- I. CALL TO ORDER – 5:00 PM
- II. ROLL CALL
 - a. 11 Presidents Cabinet members present.
 - b. Absent: Director Lumu.
 - c. Also Present: Theresa Brissette, Student Leadership and Engagement Center Program Specialist.
- III. President, Sky Halter – President Halter met with Matt Daily to discuss the reserve fund budget and to plan for the future of the Student Leadership and Engagement Center, including the potential structure and staffing for the department next year. President Halter attended Faculty Senate and University Council, reviewing employee feedback data and discussing the overall state of the university. Over spring break, President Halter is scheduled to attend several meetings with key stakeholders, including members of the State Board of Education, legislators, and the Governor.
- IV. Vice President, Charlie Medema – Vice President Medema met with Dean Matt Daily to discuss reserve fund spending and other ongoing projects, providing valuable insight. He also spoke with multiple instructors across the university regarding reserve funding. Vice President Medema met with Val Davids in the Student Leadership and Engagement Center to review plans for May Day, and is coordinating with Scheduling and Events regarding available spaces for the event.
- V. Vice President of Idaho Falls, Brooke Taylor – Vice President Taylor reported that, due to delays in product delivery, the Turner Day of Service event cohosted by the Idaho Falls campus and the Idaho Period Project has been postponed to Tuesday, March 31st. She is gathering information regarding the SBDC relocation proposal and has been in communication with President Halter about next steps. The Idaho Falls Student Activities Board is planning to host an ASISU lunch on April 8th.
- VI. Vice President of Meridian, Makayla Amos – Vice President Amos nothing to report.
- VII. Student Activities Board Director, Braden Worley – Director Worley absent.
- VIII. Senate Pro Tempore, Robert Saunders – Senator Saunders has been communicating with senators and individuals who submitted ideas for the reserve fund tracker, clarifying details about proposed projects. He prepared a slideshow to present all projects to the Senate this week.
- IX. Secretary, Eliana Madison – Secretary Madison reminded all members that March timecards, checklists, and committee roll calls are due Thursday, March 19th, by 5:00 PM. She also noted that the 2026 End-of-the-Year Banquet RSVP is due Monday, March 30th, by 5:00 PM.
- X. Director of Finance, Hannah Burrell – Director Burrell reported that she has been focusing on preparing a rough draft of the budget, reaching out to necessary university staff. She reviewed numerous travel applications for the advertising club and organized a drive to track all funding requests.

- XII. Director of Community Relations, Kara Price – Director Price shared that she has begun drafting a manual for future Directors of Community Relations.

- XV. Election Commissioner, Josh McCubbin – Commissioner McCubbin reported that the election opened at 8:00 AM on Monday. An IT issue delayed voting by thirty minutes, which was resolved quickly. He has also been coordinating with candidates regarding election procedures.
- XVI. Deputy Election Commissioner, Mia Price – Deputy Commissioner Price reported that she has worked on filming for the election giveaway. She and Commissioner McCubbin have planned a collection of giveaway results on Friday. She is also working on ideas for the Service Fund and met with President Halter and Housing regarding potential reserve funding projects.
