#### Overview

- The are no unforeseen changes identified for the FY22 Academic Affairs (AA) budget
- The loss in AA of EVPP Woodworth-Ney and pending loss of VP Tokle requires a thoughtful interim restructure to ensure effective functioning of the unit.
  - Salary savings in current Vice Provost role will be used to restructure duties temporarily in FY22 until a new Provost and Vice Provost is hired
  - The Provost line is sufficient to cover a new Provost salary





### Strategic Alignment

- The FY22 Budget continues to align with the University's strategic focus by...
  - Reducing administrative overhead costs
  - Eliminating non-essential contracts





## Strategic Investment Request

- Dual Credit Coordinator with outreach responsibilities
  - Assist with increasing Early College enrollment for outreach campuses
  - Split funding requested
    - .5 FTE through the Early College program revenue
    - .5 FTE funding through Central
