- I. CALL TO ORDER – 5:00 PM
- II. ROLL CALL
 - a. 9 Presidents Cabinet members present.
 - b. Absent: Vice President Amos, Director Kankolongo, and Vice President Taylor.
- III. President, Sky Halter – President Halter reported that over spring break he traveled to Boise and met with other student government leaders to present ASISU’s support statement for Idaho LAUNCH and had the opportunity to speak directly with Governor Little. He also shared that himself, along with Senator Robert Saunders, attended the Presidential State of the University Address, where they heard about future plans and the overall status of the university. He has continued meeting with deans, students, and other stakeholders regarding the reserve fund. The proposal is nearing completion and will soon be ready for recommendation to Vice President Craig Chatriand and a vote in the Senate.
- IV. Vice President, Charlie Medema – Vice President Medema met with the Office of Student Leadership and Engagement today to discuss the revival of May Day. He is currently working with Scheduling and Events to secure a space for either April 30 or, ideally, May 1, most likely on Cadet Field. He will be gathering quotes from floral suppliers and coordinating with Facilities to construct the Maypole. He also met with Justin Dayley and Alina Jablonski to review their itemized breakdown for reserve funds, noting that they have done an excellent job. Additionally, he spoke with Sunshine Denney and Chris Pickett regarding potential reserve fund allocations, and connected with Dr. Jenna Raff, who provided a statement from the Department of Audiology on the impact of the Titan Diagnostic Piece.
- V. Vice President of Idaho Falls, Brooke Taylor – Vice President Taylor, as shared by Secretary Madison, welcomed members back from break and apologized for being unable to attend the meeting. She shared that she enjoyed seeing everyone at the President’s House gathering. She reported that the Idaho Falls campus hosted the Idaho Period Project for the Turner Day of Service event, where 430 packs were assembled with 19 attendees present. The event was held in the library conference room, and the Idaho Period Project brought a media crew. Materials from the event will be shared when available. The organization expressed gratitude to ASISU for its support and donation. Prior to spring break, Vice President Taylor met with Advisor Brissette to discuss Idaho Falls campus programming. She has also invited Chief Campus Administrator Jeremy Green to attend the Senate meeting on April 8 and is awaiting confirmation. Additionally, construction has begun on the Idaho Falls campus, starting with renovations on the first level of the Tingey Administration Building.
- VI. Vice President of Meridian, Makayla Amos – Vice President Amos absent.
- VII. Student Activities Board Director, Braden Worley – Director Worley absent.
- VIII. Senate Pro Tempore, Robert Saunders – Senator Saunders met with the College of Technology Dean to review reserve funding requests. He is working with President Halter to finalize line-item budgets and is incorporating feedback gathered from the Senate reserve funding presentation. He also attended the Presidential State of the University Address.

- IX. Secretary, Eliana Madison – Secretary Madison reminded members that April timecards, checklists, and committee roll calls are due Thursday, April 23 at 5:00 PM. Members were also reminded to complete the 2026 End-of-the-Year Banquet RSVP by Monday, April 6 at 12:00 PM.
- X. Director of Finance, Hannah Burrell – Director Burrell shared that this week she has finalized several travel applications, including those for 12 students in the Advertising Club attending a competition. She sent out award letters and uploaded documentation to the drive. She is continuing work on the budget, including reviewing benefits, and will be meeting with Theresa Brissette and Senator Saunders to finalize those numbers.
- XI. Director of Public Relations, Mica Kankolongo – Director Kankolongo absent.
- XII. Director of Community Relations, Kara Price – Director Price nothing to report.
- XIII. Director of Academic Affairs, Sofia Peach – Director Peach nothing to report.
- XIV. Director of Student Affairs, Juliet Lumu – Director Lumu nothing to report.
- XV. Election Commissioner, Josh McCubbin – Commissioner McCubbin reported that the election has concluded and was completed before spring break. Results will be certified by the Senate tonight, which he will be attending. He is also working on the election giveaway with Deputy Commissioner Price and Secretary Madison.
- XVI. Deputy Election Commissioner, Mia Price – Deputy Commissioner Price reported that the election has concluded. She is awaiting the arrival of giveaway prizes and will be posting the election giveaway results tonight.
- XVII. OTHER
- a. Discussion
 - i. President Halter shared that the State Board of Education is requesting official letters indicating student support or opposition to proposed tuition increases. He noted that other institutions, including the University of Idaho and Boise State University, have already completed this.
 - ii. Deputy Commissioner Price asked about the timeline and suggested conducting a general student poll to gather input.
 - iii. President Halter responded that a draft is needed by Friday.
 - iv. Director Price suggested sending a mass email to ISU students to collect responses.
 - v. Senator Saunders noted that general student feedback would likely be negative and questioned whether the statement should reflect student opinion or the organization’s stance.
 - vi. Commissioner McCubbin stated that, due to legislative factors driving the increases, he is not in favor and believes most students would also oppose paying more for college.
 - vii. Deputy Commissioner Price acknowledged this but emphasized the importance of allowing students a voice.
 - viii. Director Peach stated she is not in favor of the increases, citing external legislative factors.
 - ix. Senator Saunders suggested that ASISU should issue its own official statement rather than solely reporting general student opinion.
 - x. President Halter noted uncertainty about whether the Board is seeking input from students broadly or from student government specifically and will seek clarification. He added that it is difficult to imagine strong student support for the increases. President Halter also shared that he is awaiting a response from the Mayor’s Office regarding a potential visit to speak with ASISU later this semester or next.
