5.2.2. Most of the conversations right now have been around budget. All the state agencies have been asked for a model of what an additional 1% to 2% would look like for this year and next year's budget if we were to cut so they've had to submit that. If the legislature does decide to go ahead with another 1-2% cuts, that would be on the immediate tail of this week's cuts. That was a little different website than TCC. That's recent. That was, last Wednesday, they were told by Friday how an additional 1-2%.

5.2.3. We were told 1% equals about \$1 million for our university's budget. Right now, our shortfall is \$8 million because of our 3% cut, but also because of insurance costs going up.

5.2.4. While the 3% cut shouldn't equal \$8 million, it does, because our budget's increasing, or costs are increasing, but our budget isn't increasing, basically, so if we were to go to an additional 1-2%, it would not be as bad, but it would still be bad.

5.2.5. Governor didn't recommend CEC for state employees this year so no raises this year.

5.2.6. Next Monday, if you would like to hear the full rollout of the budget plan for the entire university, everybody feel free to show up to Faculty Senate and join by Zoom. I can get to the Zoom link if you'd like. Faculty Senate meetings are always open.


