# I. Report from Faculty Senate Meeting – October 23, 2023

- a. Workload Policy
  - i. Much discussion and Q and A in the meeting
  - ii. Background
    - 1. An FPPC working group drafted a policy from Oct 2022 through March 2023, and edits from FPPC and the provost were incorporated in April 2023. This draft didn't get a final FPPC vote and further edits were anticipated.
    - In August 2023 administration requested that the policy be moved from FPPC to a new TWG to address its major budget, legal, and HR ramifications extending beyond FPPC purview.
    - 3. The new TWG included Administration, Senators, and Faculty, but FS did not select or approve composition.
    - To accommodate 30-day review requirement, this policy must be accepted at the next scheduled FS meeting to be signed before President's exit.
    - 5. Policy will be discussed at the next FS meeting.
    - 6. Policy will mostly likely will not come back to FPPC

- iii. Concerns were voiced about policy content, policy process, and the timeline for approval of updated policy
- iv. Key points of concern from FS are impact of uniform 3:3 on research-heavy departments, mechanism for local flexibility regarding workload details, workload credit for student instruction outside classroom, ambiguity of definitions
- v. Senators will be collecting constituents' feedback
- vi. Suggestions and concerns from FPPC as to how it should be handled going forward:
  - 1. Is there a policy map for the approval procedure?
  - 2. FS is requesting a slowing of the policy process
  - 3. Advised that FS should document this process and then share concerns with accreditation entity.
  - 4. To implement a motion and vote, policy needs meaningful revision and drastic improvement and sent back to FS for approval.

    - 3. Next task is delineation of process for early bid for tenure.

  - i. Plan is to have Blake Christensen speak at next FPPC meeting regarding specificity of expectations language.
  - ii. Next meeting 'menu of options' for such language might be useful.
- b. Status of ISUPP 4080 Faculty/Student Relationships Policy

- i. Policy needs to be stronger and more detailed. Currently, it consists of one weak paragraph.
- ii. Preliminary work done.
- iii. A preliminary outline may be a useful starting point for input.
