- I. CALL TO ORDER – 5:01 PM
- II. ROLL CALL
  - a. 11 Presidents Cabinet members present.
  - b. Absent: Director Lumu.
  - c. Also present: Dr. Matt Daily, Assistant Vice President and Dean of Students.
- III. President, Sky Halter – President Halter welcomed everyone to 2026. He shared that he is providing assistance regarding the selection of a new bookstore, and any feedback or recommendations from the group is welcome. A student survey is being conducted to gather feedback on Chartwells, with cookies and desserts donated by Chartwells to support the effort. Reserve funding meetings are being held with himself, Vice President Medema, and Director Burrell; anyone interested in participating in these meetings is encouraged to reach out and attend as well.
- IV. Vice President, Charlie Medema – Vice President Medema shared that this afternoon, he met with Director Kankolongo to discuss the throwback media project in relation to ISU's 125th birthday. He has been added to the committee by President Wagner and will be participating in upcoming discussions. He is assisting Sustainability Club President Rhea Kalivas with submitting a Benny's funding request for the Earth Day celebration, in which ASISU will be heavily involved. In addition to these efforts, he is working to establish office hours to support others in ASISU as initiatives are restarted and has continued communication with Sunshine Denny regarding the plant relocation project.
- V. Vice President of Idaho Falls, Brooke Taylor – Vice President Taylor welcomed everyone back. On Friday, January 23rd, she will be presenting to the ISU Alumni Board on behalf of ASISU. Anyone with ideas, questions, or comments they would like shared with the board is encouraged to reach out. The Idaho Falls SAB has extended an invitation to host ASISU for a Bengal Wednesday event on the Idaho Falls campus on April 8th. A poll will be sent out via Google Chat to gauge interest and availability. Transportation will be organized and provided for all members who wish to attend. On January 15th, she will be meeting with Brooklyn Hill, who was recently hired to provide marketing and outreach support on the Idaho Falls campus. She will be collaborating with her on materials for the ISU Idaho Falls Instagram page, as well as developing a student-focused ISU Idaho Falls account. She will also work in conjunction with her on the Turner Day of Service project scheduled for Wednesday, March 12th.
- VI. Vice President of Meridian, Makayla Amos – Vice President Amos shared that, at the Meridian campus, vouchers were distributed for students to redeem at the free coffee truck today. Vouchers were also distributed for a free taco truck that will be on campus later this week. Additionally, she will be meeting with Ali Crane, Director of ISU

Meridian Enrollment and Student Services, to discuss campus events at the Meridian campus for the remainder of the Spring 2026 semester.

VIII. Senate Pro Tempore, Prajakta Sharma – Senator Sharma nothing to report.

IX. Secretary, Eliana Madison – Secretary Madison reminded members that January timecards and checklists are due by January 29th, 2026 at 5:00 PM.
