QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer) is a simple and foundational course that will teach you the principles of intervention. This course is offered to anyone in the community for free and will take place on February 29th at 6pm on ISU campus. The Tribal Researchers' Cancer Control Fellowship Program (TRCCFP) will be held in person at the Northwest Portland Area Indian Health Board (NPAIHB). The NW NARCH will cover the travel-related costs of attendance. We will cover flights, hotel, per diem, and ground transportation to and from the airport. Travel details will be shared upon acceptance.

Accepted fellows will attend a two-week summer training in June 9-21, 2024 and a one-week follow-up training in the fall. We encourage AI/AN graduate students, researchers, and tribal health workers with a demonstrated interest in cancer prevention and control to apply.


