# Kasiska College of Health Professions

## Mission Statement

The mission of the Kasiska College of Health Professions (KCHP) is multifaceted. The primary responsibility of the college is the enhancement of the quality of life of the residents of Idaho and the greater community through the education of students in the health professions. This is facilitated through excellence in research, community service, teaching and application of technology, as well as strong leadership on issues related to health professions education and the delivery of health care services.

Five **Goal Categories** have been identified in the **KCHP Strategic Plan** in order to fulfill the mission of the college: Access; Teaching; Scholarly Activity; Community Service and Inter-professional Activity.

**1. ACCESS:** Providing the citizens of Idaho with a wide variety of educational choices within the health professions through addressing availability of programs and resources, student recruitment, marketing and publicity.

The KCHP continues to explore, develop and implement new program offerings in the health professions in order to provide expanded opportunities for Idaho's students and to meet the health-care needs of the citizens of Idaho. The college currently offers more than 40 associate, baccalaureate, master and doctoral degrees and certificates in a broad variety of health care disciplines (Table 1). During FY05, the **Department of Communication Sciences & Disorders, and Education of the Deaf** accepted its inaugural class for the AuD Program and has submitted a Notice of Intent with the State Board of Education to implement an online pre-professional program in Speech Language Pathology. The **Department of Dental Hygiene** has developed the first year of the new graduate program in dental hygiene. The **Department of Health Care Administration** is developing a new Center for Executive Studies through which the Masters of Public Health-Health Administration degree will be offered. The **Department of Health and Nutrition Sciences** received accreditation for the Masters of Public Health Program. The **Department of Nursing** added 3 new options to the graduate program in nursing. Finally, the **Department of Physical and Occupational Therapy** received approval of the Transitional DPT Program by the Graduate Council at Idaho State University. The number of graduates of KCHP programs remained relatively stable at 326 due in part to limitations on the number of students accepted into respective programs by accreditation standards (Table 8). State funding of programs within the college increased by 15% during FY05, partially due to implementation of new programs (Table 2).

**2. TEACHING:** Addressing faculty development, faculty recruitment and retention, and improvement of instructional capabilities.

Total FTE faculty within KCHP increased by 24.6% over FYO4 to nearly 107. Comparatively low faculty salaries continue to negatively impact recruitment and retention of faculty within KCHP programs. However, college programs continue to encourage participation by faculty in continuing education opportunities, attendance at professional meetings and conferences, sabbatical leaves to develop and improve teaching and research skills. Graduates of KCHP

programs continue to perform highly on post-graduate certification and licensure examinations (pass rates were: Counseling 97%; CSED 100%; Dental Hygiene & IDEP 100%; Dietetics 80%; Nursing 96%; Physician Assistant 95%; Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy 100%); Radiographic Science 94%.

**3. SCHOLARLY ACTIVITY:** Facilitating and improving faculty and student research and scholarly activity in the health professions.

A total of 102 publications, including refereed papers, book chapters, books and web media publications, were published by faculty, staff and students in the KCHP during FY05. In addition, 190 papers were presented at local, state, regional, national and international meetings by college personnel and students during the past year. The departments in the KCHP were successful in obtaining funding from numerous sources for various projects during FY05. The Department of Counseling received a total of \$6,000 in research and development grants; the Department of Communication Sciences & Disorders, and Education of the Deaf received \$382,450 for research, training, program development and capitol equipment; the Department of Dental Hygiene obtained \$549,893 for improvement in technology and program development; the Department of Family Medicine was awarded \$2,912,000 for development of an electronic clinical database and for research projects; the Department of Health Care Administration received \$3,300, the Department of Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy \$5,151, and the Department of Health and Nutrition Sciences \$31,000 for various small research and related projects; the Department of Nursing obtained \$380,944 for traineeships, and program and faculty development; the Department of Physician Assistant Studies was granted \$202,384 in part for its second year of a 3-year award to assist in student training; and the Department of Radiographic Sciences received \$81,500 for equipment upgrades. Many of the above mentioned awards were obtained through the KCHP Institute of Rural Health. Finally, a Faculty Research Day (with formal paper presentations) was held during the Spring 2005 semester, and mentoring programs were continued at the college level and within the respective departments in order to assist new and developing faculty to increase the levels of scholarly activity within the college.

**4. COMMUNITY SERVICE:** Facilitating the interaction of KCHP programs, faculty, staff and students with the general public and the professional communities within Idaho and the country.

Professional service provided by the college faculty, staff and students continues to be outstanding and is strongly encouraged within the college. Faculty have provided professional expertise to local medical organizations, hosted and participated in workshops and seminars on current health issues for practitioners and the general public, served as members and chairs of public service organizations and boards concerned with local health issues, and organized and participated in local health fairs. In addition, the college hosted and organized the annual Health Fair at Idaho State University which hosted several hundred health care professionals, students, and faculty from throughout the State of Idaho. Specific public service contributions are documented in the respective departmental annual reports included within this annual report.

**5. INTERPROFESSIONAL ACTIVITY:** Encouraging interaction and collaboration among the college departments, professional disciplines and faculty on projects relating to teaching, research and clinical activities in the health professions.

The college continues to actively encourage inter-professional and interdisciplinary efforts by the various departments of the college and university to improve health care in Idaho through research and public service. Success is demonstrated in the number of collaborative research activities and presentations that faculty in the college are involved in (see departmental reports herein) and by the variety of settings in which faculty are involved in professional service throughout the state of Idaho. The Institute of Rural Health is involved with a number of research and service activities with agencies located throughout Idaho.

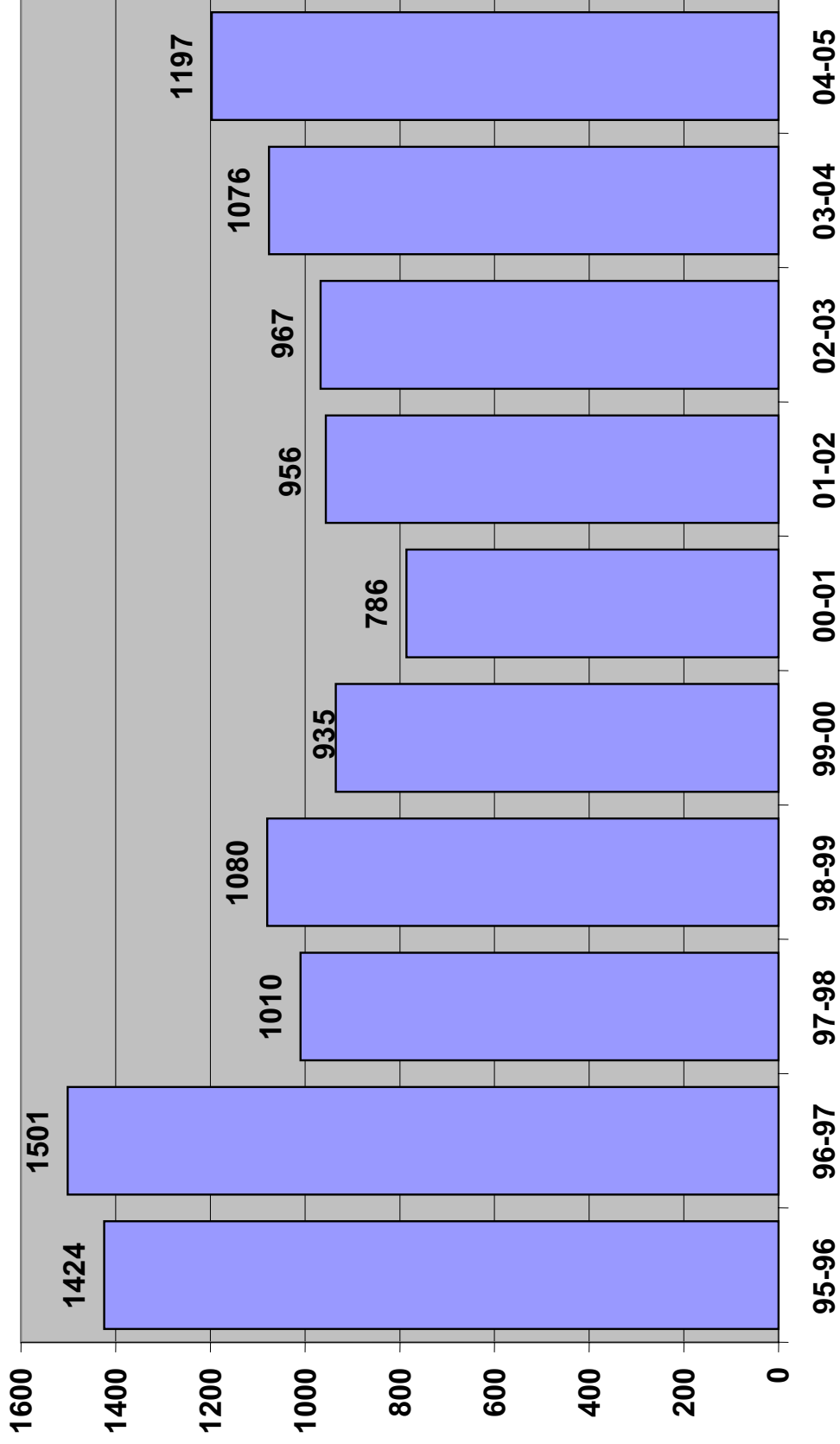

# Number of Minority Students 1995-2005

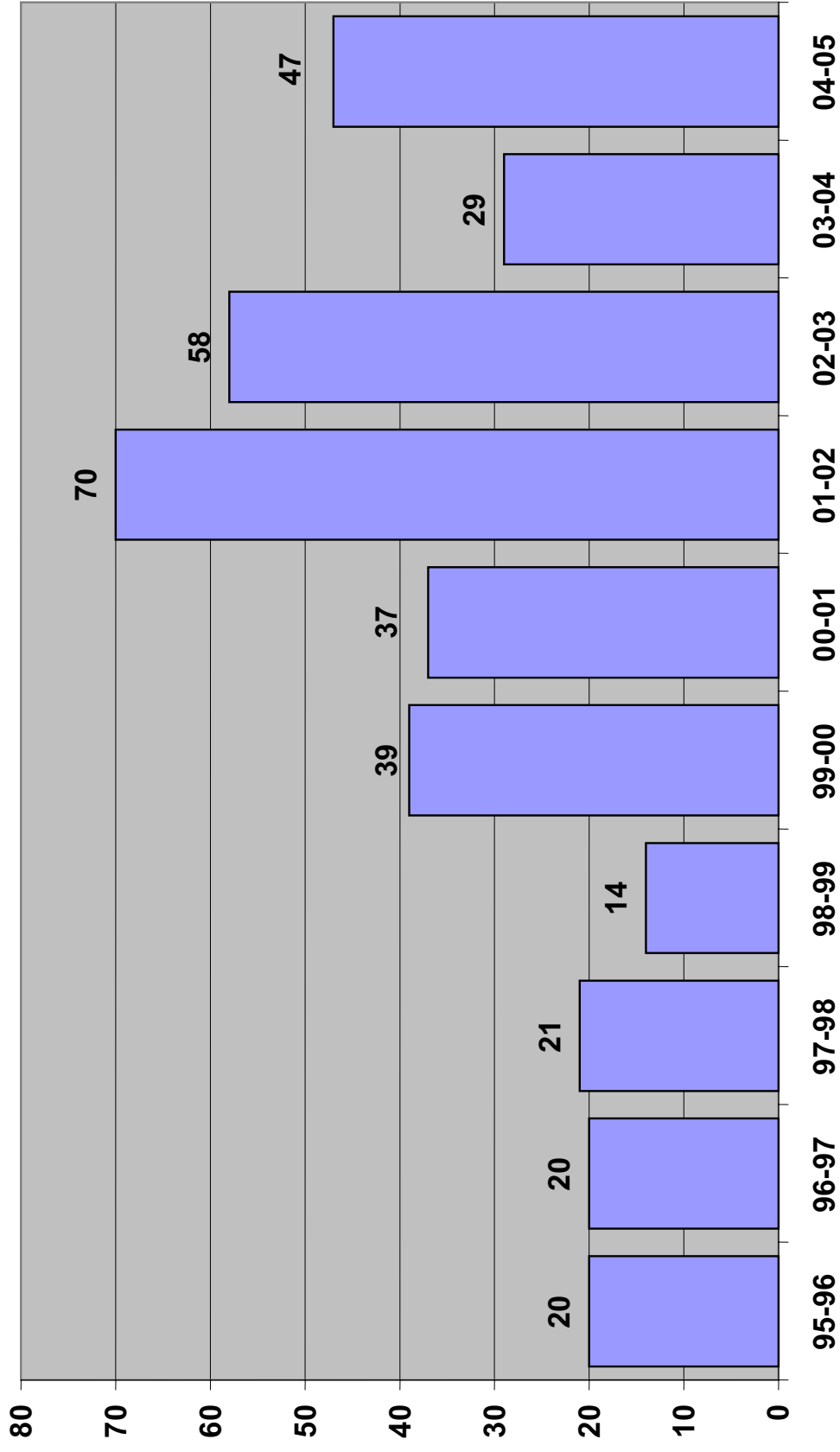

# Clinic Operations

## **Kasiska College of Health Professions Clinic Operations - 2004-2005 Annual Report**

### **Communication Sciences**

During the 2004-2005 academic year 2547 Clients were seen in the audiology clinic. Hearing evaluations, ABR, ENG and impedance clinics were used to examine 658 children, while 1889 adults participated in hearing evaluations, ABR, and ENG examinations.

The speech language clinic provided therapy for 179 clients, 126 children and 53 adults. There were 59 clients for diagnostics, 30 children, and 29 adults, \$ 85,405 was generated from the speech language and audiology clinics during 2004-2005. \$77,323 was generated from VA audiology clinics during 2004-2005.

Hearing and speech screenings were held at the Pocatello School District Head Start Program, Southeast Idaho School Districts, health care facilities, local Health Fairs, and the ISU Health Fair, ISU Preschool and many Boise area schools and daycares.

### **Counseling**

During the 2004-2005 academic year, a total of 2 couples and 2 families was seen in the Family Education and Counseling Center clinics. The Pocatello Family Education and Counseling Center Clinic had a combined income of \$80.00.

During the 2004-2005 academic year, a total of 60 individuals, 30 couples, and 10 families were seen in the Boise Counseling Clinic. The Boise Counseling Clinic had a combined income of \$1,300.00.

### **Dental Hygiene**

During the 2004-2005 academic year, a total of 1225 patients were seen in the preventive clinic. Of that number 202 were children. A total of 511 pit and fissure sealants were placed and 320 full series radiographs were taken. In the expanded functions clinic, a total of 354 amalgam surfaces were placed and 667 composite surfaces were placed. The combined clinic revenue for preventive and expanded clinic was \$50,204.65 for the academic year. Clinic sites - ISU Dental Hygiene Clinic and Not-Tsoo-Gah-Nee Indian Health Center  
Preceptors at Extramural sites - One dental hygienist and three dentists

### **Dental Sciences**

During the 2004-2005 academic year a total of 3258 patients were seen at the Pocatello Family Dentistry Clinic. The total revenue for clinic services was \$436320.43. The resident dentist also provided dental services through rural rotations at Terreton, and Preston.

### **Family Medicine**

During the 2004-2005 academic year, a total of \$ 13868 visits were made in the clinic. Of that number 25% were Medicaid and 35% were Medicare. The clinic had gross charges of \$1,738,722 for the academic year.

### **Nursing - Senior Health Promotion Clinic**

During the 2004-2005 academic year a total of 543 consultations/visits was made with patients in the clinic. Of the number 19 were new clients and 532 were return visits. Services performed included: 543 foot care; 543 health assessments; 1 other services. Donations: \$947.35

**Physical and Occupational Therapy**

During the calendar year August 2004 - July 2005 a total of 824 patients was seen in the clinic. The total revenue for clinic services was \$24,461.92.

