Developmental Behavioral Neuroscience Lab Assistant

Dr. Michele Brumley is actively recruiting undergraduate research assistants to participate on her research lab team, in her Developmental Behavioral Neuroscience Lab. Individuals may choose to receive course credit (PSYC 4483 or BIOL 4481) or volunteer.

Dr. Brumley's research lab investigates the development of motor behavior (locomotion, reflexes) and their mechanisms in developing rats. The lab often focuses on spinal cord mechanisms and conducts spinal cord injury studies (e.g., the effect of treadmill training after a spinal cord injury), as well as studies investigating maternal behavior in rats. Students will learn and may get involved with behavioral studies with rats, breeding methods in rats, microscope work, spinal cord dissections, coding behavior from video records, and collaborative research with graduate students. Desired Qualifications: at least 3.0 GPA, interested in obtaining research experience, able to spend at least 6-8+ hours in lab per week, has at least 2 full semesters left before graduation.

If you are interested, please send Dr. Brumley an email indicating any previous research experience (if you have none, that's OK), why you are interested in the position, your availability (hours per week you would want to work in the lab), and an unofficial copy of your transcripts. AMPed Up! Program

Mentorship is needed, important, and fosters many benefits. A current honors student may gain a role model and a wise friend. An honors alumni mentor may form an additional friendship and help unlock the untapped potential of a rising leader in his/her field of study. Both can reap rich rewards as students learn from their mentors and alumni advance their own mentoring capabilities. Most importantly, mentorship gives current students and alumni the opportunity to establish meaningful connections. The AMPed UP! program does this.

The AMPed UP! program is designed with structure, but the flexibility to suit both the mentor and student's needs. This self-paced program is [accessible via the Honors website](#). You can schedule the 6 sessions anytime it works for both as long as the sessions are completed before December 6, 2021.

Are you interested in becoming a student mentee? Please see the bios of the committed mentors for this semester and respond to this email with the mentor you would prefer to work with.

- First, we have a 2012 graduate who studied Biochemistry. She has studied Global Health in Ireland and completed medical school at the University of Washington. She continued her pediatrics residency at Stanford and is currently completing a research fellowship at Stanford. She would love to mentor anyone who is interested in medicine, curious about living abroad, or is wondering about taking time off before medical school.

- Second, we have a 2021 graduate who studied Psychology at ISU. As an undergraduate researcher, he investigated relationships between values and meaning in the way people talk about their lives. His honors thesis examined relationships between impulsivity, risk behavior, and risk factors for suicide development. He also has experience in psychology research labs and is currently awaiting responses from several graduate PhD programs.

- Third, we have a 2018 graduate with an Honors Bachelor of Science in Biology and a Bachelor of Science in Psychology. She is currently working in clinical research as a Certified Clinical Research Coordinator for Frenova Renal Research. She plans to continue her education by applying to the PA program at ISU.

- Finally, we have a 2020 graduate who studied Marketing; and currently works at Rain the Growth Marketing Agency. She loves the outdoors, hiking, photography, design, video, and reading. She would like to mentor a student in the ways of career preparation, character development, job shadowing, maximizing college performance, and resume help.

We hope that through AMPed UP!, honor students and alumni alike will remain active contributors to the University Honors Program and the greater Idaho State University community. If you know another honor student or alumni that would benefit from this program, please let them know of this opportunity.
