

# Teaching Innovation Grant 2017-2018

The Office of the Executive Vice President and Provost for Academic Affairs invites proposals for the Teaching Innovation Grant Program. The purpose of this grant is to recognize and reward innovation in university teaching. The grant will be awarded for the 2017-2018 academic year.

Faculty are encouraged to apply for grants of up to \$5,000 to support the development of new teaching strategies or the use of existing teaching methods in a new way to enhance student learning. Grants may be used to fund a course release, travel, software, supplies, or other costs directly related to the goals of the project, and funds must be used by June 15, 2018. Funds may not be used for research-related purposes, such as travel to conferences to disseminate research findings or for salary or stipend to be paid directly to those awarded the grants. Only one grant proposal may be submitted by a faculty member in any capacity (PI or Co-PI). Faculty who receive grants will also have the opportunity to present their work in a faculty forum on teaching innovation.

Grant recipients will be responsible for submitting a final report to Academic Affairs. The deadline for grant proposals is March 3, 2017, and awards will be announced in April 2017. Body of proposal should include:

- Abstract (250 words) written for non-specialist audience
- Proposal narrative should be no more than three single-spaced pages with 12-point font and one inch margins and should be written for a non-specialist audience. Proposal narrative should address background, nature of the innovation, objectives and significance (or impact), designated student population impacted, sustainability beyond the grant period, preparedness for project, methodology, and plan for assessing the innovation's success.
- Detailed budget & budget justification
- References cited (limit one page)
- CV tailored to project proposal (limit two pages)
- Other appendices (if needed)