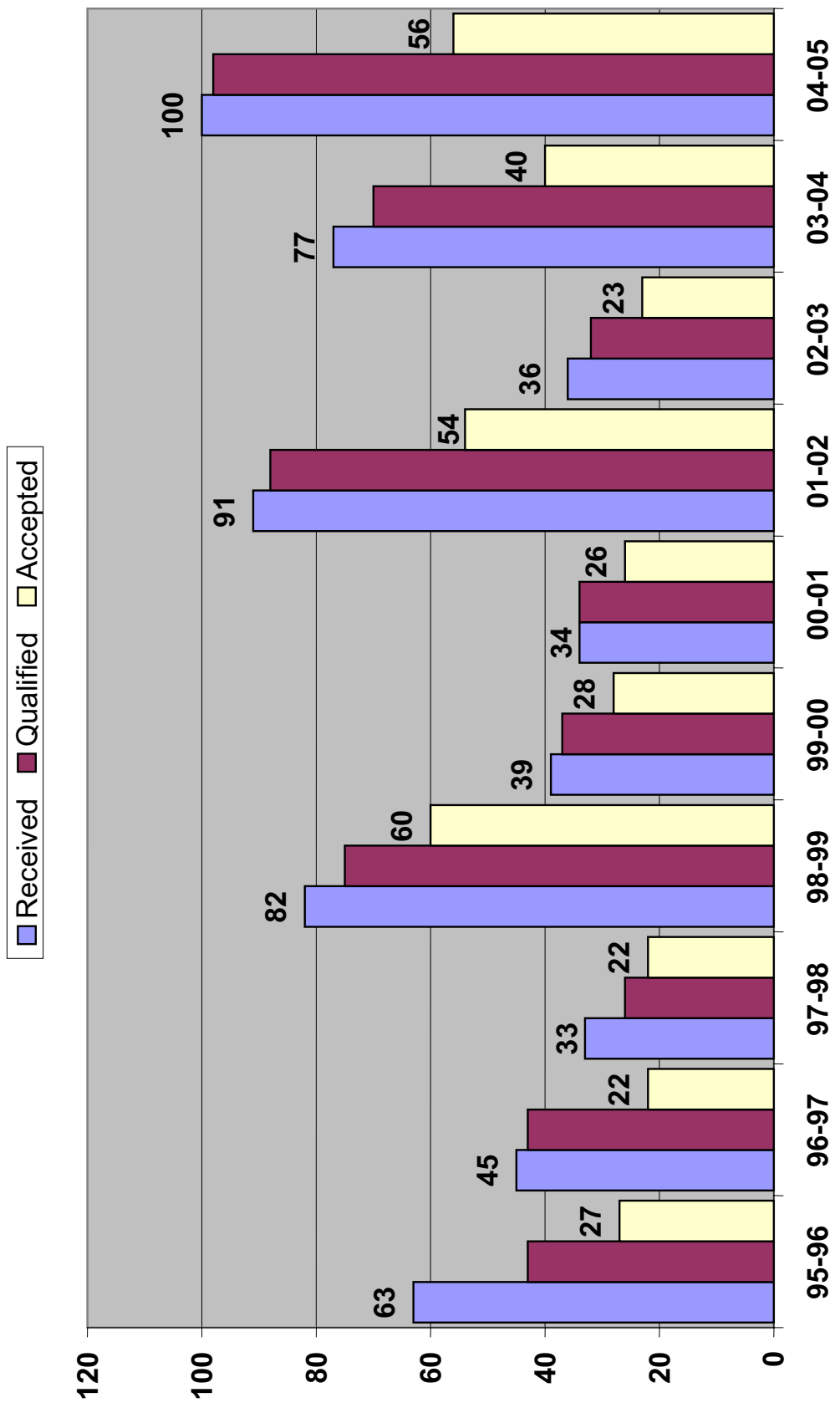

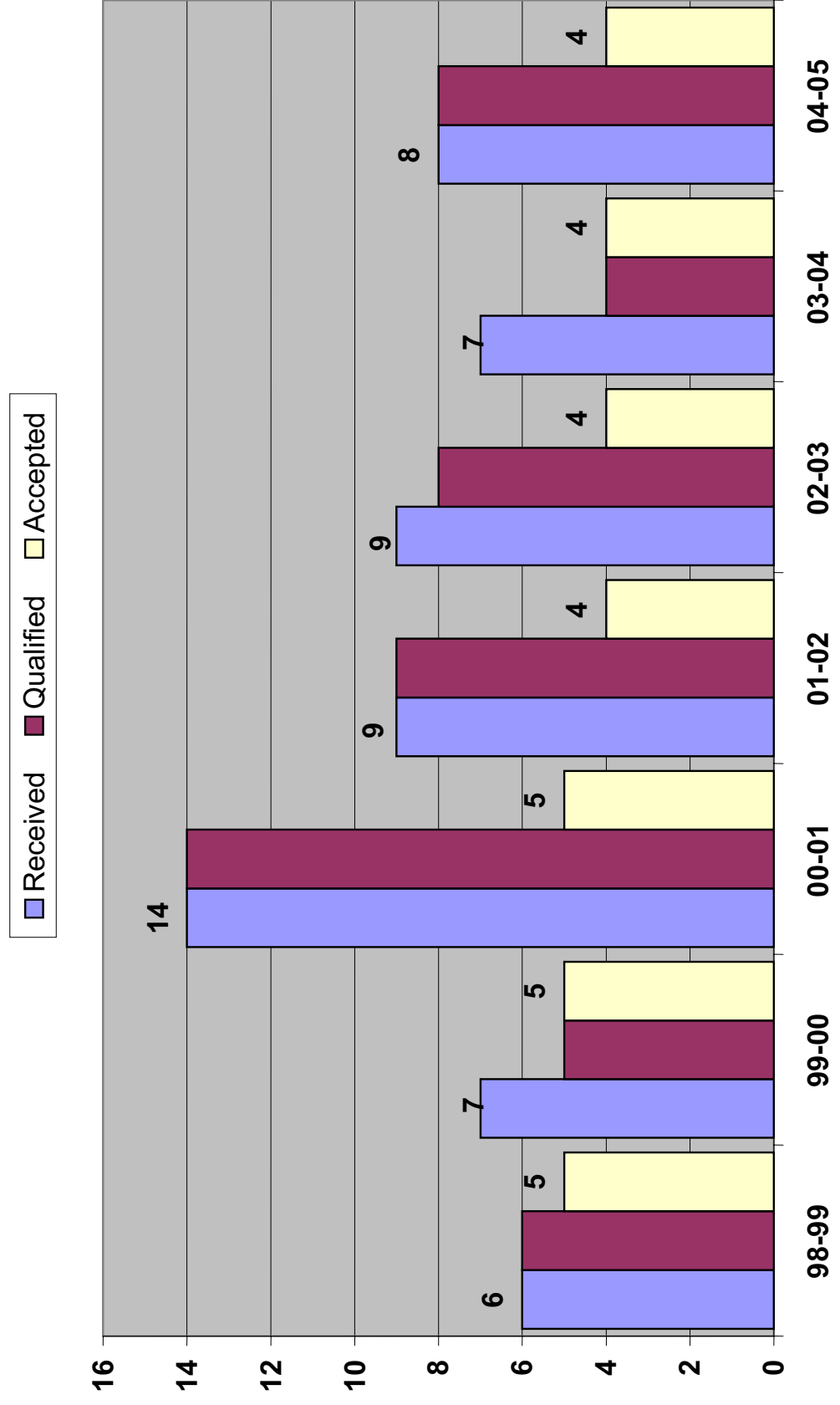

### Counseling Masters Applicants 1995-2005



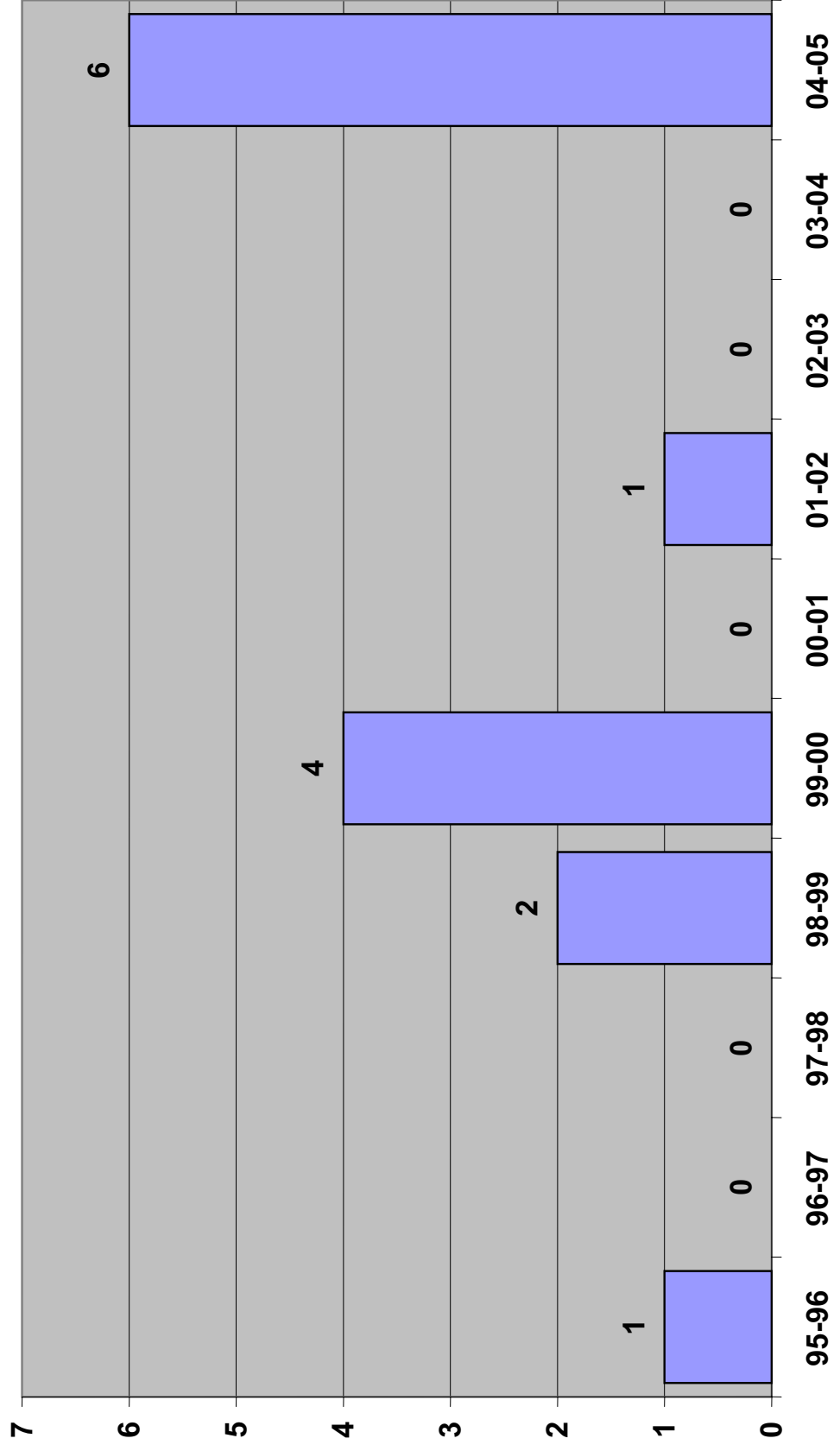

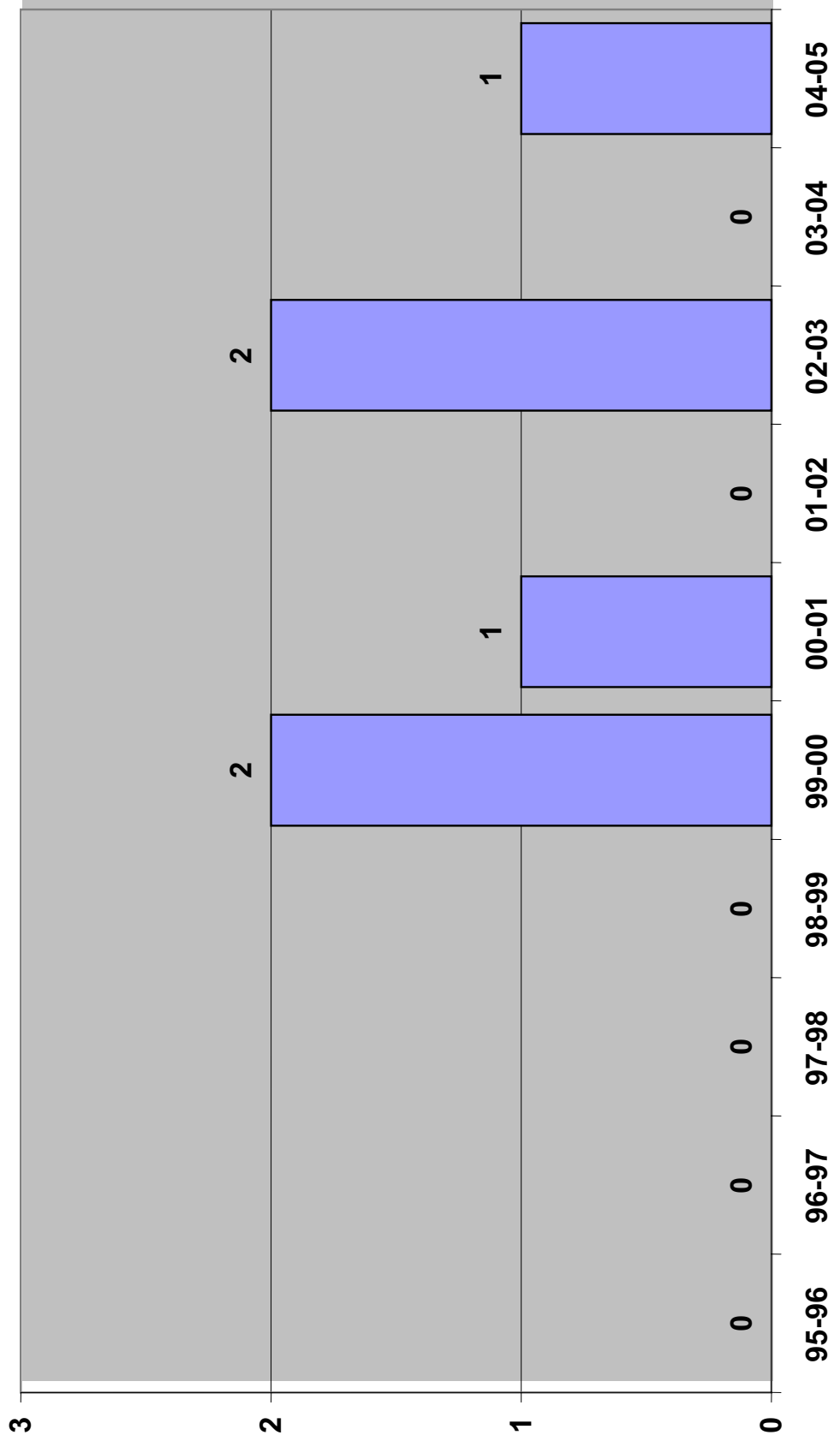

**Counseling Masters Minority Students 1995-2005**



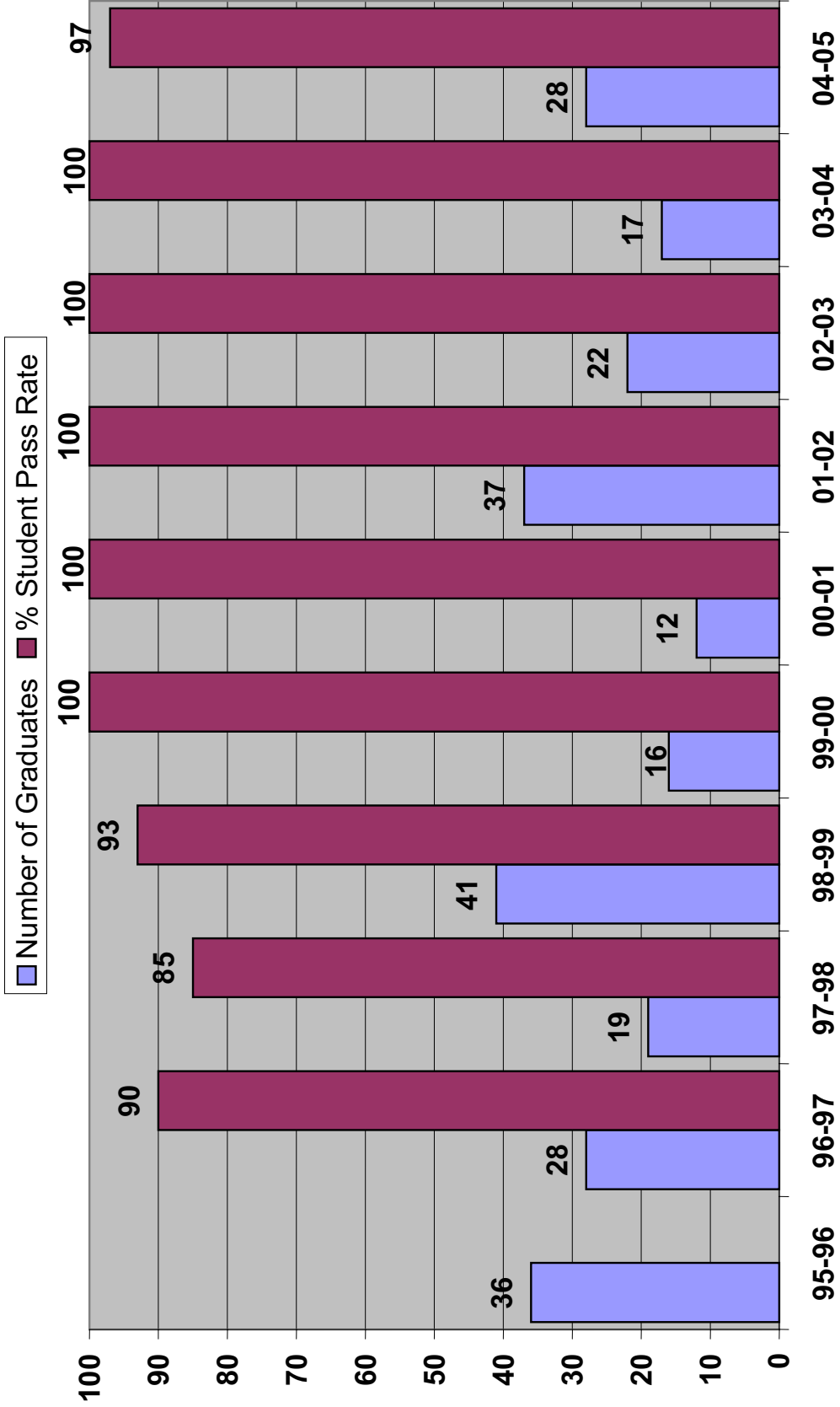

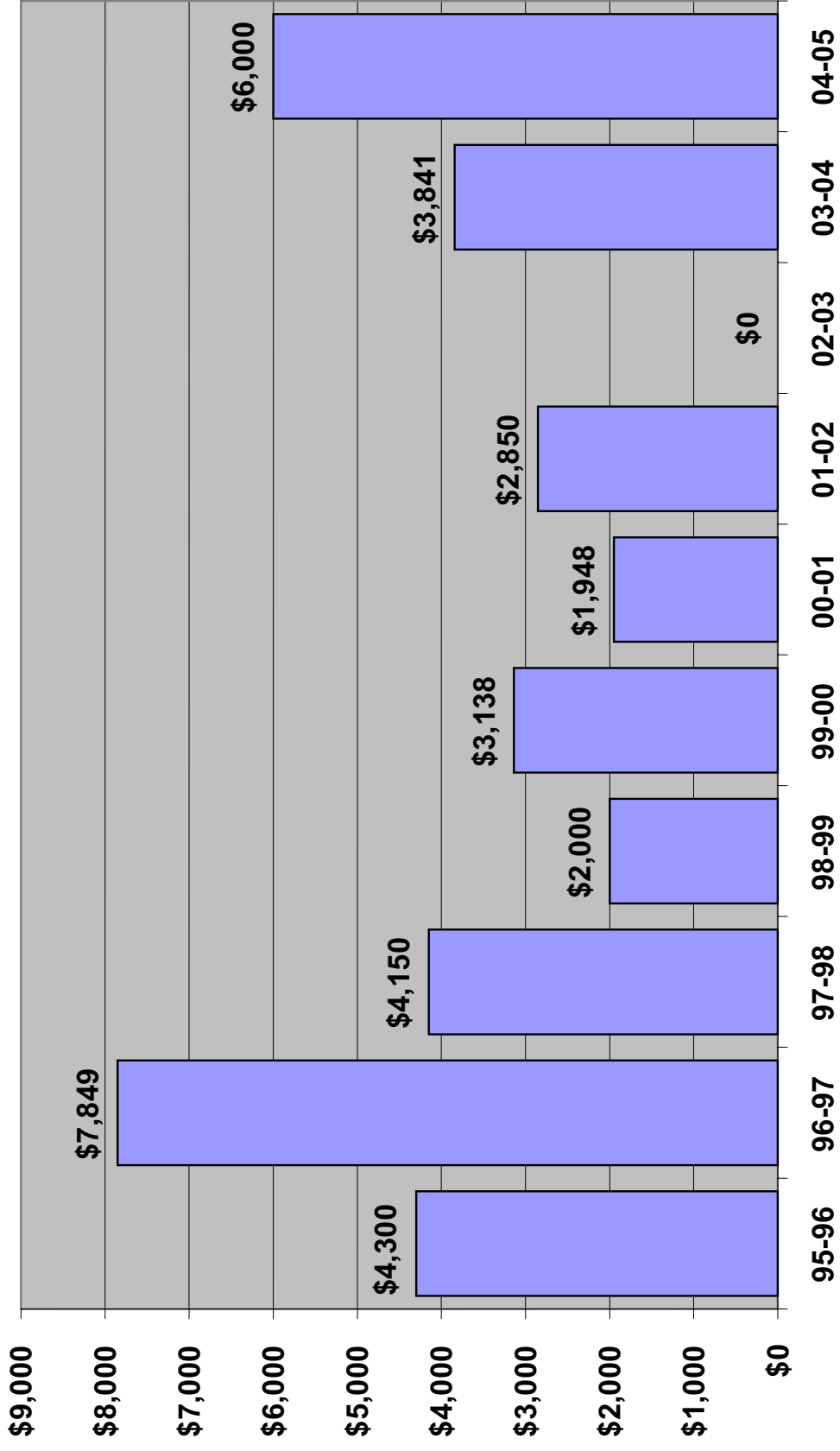

**Counseling National Exam Pass Rate 1995-2005**



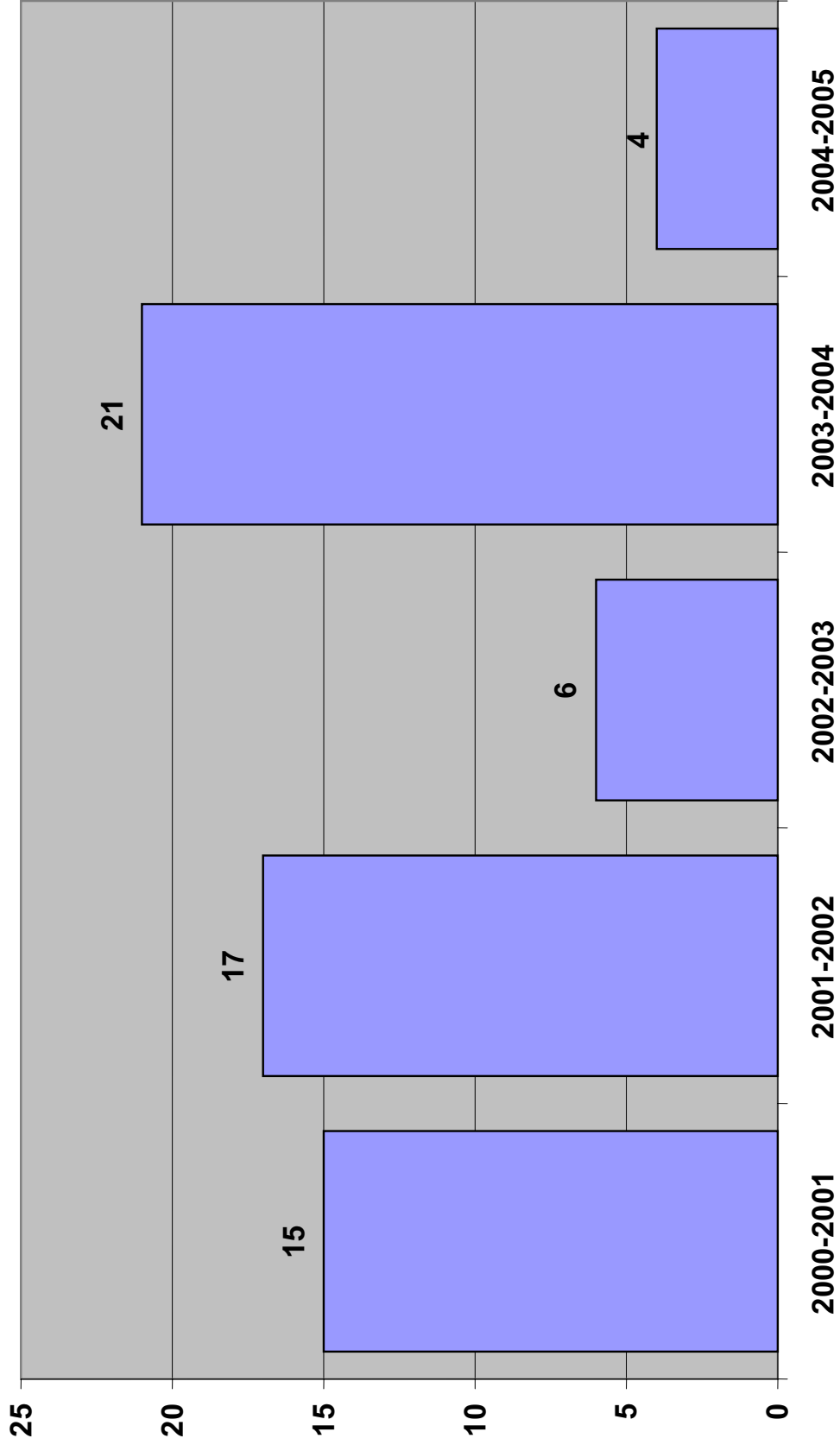

**Counseling Grant Statistics 1995-2005**



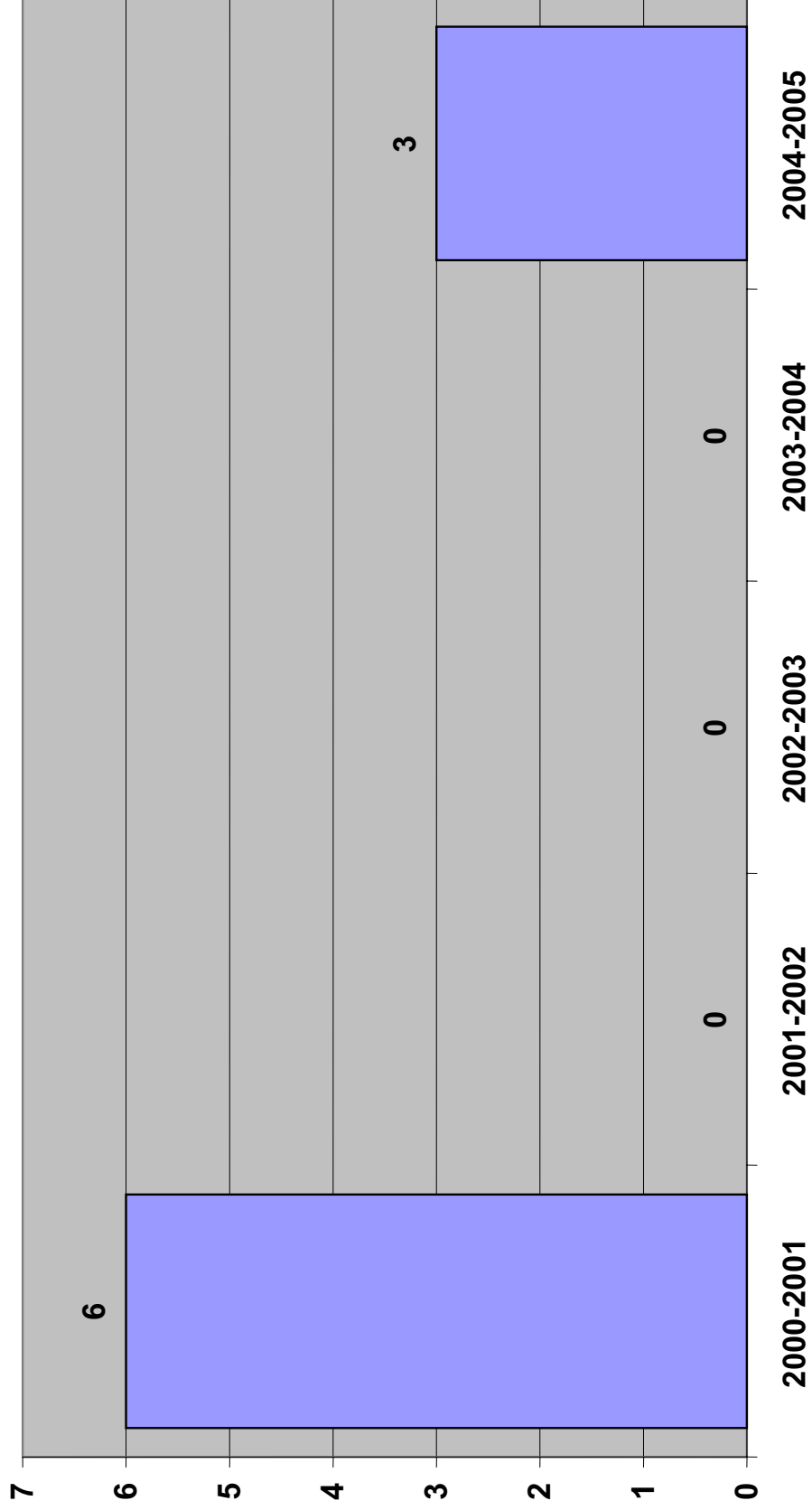

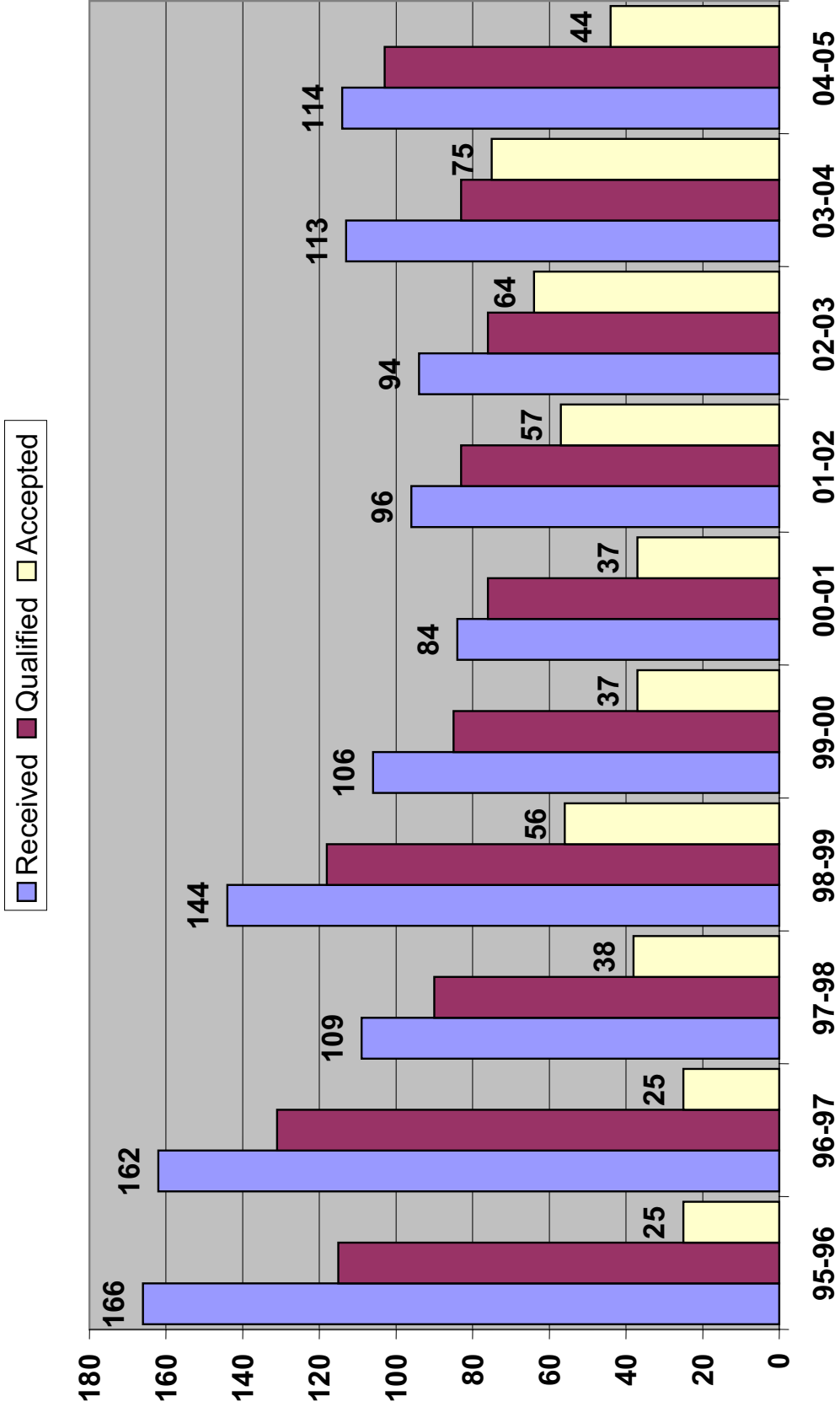

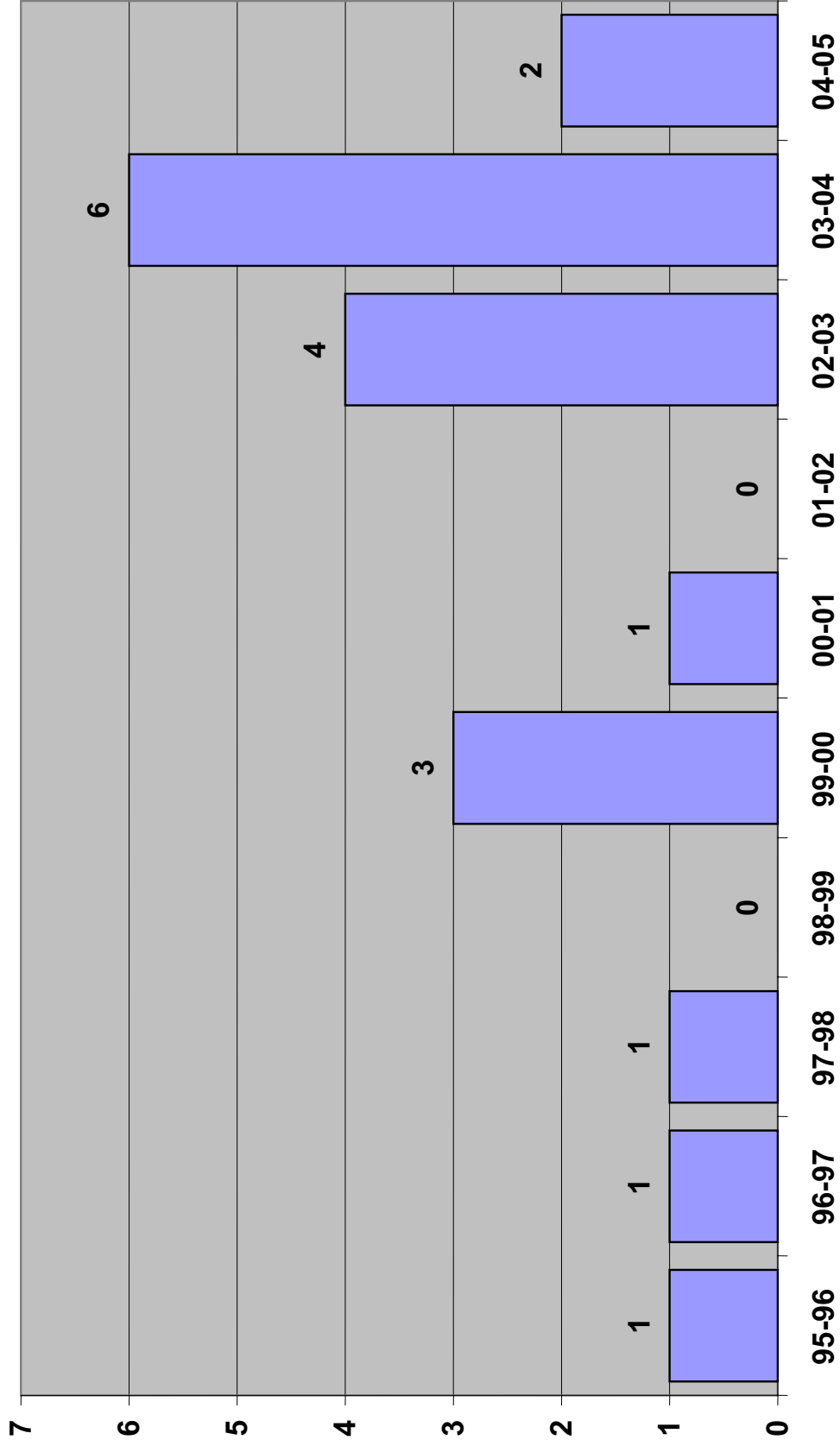

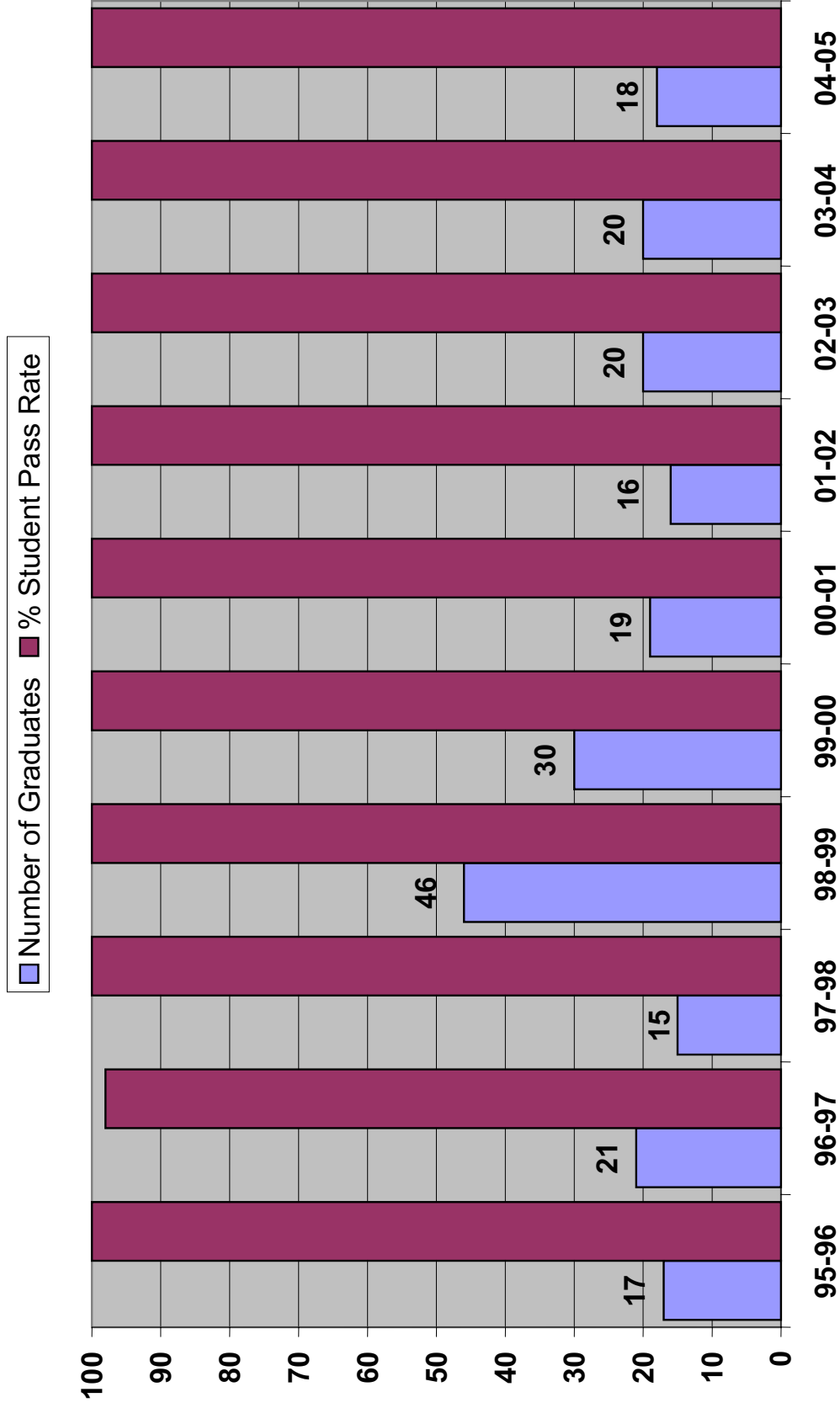

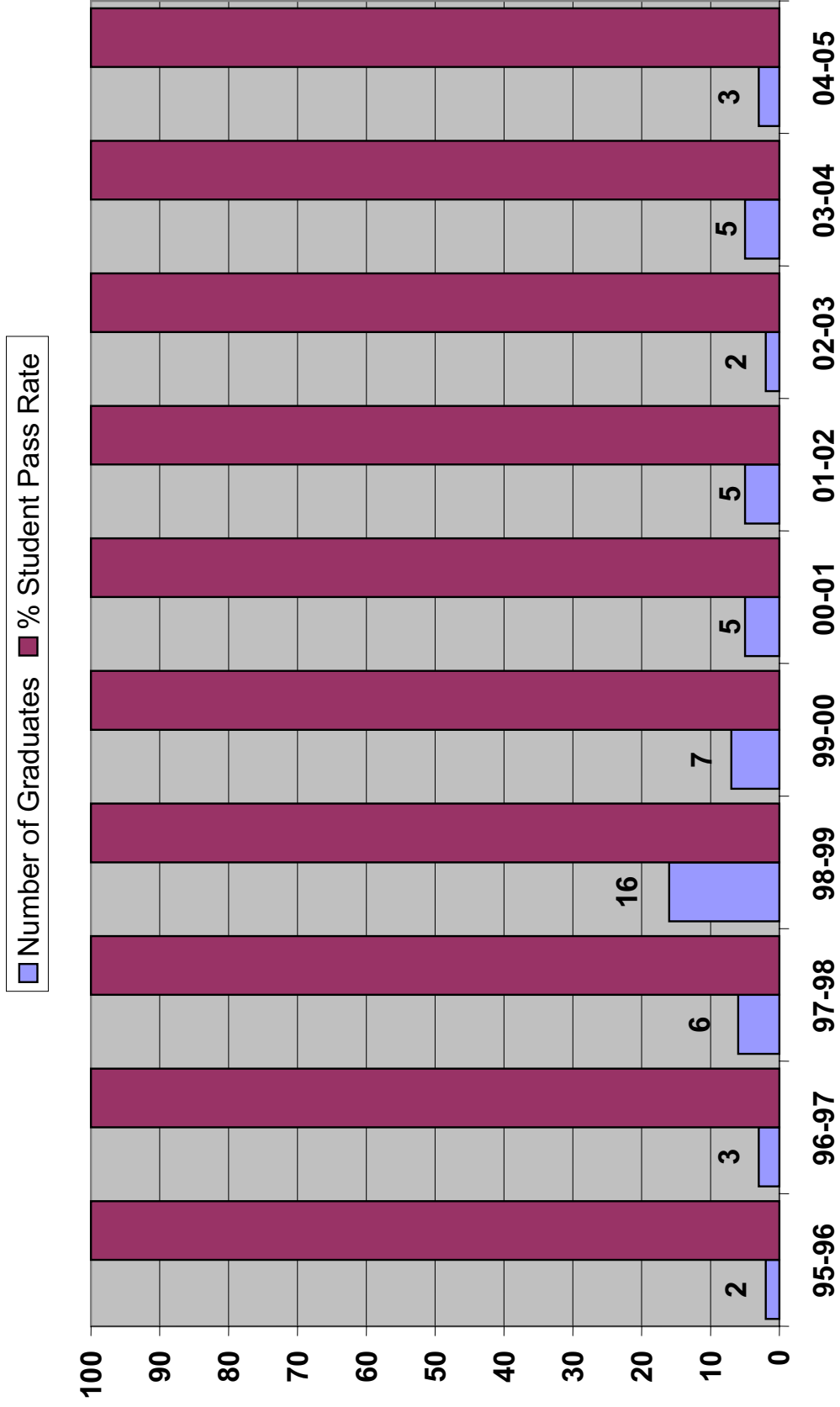

**CSED SLP National Exam Pass Rate 1995-2005**



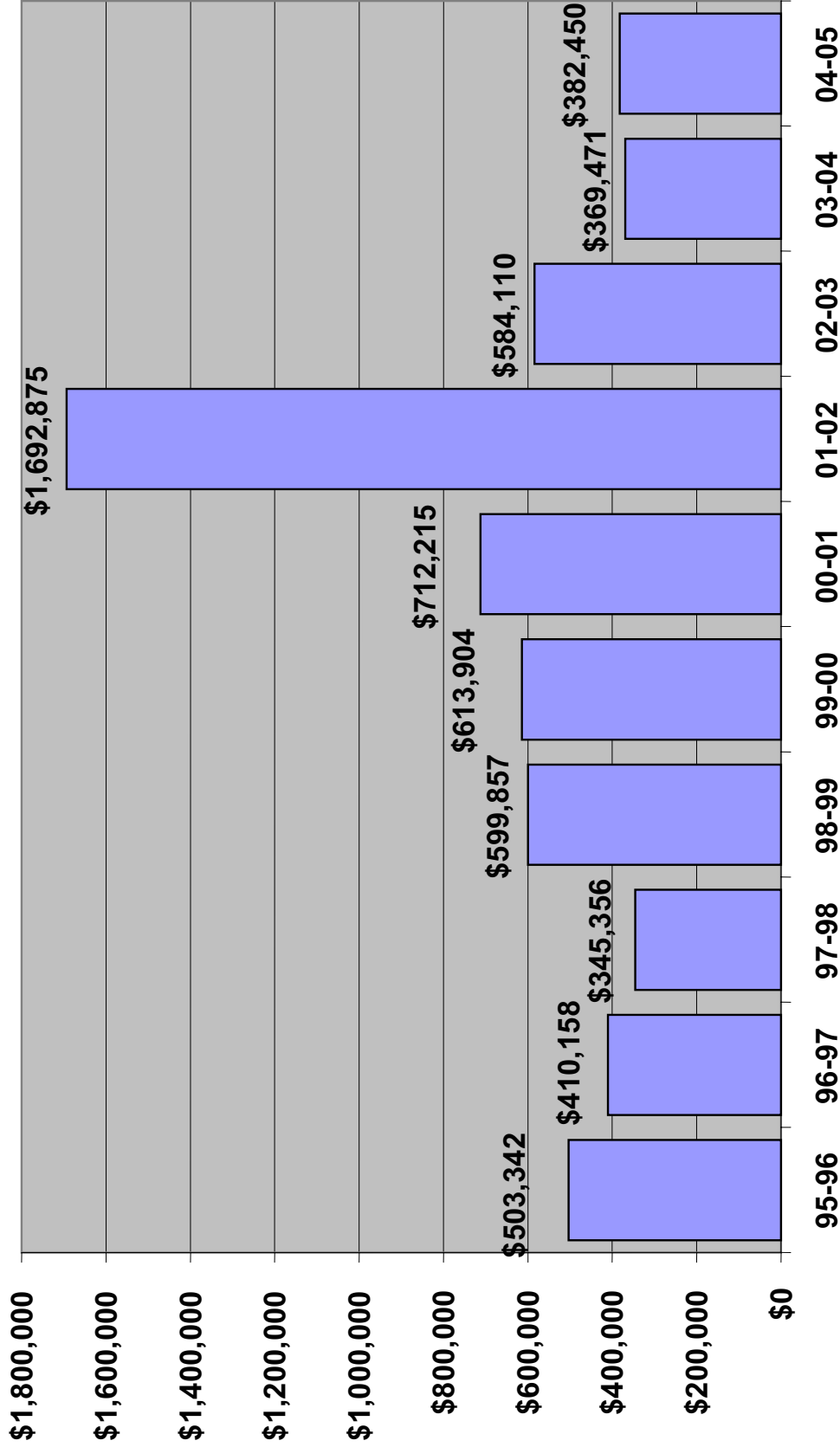

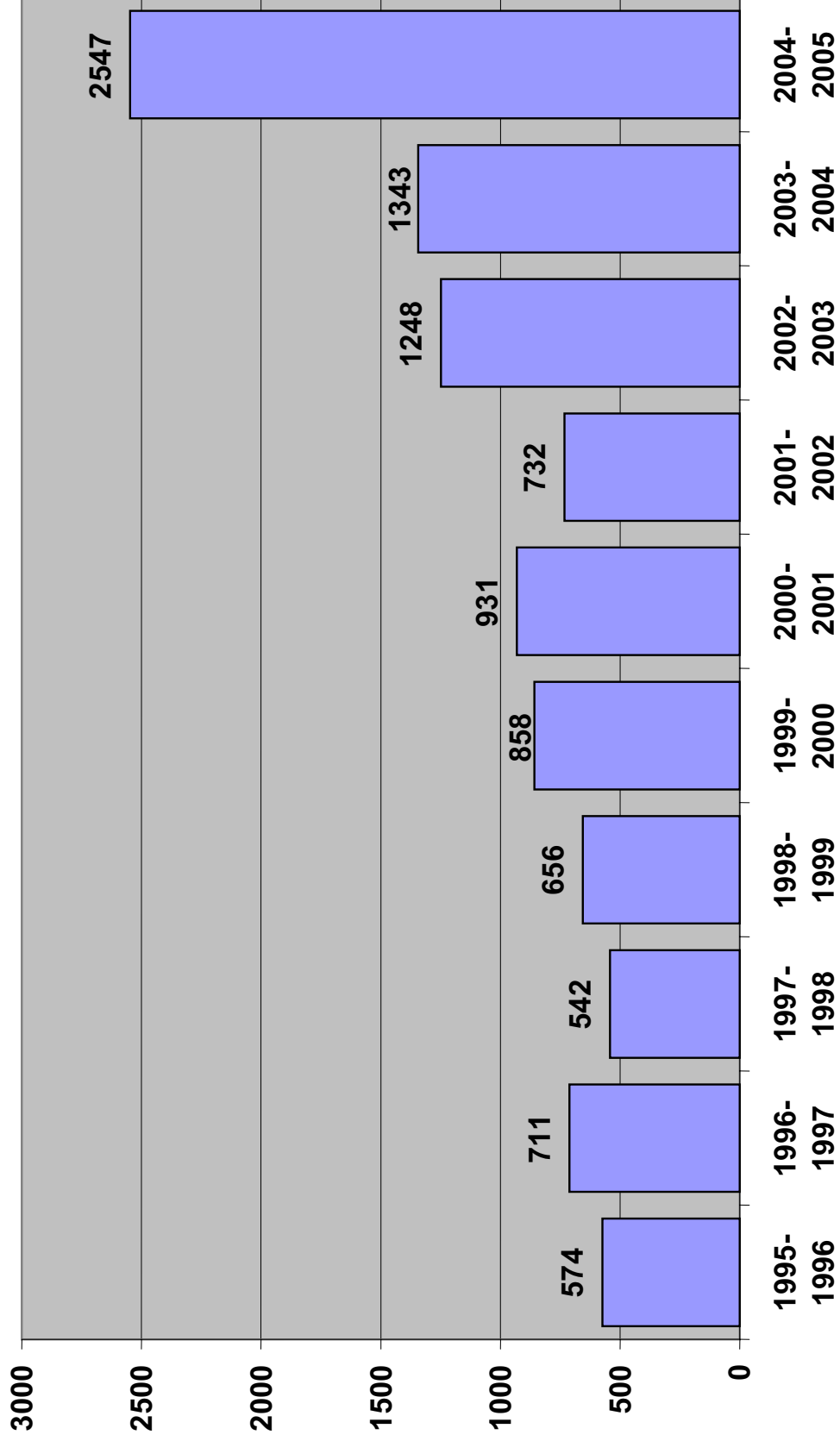

### **Special Accomplishments/Awards**

**Student** – This year's performance on the National Dental Hygiene Board Examination was once again outstanding with a 100% pass rate on the first attempt. Results of the Western Regional Examining Board (WREB) examination were also excellent. All students passed the clinical WREB exam, and the written and clinical local anesthesia examinations. One hundred percent of those students who chose to take the restorative examination passed. Idaho State University students continue to be highly ranked among participants from the eleven states involved in the WREB examination.

**Department** – The Department also was successful in obtaining a second federal initiative to further develop the graduate program. With State Board approval and receipt of federal funding, a new Master of Science Dental Hygiene degree is being developed. Two faculty members and clerical staff have been approved and funded through the grant. The new program will accept students in July of 2005.

The Dental Hygiene Department continues to be a nationally recognized program for its excellence. Evidence of this is apparent by the high student performance on national written and regional clinical board examinations as well as faculty professional involvement at local, state, regional, and national levels. Faculty members continue to be invited presenters and committee members at all levels of our profession.

