Job Description:

The Community/Professional Volunteer Program provides an opportunity for healthcare and/or teaching professionals with human anatomical learning and background to enhance or further their experience in anatomical dissection, dissection-based teaching, and/or to regularly contribute to other aspects of the lab at the Idaho State University-Meridian Health Science Center. The Program Volunteer will strengthen and deepen their anatomy knowledge through participation in cadaveric-based study, dissection, teaching and presentation of anatomical concepts in a professional educational environment. This is a volunteer position (not for pay).

Minimum Qualifications and Requirements:

1. 18 years or older and an healthcare and/or teaching professional with human anatomical learning and background
2. Effective communication skills
3. Ability to function independently or in a team-based, collaborative environment
4. Honesty and ability to maintain strict confidentiality
5. Must pass ISU-Meridian background check before beginning internship

Application:

Interested candidates are required to submit certain documents for review before receiving invitation to join the program:

- Cover Letter or Letter of Interest
- Resume or Curriculum Vitae; include summary of anatomy laboratory experience as applicable

Additional materials, such as recommendation letters, may be requested when deemed necessary.
