NURS 6600 – Theoretical Foundations for Nursing Practice

- 1. Discuss nursing knowledge, nursing theories, and conceptual frameworks as they apply to advanced nursing practice and nursing research.
- 2. Evaluate and analyze theories from different paradigms.
- 3. Apply nursing theories and theories from other disciplines to advanced nursing practice.

NURS 6602 – Health Policy

- 1. Analyze national health care finance policy and effects on health care delivery.
- 2. Analyze regulatory, legislative, economic, and public and/or private policies related to nursing practice, supply and demand issues. May be state or national perspective.
- 3. Compare and contrast environmental influences on nursing and the health care system.
- 4. Analyze relevant legal and ethical issues affecting health care policy development and implementation.
- 5. Discuss a health policy issue of interest with a local, state or national policy maker.

NURS 6610 – Advanced Evidence Application

- 1. Critically appraise sources of evidence which support nursing practice in traditional and nontraditional healthcare settings.
- 2. Apply principles of research in nursing practice.
- 3. Apply research findings to evidence-based practice.
- 4. Analyze the evidence-based practice process.

NURS 6612 – Health Care of Rural Communities

- 1. Explore unique aspects of rural and frontier communities.
- 2. Evaluate the health care needs of rural, vulnerable, and diverse populations.
- 3. Apply current research and related literature to rural and frontier health care systems and practices.
- 4. Analyze the impact of the rural and frontier environment on the health of individuals, families, and communities.

NURS 6620 – Advanced Human Pathophysiology

- 1. Analyze pathophysiologic mechanisms of specific diseases by: Identifying molecular and cellular alterations to the affected organ systems. Describe molecular and cellular responses to specific disease processes. Identify disease pathways and the resulting local and systemic infections.
- 2. Analyze the systemic response as protective and useful for recovery and speculate upon the etiology of individual responses across the lifespan.
- 3. Recognize the epidemiology and clinical manifestations as pertaining to individuals and populations across the life span.

NURS 6621 – Advanced Nursing Roles

- 1. Develop an evidence-based, comprehensive and inter-professional plan of care that is patient- centered for an individual, family or population in a clinical area of practice.
- 2. Examine the knowledge, skills, attitudes and expertise of the advanced nursing practice role in education, management and interprofessional patient care management.
- 3. Analyze health care systems and health policy issues that affect advanced nursing practice roles.

NURS 6633 – Rethinking Nursing Education

- 1. Explore teaching/learning principles and theoretical perspectives that contribute to patient care outcomes, management of care and policy development.
- 2. Explore interventions that support an environment of inclusivity, social justice and transformational change in educational and practice environments.
- 3. Discuss evidence-based interventions that strengthen the intersection of education and practice within healthcare systems.
- 4. Correlate new knowledge with one's own personal philosophy of teaching.

NURS 6635 - Curriculum Issues and Development

- 1. Describe the relevance of planning prior to creating curriculum and evaluation methods.
- 2. Explain the process of creating valid and reliable curriculum.
- 3. Consider curriculum design as a means of scholarly activity
- 4. Reflect on personal experiences working with curriculum building and evaluation.
- 5. Discuss evaluation methods of students' higher-level critical thinking.
- 6. Compare and contrast different methods of testing.
- 7. Create or revise an undergraduate nursing course.

NURS 6639 – Teaching and Learning Strategies in Nursing Education

- 1. Evaluate common faculty issues in the development and management of a course.
 - a. analyze the faculty role within recent education trends.
 - b. create a theoretical online class presentation for faculty.
 - c. create a clinical learning. environment and 1-hour post-conference.
 - d. evaluate simulated students' performance.
 - e. respond to a simulated class issue.
- 2. Apply a variety of teaching strategies to class presentations and learning environments.
- 3. Apply a variety of instructional technology and methodology best practices to class presentation.
- 4. Employ an instructional design framework for designing class/course presentations.
- 5. Discuss legal/ethical issues in instructional design and course management.
- 6. Synthesis of best evidence for course development, management, and evaluation.

NURS 6640 - Evaluation Issues and Strategies in Nursing Education

- 1. Analyze the concepts of assessment and evaluation in nursing education.
- 2. Explore and critique various evaluation strategies for the learner-centered environment.
- 3. Develop examples of formative and summative evaluation for programs, courses, and students.
- 4. Explore and discuss issues and strategies for evaluation in the clinical setting.
- 5. Produce a written scholarly paper that shows your knowledge and understanding of an evaluation strategy and place in an electronic portfolio.

NURS 6647L – Advanced Nursing Practicum

- 1. Demonstrate quality and safety initiatives in the coordination of care in an area of clinical practice.
- 2. Demonstrate leadership and collaboration skills in the inter-professional care of patients, families or populations in an area of clinical practice.
- 3. Complete an educational project designed to improve patient care outcomes, incorporating theory, economic, policy considerations.
- 4. Influence regulatory, legislative and public policy to promote and preserve the health of communities.

NURS 6655 – Advanced Leadership

- 1. Analyze the concept of leadership in depth.
- 2. Compare effective leadership approaches in the changing health care system.
- 3. Compare and contrast historical and current theory/models which support effective leadership.
- 4. Participate in personal leadership development.
- 5. Create a leadership vision for practice.