## **FACULTY HIGHLIGHTS: Research And Creative/Scholarly Activity**

**Carole Christie, MCouns, Denise Bowen, RDH, MS, and Carlene Paarmann, RDH, MEd** are conducting research in the area of developing student competency in ethical reasoning and professional responsibility. Some results of these on-going studies have been published in two articles in the Journal of Dental Education. The authors have been selected to present a faculty development workshop on this contemporary issue at the annual session of the American Dental Educators' Association in March, 2006

**Ellen Rogo and Jacque Freudenthal** are conducting a longitudinal study to determine the relationship of entering students' performance on their critical thinking and manual dexterity tests, when measured against a variety of program outcome measures. Results of this study will be of significant benefit to the Department of Dental Hygiene as they continue to evaluate and revise admissions criteria.

**Kristin Calley & Kathleen Hodges** conducted a survey and analyzed data of licensed Idaho dental hygienists regarding various professional issues that are significant to the advancement of dental hygiene. The resultant paper and report, "Professional Issues and Demographics Survey" were presented at several professional dental meetings throughout the state of Idaho. A grant for this research was awarded from the American Dental Hygienists' Association.

**Denise Bowen, RDH, MS**, is currently on sabbatical leave and in the process of co-authoring a new research textbook, "Research Methods for Health Professionals: Perspectives and Practical Approaches." Publication is anticipated by the first quarter of 2006.

**Kristin Calley** authored a chapter in the latest edition of a premiere dental hygiene text due to be published in 2006: *Dental Hygiene Process of Care*, Chapter 12 in Mosby's *Comprehensive Review of Dental Hygiene* 6<sup>th</sup> Ed. Darby, ML Ed. CV Mosby C.: St Louis.

**Carlene Paarmann, RDH, MEd**, has signed an agreement with Lippincott Williams and Wilkins to publish *Pain Control for Dental Practitioners*, with publication expected in the spring of 2006. The 2-disk set of CD ROMs and the *Supplementary Clinical Manual* were developed in response to a need for comprehensive, up-to-date educational materials for the administration of local anesthesia that are compatible with today's technology and styles of teaching and learning. The CDs also can be used in distance education and continuing education courses.

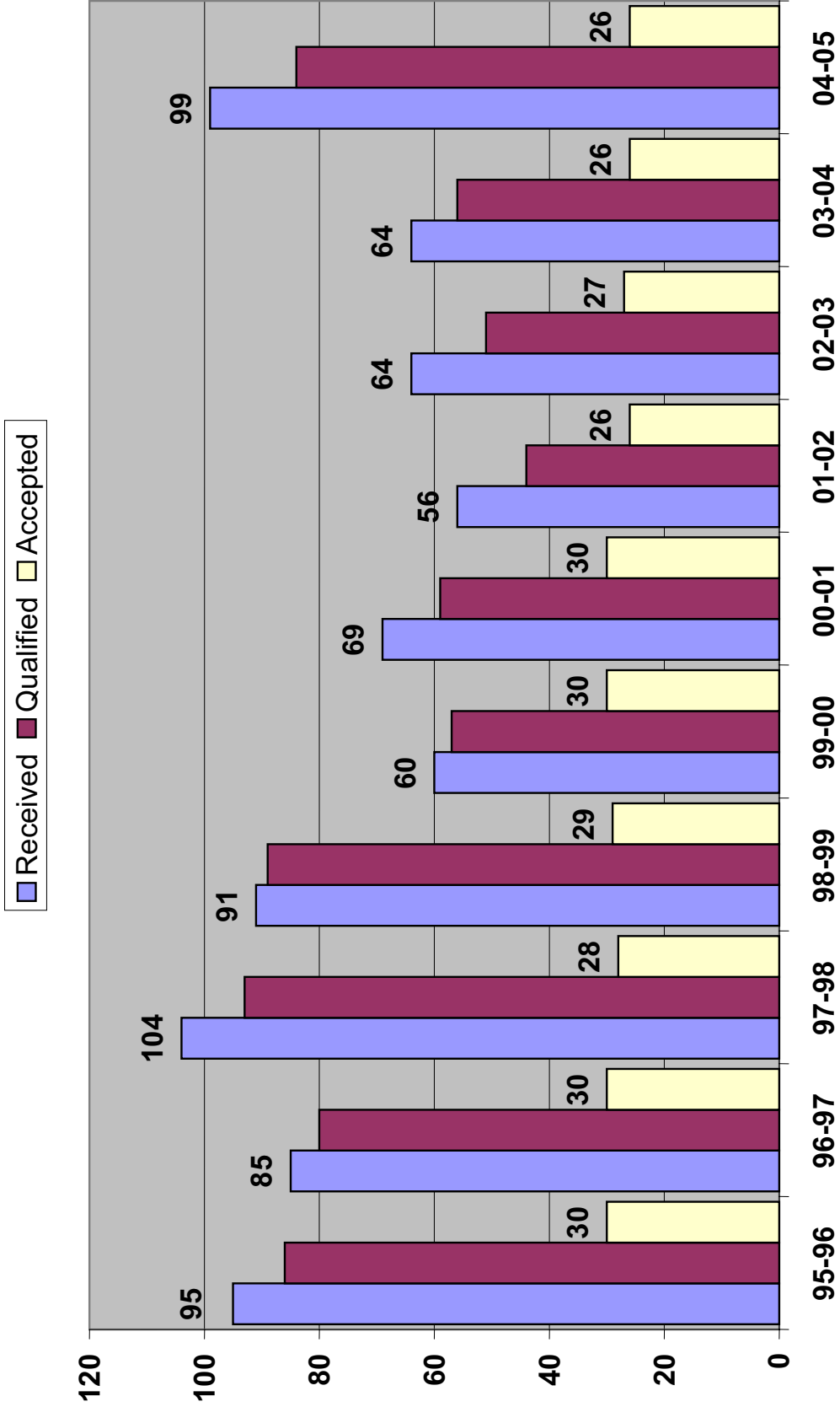

They recently submitted an article for publication to *Medical Teacher* entitled "The Faculty Learning Community for Teaching Evidence-Based Practice: An Interdisciplinary Approach." Additionally, Ms. Rogo is currently collecting data on senior dental hygiene students' use of evidence-based practice and the Internet to enhance patient care.

