## SERVICES PROVIDED BY COLLEGE OF EDUCATION ADVISORS

- Help you choose and/or change your major
- Review degree/major/certification requirements
- Collaborate to develop and write a course plan of study
- Provide important university and department information such as deadlines, scholarships, and opportunities
- Sign academic forms (petitions, appeals, academic plans)

## ADVISOR RESPONSIBILITIES

- **Offer** easily accessible times to meet in person, via phone, or Zoom
- **Communicate** important information through email and text
- **Maintain** knowledge of your program and certification requirements
- **Create, send, and update** your plan of study as needed
- **Encourage** you to build self-efficacy and problem solve
- **Review** your academic progress
- **Discuss** strategies to help you utilize personal and available campus resources and provide referrals

## STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- **Schedule** and **attend** advising appointments at least once a semester
- **Read** and **respond** to ISU emails in a timely manner
- **Prepare** for advising sessions by reviewing DegreeWorks and bringing questions
- **Follow** your plan of study and **inform** advisor about changes
- **Accept responsibility** for your academic progress and outcomes
- **Meet** important dates and deadlines
- **Communicate** with advisor about academic or personal challenges that affect your academic progress

# STEPS TO SUCCESS



## BEFORE SCHOOL STARTS

- Closely read your **ISU** email messages (can be forwarded to your personal email)
- Meet your advisor at New Student Orientation and register for classes
- Make an appointment with your advisor, if necessary
- Become familiar with MyISU, DegreeWorks, Navigate, and Canvas
- Learn about the Book Bundle

## FIRST YEAR

- Learn how to independently register for classes, following your degree plan
- Review academic progress using Canvas, DegreeWorks, and MyISU
- Take your foundations class, e.g. EDUC 2201 & 2204 or HPSS 2223
- Attend the mandatory advising meeting in your foundations class
- Collaborate with your advisor to create a plan of study
- Attend office hours and meet your instructors
- Attend tutoring as needed, utilizing the ISU Tutoring Center
- Support your personal wellness through involvement in clubs and organizations

## CONTINUING

- Watch your DegreeWorks and contact advisor with concerns
- Check in with advisors each semester to check on and/or revise your plan
- Maximize open course options by registering as soon as you are able
- Make connections with students and faculty in your major
- Meet with the Career Center to craft your resume
- Discuss student teaching eligibility requirements with advisor and meet College of Education deadlines (Teaching majors)
- Take advantage of student resources such as Counseling and Mental Health, the Wellness Center, Disability Resource Center, Bengal Success Center, Reed Gym, and the Student Health Center

## FINAL YEAR

- Apply for graduation (everyone) and Commencement (if you plan to attend)
- Meet with faculty and academic advisors to discuss career plans
- Refine your resume, participate in mock interviewing, and strategize employment plans with the Career Center
