CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING LEADING TO THE DEGREE MASTER OF COUNSELING (M.COUN.)

The master's of counseling specialty practice area in Clinical Mental Health Counseling is a generalist practice area designed to prepare counselors to provide counseling services to a diverse range of clients in various settings. This counseling specialty practice area emphasizes wellness, development, and advocacy related to clients and the community. Some of the settings where students have served practicum and internships are: mental health centers, group and private practices, and alcohol and substance abuse centers. Within their internship, students are strongly encouraged to work with individuals, groups, and couples and families.

A. **General Residency Requirement.** For the Master of Counseling (M.COUN.) specialty practice area, the student is required to complete the equivalent of at least four full semesters of resident graduate study beyond the bachelor's degree. The minimum Clinical Mental Health Counseling program must total 60 semester hours.