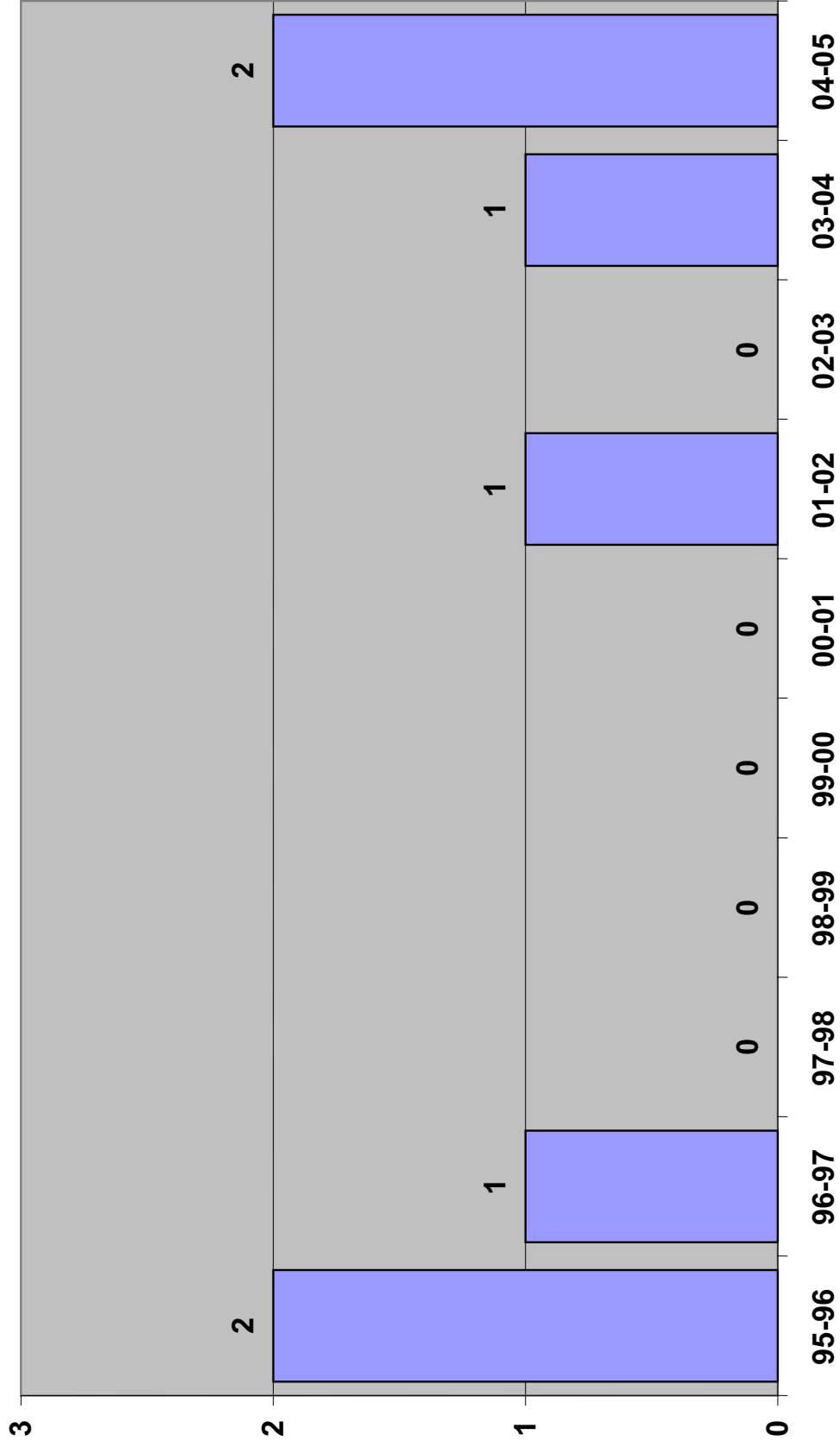

# Dental Hygiene Applicants 1995-2005



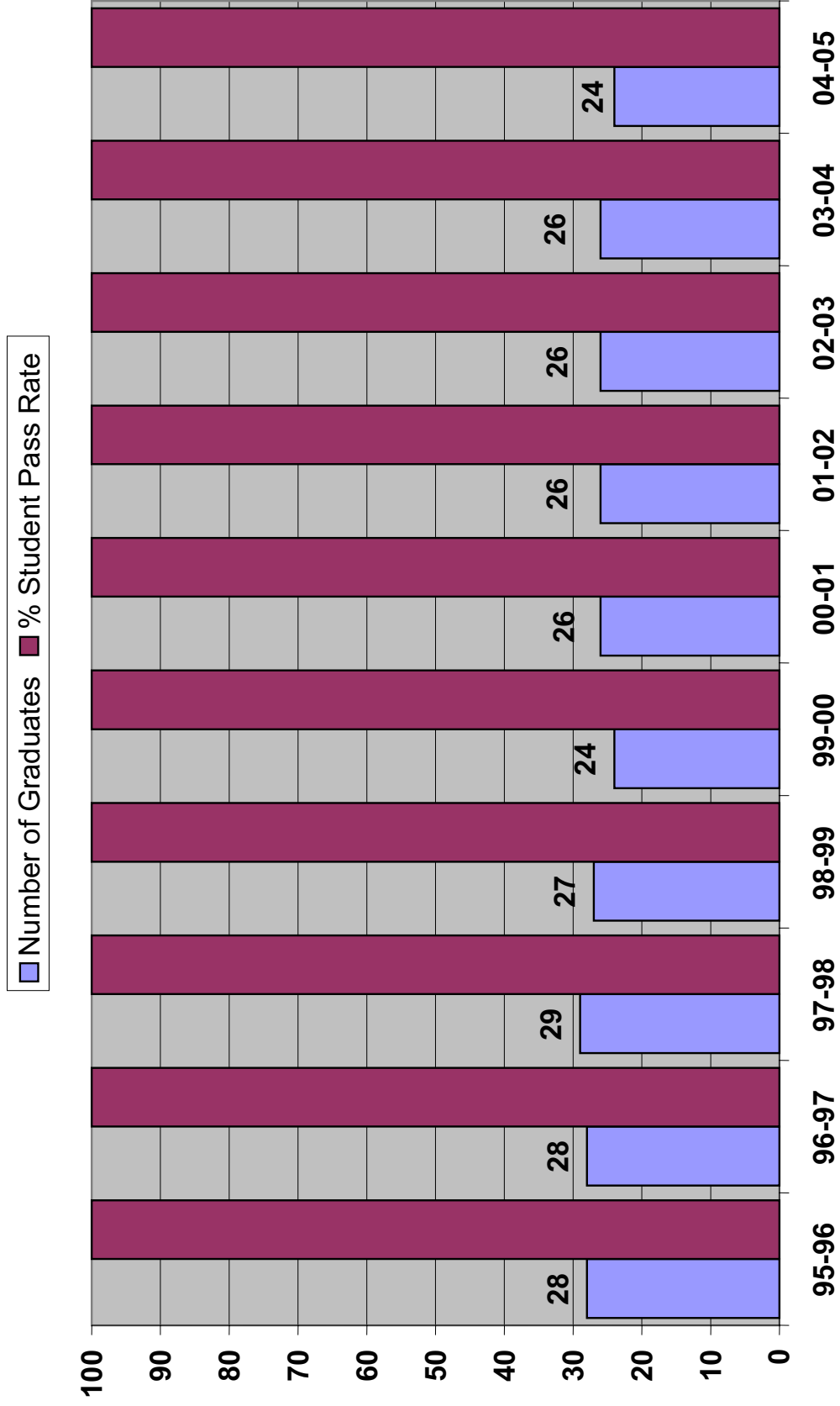

### Dental Hygiene Minority Students 1995-2005



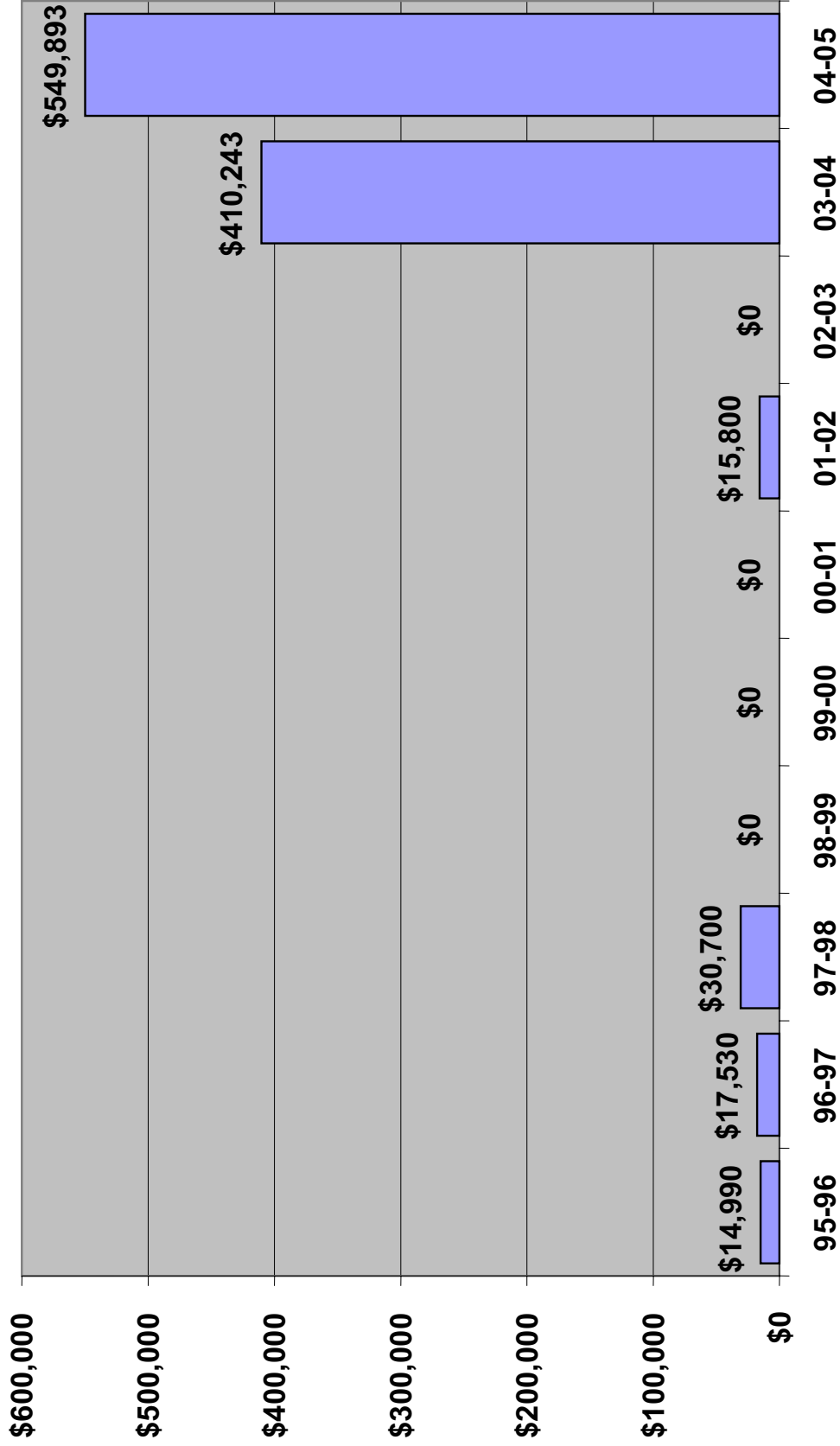

### Dental Hygiene National Exam Pass Rate 1995-2005



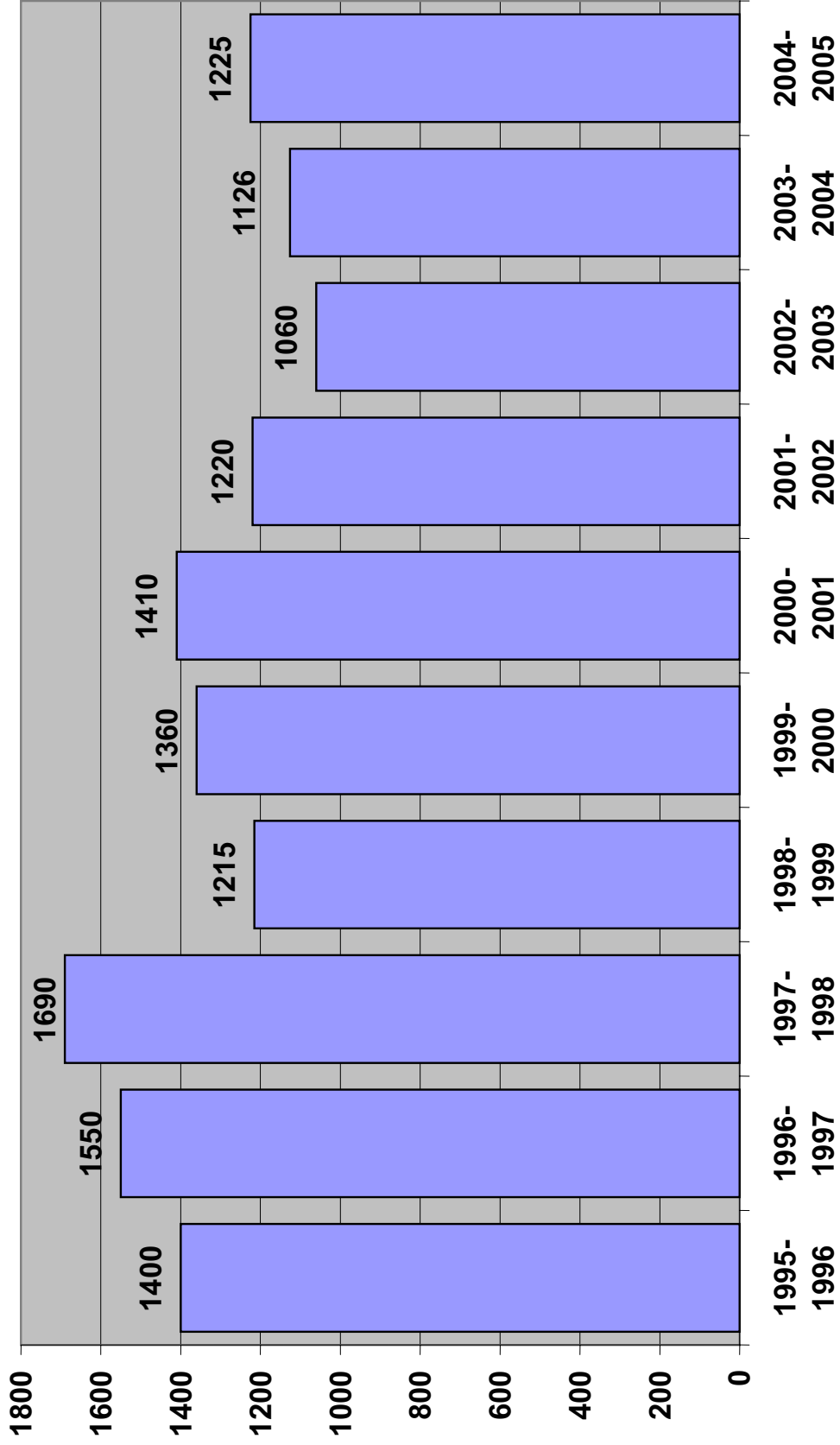

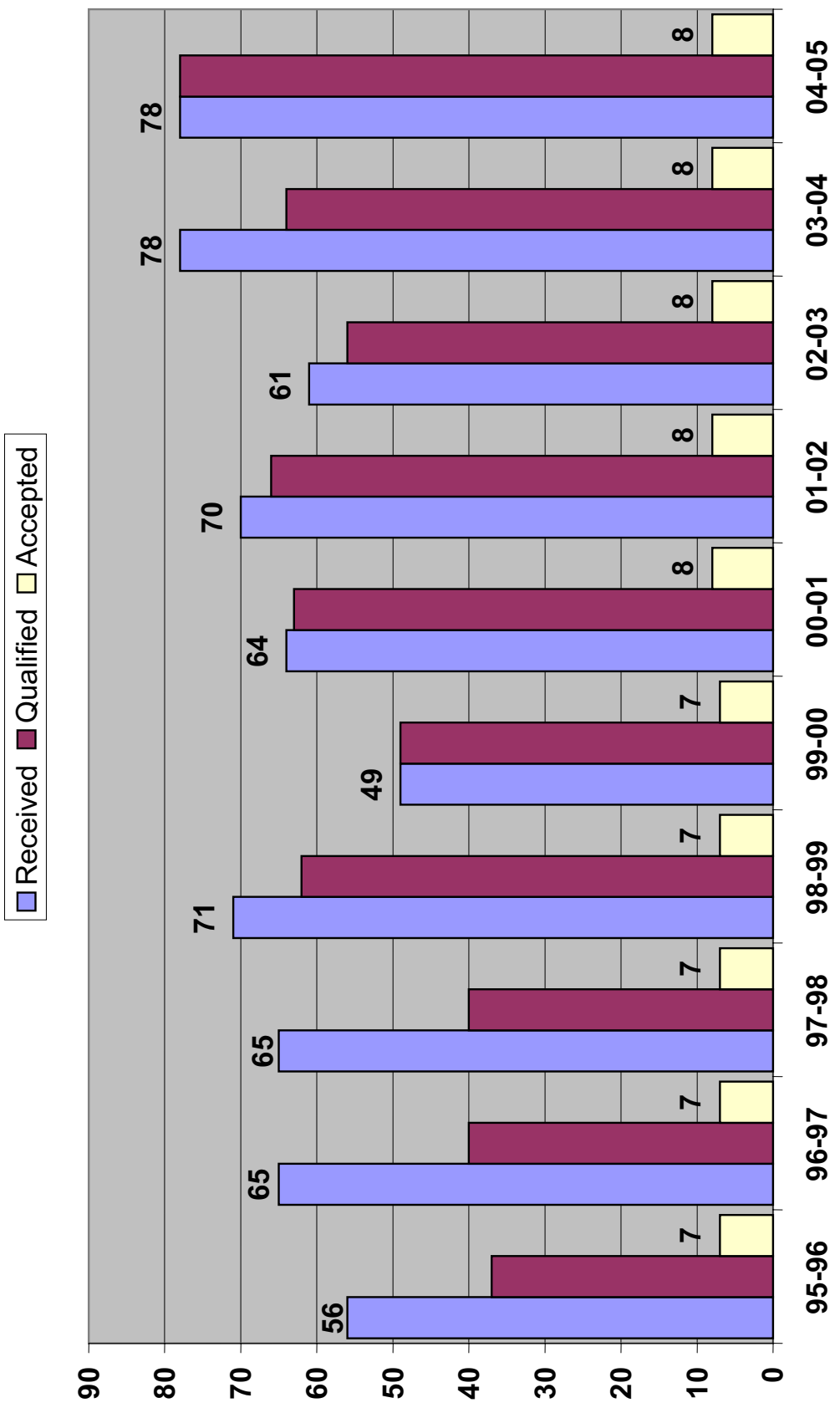

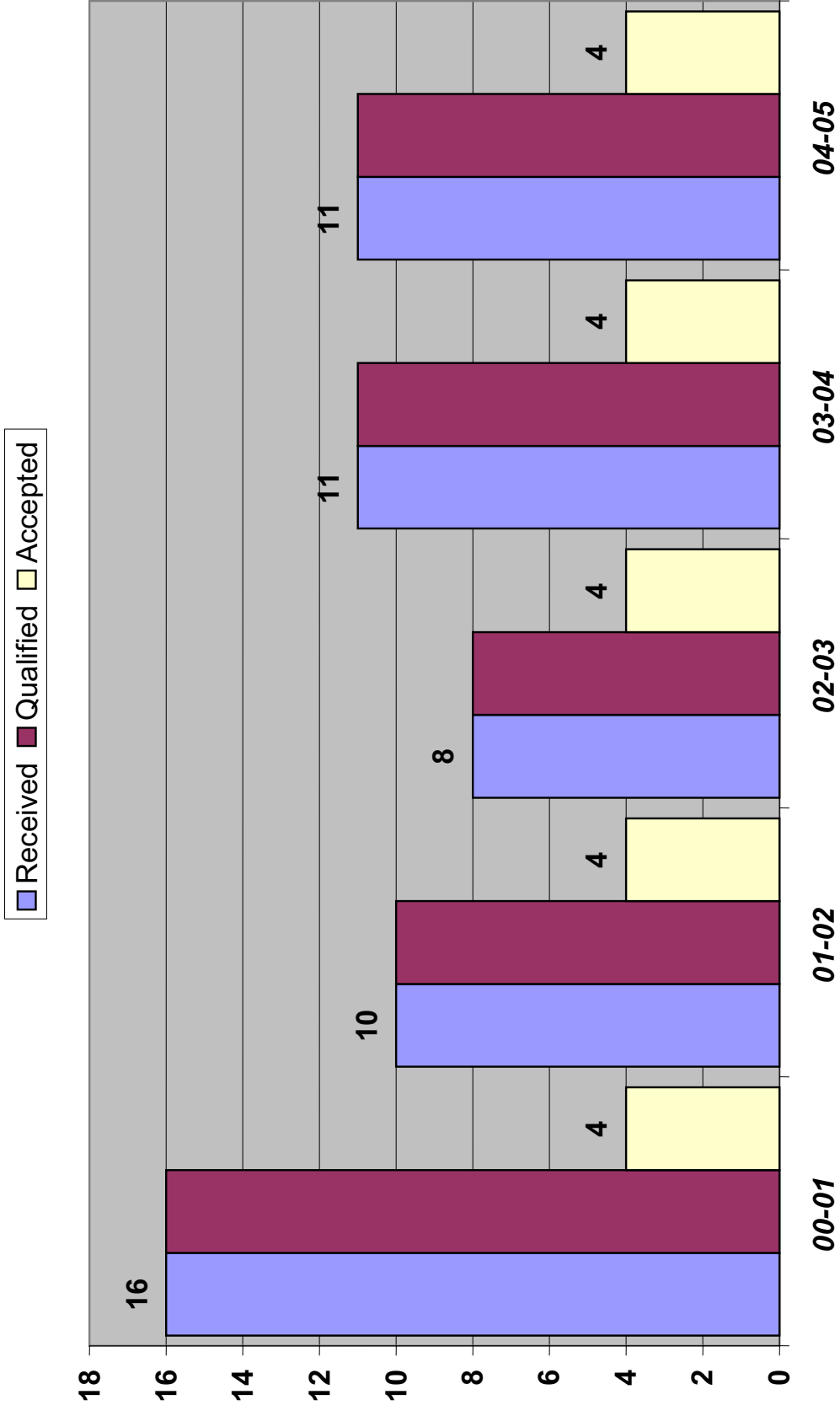

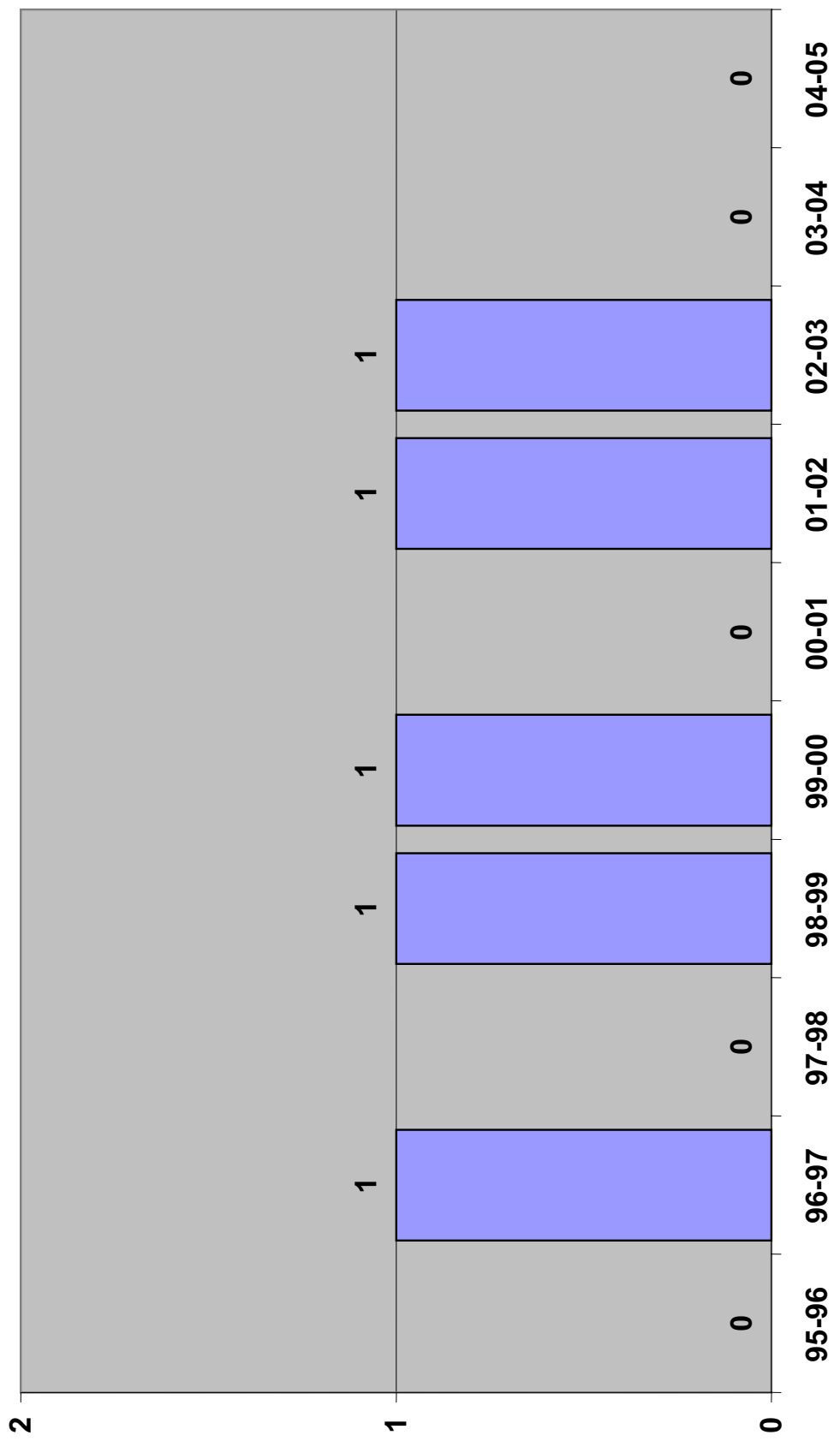

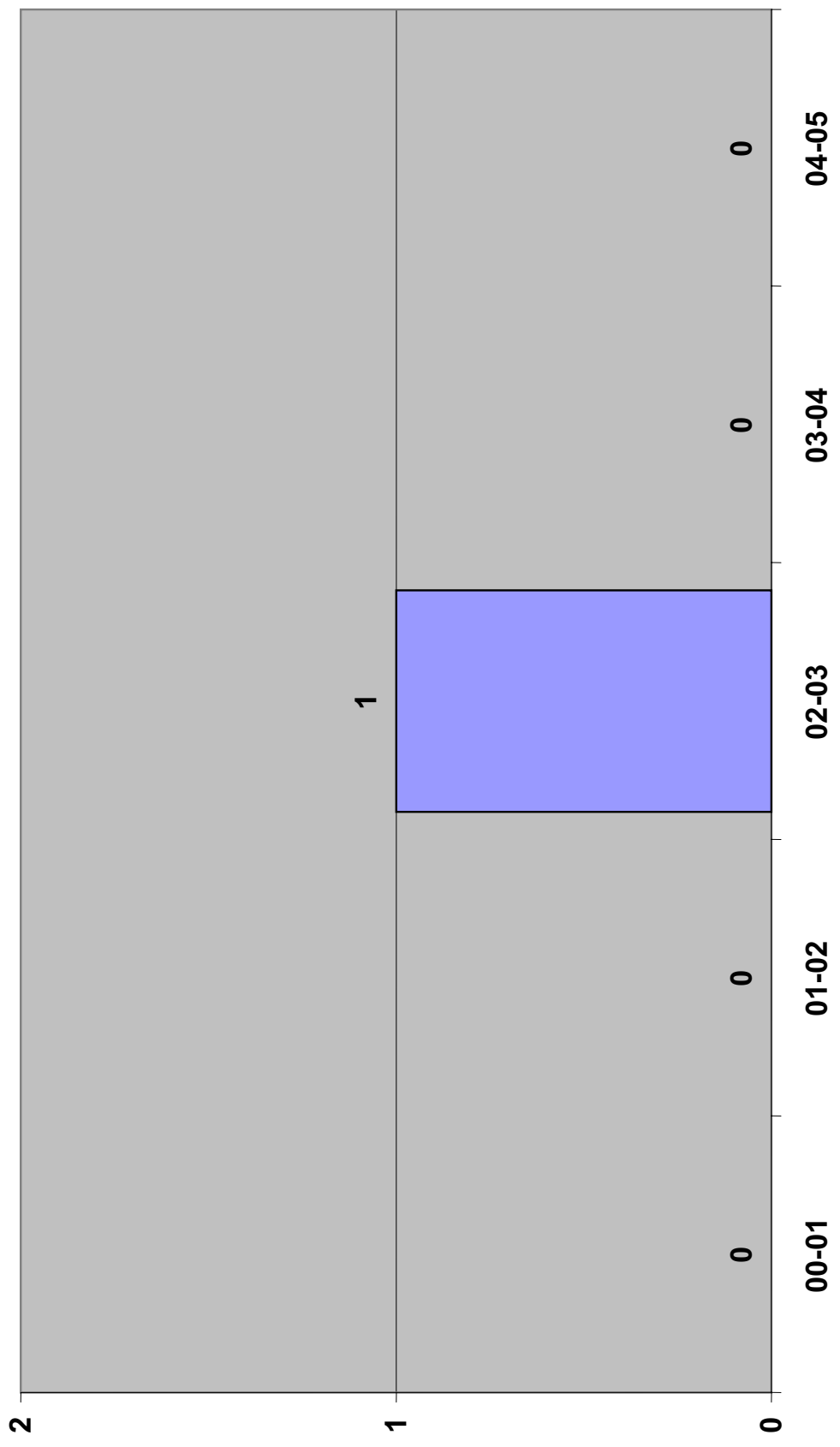

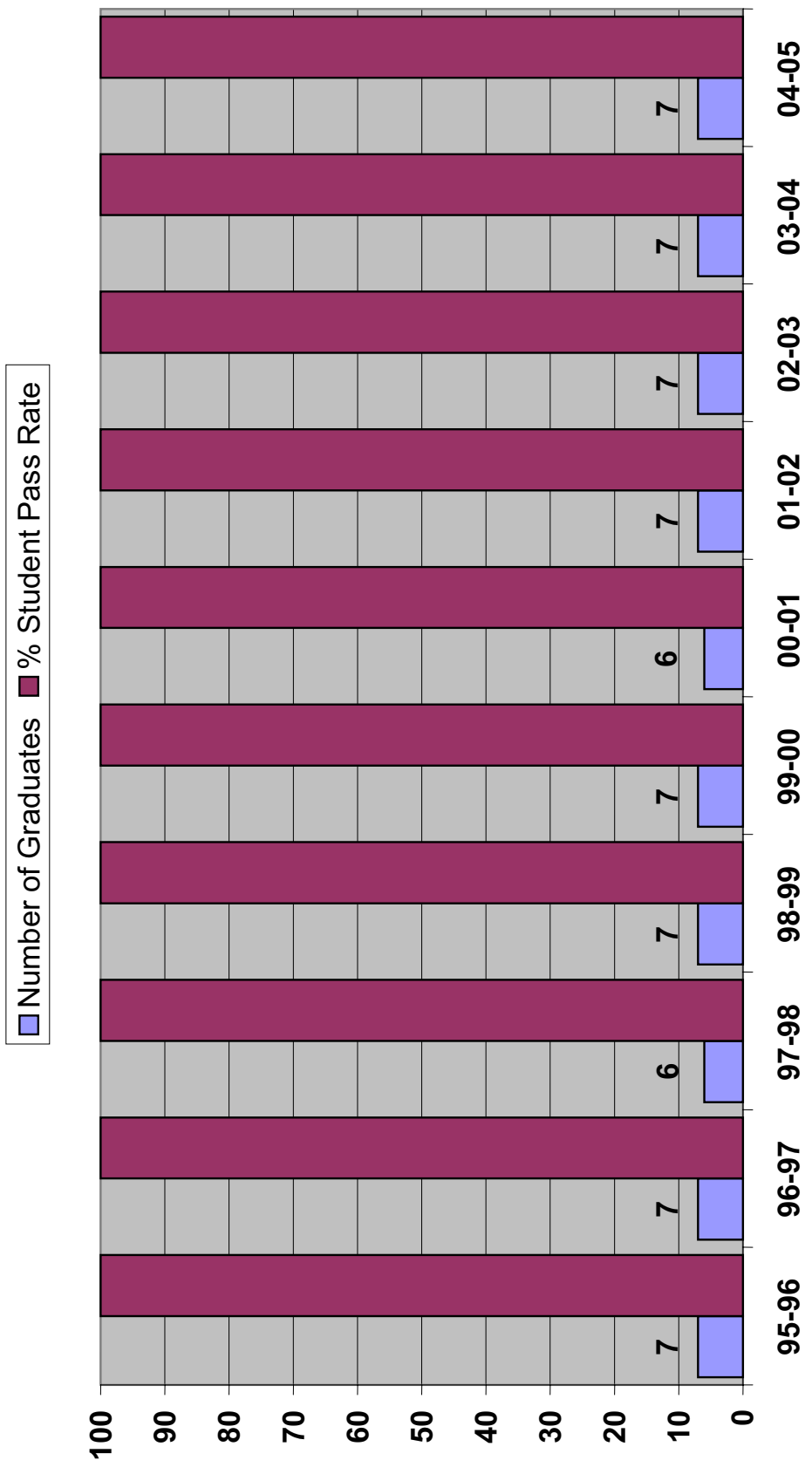

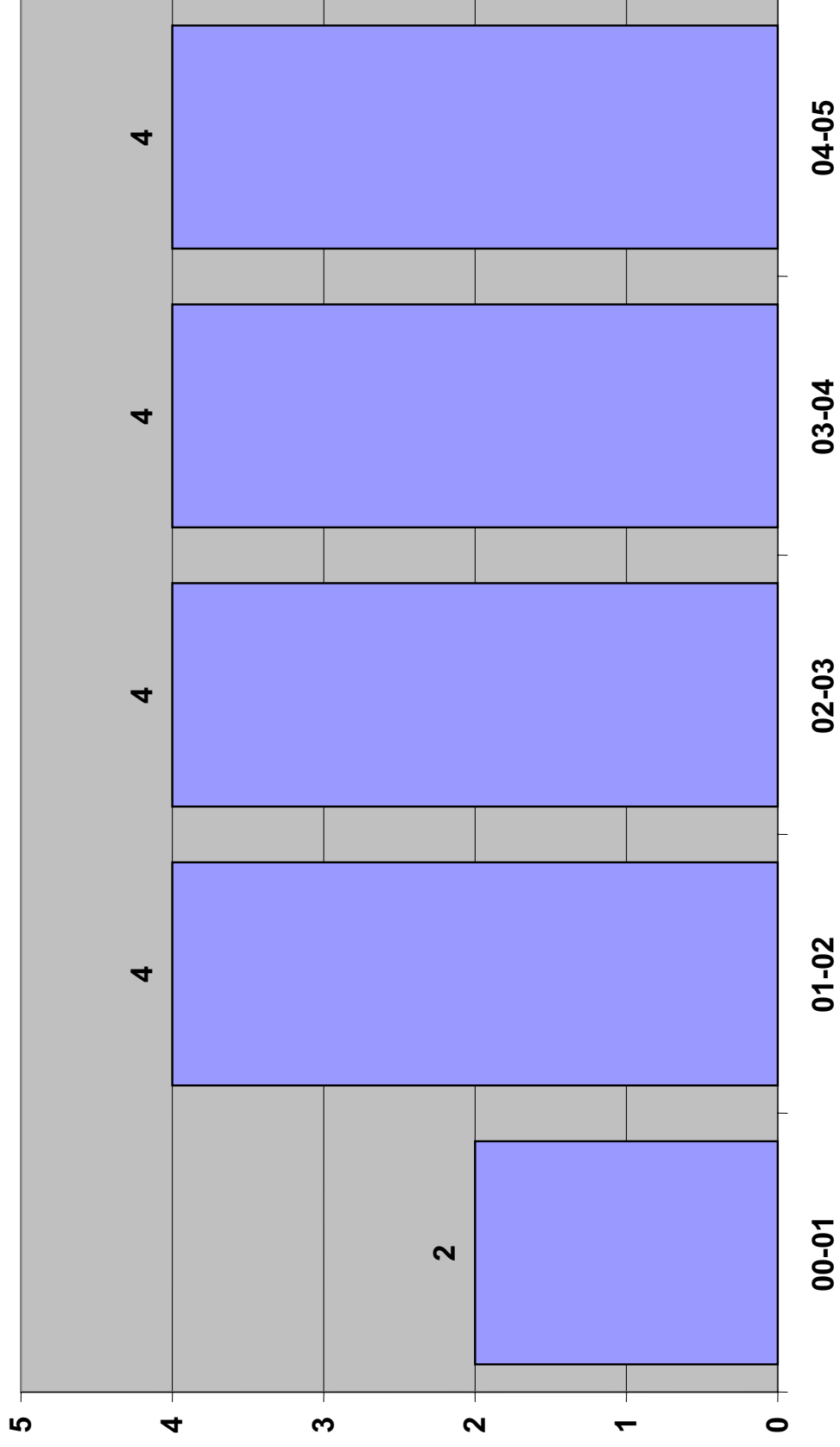

### Dental Sciences IDEP National Exam Pass Rate 1995-2005



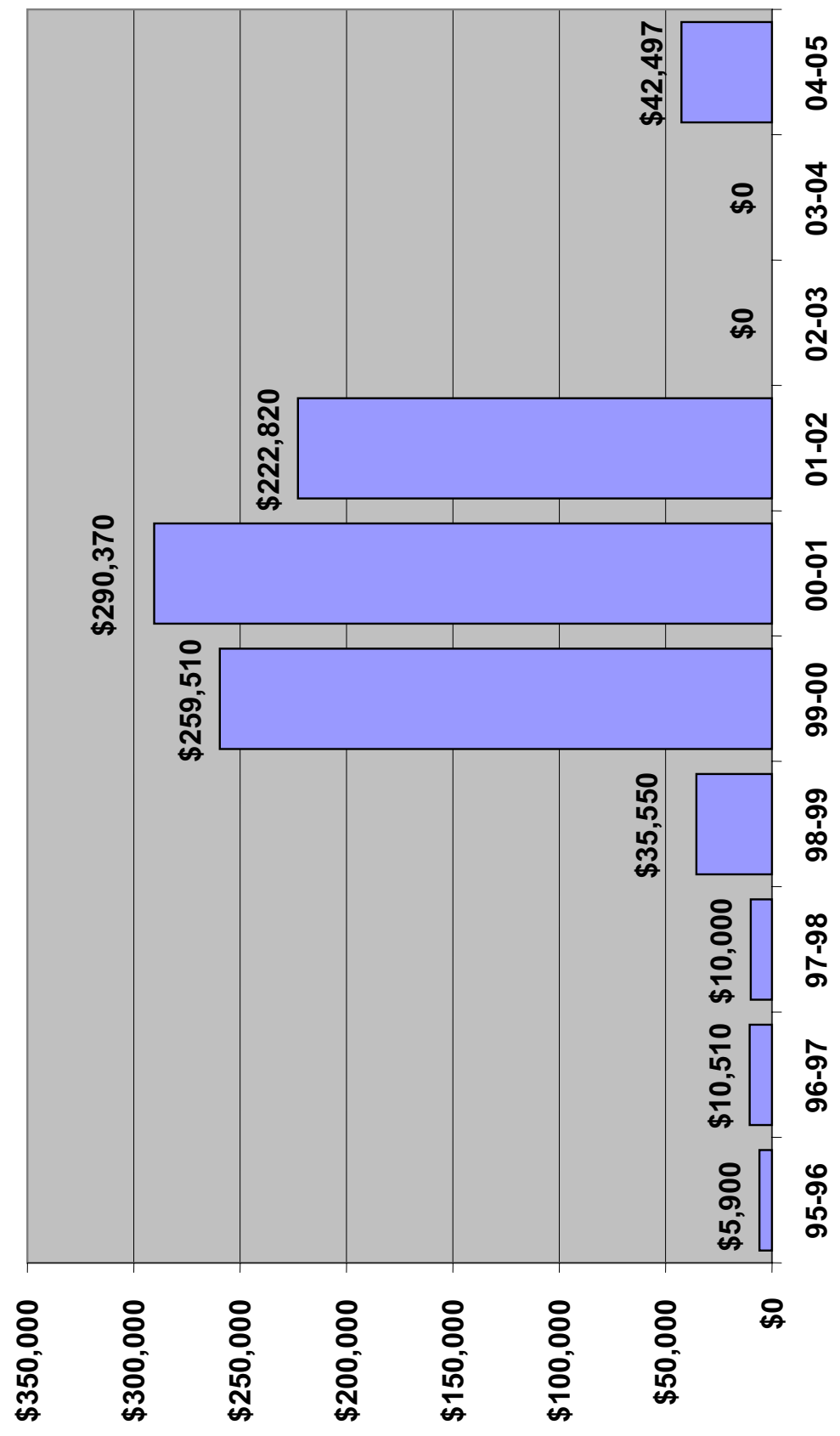

### Dental Sciences IAGD Number of Graduates 2000-2005



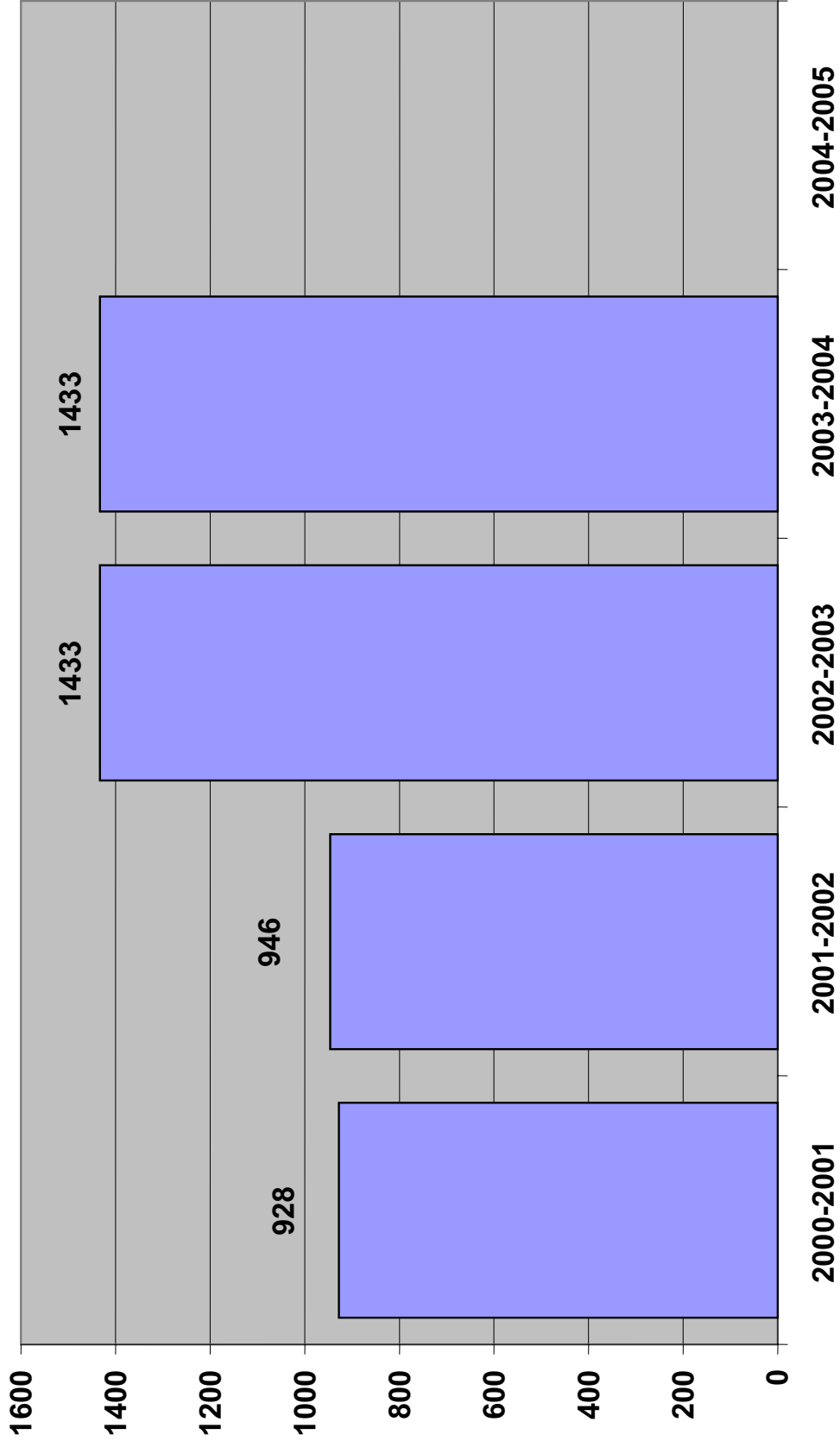

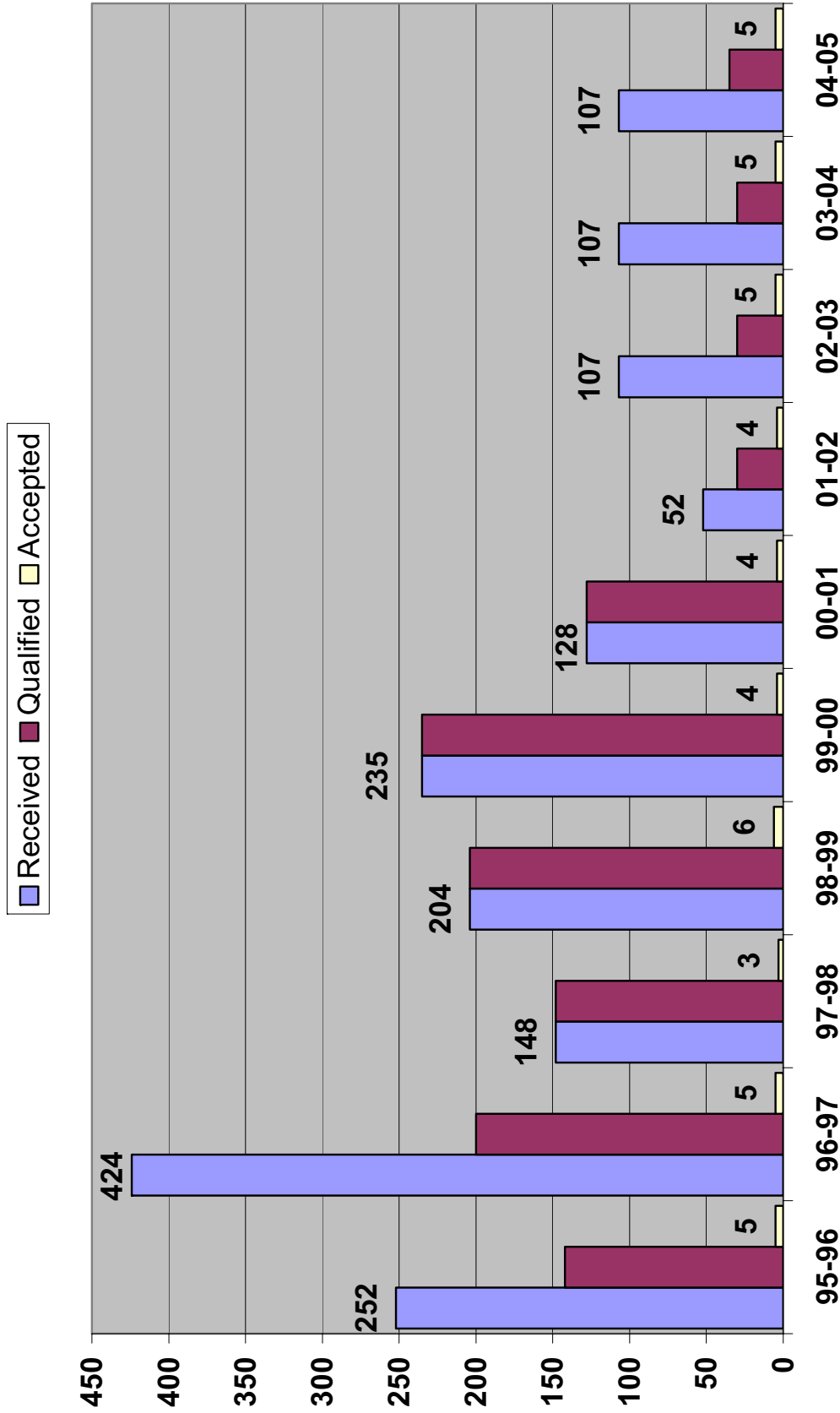

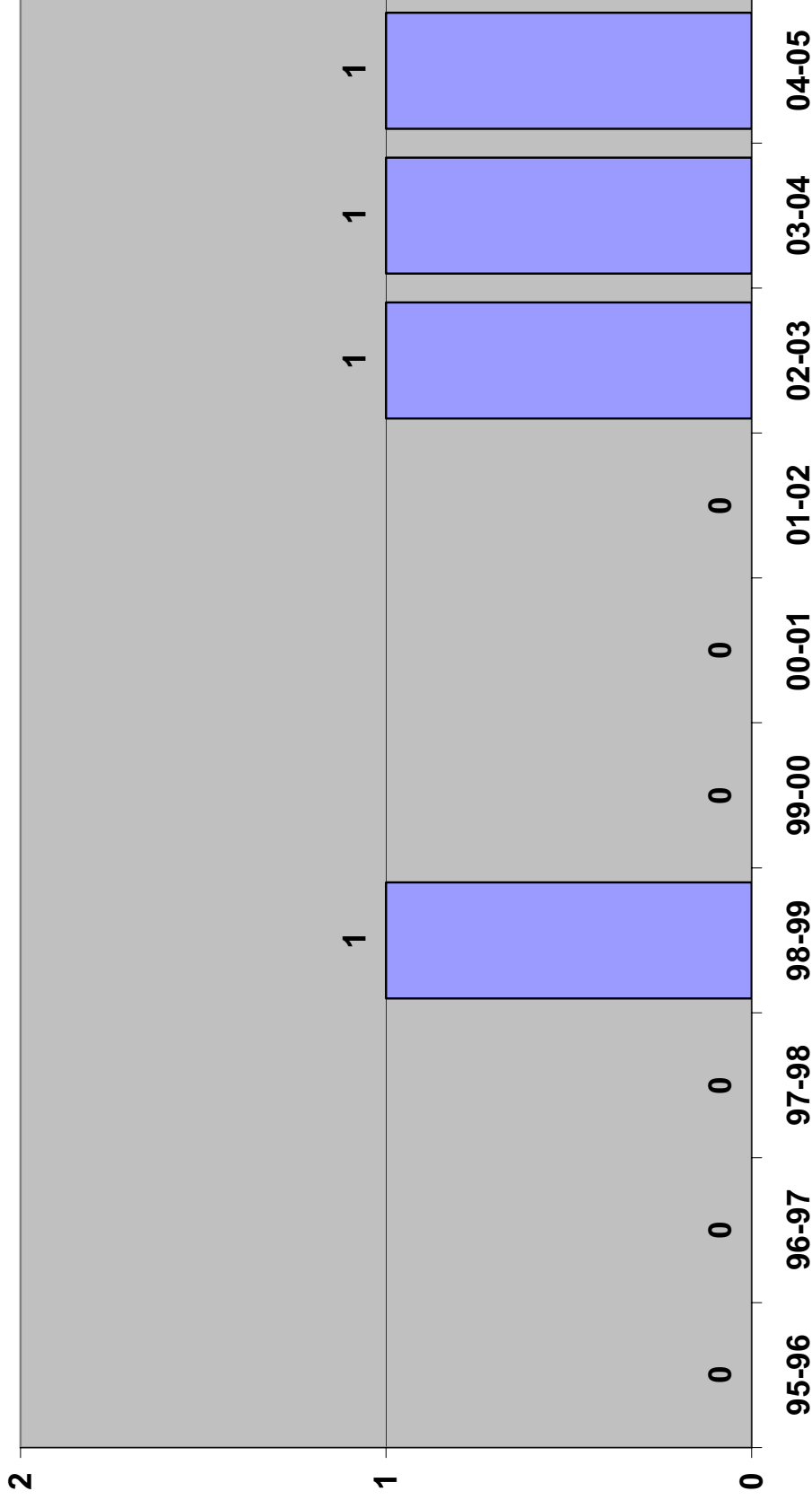

# Family Practice Residency Applicants 1995-2005



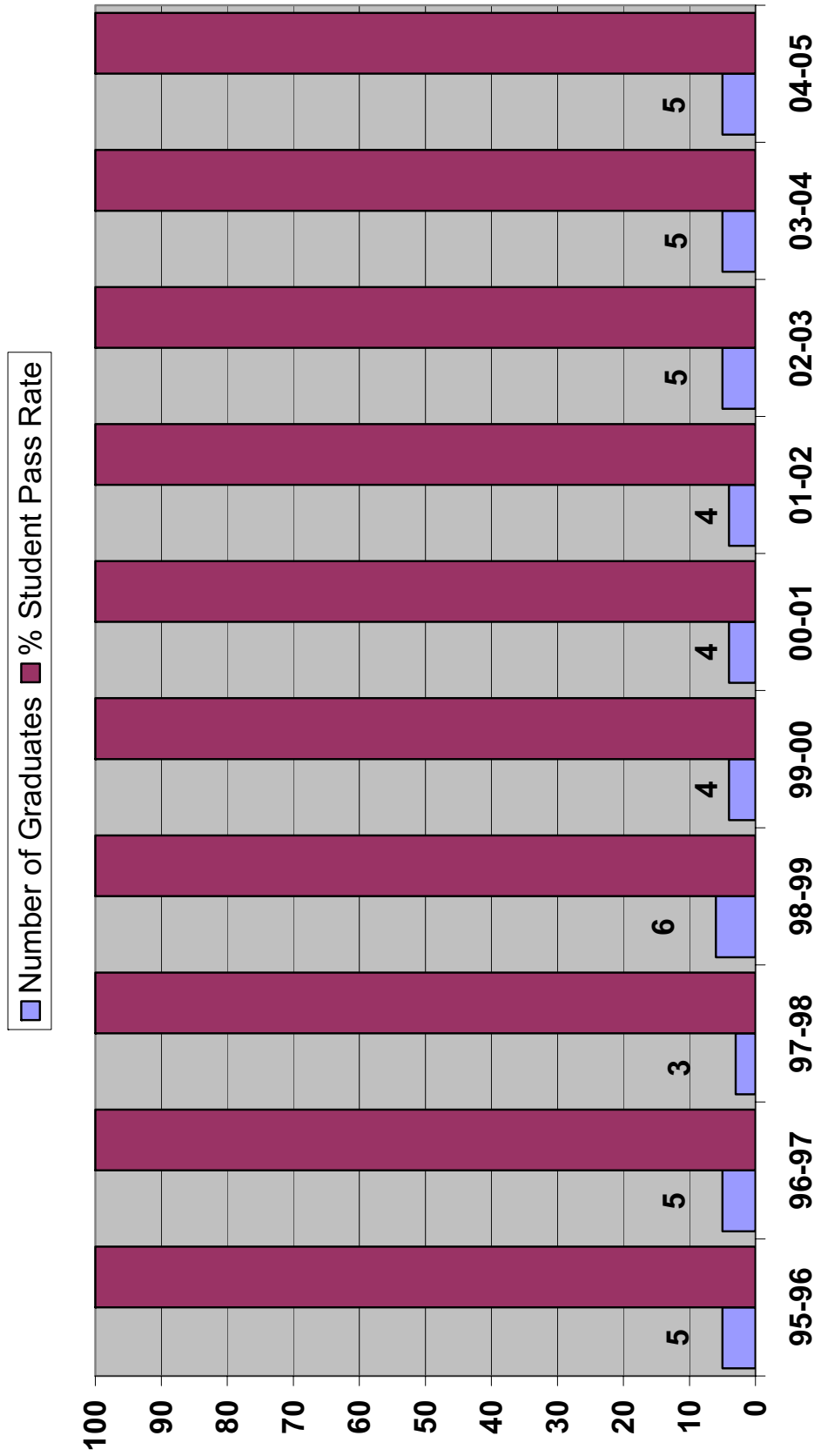

# Family Practice Residency Minority Students 1995-2005



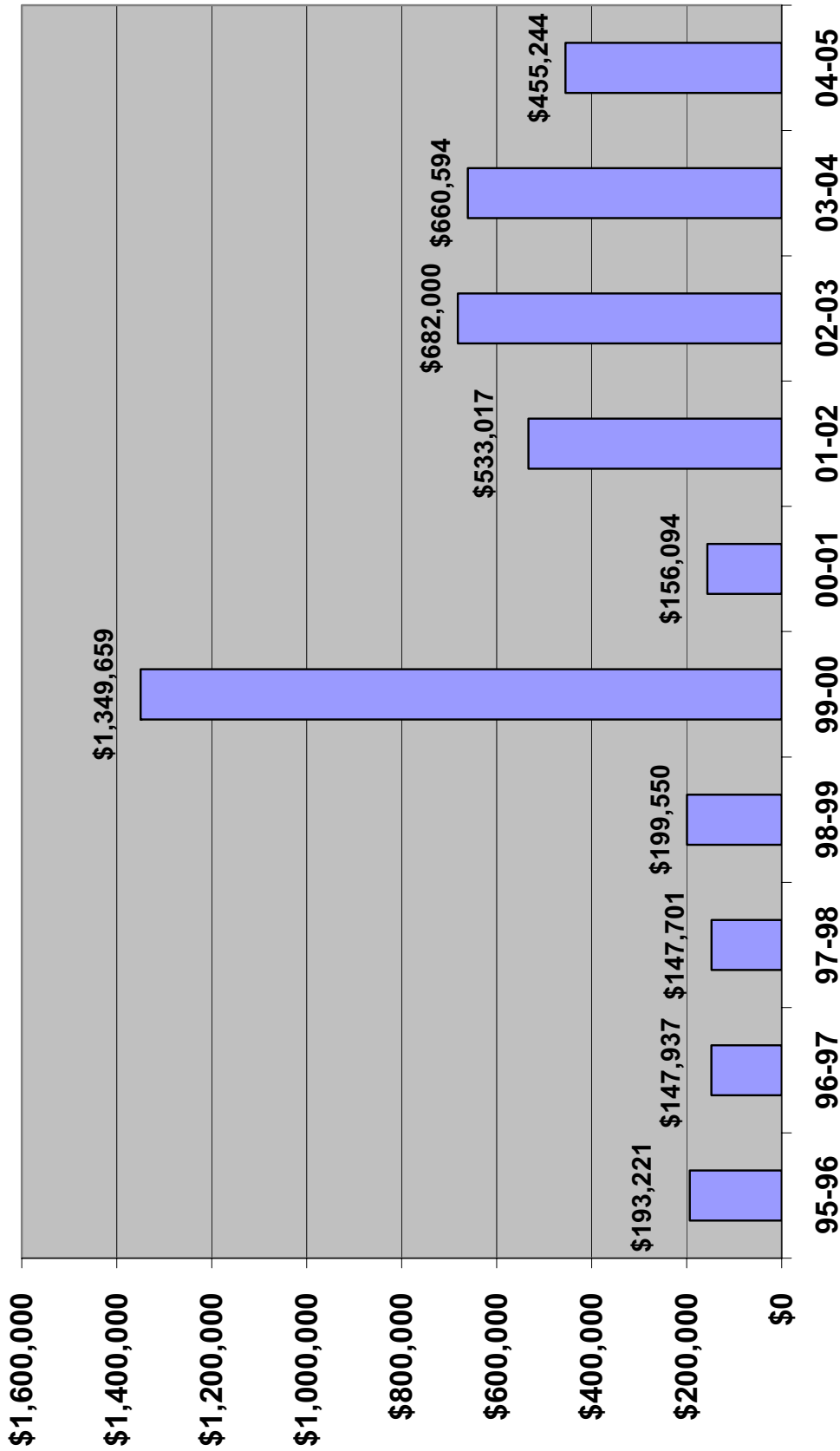

# Family Practice Residency National Exam Pass Rate 1995-2005



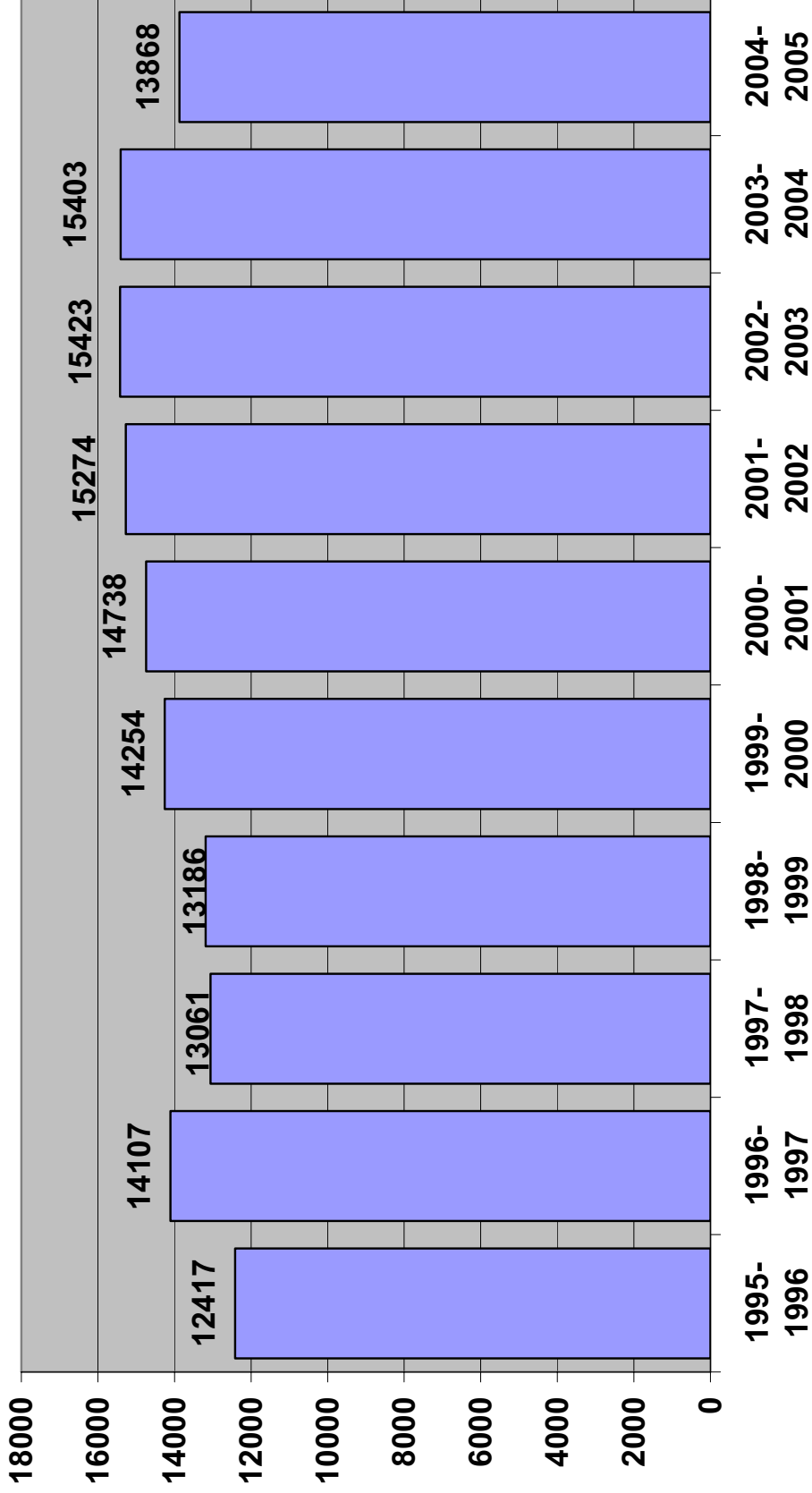

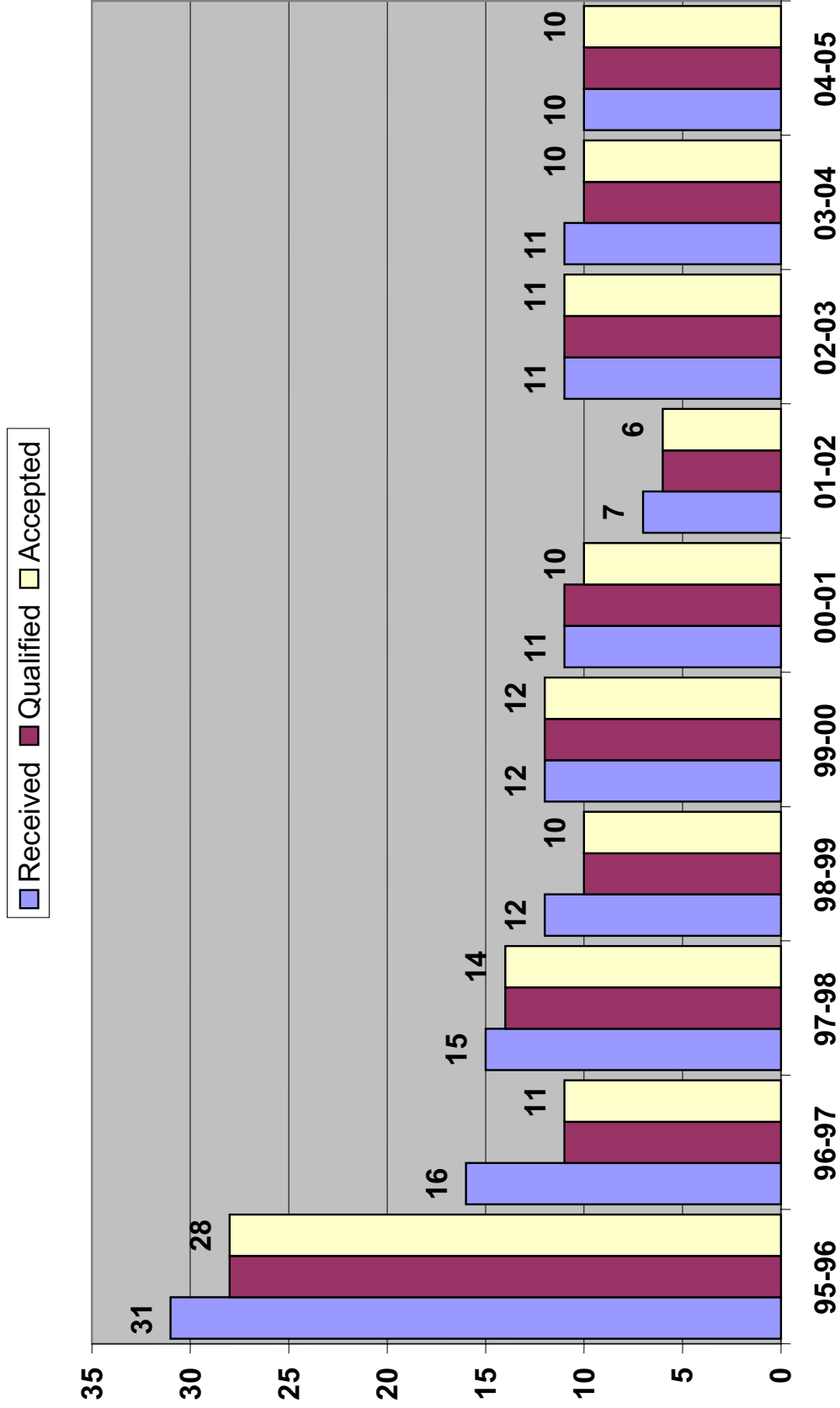

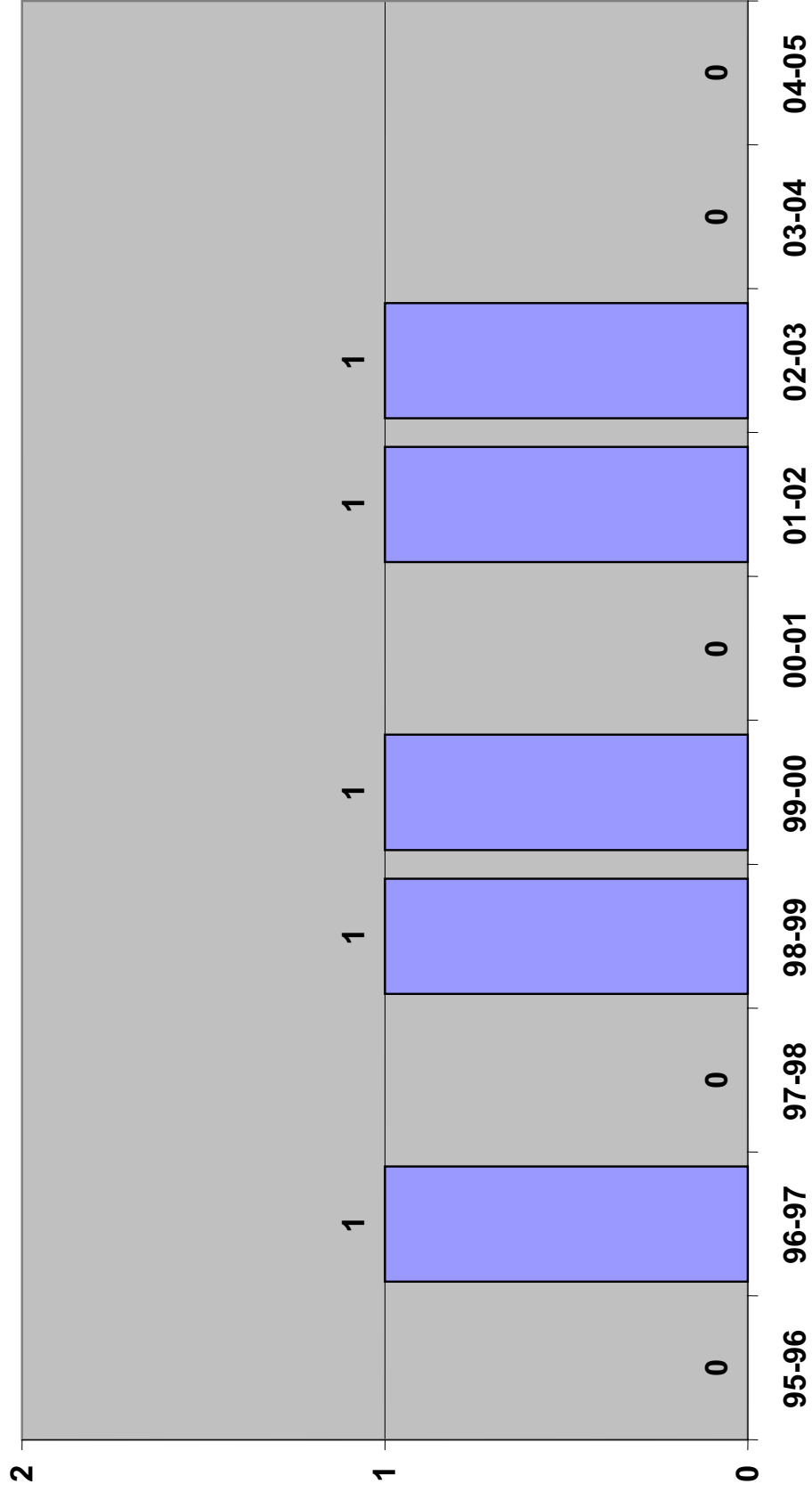

**Health Care Administration Applicants 1995-2004**



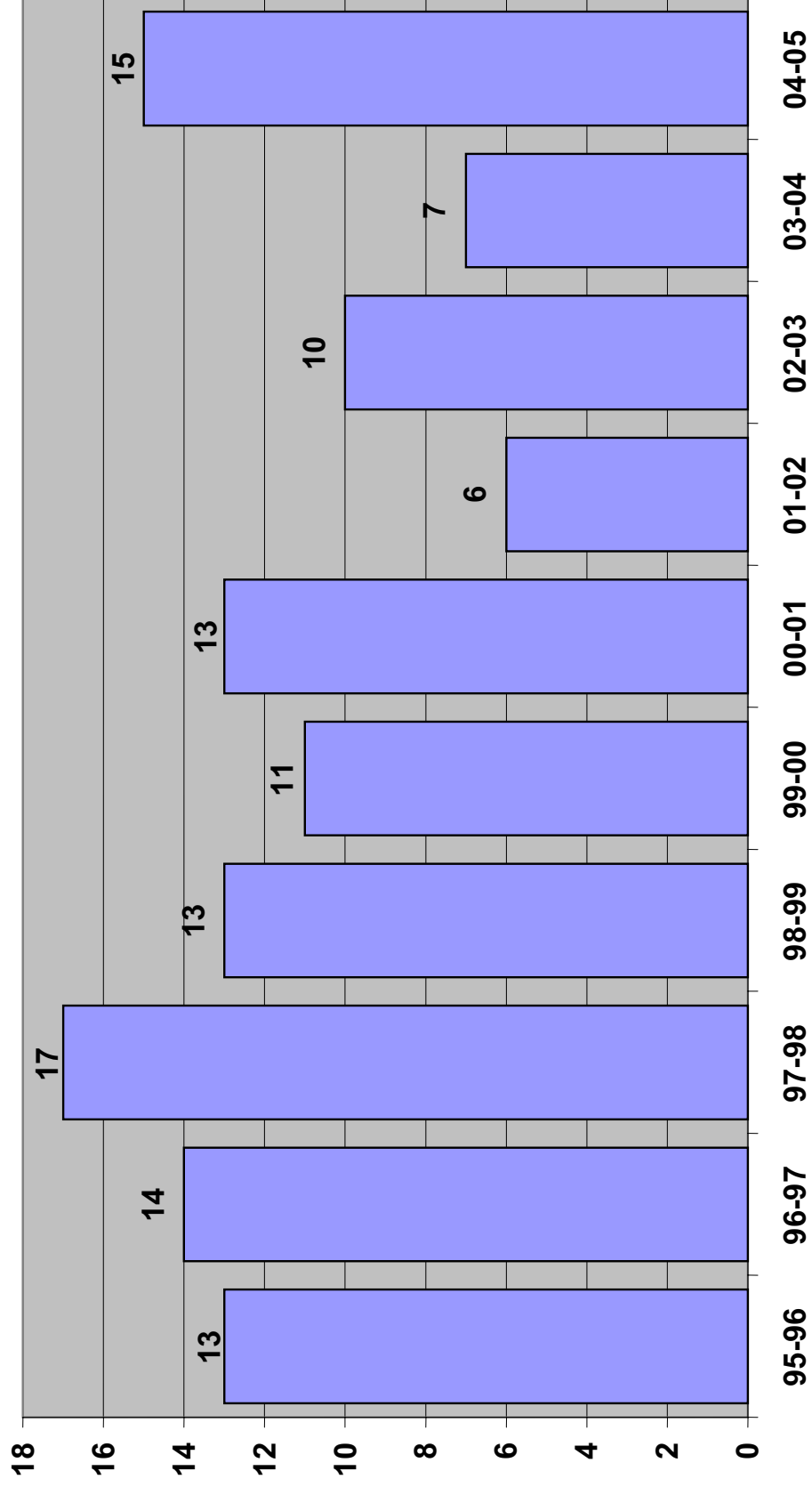

## Health Care Administration Minority Students 1995-2005



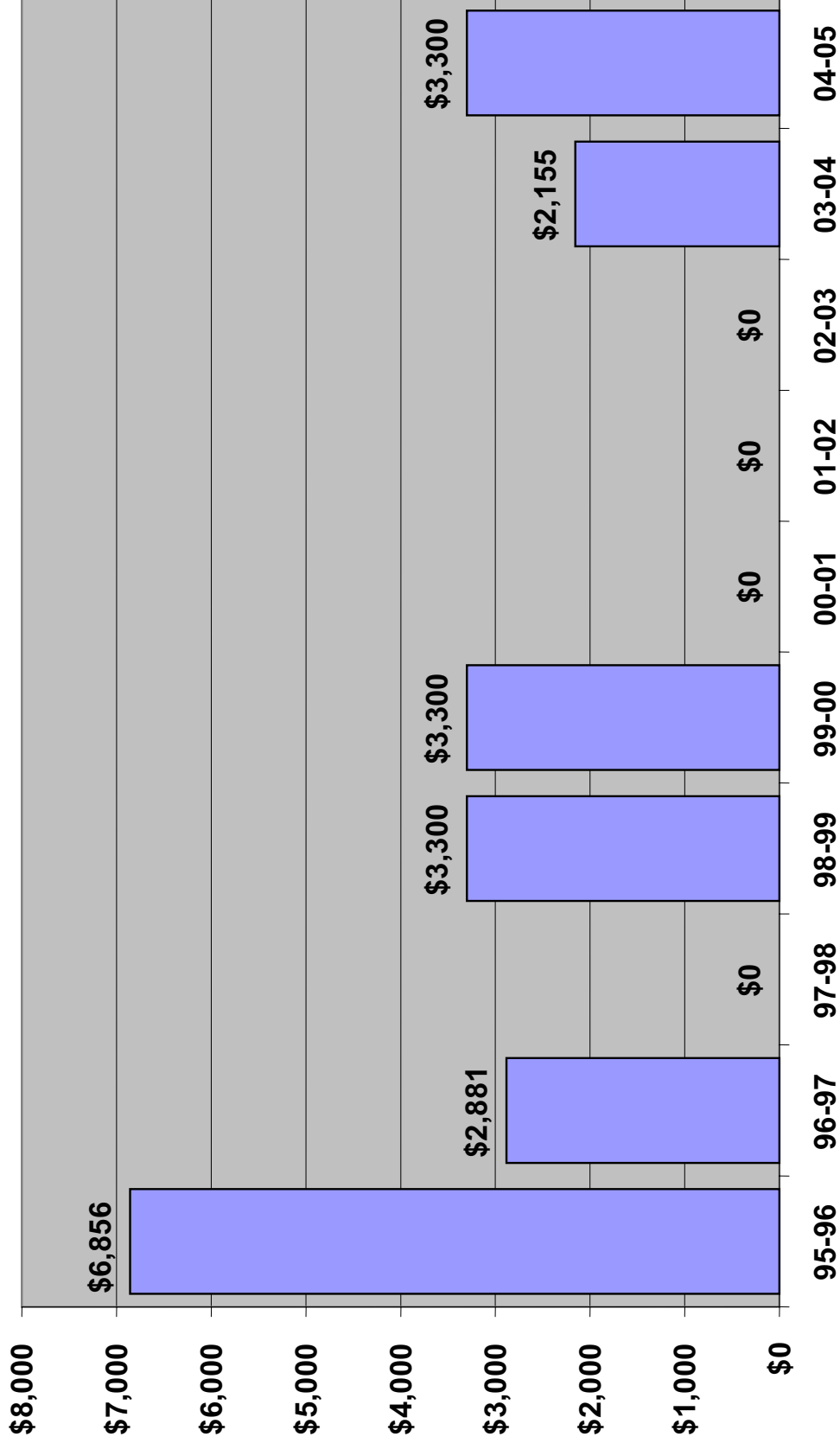

**DEPARTMENT MISSION STATEMENT**

The mission of the Institute of Rural Health (IRH) is to improve the health of rural communities in Idaho and the Intermountain Region, as well as throughout the nation and the world through research, education, and service.

**ACCOMPLISHED GOALS**

**Progress towards 2004 –2005 goals**

After 7 years of tumultuous growth, this past year has been one of gaining maturity and stability for the IRH. Thanks to our hard-won position of being sufficiently funded through 05-06, we were able to focus on internal functions instead of constantly scrabbling for more money. We have now implemented positions, policies, and procedures to sustain a mature research institute. This departmental reorganization has been an unqualified success, exceeding all of our hopes.

*Goal 1: Secure funding for IRH concentrating on (a) focusing our grant portfolio to maximize the skills and abilities represented by the IRH faculty and staff, and (b) continuing to pursue increased state support of the IRH.*

