ASISU ELECTIONS: CHOOSING NEXT YEAR'S STUDENT GOVERNMENT

The time has come for students to run for elected officer positions within student government for next year.

2006-2007 elected positions for ASISU (Associated Students of Idaho State University) include the Student Body President and Vice President, ASISU Senators (representing each ISU College), and Vice President of the Idaho Falls Center for Higher Education.

The information packets for potential candidates are now available and can be picked up at the Student Leadership Involvement Center (SLIC) on the third floor of the Pond Student Union.

It must be completed and submitted by Friday, January 27th at SLIC.

ASISU student government works closely with the ISU administration to share governance of the institution by setting and administering student fees, developing policies and procedures, and providing useful services to students.

The ASISU General Election will be held online on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, February 15-17 by logging on to the ISU website.

Training and support for ASISU student government representatives

is provided throughout the year.

Elected officers must participate in mandatory training sessions throughout the Spring semester, and a two day retreat at an off-campus location before school resumes in August.

Mandatory Candidate Meeting for ASISU General Election

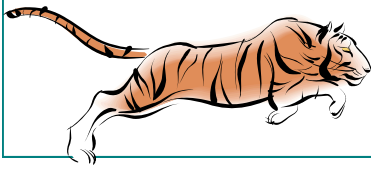
