Examined the 20 distinct screens/functions identified above. This includes screens that appear based on actions the student takes during the initial registration process, as well as during the four major stages of the web application. This is a sample of the work we have done:

- · Identify all accessibility issues associated with each of the 20 screens
- · Classify them according to their level of importance
- Explain why they present accessibility or usability barriers
- · Provide the WCAG 2.0 "best practices" remedial solution/recommendation
- · Provide the appropriate WCAG references

Our software interface has been tested and functions on all readers and magnifiers and we have processes in place for students with hearing, physical or cognitive disabilities. The Examity software interface provides faculty with the ability to request exceptions such as extended time and other accommodations for students that are entitled to them. When a student is entitled to extended time, we provide this time at no additional cost as a courtesy.