*Goal 1(a):* All of our new funding received this year focused on areas of identified expertise for the IRH. Two new projects (Stamm, Laxminarayan) were in telehealth and one new project was in alcohol and aging research. The alcohol and aging project, granted to Dr. Laura J. Tivis, was a major accomplishment as it was a competitive renewal for Dr. Tivis and the first large NIH project for the IRH. While the IRH might appear to have been less successful this year as total new funding decreased from previous years, this really reflects a maturing of the organization since our current projects are both longer and larger and we have been 100% successful in non-competitive renewals.

*Goal 1(b):* While we were not successful in obtaining additional state-appropriated support for the IRH, we have improved the distribution of our state-appropriated funding to increase the stability of the IRH's management. Each of the five members of the new "IRH Admin Group" now has some state funding in addition to their extramural grant funding. (See description of this management group under Goal 2(e) below.)

*Goal 2: Administrative reorganization of the IRH to accommodate its increased size, including (a) hiring a new director; (b) hiring a new Research Administrator to oversee internal operations; (c) reorganizing the finance team, including hiring a new, higher-level finance team leader; (d) reorganizing the administrative support team, including hiring a new, higher-level administrative support team leader; (e) reorganizing departmental governance to increase faculty and staff participation and reduce administrative "log jams;" and (f) increasing the number of scientifically trained faculty and staff.*

*Goal 2(a):* Dr. Beth Hudnall Stamm was returned to the position of director following the tenure of Dr. Neill Piland (2002-2004). Dr. Stamm had previously served as director from 1999-2002.

*Goal 2(b):* After an extensive period of planning and a national search, Dr. Cyndy Kelchner was hired as the Research Administrator. Dr. Kelchner returned to the U.S. after serving in a similar position at the Australian National University Supercomputer Facility for six years.

*Goal 2(c):* Following a competitive national search, Ms. Jana Bodily-Roan was hired into the newly created professional Research Associate position as head of the IRH Finance Support Team. Ms. Bodily-Roan previously served in a similar position at the IRH prior to the reorganization. Her new duties include oversight of the IRH budget as well as research in fiscal grants management procedures.

*Goal 2(d):* Following the upgrade of the IRH Administrative Support Team Leader position from an Administrative Assistant 1 to an Administrative Assistant 2, Ms. Corinne Johns was hired to

lead the team. Ms. Johns brought extensive experience from her previous position as an AA2 in the Office of Research.

