

Resident/WRGP Tuition and Fees 2025/2026

An estimated cost for the 24-month campus SLP graduate program for a non-thesis track student is shown below. A thesis track would require **3 additional credits**. Tuition and program professional fees are listed. An additional charge for malpractice insurance is \$5 per semester. ISU maintains this policy for you.

Full Time (9 credits or more) Resident Graduate Tuition: \$5820.00, plus professional fee of \$232 per credit hour.

Part Time (8 credits or less) Resident Graduate Tuition: \$592.00 per credit hour, plus program professional fee of \$232 per credit hour: \$592.00+\$232.00=\$824.00 per credit hour.

Note: Students may opt-out of the new Student Clubs and Organizations Fee (\$4.50).

*Keep in mind, tuition generally increases each fall semester. Final program cost is approximate, as tuition for the second year (2026/2027) is based on 2025/2026 tuition rates.
