Scholarship to Support Creative Women

PURPOSE:

The Women's Studies scholarship is designed to support female students who have declared a minor in Women's Studies and who show creativity in their academic pursuits. Although the "arts" has been our main focus; broadly defined to include, but are not limited to, visual and 3-D arts (e.g., painting, pottery, metal work, sculpture, etc.), folk-based fine arts (e.g., weaving, beading, book-making etc.), performing arts (e.g., voice, theater, dance, musical instrument, etc.), and creative writing (e.g., poetry, fiction, playwriting, etc.) we welcome entries from any woman who has found a unique and creative way to pursue her research or academic goals.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Women who are declared Women's Studies minors (forms to declare the Women's Studies minor are available in the History Office, LA 332)
- Minimum 2.5 GPA while at ISU

APPLICATION PROCESS:

To apply please compile the following materials:

- Cover page with name, contact details, year at ISU, current GPA, Bengal ID, and declared major (if any)
- Copy of most recent transcript with current class schedule (unofficial is acceptable)
- A one page written statement describing the relationship between your art and your interest in the field of Women's Studies
- Two representative samples of your artistic work (as appropriate to your field)
- List of names and contact details for two references familiar with your academic and/or artistic work

SELECTION AND AWARD DETAILS:

Selection will be made on the basis of artistic merit and commitment to Women's Studies. There is no financial need-based component. The scholarship will be \$500 and may be used for any costs related to the recipient's education at ISU. The scholarship winner will be announced formally in July, 2008.