*Goal 2(e):* The goal of the departmental governance reorganization was two-fold. First, it aimed to create a participatory process in which every IRH employee, including students, staff, professional staff, and faculty, could take part in the governance of the department. Second, the reorganization sought to even out the workload so that more people contributed, reducing the individual burdens that had resulted in our “log jams.”

The Director, Research Administrator, IRH Boise Center Coordinator, and the heads of our financial and administrative support teams now form the “IRH Admin Group” and together work to run the department. This group has a designated decision-making structure that keeps all five people active and available to the entire department, assuring that someone in the group is always available to assist with background and decision support.

In addition, the department has been totally reorganized. We are now governed by five chartered committees that have equal representation from all types of employees: faculty, professional researchers, classified staff, and student workers. There are five seats on each committee, one for each category of employee and one at large seat. We also have ex officio members from the IRH Admin Group who assist in keeping the groups on track with the overall function of the department. The five chartered committees are as follows: Personnel, Structure and Function, Vision, Resources, and Grants. Ad hoc committees and other standing committees may be created as needed to address emerging issues. The Director, the IRH Admin Group, and the committees are jointly responsible for the effective functioning of the IRH. Thus far this new structure appears to be working very well.

*Goal 2(f):* Four new scientifically trained research faculty were hired this year (Larsen, Kelchner, Massad, Ramloll), resulting in at least one senior scientist on every project.

### **2005-2006 Goals**

*Goal 1:* Secure extramural funding for the IRH concentrating on (a) increasing the number of Principal Investigators who submit grants and (b) focusing our grant portfolio to maximize the skills and abilities represented by the IRH faculty and staff.

*Goal 2:* Continue to seek additional state-appropriated support. Currently, state-appropriated funds support only about 2.5% of the IRH budget.

*Goal 3:* Increase peer-reviewed publications. We now have additional faculty and staff to help support this goal.

*Goal 4:* Continue to refine the administrative reorganization so that it becomes deeply embedded in the departmental culture.

*Goal 5:* Now that the department is reorganized, the next step is to help people manage their own workflow so that they are able to do their best possible work, participate in professional development activities, and use their leave time in appropriate ways.

