PROGRAMS DEVELOPED AS DEAN:

Physical Therapy (PT). This program began as a Master of Physical Therapy (MPT) degree and has recently been upgraded to a doctoral degree (DPT). In addition to the entry-level program, PT also offers a transitional doctoral degree for those PT's who hold a bachelor's and a Master's degree in physical therapy.

Speech-Language Pathology (SLP)—Boise. Through a special appropriation from the state legislature, the Master's degree in speech pathology was added to the Boise area in order to address the critical shortage of speech language pathologists in school districts in the western part of the state. Later, a bachelor's degree in speech pathology and audiology was added to the Boise area in cooperation with Boise State University.

Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP). While the Nursing Department has had a long-standing Master's program, this option was added through a special appropriation by the legislature to the Pocatello campus. It was later added to both Boise and northern Idaho. The Master of Science degree is now fully on-line, and both bachelor-prepared and associate degree nurses are eligible for

entry into our Master's program.

Master of Public Health (MPH). This program was initially developed on the Pocatello campus and was later added to the Boise campus. We now have graduate faculty at both the Pocatello and Boise campuses.

Audiology. Idaho State University has had a Masters of Science degree in audiology for many years. Recently, we upgraded to the Au.D. degree and expanded the program to our Boise campus where we now have a resident faculty member.

Dietetics Internship. ISU's Dietetics Program includes a separate baccalaureate degree and post-baccalaureate dietetics internship certificate program. We have expanded the Dietetics Internship to the Boise area where we now have a resident faculty member.

Counseling. The program changed its doctoral degree from an Ed.D. to a Ph.D. after joining the College from the College of Education. We later expanded the offering in the Boise area from a Master's of Counseling (M.Coun.) degree with a mental health option to include an additional M.Coun. in Marriage, Couple and Family Counseling. We now are working to develop a Ph.D. program at the Boise Center.

Physician Assistant Studies (PAS). The Physician Assistant Studies Program started on the ISU campus as a baccalaureate degree. We later updated to a Master's degree, and we are currently in the process of expanding the program to the Boise area, where a full complement (20) of students will be admitted fall 2007, expanding our total enrollment in the program to 50 students per year.

Occupational Therapy (OT). Following the development of the PT program, we added the Master in Occupational Therapy degree. This program is housed jointly with the PT program, and students from both programs take core courses together. A doctorate in occupational therapy is in the planning stages.

Idaho Advanced General Dentistry (IAGD). Two dental residencies have been developed including a full outpatient clinic on the Pocatello and Boise campuses. We accept a total of 8 residents per year at each site.

Institute of Rural Health (IRH). The IRH is the grants and contracts unit of the Kasiska College of Health Professions. Researchers at the Institute are housed on both the Pocatello and Boise campuses.

Idaho Center for Disability Evaluation (ICDE). This center evaluates all developmentally delayed adults in the state of Idaho and is funded through a contract with the state division of Medicaid.

Dental Hygiene. The Master of Science degree in dental hygiene is a fully on-line program and enrolls one third of the total Master's students in dental hygiene in the country.

Educational Interpreting/Deaf Education Studies. Both baccalaureate and associate degree programs were added to the Pocatello campus. Plans are under way to expand both programs to the Boise campus.

Fast Track Nursing. This Bachelor of Science program was developed on the Boise campus to address the critical shortage of professional nurses. It accepts only students with baccalaureate degrees in non-health professions.

International Exchange. We forged an affiliation agreement for this program with the University of Capetown, Western Cape, South Africa. Students and faculty exchange regularly with this international partnership.
