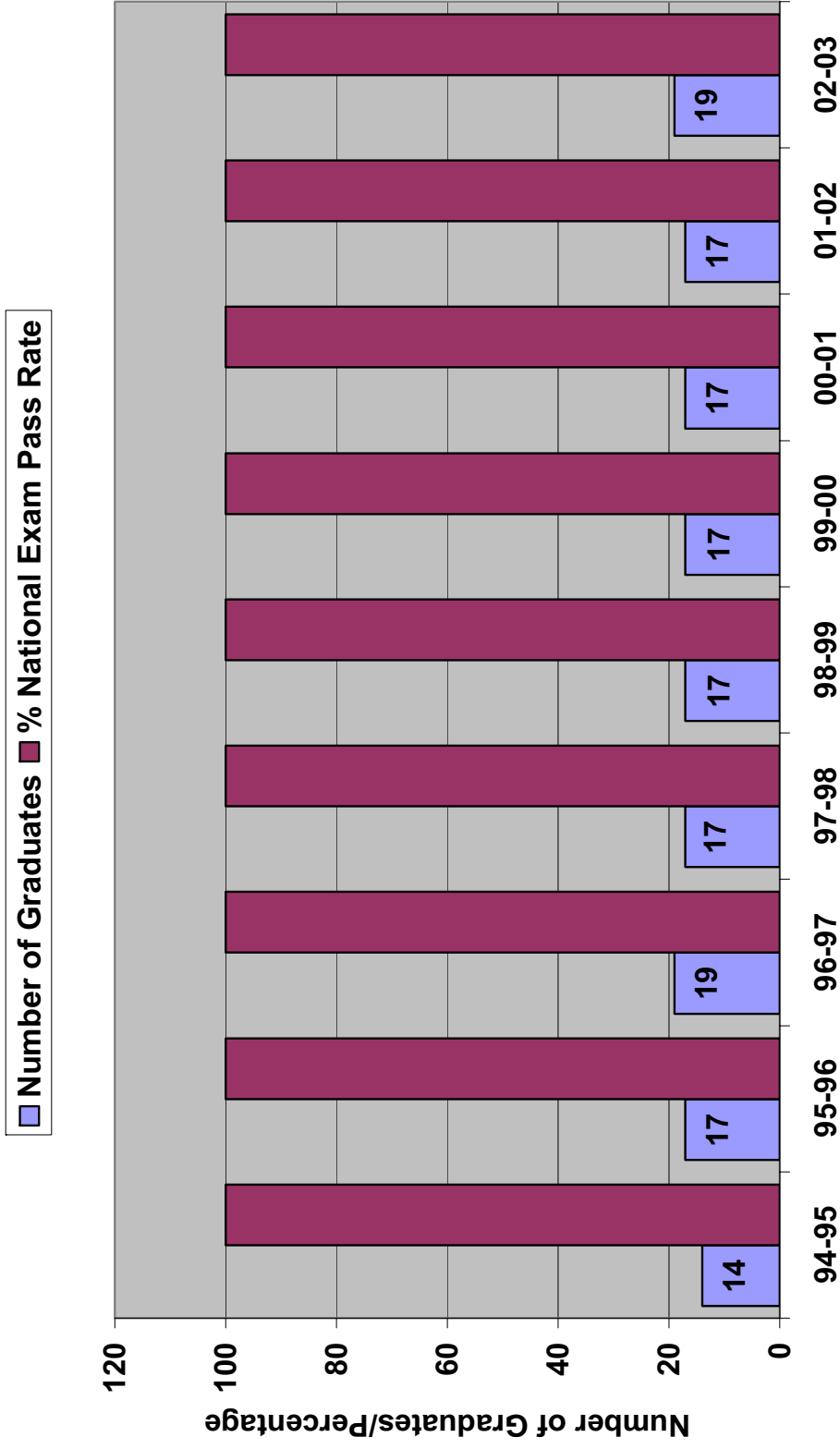
A. Department -2002 graduates scored in the top 3% of all