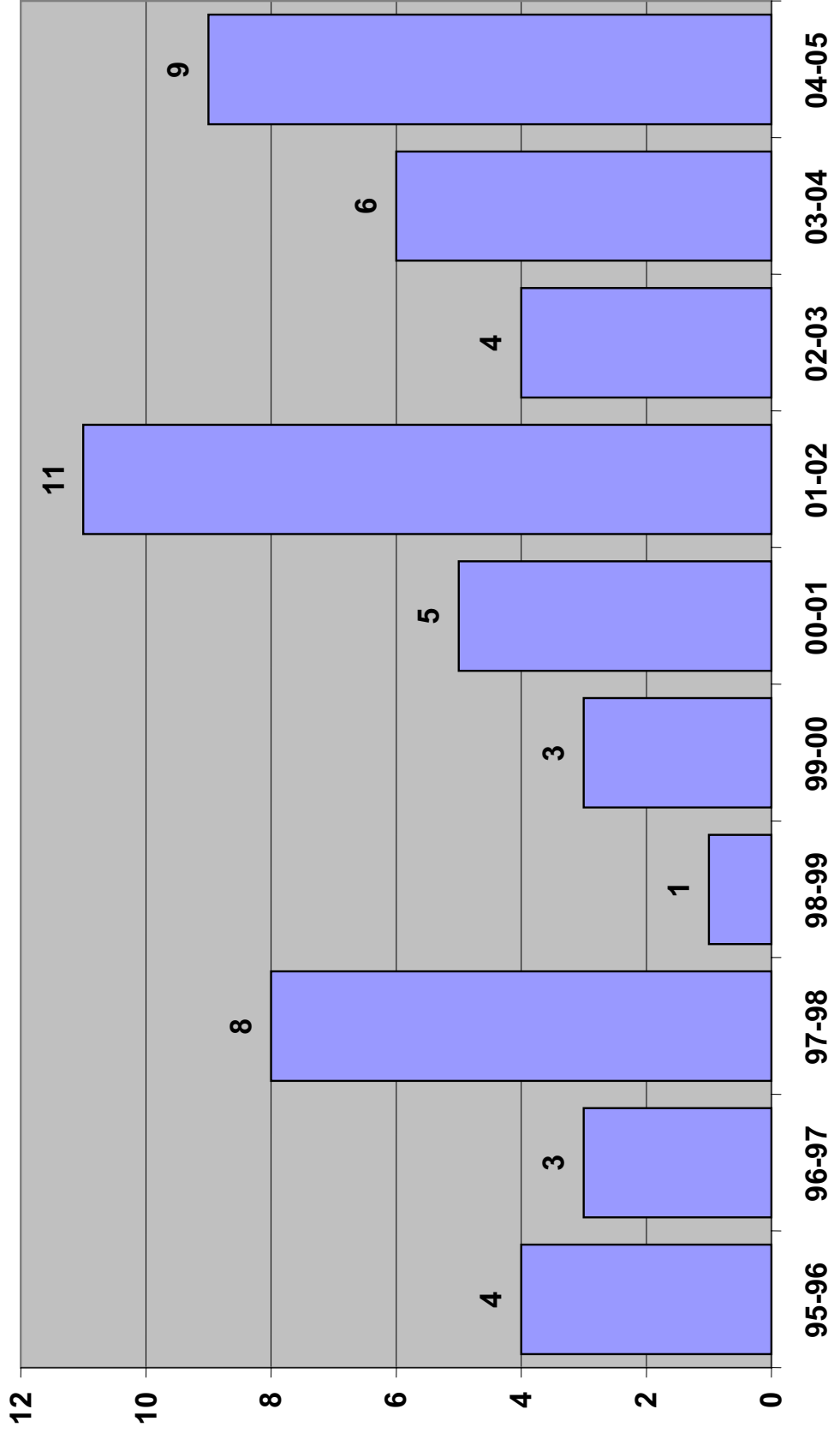

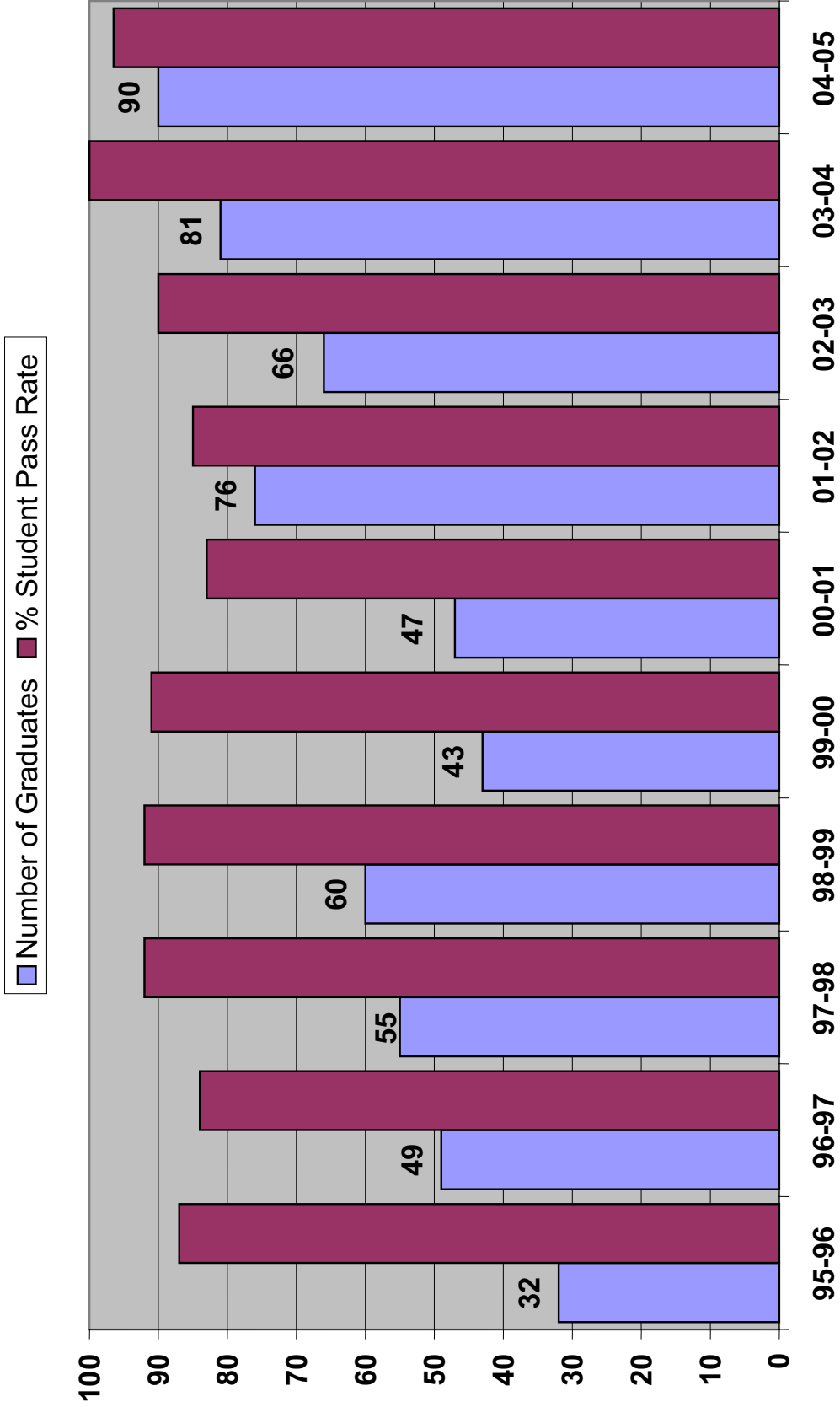

### Nursing BS Minority Students 1995-2005



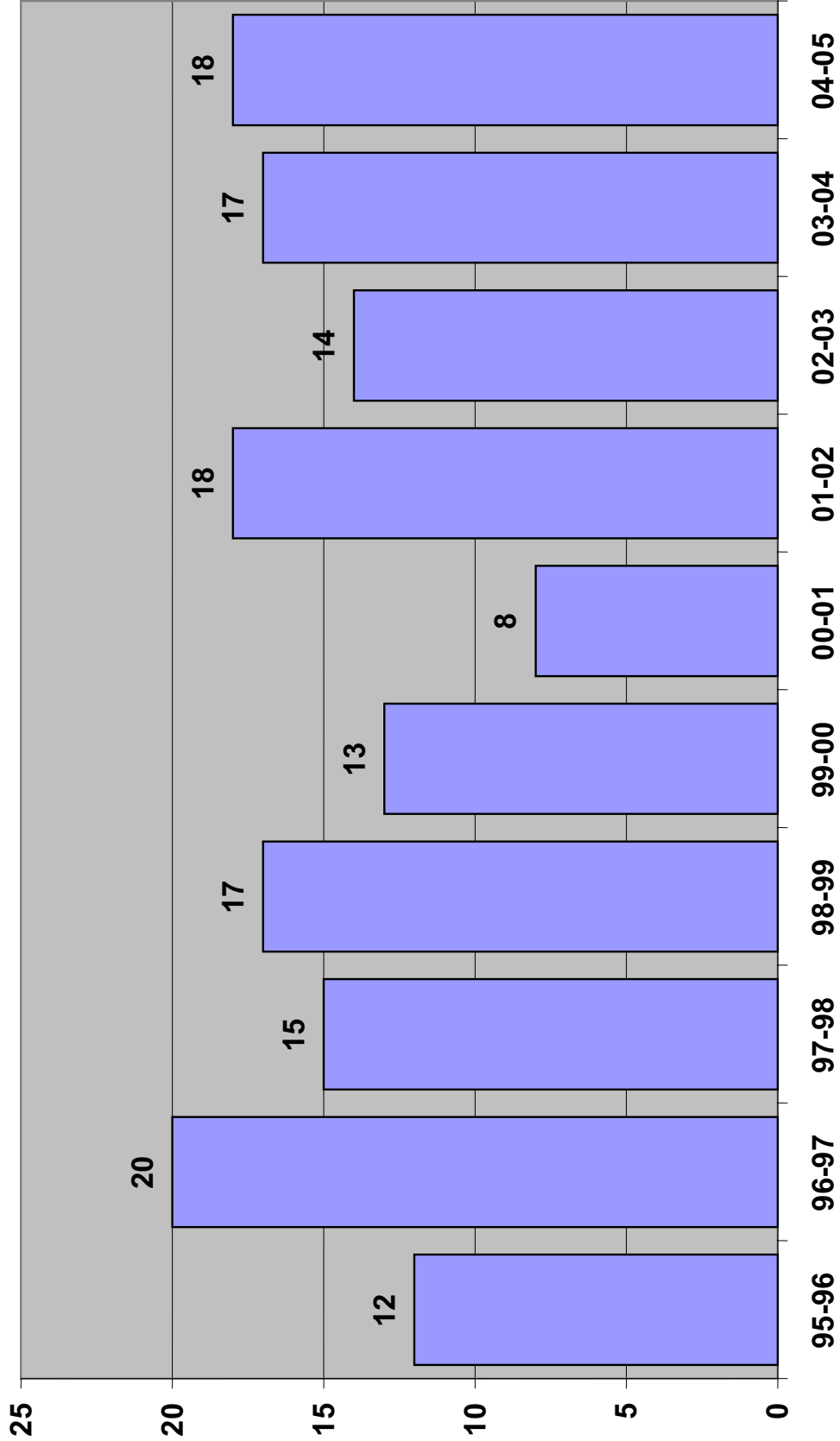

**Nursing BS National Exam Pass Rate 1995-2005**



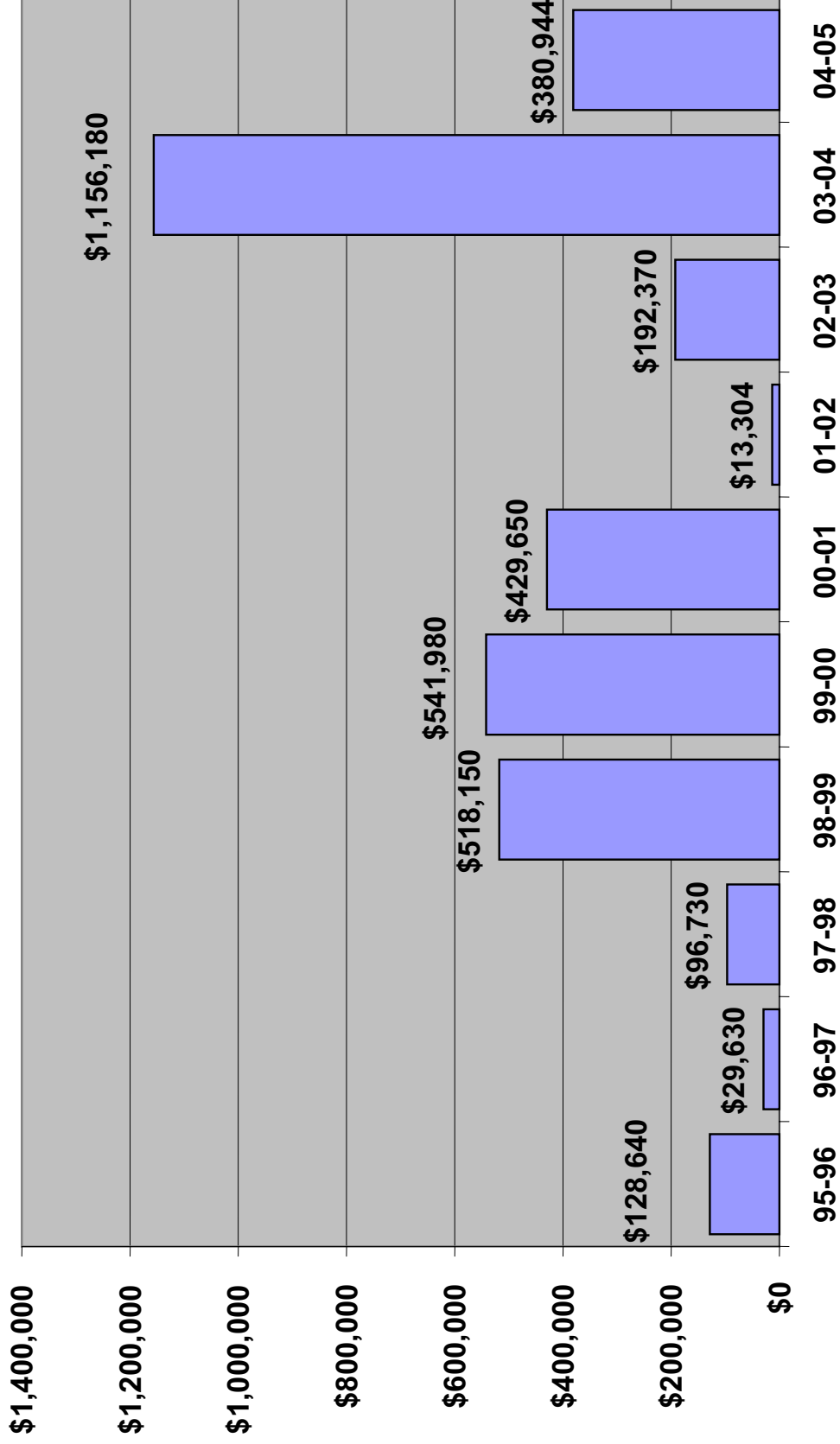

### Nursing MS Number of Graduates 1995-2005



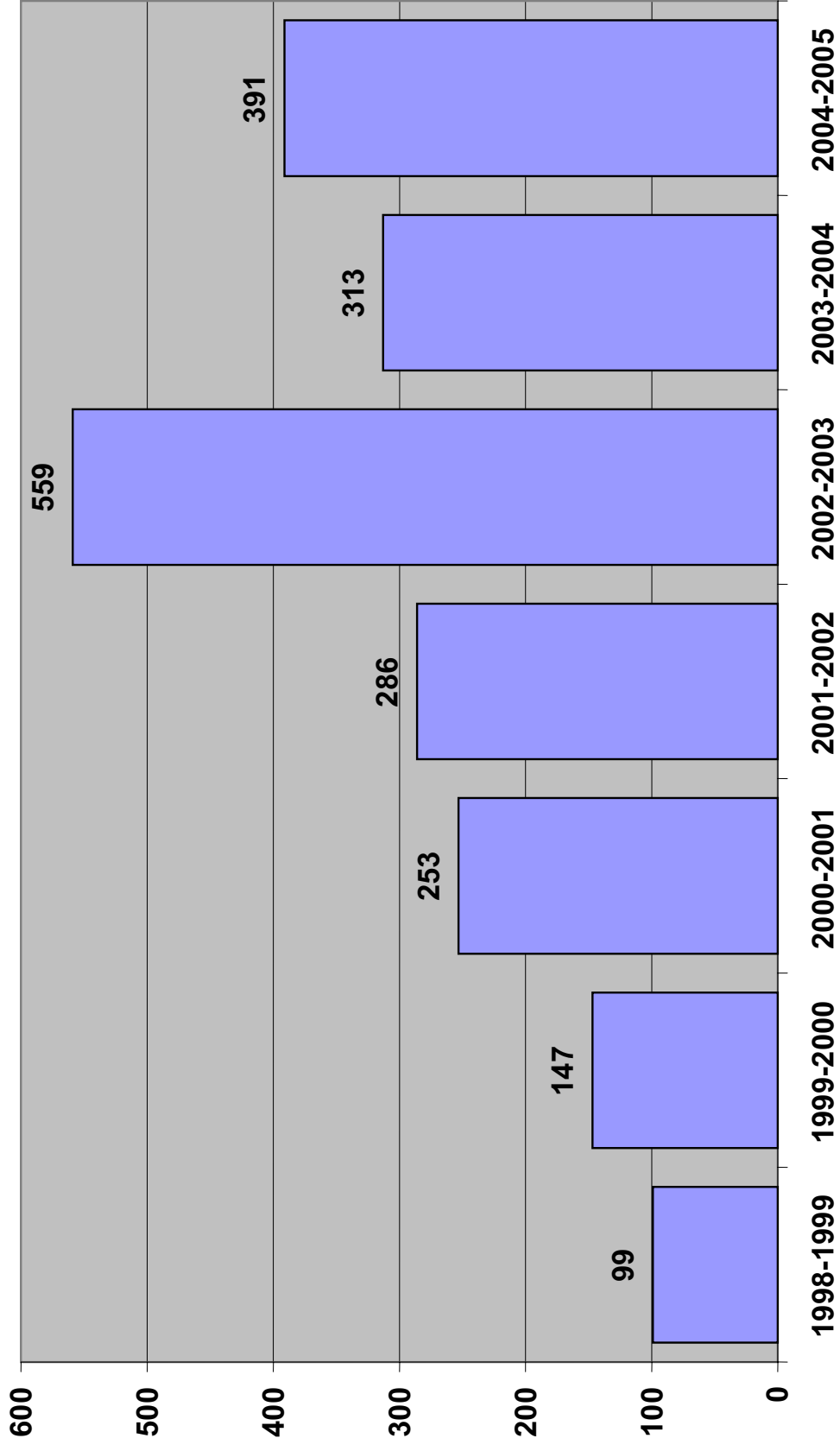

**Nursing Grant Statistics 1995-2005**



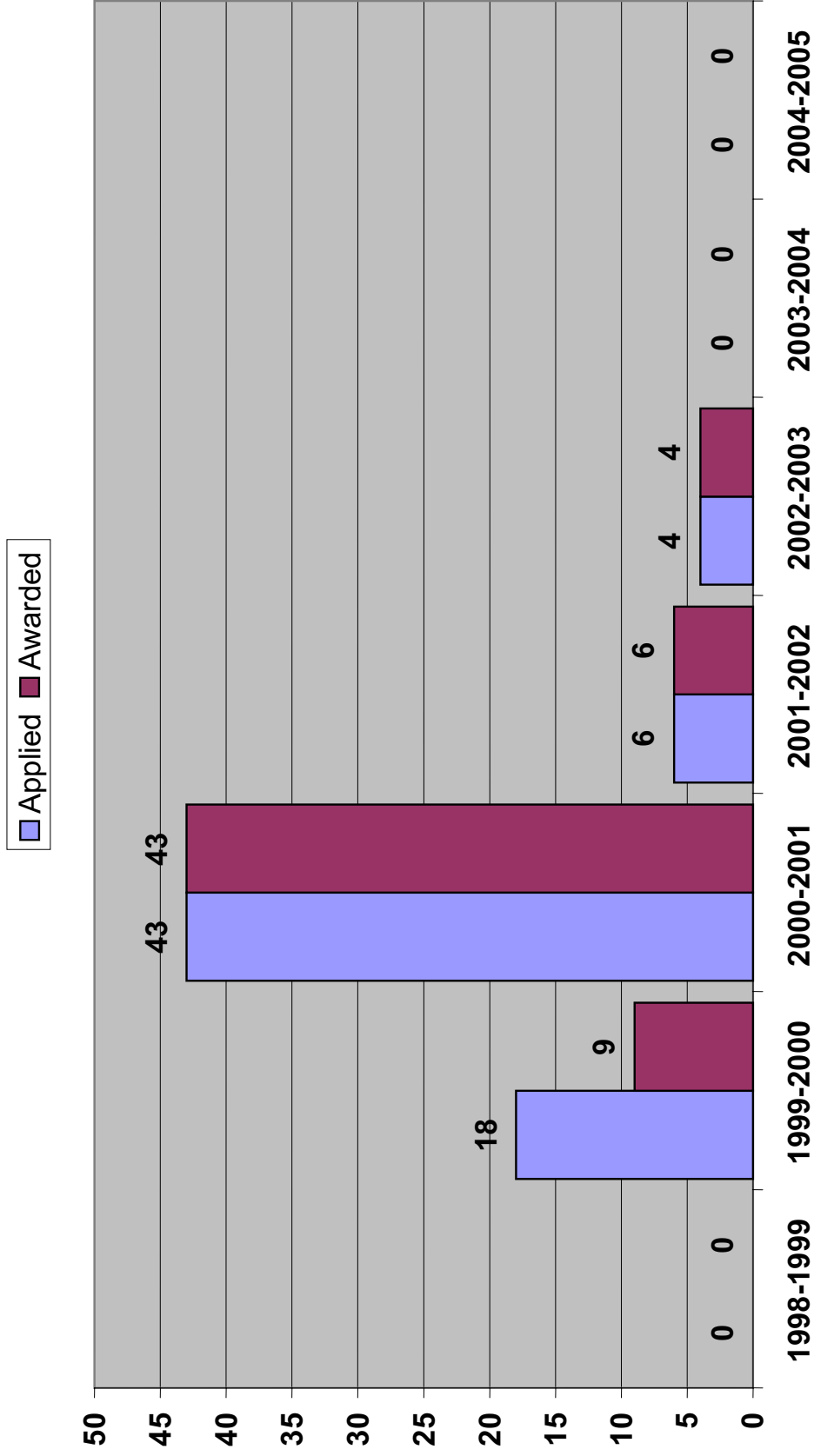



### 3. Accomplished Goals from 2004-2005

- Focus on improving the didactic year
  - Improve timing and notification of class/lecture scheduling: Achieved. A policy was implemented by the Academic Year faculty and staff that markedly improved the scheduling of lectures, notification of lecturers, posting of lectures on the Sun Calendar for student access, and follow-up with lecturers for thank-you notes and reimbursement.
  - Improve testing and evaluations
    - Code/categorize all questions: Achieved. All questions used on all tests in both the Academic Year and the Clinical Year have been coded for both content area and level of difficulty. This has facilitated evaluation and counseling of students.
    - Correlate test questions with objectives and textbooks: Achieved. All test questions have been reviewed to assure correlation with published objectives.
    - Evaluate grading criteria: Achieved. Grading criteria for both the Academic Year and Clinical Year were reviewed and revised.
- Consider digitalizing lectures and posting on-line: Partially achieved.
- Update WebCT for the clinical year: Achieved.
- Identify “diversity” clinical sites (grant): Partially achieved. Existing clinical sites were reviewed to determine which met our criteria for “diversity” experiences.
- Attempt to decrease student stress in the didactic year: Achieved. We began the year with team building activities. We increased faculty interaction with the students, increased updates to students on their progress and program changes, increased the number of social activities. This class demonstrated a decreased level of stress manifested by fewer behavioral violations and less class divisiveness.
- Implement diversity curriculum in the didactic year (grant): Achieved.

