

- Name:** **ASISU Scholastic Scholarship**
- Amount:** Not greater than one half of full-time resident tuition
- Award Period:** Each Semester (Fall and Spring)
- Major:** All—Please note: Students may submit an application for only one College and it must be based on the student's college of record. Students with dual majors must submit their applications for the College of their primary major.
- Class Level:** Sophomore, Junior, Senior, Graduate. Must have completed 26 credit hours by the end of the current semester (exceptions for one-year programs).
- Enrolled:** Full-time (meaning full-time credits successfully completed) in semester preceding the semester of application (not including summer) (not required of graduate students), the semester application is made, and the semester the award is received (exceptions for one-year programs). Full-time is defined as 12 credits for undergraduates and 9 credits for graduate students. Additionally, the required minimum cumulative GPA must be maintained through the end of the semester of application in order to be eligible to receive an award.
- GPA :** 2.75 for undergraduates, 3.00 for graduate students
- Citizenship Required:** ID: (No) US: (No)
- Graduate Student Requirements:** GRE/GMAT test score copy