programs in the IS.

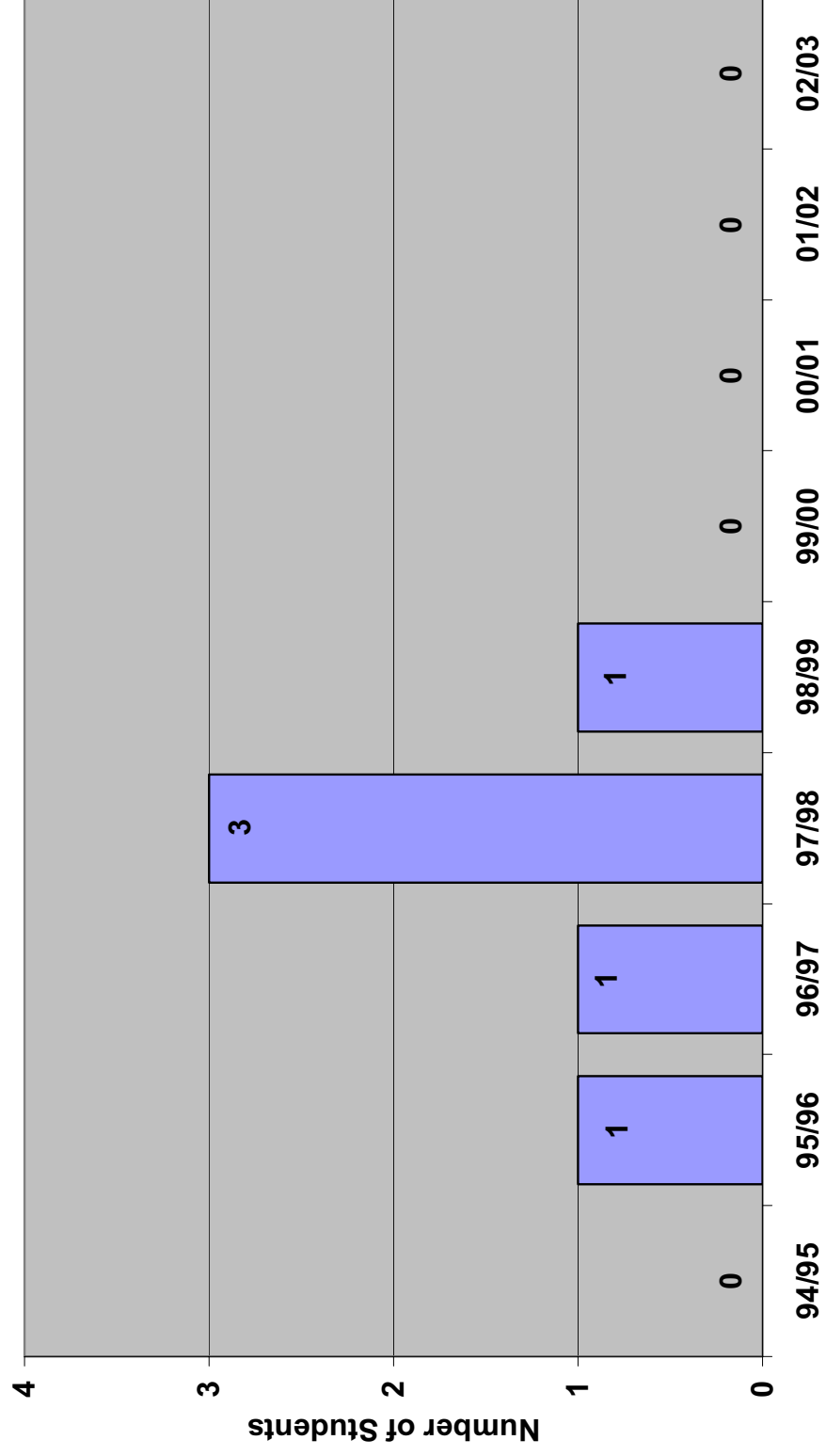
# Radiographic Science Applicants 1994-2003