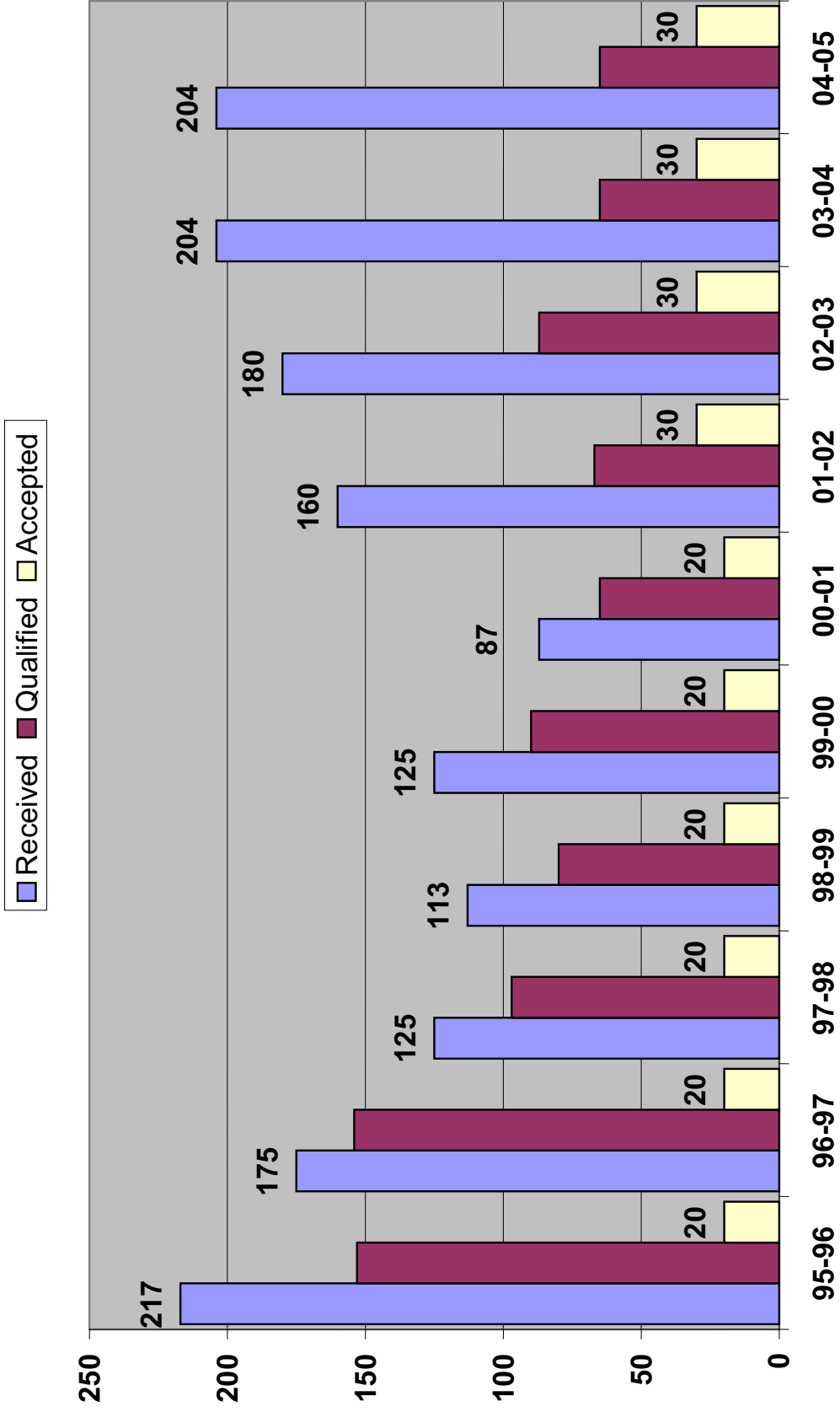

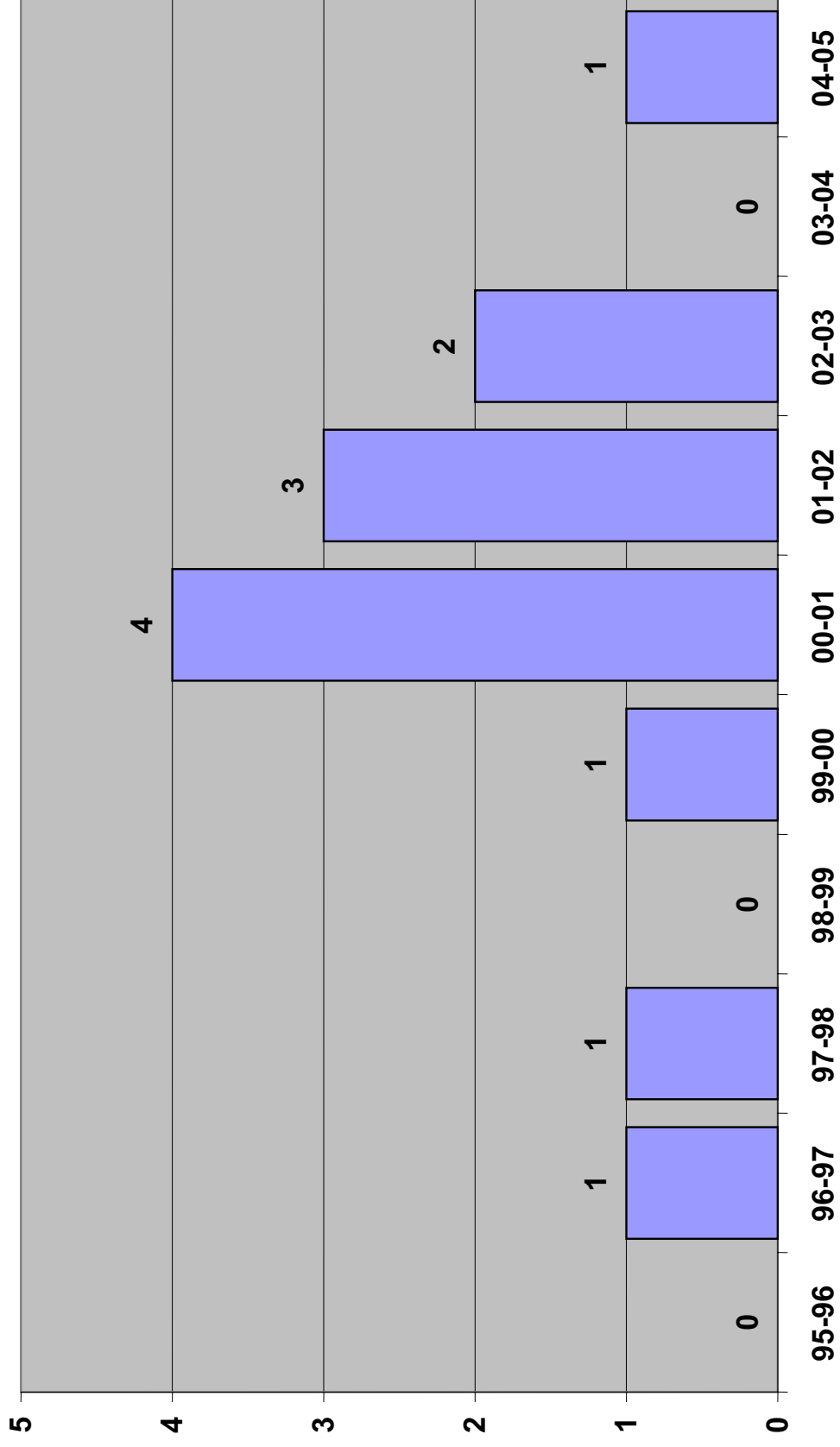

### Physician Assistant Applicants 1995-2005

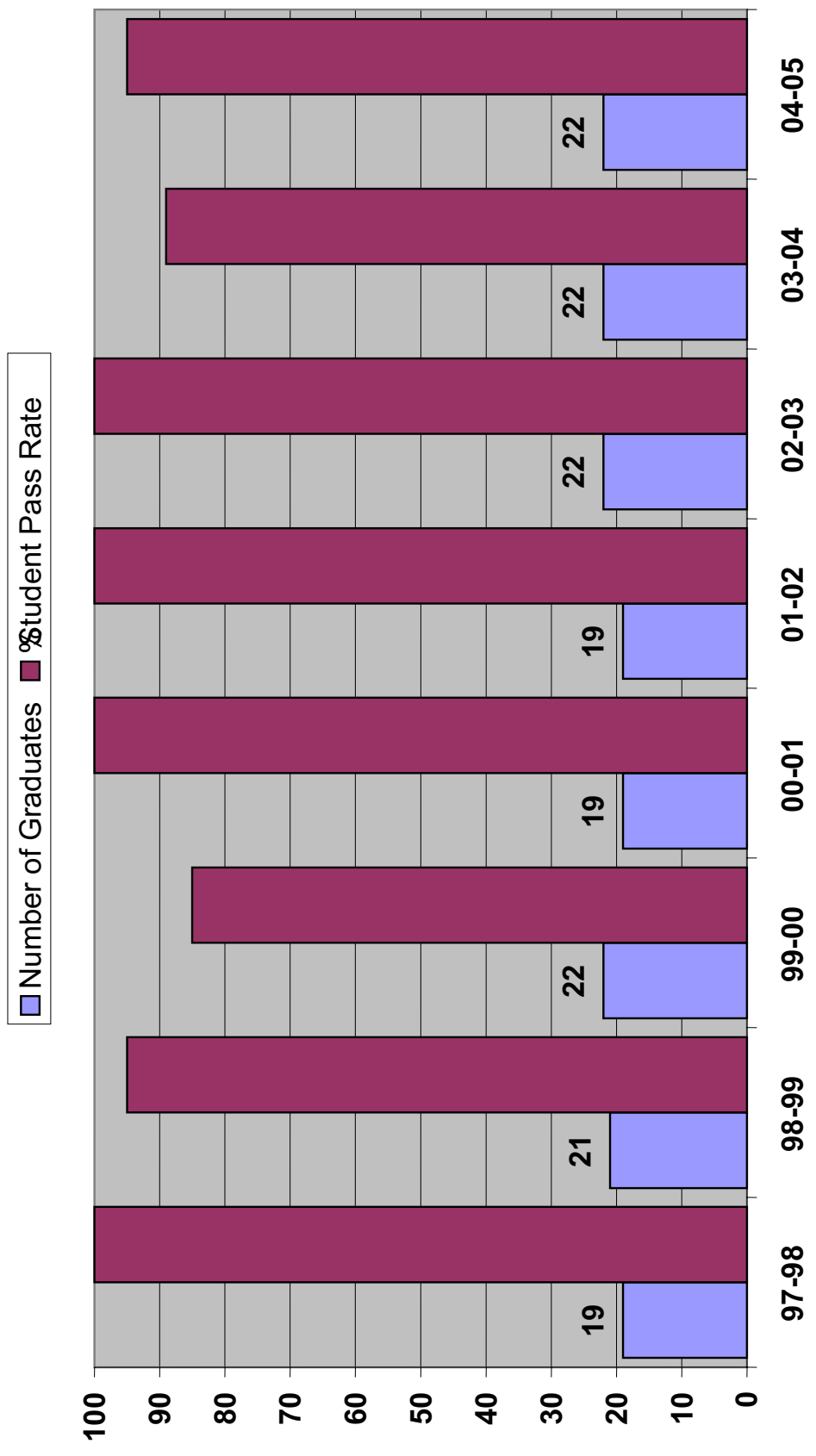

### Physician Assistant Minority Students 1995-2005

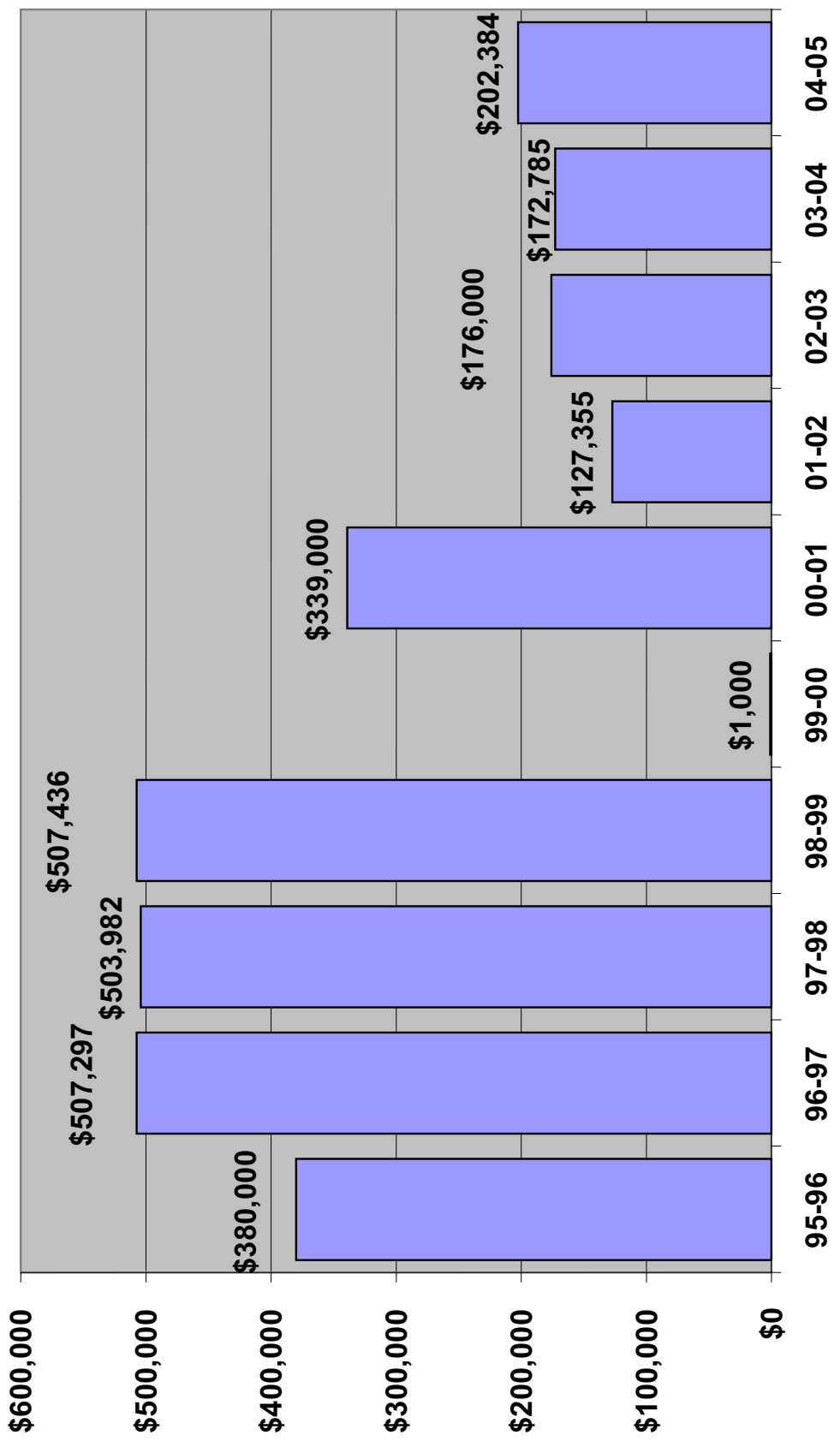


# Physician Assistant National Exam Pass Rate 1997-2005

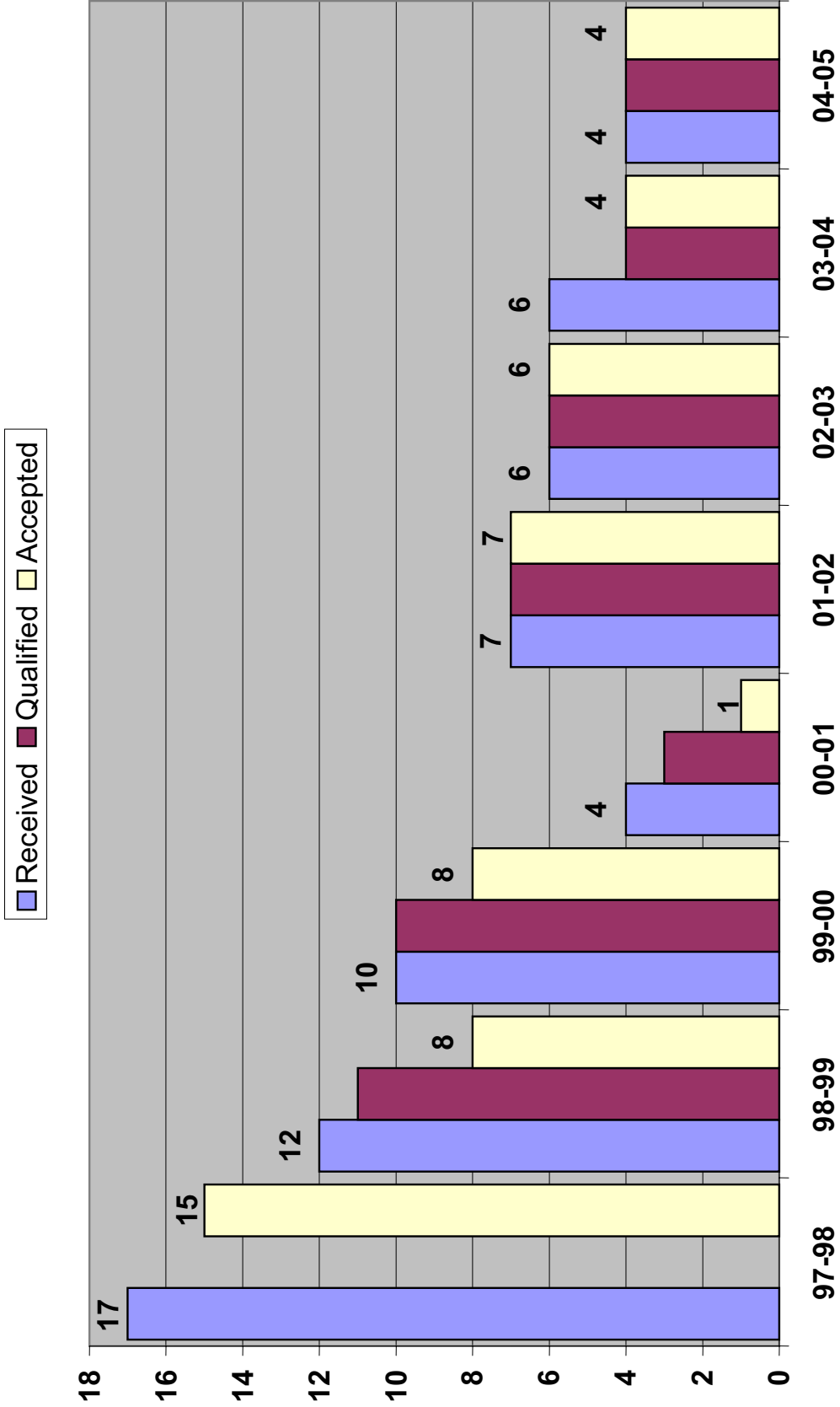

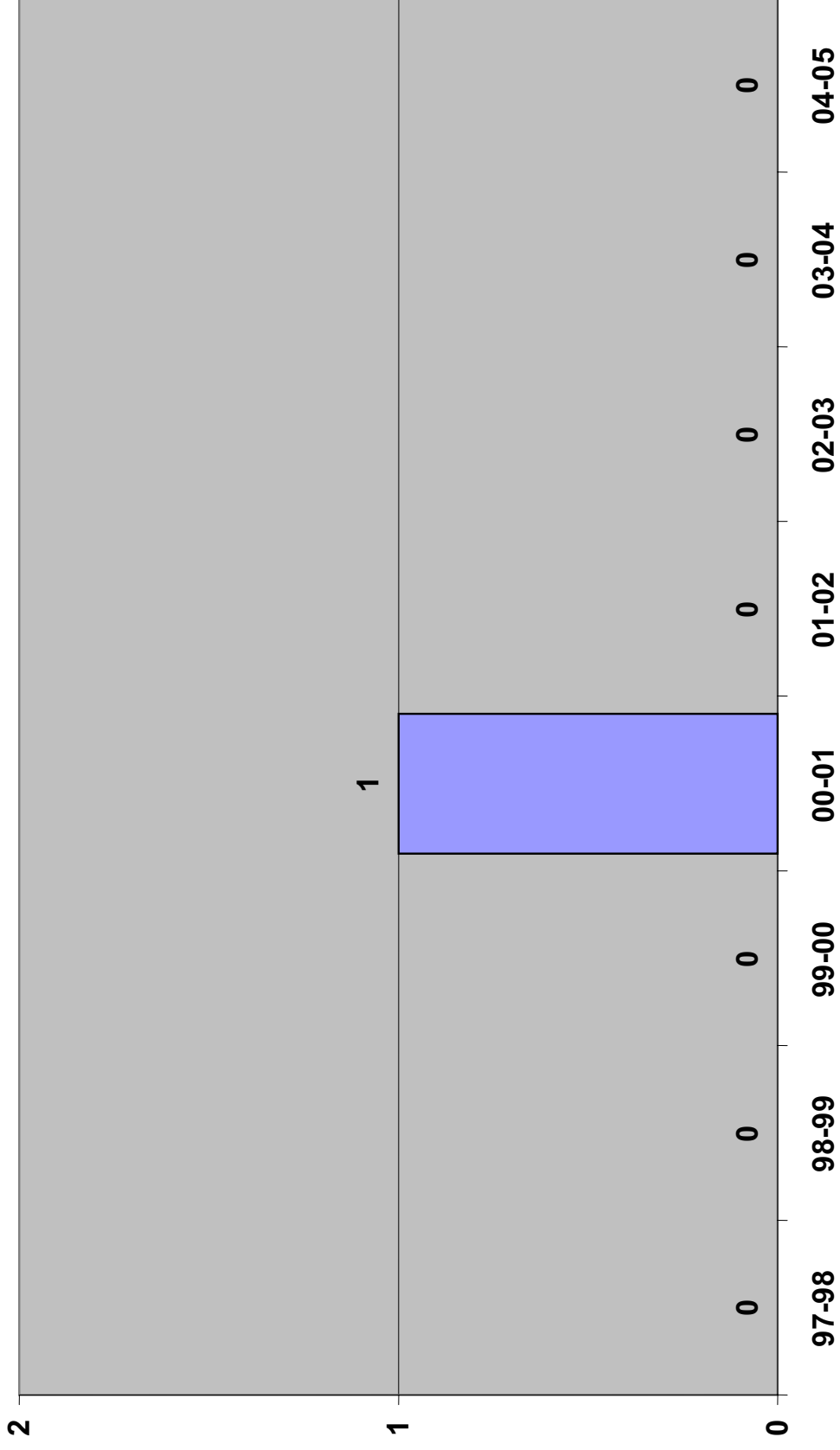

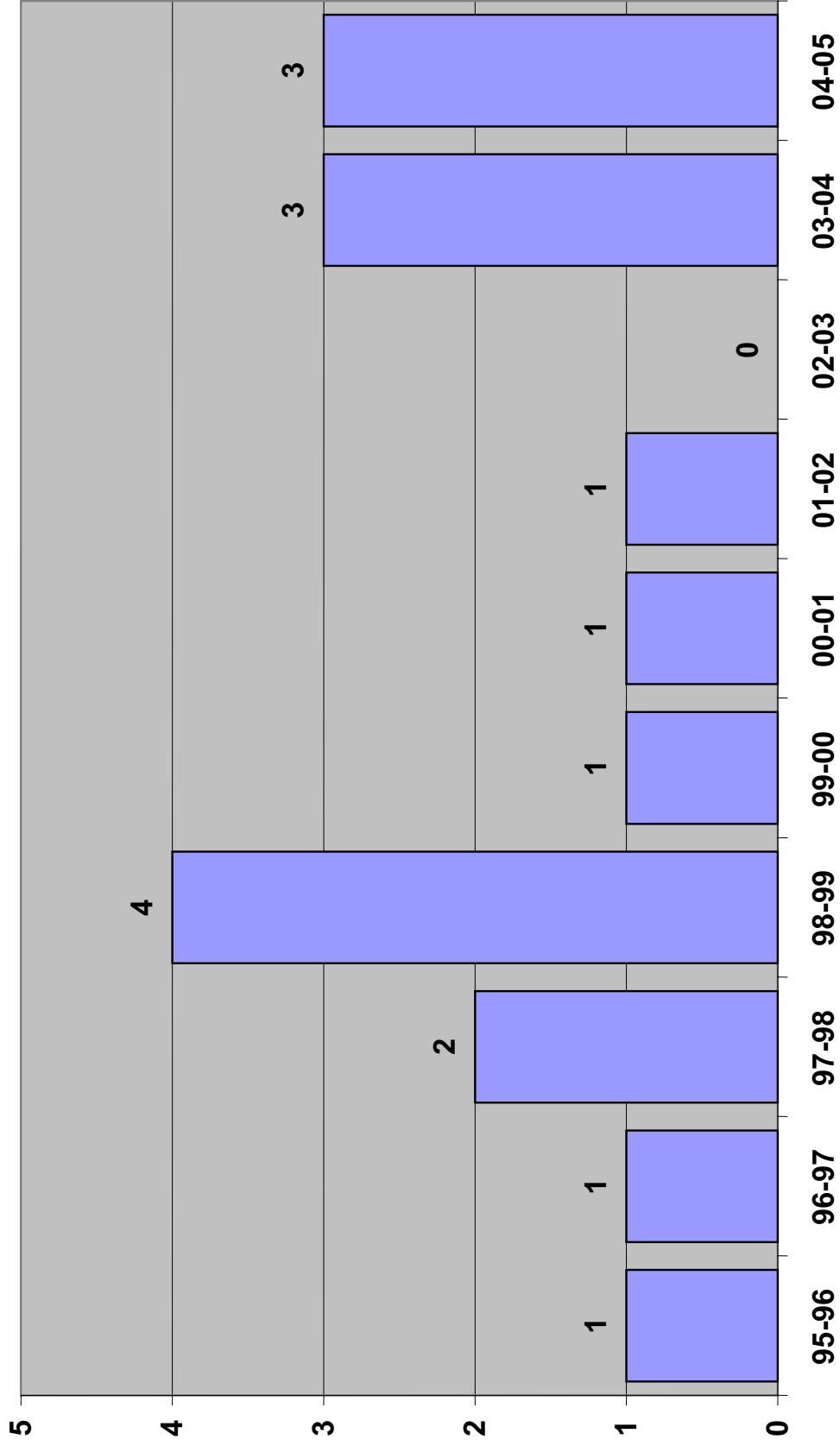

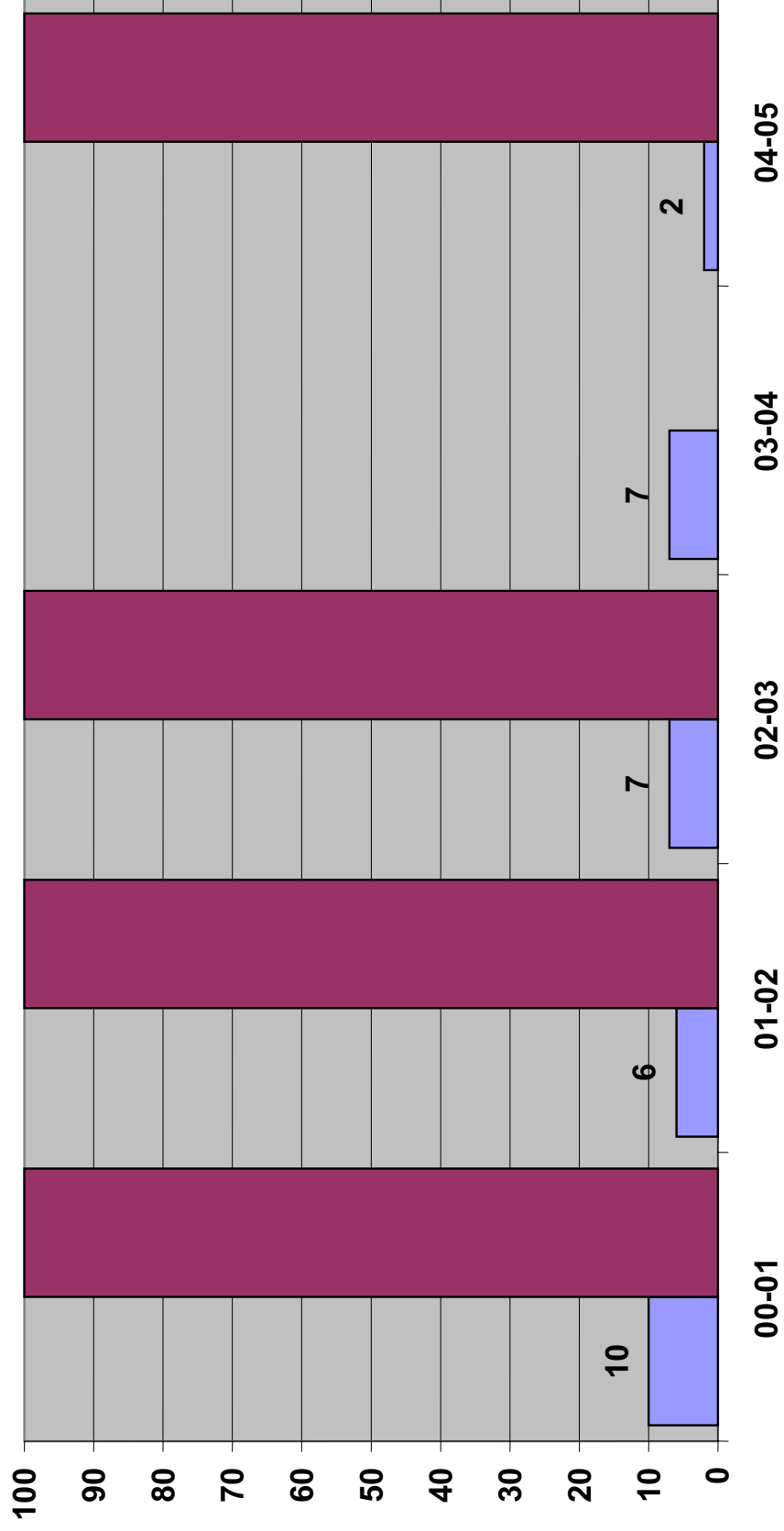

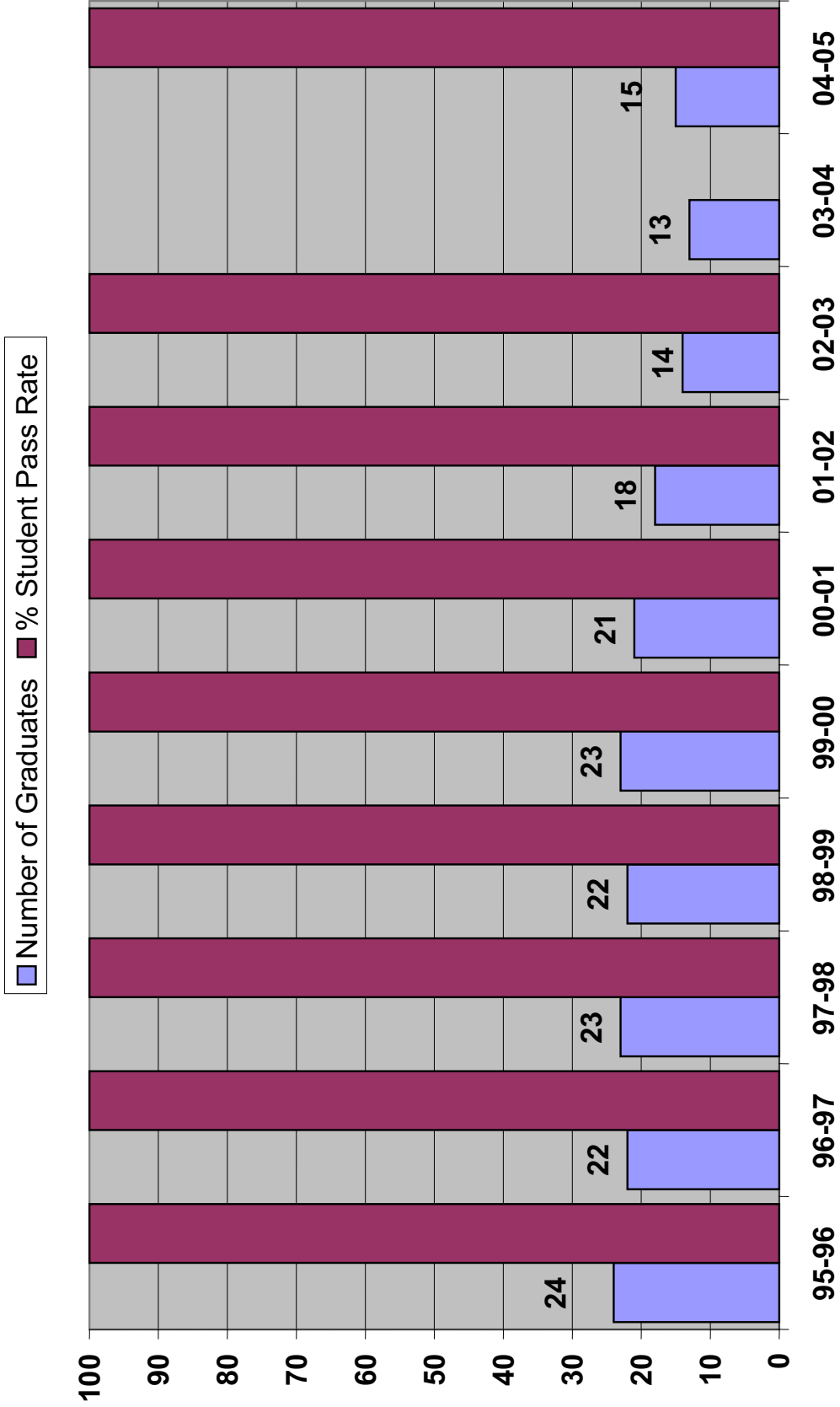
# Occupational Therapy National Exam Pass Rate 2000-2005

Number of Graduates    % Student Pass Rate



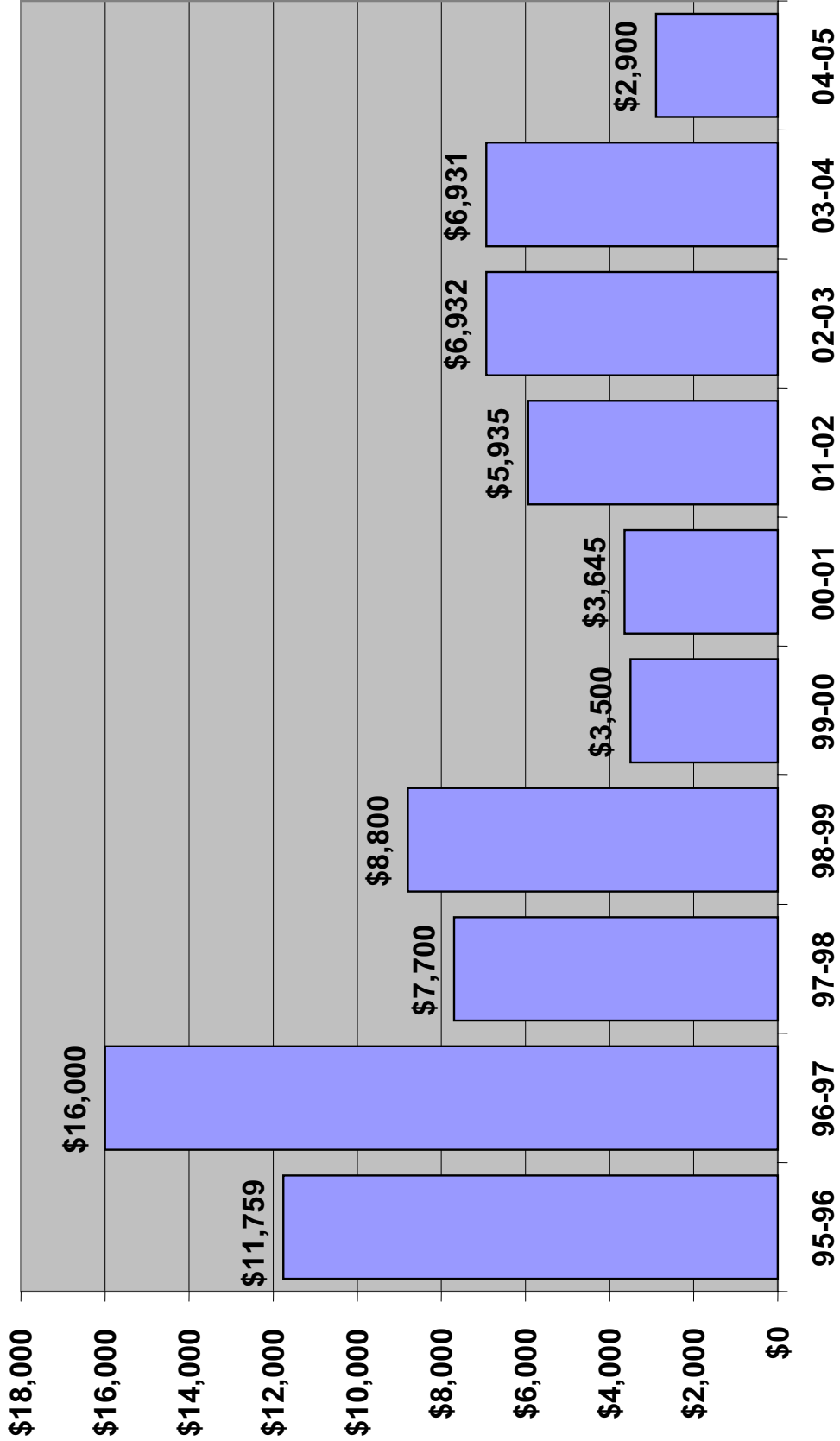

# Physical Therapy National Exam Pass Rate 1995-2005



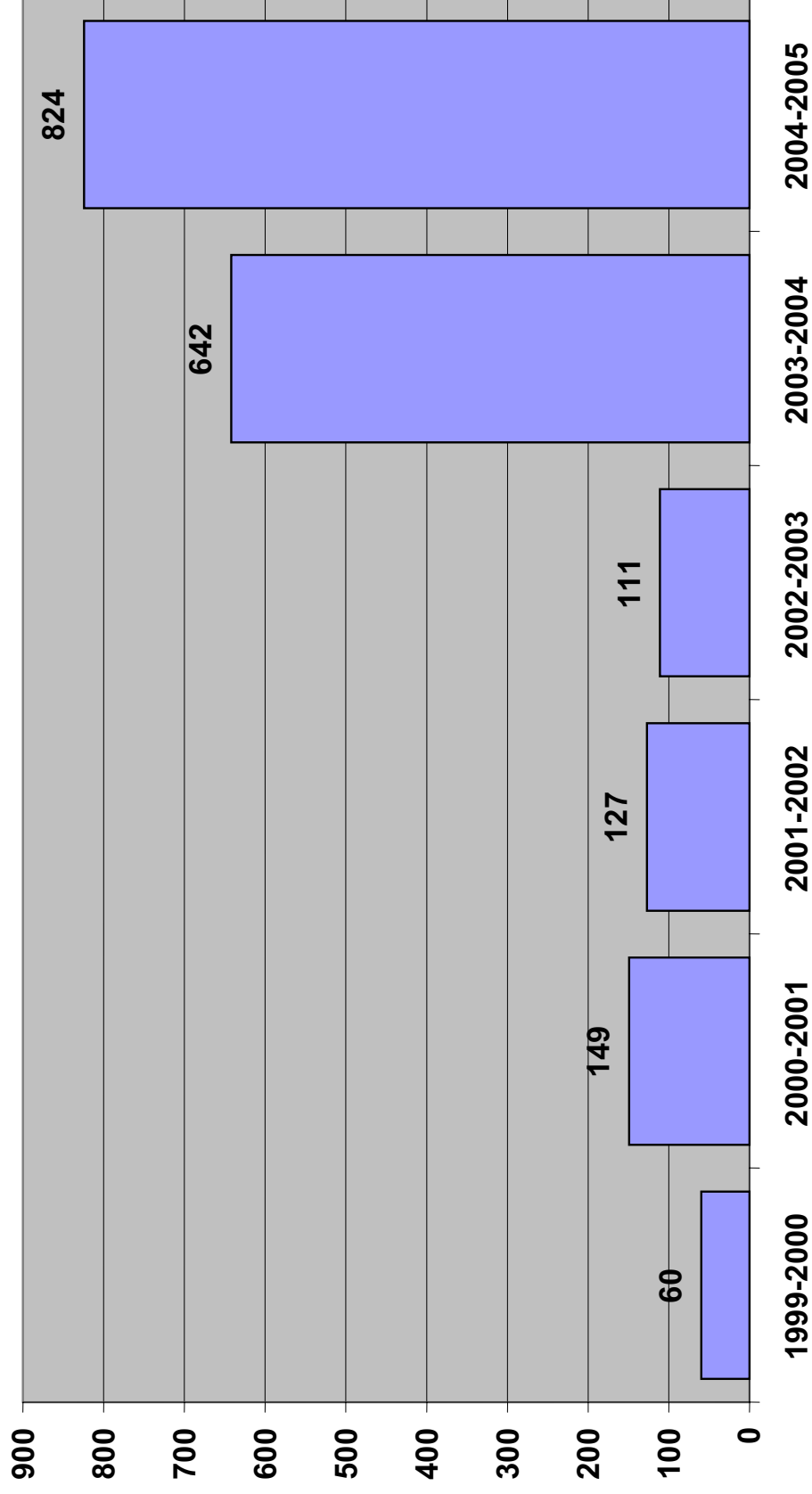

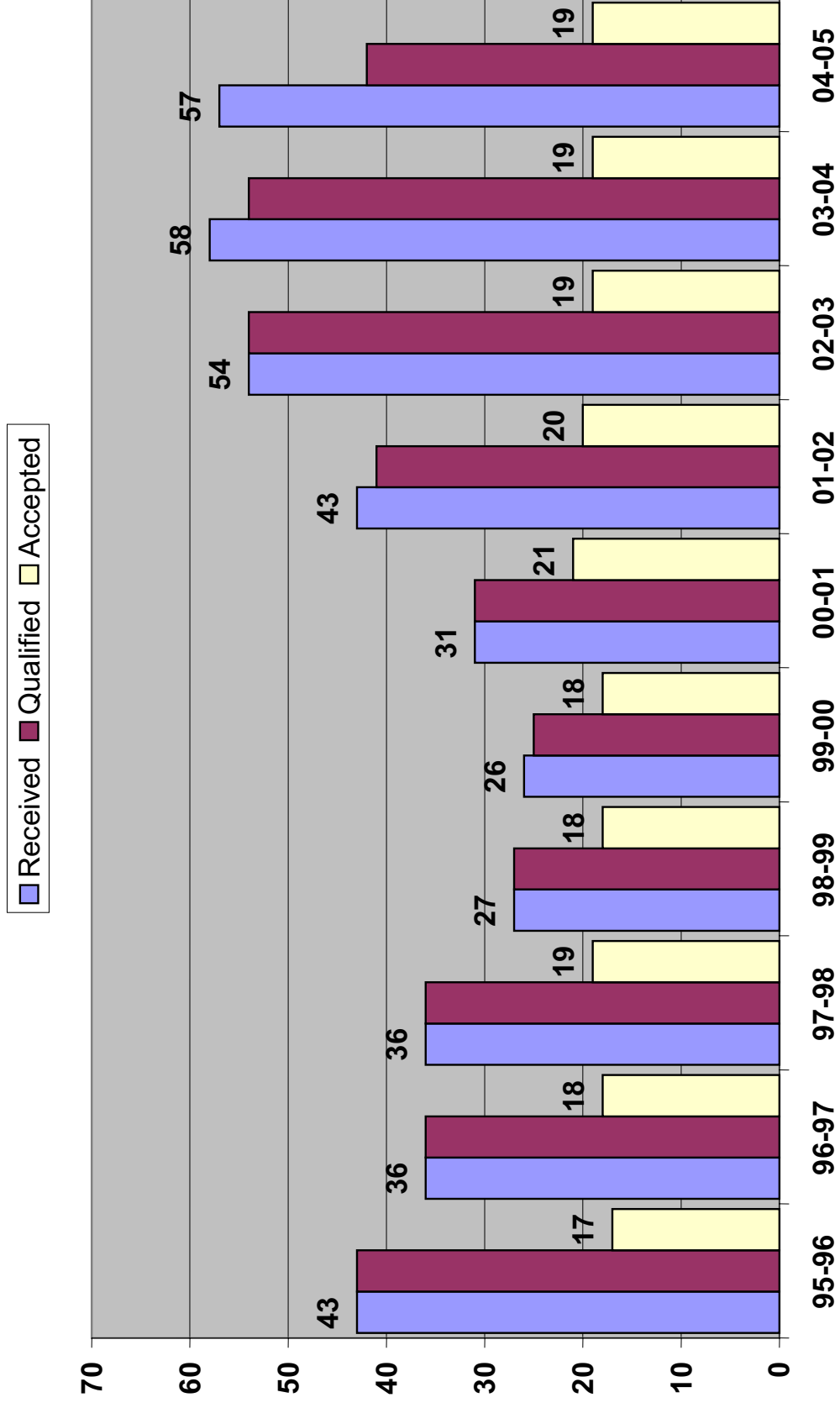

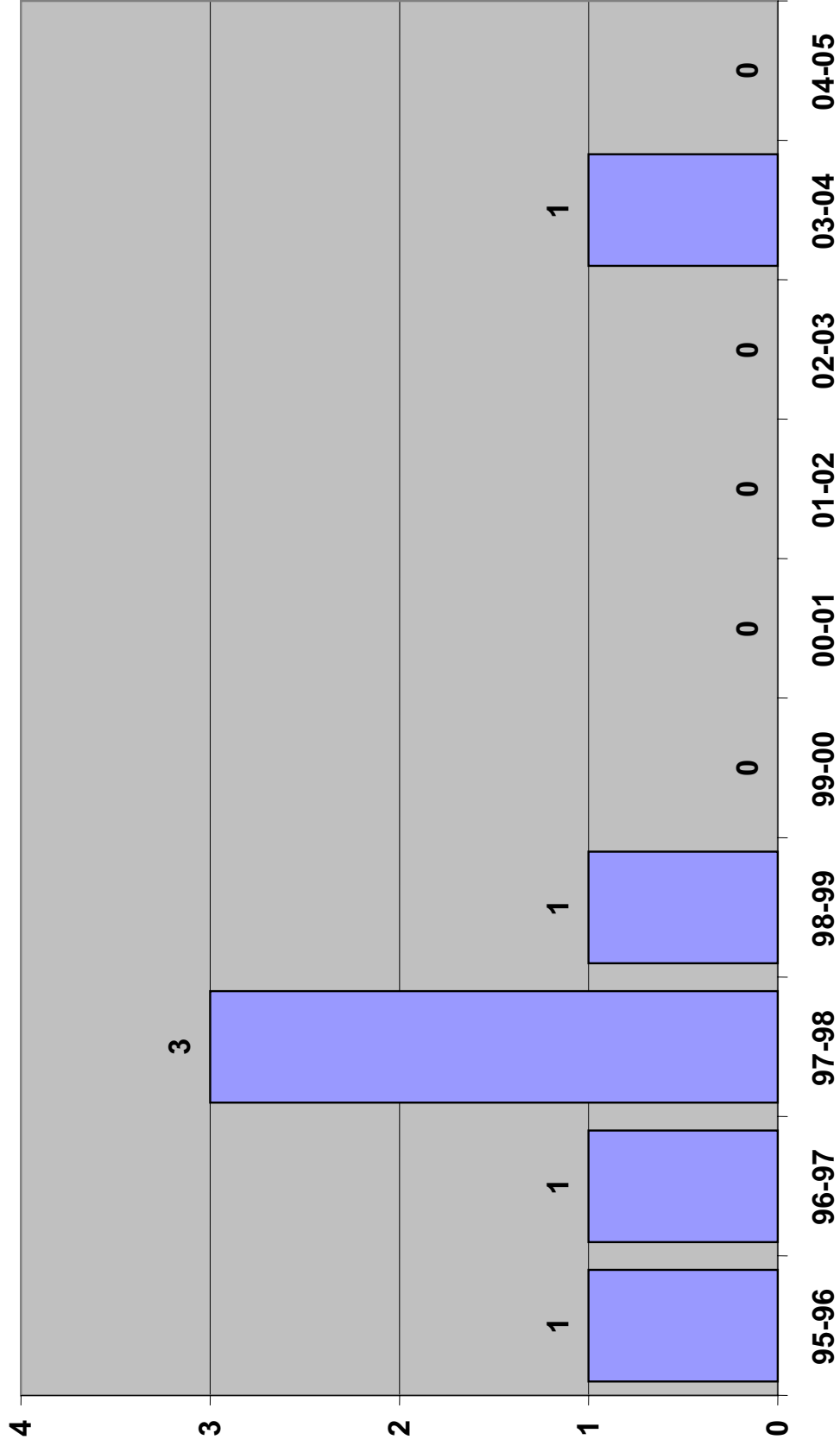

# Radiographic Science Applicants 1995-2005



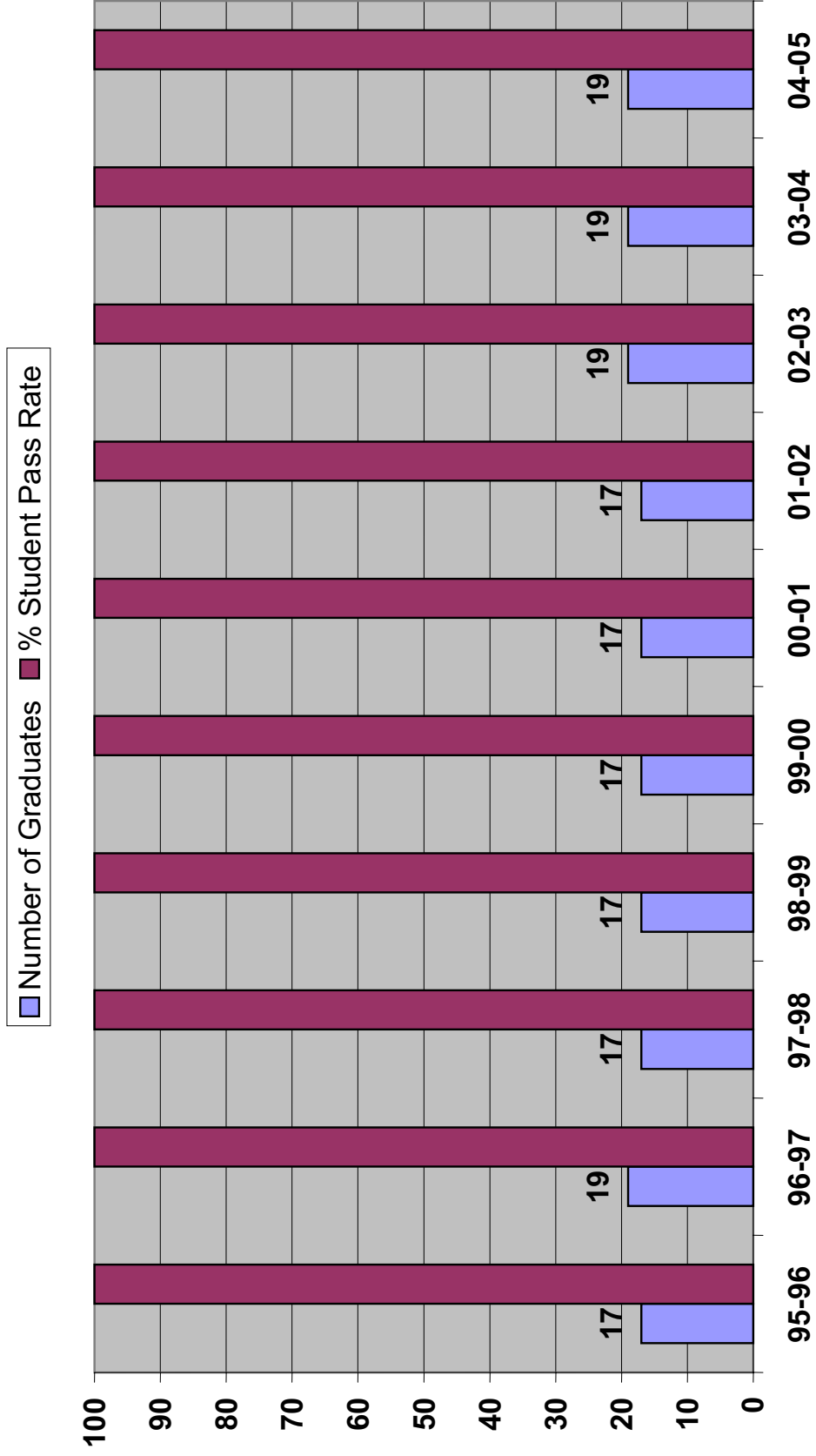
