Kudos to Mostafa Fouda, assistant professor of electrical and computer engineering, and his Ph.D. student, Ahmed Ashour!


They earned a Best Paper Award at the 2023 International Conference on Computer Science, Information Technology, and Engineering in Jakarta, Indonesia. The paper
